Graduating in 1915 from Woodville Kirby High School with a class of only eight seniors Mrs. Fred "Winnie" Matthews was honored by the Kirby High School Student Council Monday when she was presented the Citizen of the Month Award.

According to Patti Raiford, president of the Kirby High Student Council, "Miss Winnie" has contributed a lot to the students of Kirby High throughout the years.

The Student Council President was referring to assistance given by "Miss Winnie" toward various school projects and clubs with material from her fabric shops and "her uplifting smile" to the students who pass by her store on the corner of Charlton and Bluff as they're on their way to and from school. She has donated to the flag

corp and the pep squad and given patterns to the clubs for their projects and saved the clubs and organizations at school some hard earned money by backordering special material requests.

She has also helped in the development of Home economics classes at the school. "Miss Winnie" is the second such recipient to receive the coveted "Citizen-

ship Award". The first was Mrs. Curtis Garner who was chosen by the Kirby High Student Council in November for her constant contribution of time and effort to improve conditions within the Woodville Independent School District.

According to "Miss Winnie" W.R. Brown was Superintendent of Schools when she graduated. First in her class scholastically. She was given the honor of offering the welcoming address for the graduation ceremony.

"Miss Winnie" who recalled that students were only allowed to spend \$10 for graduation clothing in that day, stated that she felt that there have been tremendous educational advances since her day in school.

She is the proprietor of the Fred F. Matthews Fabric Store which was built in 1935 and which opened in Woodville in May of 1936.

Miss Winnie reflected much love for the students who formally presented her with her recognition certificate with a slight tear in her eye demonstrating quietly how much she cherished the honor.

Coe Seeks Re-election As DA

Stanley Coe has announced his candidacy for re-election as District Attorney of the 88th Judicial District of Texas, comprised of Hardin and Tyler Counties. His name will appear on the ballot of the Democratic primary to be held Saturday, May 1, 1976.

Stanley Coe was born in Kountze, Texas, and is a native of Hardin County and member of a long-time Hardin County family. His father, the late Thomas B. Coe, was Chief Justice of the 9th Court of Civil Appeals sitting in Beaumont, Texas. Prior to assuming his duties on the Appellate Court, Judge Coe held the office of District Judge of the 75th Judicial District of Texas comprised of Liberty, Chambers, Hardin and Tyler Counties. Stanley Coe attended Lamar University in Beaumont and graduated from South Texas College of Law in Houston, where he received his law degree.

While serving in World War II, he received five Campaign Stars. He participated in the Normandy Beach Head Invasion on D-Day and was later wounded at the Battle of the Bulge. Returning to active combat, he received the Fifth Campaign Star and received 40% disability for wounds received while in combat.

He practiced law here before being elected District Attorney. He is married to Edith Teer Coe. They have a son, John Coe, who is a Houston attorney and a daughter, Larlin Hooks of Beaumont.

"A candidate's campaign for public office should be founded solely on his past performance as a public servant and nothing else," said Mr. Coe. "I believe I have a good record while I have been your District Attorney. I believe that I have the education, training and experience to continue to provide effective and meaningful representation."

"I have always done my best to see that justice is done in and out of the courtroom. I have always done my best to follow the law as set out in the statutes and Constitution. My best friends tell me that I don't smile enough. I may not; but perhaps you should."

Elliott Seeks House Seat

S.M. "Doc" Elliott, Dayton Chiropractor, has announced that he will be a candidate for the District 16 Texas House seat in the May Democratic Primary election. District 16 includes Liberty, Polk, Tyler, Trinity and San Jacinto counties. The district is presently represented by Perry A. Tanner, Jr., who will not seek re-election.

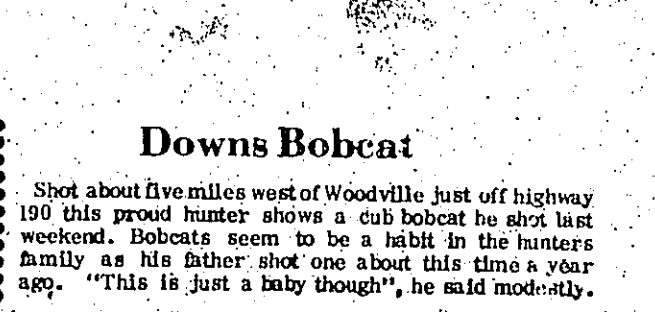
Warren Junior High girls started district Monday, Jan. 5, 1976. The girls took their first loss of the new year at Warren against Shepherd.

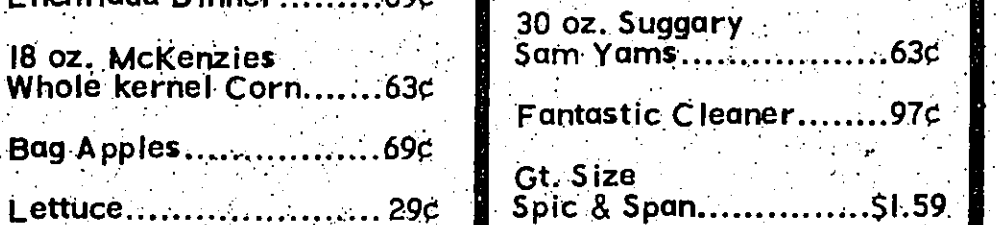
