School Service League Appoints 'Liaison' Group

The Woodville Independent School District School Service League, in their first meeting of 1976, created a School Board Liaison Committee composed of three League members, "to keep better contact with the activities and actions of the board."

Appointed to that committee were: Mrs. Grady Holderman, Ed Eastham and Mrs. Anne Garner.

Mrs. Garner, publicity chairman for the group said, however, that the function of that group would not be that of a "spy" or watchdog.

"The group, since it was formed to play a supportive role in helping solve school problems, needs to be nearer where the decisions are made that are affecting school policy which directly affects W.I.S.D. school students," she said.

"We need to make the board more aware that the service league is ready and willing to help."

League President Dr. Jim Jinet, heard extensive reports from various committee persons concerning accomplishments made during the past year of the one-year old organization.

Mrs. Tom Knight, a school nurse and who is a member of the League reported on activities of the Health Services Committee of which she is a member. She reported to the group of activities in completing fluoridation of some 1,100 W.I.S.D. students in grades kindergarten through eighth.

According to Mrs. Knight, "The students received dental health and brushing instructions, plus free toothbrush kits which were distributed to each student. The complete process was monitored by Woodville's two dentists," she

said. Other health service committee accomplishments performed by the League consisted of volunteer work in coordinating the Tuberculosis Skin Test which was given to each of the students. Volunteers were enlisted to assist children to the area where the Texas State vaccine was administered.

Building and Playground Committeeman Grady Holderman reported on funds earned following the successful presentation of the Christmas play "Amahl and the Night Visitors." The League sponsored the project with the help of the Lions and Rotary organizations in Woodville.

The play netted some \$468.86.

Holderman asked the group to decide on whether or not to spend the money for a playground slide or expand the funds for a more comprehensive "creative playground" concept, which would require further study.

The group chose to move toward the "creative" playground so the children would receive more complete and proper muscle and motor development in using the equipment.

Holderman reported on the apparent availability of funding from the Soil and Water Conservation office amounting to some 80 percent of the cost of designing and building a new playground, Holderman said, however, that funds and approval of the project wouldn't be forthcoming for "at least two years." He was asked to research the possibilities of the funding and also to check with Texas A&M University for any planning that might be offered in

designing the playground. The Classroom Assistance Committee was represented by Cynthia McCafferty and Karen Sullivan both of who reported progress in utilization of volunteer manpower and material.

According to Mrs. McCafferty, "There are 20 volunteers, but there are still many gaps that need to be filled." According to Mrs. Phillip Sherrod, a first grade teacher, "I use my teacher to assist with the slower learning students."

The two coordinators of the Classroom Assistance Committee reported that "It has been very gratifying for us in working with the children." Mrs. Sullivan reported that some 3,800 "flash cards" had been completed for student use. A Career Day on March 4 is planned for older students.
