## County Commission Endorses Fair Plan

The Tyler County Commissioners met in regular session Monday and heard a request from Carl Nichols, president of the Tyler County Community Fair group for an endorsement from the Commissioners needed, Nichols said. "Just help get the fair off to a good start."

The Commissioners also heard and approved a request from J.W. Henry for a trash disposal consideration, approved a request from Sheriff Lewis Craven for a teletype information system, and approved "free" usage of the courthouse grounds for the upcoming Dogwood Festival and

Western Weekend activities. Nichols, asked the courts help in defraying initial cost obligations of the fair "on a reimbursable basis". Commissioners agreed on a motion by H.C. Parks to work out a plan to help fund the "reimbursement" of the County Fair which officially has been set for Sept. 17, 18 and 19 near the FFA Rodeo Arena which is located adjacent to the Tyler County Airport. County Judge Tom Dick Mann called the project "real worthwhile."

The court agreed to actively review personnel considerations relating to recent Deep East Texas Council of Governments CETA employment programs which terminate in the next few months. Commissioners are interested in knowing what fundings may still exist for the program and will consider what the requirements of the county will necessitate.

Sheriff Craven reported to the commissioners of a need within that department for a teletype machine offered through a DETCOG grant. Craven said the 100-word-a-minute machine which could be used on a cooperating basis with the City of Woodville, would cost the county only \$25 per month. The proposal was approved on a motion by President Nichols. Commissioners tabled until receipt of specific contract terms a proposal to have the radio systems repair parts and service contract awarded to a Livingston firm. Commissioners authorized repair to a garbage truck for a falling transmission and tabled discussion on a request from Peace Justice E.A. Sturrock "to bring the books of his office up to date."

## Tyler County Community Fair Is Sept 17-19

Official dates have been set for the Tyler County Community Fair on September 17, 18 and 19 at the HFFA Rodeo arena near the Tyler County Airport.

At the second meeting of the committee, held on Monday in the Commissioners' courtroom, President Carl Nichols called the meeting to order and asked for a name to be given to the group. Tyler County Fair, Inc. was selected as the title for this non-profit organization. It was voted to have a bi-centennial theme for their 50th annual fair. Committee reports were given; publicity chairman Melnee Davis reported two sub-committee chairmen for her committee. Joe Setley will be in charge of posters, bumper stickers and other publicity items and Joyce Hake will be in charge of the news media. Joyce Crowson said Kathryn Branch will be co-chairman of her committee division and responsible for concessions. Joan Graham will serve as co-chairman of the commercial portion and Florence Williams will be in charge of

exhibits and display booths. Toby Spurlock reported on the show and Bobby Battle reported he had talked to agriculture teachers in most of the county schools. He said it would be possible to have a showing in four livestock divisions: cattle, swine, poultry and rabbits. Working with him will be Ben Worthy, J.C. Clark, Jr., Milton Durham and Robert Keith Moore. Exhibitors will be limited to those in Tyler County. President Nichols read about a seminar to be held in Kerrville, February 21. This seminar, sponsored by the Arts and Crafts Foundation, will give ideas and lectures on organizing and conducting a fair. Three persons will attend these meetings on behalf of Tyler County Fair, Inc. They will record each of the sessions and return with these recordings and notes to aid committee members. The next meeting will be held on Monday, March 8 at 10 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom. All interested persons are welcome to attend.

## Woodville Faces Fuel Cost Penalty

The Woodville City Council heard a serious gas shortage update from City Manager Walt Davis Monday at that group's regular monthly meeting, and jointly agreed to meet with the City's top volume

users in request cutback procedures. In consideration of the fuel shortage the city is facing. According to Davis the City of Woodville is one million cubic feet of gas over its al-

lotment. That overage according to fuel contracts amount to some \$10 per 1,000 cubic feet of gas, he said. City Councilmen agreed to discuss with the major users possible cutback or conservation measures in the next few weeks and months.

Davis said that other municipalities in the area were facing similar shortages, due for the most part, he said, on the lengthy cold weather season. Another factor in the increase usage for the City of Woodville is the addition of two new volume "hookups" added last year. On another energy consideration City Manager Davis reported that the Council also faces a possible visit from Gu-States Utilities soon regarding rate changes for electricity usage in the city. In other business and at

the suggestion of City Attorney Joe Wheat the Council deferred a second reading of a cable TV ordinance for a franchise request from CATV systems of Dallas. The council rejected a partial payment on taxes from A.C. Ohlen "in order to follow the law". City Manager Walt Davis was instructed to return the check to Ohlen with a statement letter from the city regarding the guidelines it must follow in accepting such a payment. Councilmen agreed to install streetlights in the Timberland Addition and agreed to advertise for bids for a new police car. Councilman Jim Jimette initiated a motion which passed to appoint J.P. Miller as Election Judge for the upcoming City election along with Kirby Pope as Assistant Judge.

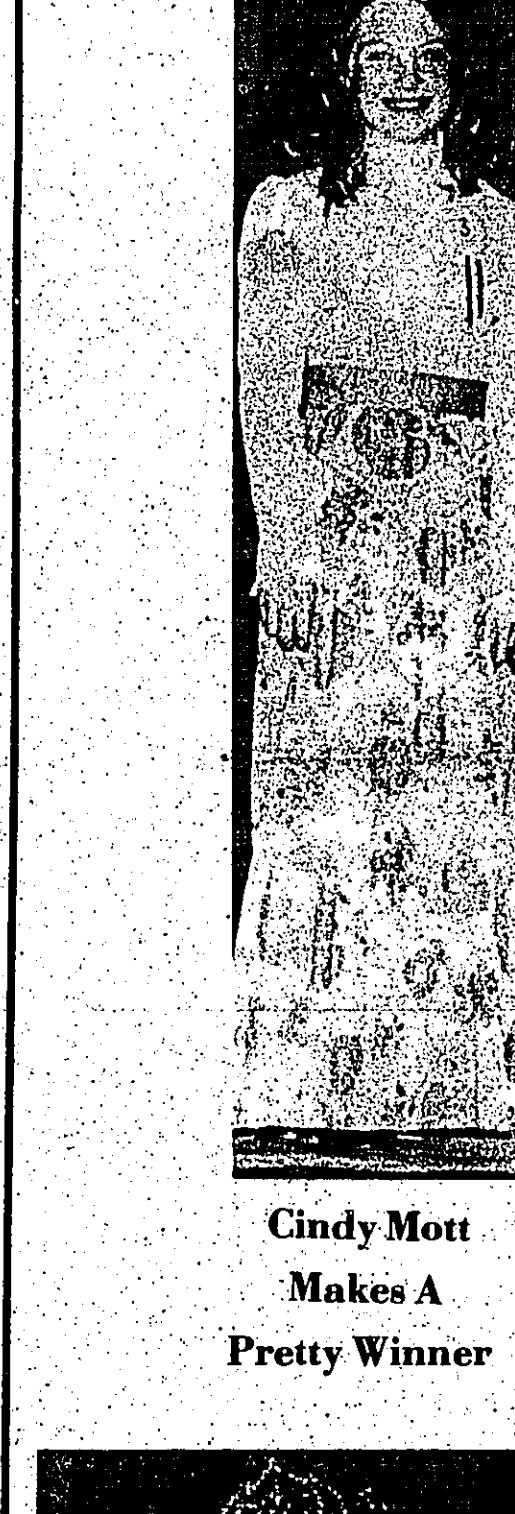
