## County Schools Issue Free Food Policy

The schools of Tyler County including Chester I.S.D., Colmesneil I.S.D., Spurger I.S.D., Warren I.S.D. and Woodville I.S.D. -- today announced their policy for free and reduced-price meals for children unable to pay the full price of meals and milk served under the National School Lunch program.

Local school officials in issuing this statement have adopted the following family size income criteria for determining eligibility:

Children from families whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. In addition, families not meeting these criteria but with other unusual expenses due to unusually high medical expenses, shelter costs in excess of 10 percent of income, special education expenses due to the mental or physical condition of a child, and disaster or casualty losses are urged to apply.

Application forms are being sent to all homes in a letter to parents. Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If a family has foster children living with them and wishes to apply for such meals and milk for them, it should contact the school.

In the operation of child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, or national origin.

Under the provisions of the policy school principals will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he may make a request either orally or in writing to the superintendent or school lunch representative for a hearing to appeal the decision. The policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

Each school and the office of the superintendent has a copy of the complete policy which may be reviewed by any interested party.

The school children of parents or guardians who become unemployed are eligible for free or reduced-price meals during the period of unemployment, provided that the loss of income causes the family income during the period of unemployment to be at or below the levels shown on the table.

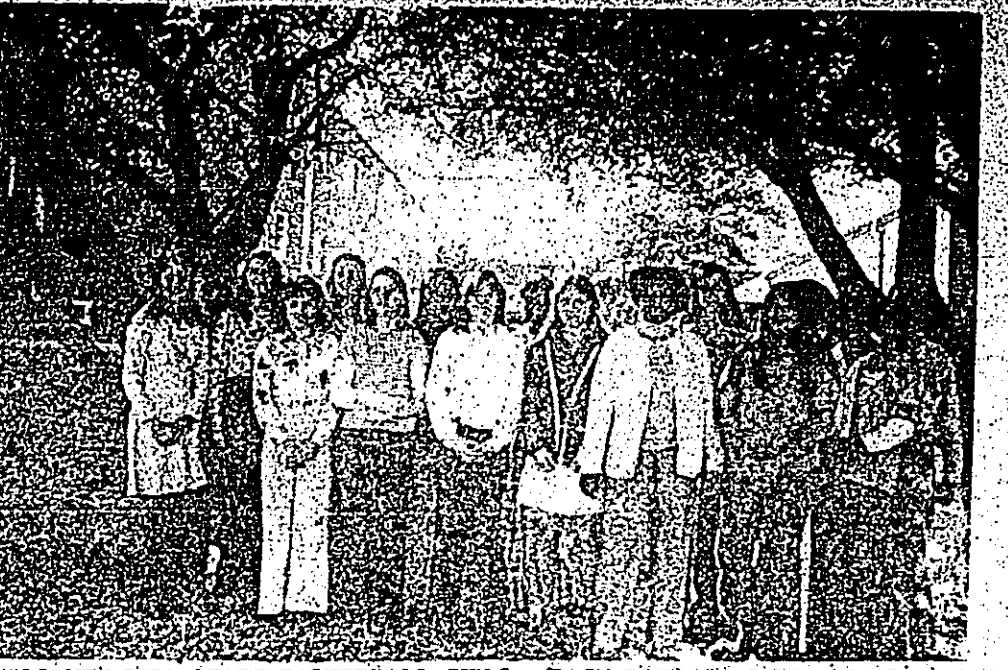
