What Next Gray? Lift-Off Brings 'Miles Of Smiles'

National TV news commentator Hughes Rudd told his early morning audience Monday that his organization "Could" understand why the little town of Woodville would want to lift an out-house anyway?

If you asked Clyde Gray "Why?" on Saturday, odds are that you wouldn't have gotten an answer as busy as his, but, it was written all over his face, nevertheless.

Gray was responsible for gathering nearly 1,000 persons Saturday at the entrance to his Heritage Garden Village to witness a helicopter lift-off from Woodville with the designation of the privy in Nederland as part of the Bicentennial Festivities.

Just as many folks were on hand to greet the incoming helicopter and privy in Nederland and among them was Congressman Charles Wilson, who donated "A years supply of the Congressional Record" which he said "Was a necessary ingredient for any privy."

Gray put the spectacular idea together with Port Arthur's famous J.J. Justice who said he needed an out-house to compliment the Nederland Festival activities.

The fest carried both Woodville and Nederland miles of television film and a rain or two of newspaper coverage in state and national publications.

Gray says further "It's not over yet."

Dorothy Nettles, candidate for Commissioner, Precinct 1 in Tyler County and Owner of the local Sears store here presented the group with an official copy of the Sears catalog to go with the privy flight.

An official "Out-house Queen" was designated who was complete with bouquet of corn-cobs while robed in a flowing newsprint gown. Kimmy Lashlo, a Burnese Country singer charmed the group with popular American songs.

Tyler County's own Jethro Holmes and his two oxen Tom and Jerry helped pull the out-house to its launching pad where the small chopper picked up the privy amongst gusty winds and the applause of the crowds.

A group then formed an automobile parade to the Nederland Festival where the landing provided some excitement for the flatland folks who joined in the festival activities.

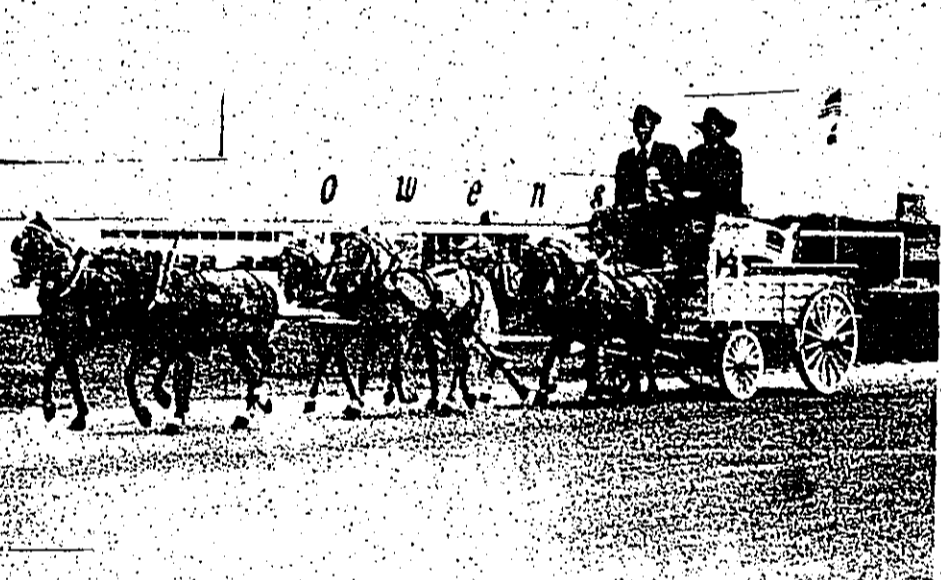

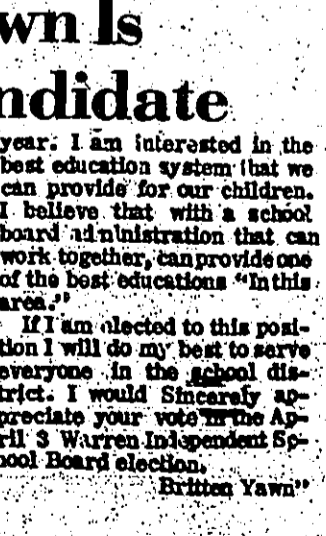
"I, Britten Yawn am announcing my candidacy for school board trustee position #7 for Warren Independent School District.

Bicentennial Is Big Part Of Dogwood Festival

The streets of Woodville will take on a festive air of bicentennialism Saturday, April 3 at 2 p.m. with flags flying, bands marching and soldiers marching. One of the most important flags to wave that day will be the official bicentennial flag which will be presented to the county following the Dogwood parade.

Leading the parade will be the Fort Polk Color Guard and Drill Team clad in their colorful 1776 uniforms. The 17-member group will include a drum major, a fife and a flag bearer.

Over 14,000 persons are expected to attend the annual Dogwood Weekend parade according to parade chairman George Jarrott. U.S. senator John Tower will serve as the parade marshal and later speak at the flag presentation. There will be over 125 entries in the parade this year.

Crowd pleasers will include the Jasper Lions Club rodeo "Good Guys and Bad Guys" who will be staging their traditional "shoot-outs" along the parade course. The Shriners will bring their marching group, clowns and funny automobiles.

There will be eight marching bands in the parade. Chorus music will be provided by the Southernaires of Robert E. Lee High School, Houston. This group is directed by Miss Elaine Grant and will be featured at the Dogwood pageant that night.

The 29 visiting duchesses will also be riding in the parade. Their cars will be judged on decorations, their dress and the best presentation or interpretation of the Bicentennial theme.

Floets will include the traditional Queen's float ridden by 1975 Dogwood Queen Nancy Nichols. Other floats will be those of the trail bearers and ladies-in-waiting. Each line-up of the five county princesses will have their own decorated floats. Other entries will include the Wee Wisdom Nursery, Mahan Plumbing and the Woodville Lions and Rotary clubs. Prizes will include cash awards, trophies and ribbons.

Dr. Ralph Steen, recently named Mayor of Texas by the Dogwood Committee will be in the parade as will state senator Don Adams and US congressman Charles Wilson.

Several automobile clubs from Houston will be participating in the parade.

The Classic T-Bird Club will bring their '55, '56 and '57 Thunderbirds to the parade and the Antique Automobile Club will have restored antique cars. Members will wear antique clothing to match their cars.

Joim Smith will be responsible for starting the parade and planning the route A.J. Corbett will direct the parade and ladies-in-waiting. Each line-up.

At 4 p.m., following the parade, there will be the official presentation of the bicentennial flag in front of the Tyler County Courthouse. Speakers will include Senator Tower and Sam Klutz, chairman of the Texas Bicentennial Committee. The ceremony will be directed by the Fort Polk Color Guard.

Activities about the courthouse will include the BAPF sponsored Arts and Crafts Fair with over 20 dealers from about the state participating in the two-day fair.

Tourism Brochures Now Available
