Dogwood Parade, Coronation April 3

The Tyler County Dogwood Festival winds up its spectacular 33rd annual festival with the Queen's Coronation and traditional historical pageant this Saturday, April 3.

The festival queen will be chosen from five princesses, one representing each of the high schools in the county. She will be announced in the Queen's Coronation at 8 p.m. April 3 in the Dogwood Amphitheater.

The 1976 princesses are Debbie Price, of Spuriger, Jill Crawford of Woodville, Tracy Byerly of Warren, Cathy Hooks of Colmesnell and Benita Vinson of Chester.

Five runners-up will act as ladies in waiting. The entire royal court, including 35 visiting duchesses from area towns and their escorts, will be presented at the coronation and in the annual parade, scheduled for 2 p.m. with flags flying, bands playing, and soldiers marching. One of the most important flags to wave that day will be the official bicentennial flag which will be presented to Tyler County immediately following the Dogwood parade. U.S. Senator John Tower will make this presentation assisted by Sam Kinch chairman of the Bicentennial Committee. Leading the parade will be the Fort Polk Color Guard and Drill

team in their colorful 1776 uniforms. Over 15,000 persons are expected to attend this 33rd Dogwood Parade which this year boasts over 125 entries. Travel the beautiful scenic highways of East Texas April 2-3 and join the folks in Woodville when "It's Dogwood Time in Tyler County".

County Airport Gets \$19,000

The Texas Aeronautics Commission has approved this issuance of \$192,050 in state grants to seven cities for airport construction and improvements to be conducted jointly by the Federal Aviation Administration and state and local governments.

The Commission, meeting in Austin Wednesday, approved the issuance of \$19,000 in state funds for an airport project in Woodville. The funds will be used to complete the overlay of runway 16/34, the taxiway, and apron.

Tyler County Dogwood Festival Parade Marshal and the United States Senator for Texas John Tower will formally hand over to Tyler County Bicentennial Committee members on Saturday, an authentic American Revolution Bicentennial Flag to fly at the Tyler County Courthouse. The event will occur in conjunction with the Tyler County Dogwood Parade which begins at 2 p.m. on April 3.

The flag presentation ceremony will take place at 3:00 p.m.

School, Municipal Elections Saturday

Tyler County voters will go to the polls this Saturday, amidst all the pageantry of the Tyler County Dogwood Festival and try to elect candidates who will govern their schools and municipalities during the next important decision making years.

The Woodville City election will see three persons vie for two seats, at-large, with Terry Watts running unopposed for the mayoral position.

The last city vote saw only 69 voters register their choice in that election.

Incumbent Malcolm Radford, a dentist here, is seeking return to his seat while political "newcomers" Doug Tolbert and David Mann are also in the running for the additional vacancy which is given up by Watts in his bid for the top city post.

According to City Manager Walt Davis the balloting for the municipal vote will be held on Saturday, April 3 from 7 a.m. till 7 p.m. at the Woodville Fire Station.

Judging the election will be J.P. Miller with the help of Kirby Pope as assistant judge.

The Woodville Independent School District trustee race will see six candidates run for three seats on Saturday with incumbent W.S. Nichols as the only unopposed candidate for Position No. 3.

Seeking the Position 4 seat are D.M. White, former assistant principal in the Woodville Independent School District; and Tom Knight a local pharmacist. The only woman candidate in the school race is Mrs. Margaret Lane who is also in contention for Position 4.

Position No. 5 is being sought by incumbent Fred Sullivan, in the retail hardware business in Woodville, and Jack I. Esler, who lists his occupation as a pilot. Esler had originally filed for position four but changed several days later.

Election judge for the District will be James K. Brown.

Voting for the school board election will take place in the Kirby High School annex. All registered voters in the district are eligible in that balloting.



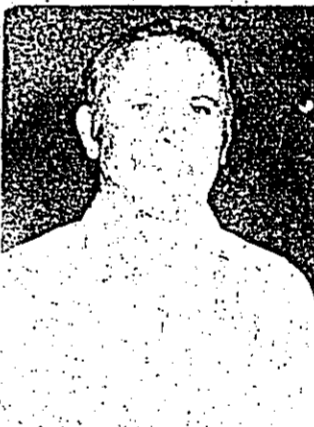

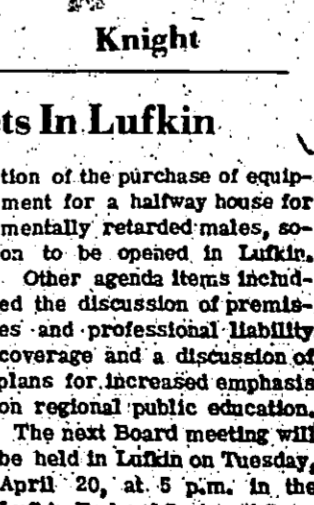

Editor Mack To Present 'Mr. East Texas' Award

Darrell Mack, executive editor of The Beaumont Enterprise and Journal will present the "Tyler County Dogwood Festival 'Mr. East Texas Award'" to Dr. Ralph Steen of Stephen F. Austin State University in ceremonies at the Dogwood Pageant this Saturday, beginning at 8 p.m. Mack is standing in for last year's "Mr. East Texas" Ralph Ramos, who died during the past year while employed by the Enterprise Company. Ramos was known through-

out East Texas for his colorful coverage of East Texas people.

Mack has worked for the Kansas City Star two years and then joined United Press International where he worked in the Dallas, Edinburgh, and Houston Texas offices. In Houston he was bureau chief for seven years.

He was named Executive Editor of the Beaumont Enterprise and Journal in August of 1973.

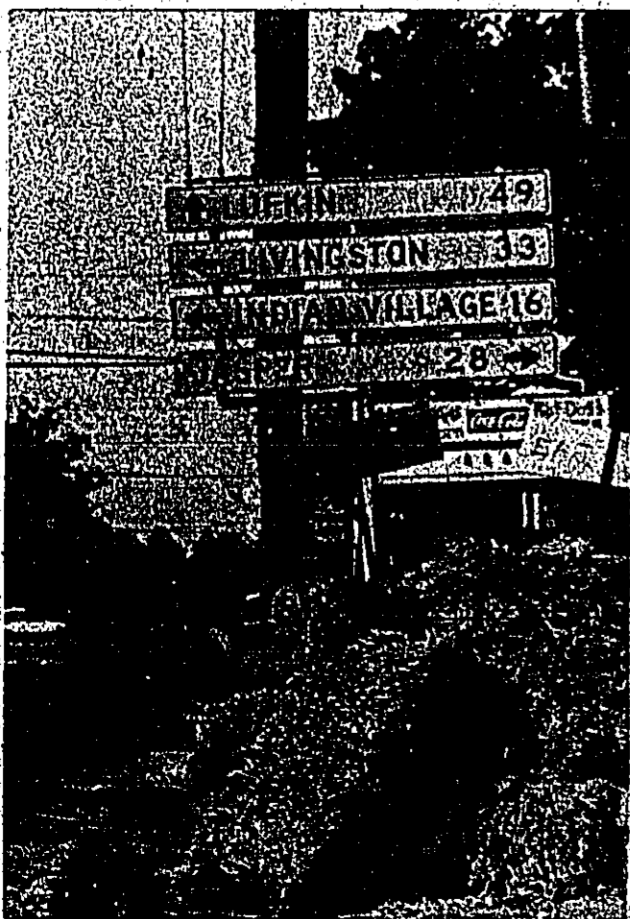
Western Winners Announced

Texas Taxes

The Comptroller's Office recently completed a thorough audit of the handling of public money in Duval County, which not only revealed a wide spread of mismanagement, but also indicated the likelihood that the county may be broke by the end of the summer.

As of pre-estimate, Tuesday the final drafts of the contract were being reviewed by attorneys for both the City and County and were still awaiting final signatures from the parties involved.

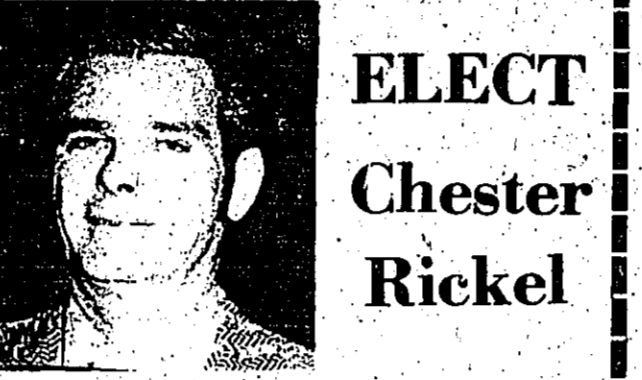

DETTA Meets

CENTER-The Deep East Texas Development Association held their regular monthly meeting Friday at the Lake Country Inn in Center, Patrick H. Fussell, Association Vocational School Funds.

Our auditors discovered that funds of the water district had never been deposited in interest bearing accounts. Over the past 10 years the district has lost about \$250,000 in interest. In December, 1975, for instance, the water district had \$849,177.48 in the bank. None of this money was earning interest.

In November, 1967, the bank did not require a signature on a \$678,985.11 check from the county to the water district and in effect allowed an unidentified individual to walk out with a quarter million dollars worth of public money with no accounting of where it went or who took it.

Suffice it to say that we are going to see to it that they keep their books right in Duval County from now on. We can and we will make it a lot harder for anyone to steal public money.

Certainly while we don't anticipate a need for similar action in the great majority of Texas's 254 counties, we will make every effort to insure that the taxpayers' dollars are properly collected, managed, disbursed and accounted for. In other words, in any county where we find no accounting system, or an inadequate one, we will prescribe corrective

Texas State Tree The Pecan

It'd bet the patriots that make up the Liberty Tree in Houston never doubted their efforts would be celebrated 200 years later.

Throughout those two centuries, trees have played an important role. In addition to raw material for construction and fuel, they have provided shade in places where our forefathers laid the courses of history.

The story goes that the former Governor James Hogg, on the eve of his independence, in 1906, was visiting an old law partner in Houston during that evening, and discussion of death trees, and the Governor made this public statement: "Let my children plant at the head of my grave, a pecan tree, and at my feet, an old fashioned nut tree, and when these trees shall bear, let the nuts be given to the plain people, so that they may plant them and make Texas a land of trees."

That night Governor Hogg died in his sleep. Shortly after his burial in Austin's Oakwood Cemetery, the Governor's wishes were carried out by his children. In 1910, the Texas Legislature proclaimed the pecan as its official state tree.

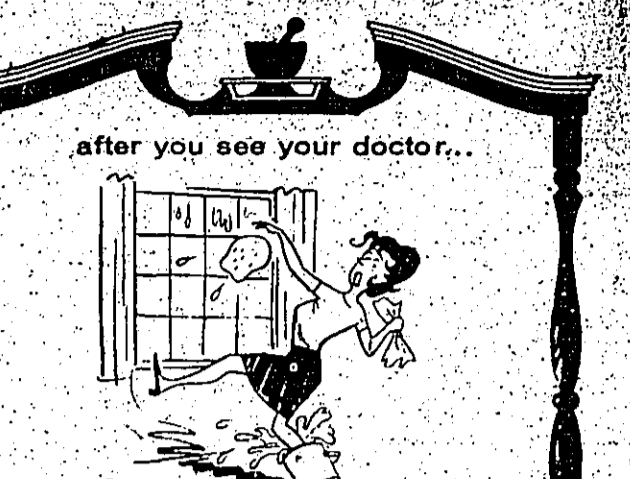

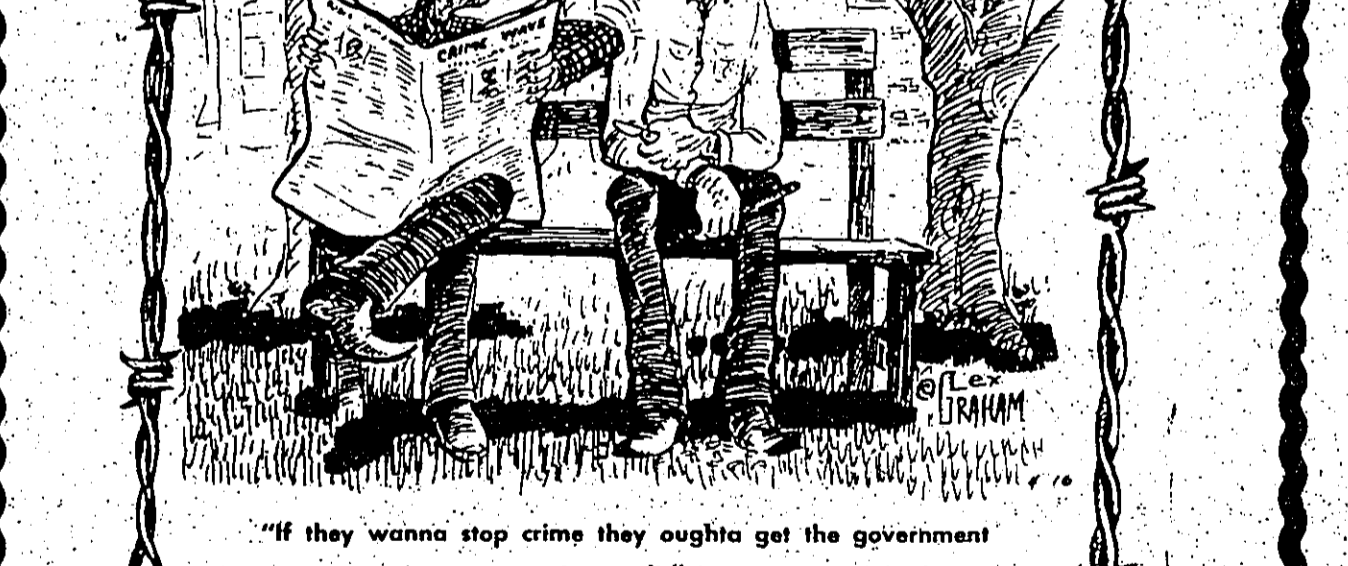
