SPITTERS ASKED TO COMPETE



Voters Asked To Approve Measure

The Woodville Independent School District has released plans for a new high school plant to be built on the Sutton land in west Woodville.

The school board has an option to buy 40 acres of land with an additional option to purchase ten more acres. Agreements have been sign with adjoining property owners for access to the new school grounds and facilities

District officials hope to finance the needed improvements by floating a \$3.1 million bond issue. The voters will be asked to approve the move in an election to be held on September 28.

Five such efforts have failed in previous elections. Woodville schools now have 1,650 students and some of the present buildings are in poor condition. High-School accreditation standards are not now being met in some departments, according to school officials. Details of the bond issue and the arguments for new facilities will be presented in a later edition of the Star.



Mourning dove daily bag and possession limits for both Zones will be 10 and 20 respectively The all-day dove hunting for the winter segments was tried experimentally last season and proved successful and popular enough with hunters that the Commission chose to allow it again this season.

The five-day hunting season for white-winged doves is set for Sept. 4,5,6,11 and 12 with shooting hours from noon to sunset and daily bag and possession limits being 10 and 20 respectively in those counties where whitewing hunting is permitted. A special nine-day season for

ed From The Besmount Enterprize KOUNTZE - A libel suit was filed Tuesday against Kountze News publisher Buddy Moore by Precinct 3 Commissioner Hugh Bevil Means, accusing Moore of damaging Means' career and reputation with an article printed in Moore's newspaper last year.

The action is a countersuit to Moore's petition filed in June, accusing Means of beating Moore up at a commissioners workshop April 25, 1975.

When the men and their attorneys met Tuesday morning so Moore and Means could give statements in Moore's suit, which is set for trial Sept. 7, Means' lawyer, Bob Keith of Beaumont, gave Moore's lawyer, Benton Musslewhite of Houston, a copy of the libel petition filed in 88th District Court.

The petition, Musslewhite said, charges Means was libeled in an April 24, 1975. edition of the Kountze News when Moore wrote that some political observers in Hardin County had mused "certain county officials"-were receiving "alleged kickbacks" on solid waste equipment.

The petition charges Means was libeled by Innuendo and Implication, even though he was not named in the article, Musslewhite said. Means' reputation and career in business and politics were \$10,000, which is the minimum amount for a libel action, the petition says.

The day after the article was printed, April 25, 1975, witnesses said Means beat up Moore in the commissioners courtroom. Moore was taken to the hospital with a broken nose and a dislocated shoulder

Means said at the time the article was





Carter's VP Choice Is **Gilt-Edged** Liberal

Jimmy Carter's selection of Sen. Walter Mondale (D.-Minn.) as his running mate and Carter's repeated emphasis on the "compatibility" of their views suggests that the Democratic ticket this year may be just a shade but only a shade less liberal than the McGovern-Shriver ticket of four years ago.

Carter, as we have pointed out previously, made it clear in his personal statement before the Democratic platform committee that he hopes to push this country to the left domestically (see July 10 issue, page 5). In that statement, Carter came out for a nationwide health insurance program, a guaranteed annual income plan, the Humphrey-Hawkins jobs bill, in-





creased federal aid to education, huge new federal transportation subsidies, new billion-dollar urban programs, a rash of Naderite regulatory agencies, continued busing and abortion-on-demand, standby wage and price controls, a standby system of oil raioning, etc., ad nauseam. In the defense and foreign policy area, Carter wants to expand trade with the Soviets and slash the already under-sized military

If the Plains, Ga., Democrat hasn't lied to us, then the 48-year-old "Fritz" Mondale should suit him to an ideological "T." "At a time when many liberals are finding it expedient to duck for cover," a Wall Street Journal reporter lovingly wrote of Mondale in 1972 when he was running for his second term in office, "he remains outspokenly liberal a leader, for instance, in the fight against legislative curbs on school busing....

Of his liberal credentials, the Journal went on, "there can be no doubt. The son of a small-town Methodist minister, he says concern about poverty and inequality was drilled into him 'over breakfast, lunch and dinner and on weekends to boot."

"Active from high school days on in Minnesota's liberal, programmatic Democratic-Farmer-Labor party, he was named state attorney general at 32 by then Gov. Orville Freeman, and quickly built a reputation as a staunch fighter for consumer protection.

★ Critics of the Reagan bornbshell låst week say there is no difference between Reagan's offering the vice presidency to Richard Schweiker and President Ford handing the job to Gov Nelson Rockefeller, since both Schweiker and Rocky are liberals. But others disagree. In the first place, Ford didn't need Rocky to help him secure a nomination or an election, since he was already President More important. Ford put Rockefeller in charge o the Domestic Council, even though he had never forsaken any of his beliefs in huge, federal spending programs. Reagan, on the other hand, has not promised any major job to Schweiker, and has Schweiker's promise that he'll be selling the Reagan philosophy while in office

* Sen. Jesse Helms (R -N C), who has one of the most conservative voting, records in the upper chamber, not only endorsed the Schweiker pick, but turned up at the Pennsylvanian's first press conference subsequent to his selection to lend him moral

* The publisher of the conservative Manchester Union Leader, William Loeb, broke ranks with Gov Meldrim Thomson for having come out in opposi tion to Reagan. In an editorial titled "too early for the verdict." Loeb implied that Thomson should not have "run off at the mouth" and disavowed the ex-California governor. Loeb said he wasn't overly enthusiastic about Schweiker, but he said more time was needed to see if the selection was a wine political maneuver to secure additional delegate votes

* Gov James Edwards of South Carolina has renewed his commitment to support Ronald Reagan for the GOP presidential nomination, while Sen Strom Thurmond (R -S C), who is also for Reagan. predicted Edwards would join him in opposing Reagan's vice presidential pick at the convention

The idea that a Reagan-Schweiker ticket might work to the GOP's political advantage in the Northeast was bolstered last week when Mrs. Randy Engel, head of the Pennsylvania-based U.S. Coalition for Life-an anti-abortion group with approximately 1,200 affiliated organizations across the nation and abroad-issued a statement to the press pointing out that the Democrats have written the millions of pro-lifers in Pennsylvania and elsewhere out of their party and that Ford's views are equally unacceptable

Speaking "on behalf of pro-life Pennsylvanians" cross the state." Engel said "we will not support the Ford ticket ... and will under no circumstances support the Carter-Mondale ticket." The pro-life leader argued that "Ronald Reagan, who has supported a mandatory Human Life Amendment to the Constitution and Sen Richard Schweiker, who has a very good pro-life record in Congress, offer the only hope of bringing about the national goals of the pro-life movement." In a separate interview, Dr Mildred Jefferson of Boston, head of the National Right to Life Committee, expressed similar views

* The biggest criticism of the Schweiker move from many conservatives is that it doesn't seem to have worked "If Reagan was going to muddy up his political image this way," said one political obne and his operators should have made sure that Schweiker could have brought along the necessary delegates." In fact, the Schweiker move, by appearing cynical, seems to have cost Reagan a number of delegates.

* If, as some argue, Reagan's choice of Schweiker was a crass political move, proof was not long in coming that he is not the lone practitioner of the art among former governors. On the same afternoon as the Schweiker announcement John Connally---who had maintained a stance of strict neutrality as long as he was in the possible running as either candidate's selection for Veep-hurried from Texas to Washington where he huddled privately with, and then endorsed, the only GOP candidate who has yet to pick a running mate

* The latest intended victim of the Ford forces' attempt to stack the GOP convention is actor John Wayne, who charged last week that he had been "disinvited" to the GOP convention But Wayne, who supports Reagan, said he will go to the convention anyway to "speak my piece" for the former California governor

* No sooner had Reagan dropped his Schweiker bombshell last week than a host of GOP lawmakers, including Senators Bob Dole (Kans) and Paul Fannin (Ariz.), denounced the move as, in Dole's words, "an abandonment of Reagan's philosophy." But observers point out that it was these and other conservative senators, such as Tower. Goldwater, Hruska, Brock and Curtis, who abandoned their philosophy when they didn't support Reagan in the first place, thus forcing him to reach out to Schweiker to try to get some additional delegates "So-called conservative opinion leaders who decided at the beginning that the better part of valor was to support the incumbent," said Reagan strategist John Sears, "have little room to talk now."












Jarrott Drug Center is the Walgreen Agency for Woodville.


