### Civic Volunteers Schedule Meeting

A meeting of representatives of Woodville and Tyler County civic and volunteer organizations has been called for Tuesday, September 14 for the purpose of organizing a swine flu vaccine program here. Harry Castleberry of Lufkin, district coordinator of the Volunteer Program will be here to explain the program and assist in organizing the committees and outline the duties of each. Plans call for the vaccine to be administered to as many of the county as possible, once the vaccine arrives.

There is no way possible that private physicians and county-city health unit workers can handle such a large number of people in such a short time without volunteer help from the public.

The following committees will be needed: clerical, transportation, telephone, publicity, recruiting, technical assistance, general and communications. Immunization sites and dates will be announced after the vaccine has been received.

The meeting for organizing to volunteer committees will be held at 5:30 p.m. September 14, in the Community Room at the Citizens State Bank in Woodville. Meeting is open to anyone who wants to help.

Johnston threw a pass to Green for the two extra points and giving the Hawks a one point advantage.

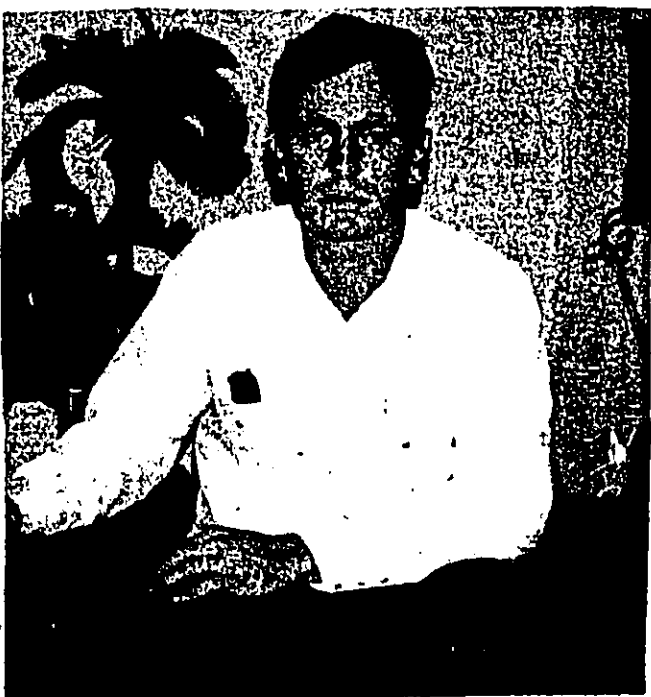

### Baboon hunt in Eastexas?

KILGORE, Tex. (AP) — Rusk County authorities had a suspect in custody Sunday after a six-day reign of terror, ending the county's most intensive baboon hunt.

Baboon hunt? Armed with a large net, four Rusk County Health Department officers and two dove hunters Saturday apprehended Handy, a 140-pound baboon, who escaped last Monday from his owner, Ronald Reagan, a Kilgore businessman.

Handy eluded Rusk County sheriff's deputies, shotgun-toting Kilgore police officers and dozens of vigilantes for six days.

He was responsible for at least one assault and one attempted assault while terrorizing

citizens and dogs as he bounded around this East Texas county, authorities said. Handy was incarcerated at an animal clinic in nearby Henderson.

A sheriff's department spokesman said Handy will probably be sent to Austin to be tested for rabies.

"He scared the hell out of a lot of people," said Kilgore patrolman Charles Rogers. "We received all kinds of calls saying he was everywhere."

"He grew with each call," Rogers added. "One report had him about seven feet tall, weighing 450 pounds and with tusks six inches long."

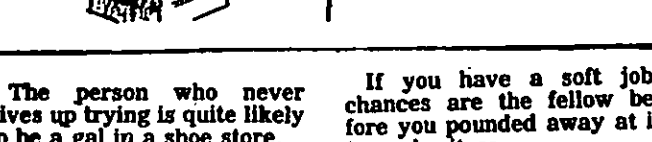

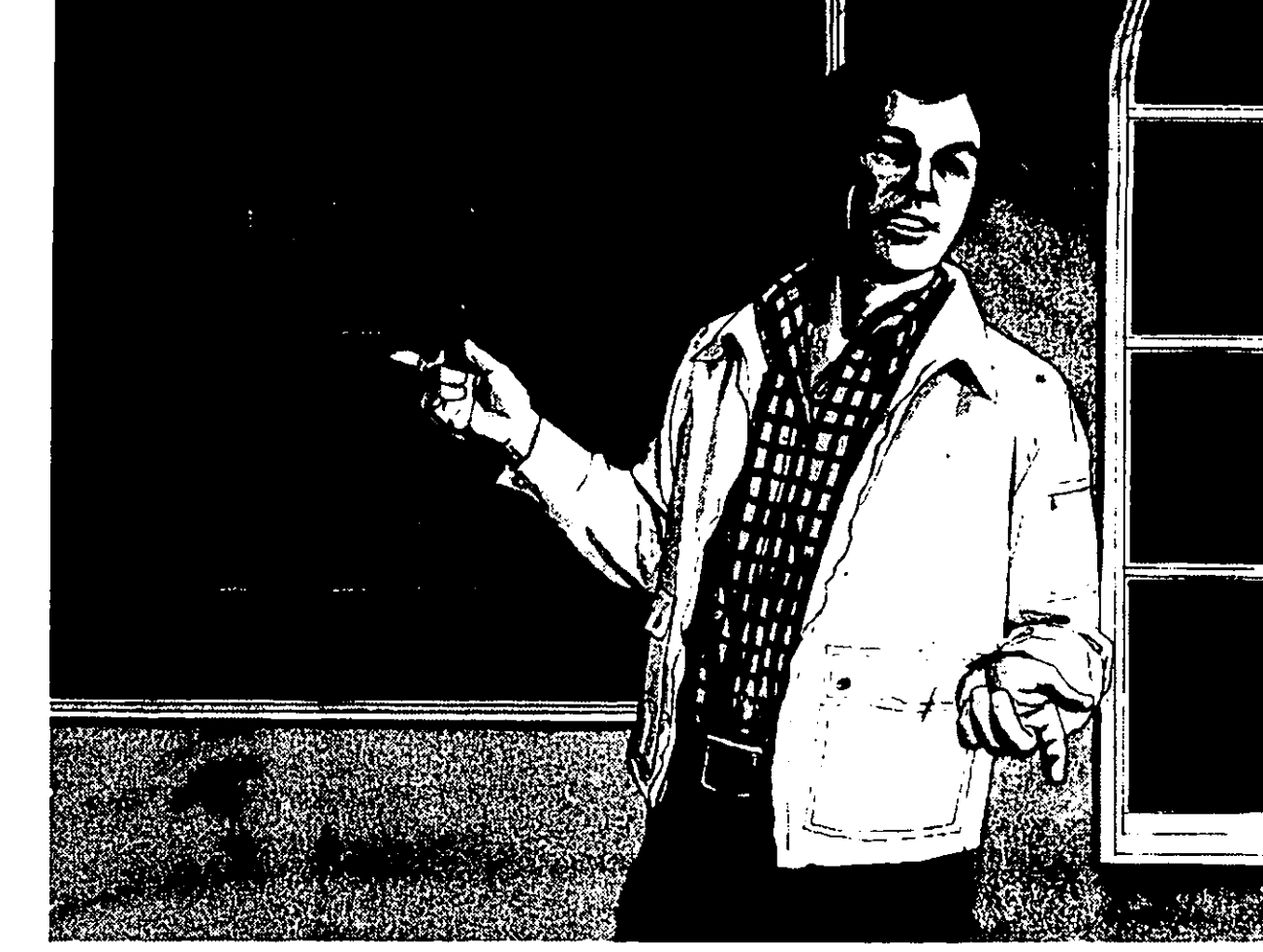
## FAITH LAYS THE FOUNDATION FOR GOOD CITIZENSHIP

**Congressional congratulations**

We periodically castigate members of Congress for their all-too-frequent pay raise antics. And so, to be fair, we must praise members of the House for voting last week against the cost-of-living pay hike they were to receive automatically.

No doubt heavily influenced by the fact that many of them have opposition in the Nov. 2 general election, the lawmakers in their wisdom decided they could make do for another year on their current salary of \$44,600.

The vote also denies raises to federal judges, cabinet members and other top federal officials who also were to receive automatic hikes later in the year.

We really don't care what the House members' motives were. They still deserve a round of applause. Rep. Jack Brooks of Beaumont was one of only 75 members who voted in favor of the pay raises. Rep. Charles Wilson of Lufkin was among the 375 lawmakers who killed the increases.

We think the House action is one of the best arguments we've seen for electing its members for only two years at a time. Under the system, perhaps we can avoid congressional pay raises except in nonelection years.

**Periwinkle thrives**

COLLEGE STATION — The hot summer sun may cause some flowers to wilt and die but not the periwinkle. It actually thrives in Texas' summer weather.

Periwinkles, or vinca roses as they are sometimes called, can be an attractive addition to the summer landscape, says Everett James, landscape horticulturist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. They begin flowering when they are a few inches tall and continue to grow and bloom until the first heavy frost.

Periwinkles come in common or dwarf varieties and produce small-petals-like flowers ranging from white to deep rose in color. The plants have glossy, dark-green leaves.

Common varieties are usually rose colored and are from 18 to 30 inches tall. Dwarf varieties grow from 8 to 10 inches tall and may spread out as much as two feet, notes the Texas A&M University System specialist.

Dwarf varieties work well as edgings for flower and shrub borders and include Coquette, Little Pinkie and Bright Eyes. Spreading and trailing varieties that look especially good in hanging baskets and window boxes or as ground cover include Polka Dot and Rose Carpet.

Plant periwinkles in full sun or partial shade in a soil with plenty of organic matter, suggests James. The best time to plant is after the soil has warmed up, usually around May 15.

**Opponent unfamiliar to Bentsen**

San Antonio (UPI) — Somewhere in the rules of political warfare it probably says that a candidate should know who his opponents are. And if there is such a rule, Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, D-Tex., has broken it.

While campaigning in a crowd Monday at the Meager Hotel, Bentsen offered a warm greeting to Pedro Vasquez and at a news conference later answered one of Vasquez's questions.

Vasquez asked Bentsen if he supported deportation of illegal aliens.

"I certainly do," Bentsen replied, adding that he had supported giving additional federal funds to immigration authorities for controlling the illegal alien situation.

As it turns out, Vasquez is a member of the Socialist Workers party, which opposes deportation, and his name will be beside Bentsen's on the November ballot.

After the news conference Bentsen expressed surprise when told that his political opponent had been there.

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**Indio limits workers to 3 children**

New Delhi — The government of India, continuing its stepped-up birth control program, has ordered government employees to limit the size of their families to three children.

The ruling, an amendment to the civil service conduct rules circulated over the weekend, is part of a major government policy set forth last April, giving top national priority to slowing down the increase in India's population.

With the tacit encouragement of the central government, several states are drawing up legislation providing for the compulsory sterilization of persons who have more than two or three children. In addition, clinics offering vasectomy and cash bonuses for vasectomies are opening up all over the country.

**The Tyler County FISHERMAN**

Hi there, thanks for the cards and letters. Will answer them in the weeks ahead.

Let's get started with pond and small lake fishing. There are three or four ways to attack the fish in ponds. There's TNT or telephoning. But that's not right. We're sports fishermen, not fish hogs. We've got to do it the fun way. (The hard way, that is).

First, we'll fish along the bank. Sitting in one place fishing all day is a no-no. That is, if you want to catch a lot of fish. The same rig you use in creek fishing is all right, except heavier line. Don't use too heavy a line. Let your bait swim a little. Keep moving from shadow spot to shadow spot. This way you will find out where the big ones hang out. And—that is the name of the game.

I haven't said anything about worm fishing, yet. So, we'll get a boat and fish from that for awhile. Worm fishing is worm fishing—bank or boat. When you get in a boat, be quiet, shut up—just fish without a sound. Rig your pole and get your gear close to you. When fishing in a boat—noise scares the fish...even a cough will scare 'em for quite a distance. Dragging your tackle box on the bottom of the boat, banging the oars, hitting the side with your big feet or pole will scare 'em.

The noise of the motor doesn't seem to spook 'em but I like to ease up on a likely spot to fish. Most people don't know where to fish or how to fish a strange place. Ask another person who may have fished there—or ask someone who is there. Most fishermen are very helpful this way.

If you have a pond or lake to yourself, start thinking like a fish—FOOD, SHELTER, TEMPERATURES, etc. "Y'ol will lose some fishing time, but it will pay off. Look the pond over. Use your line and check the depth. Look for sunken trees and bushes in the water—snag places. Fish is shadows of these. Try your water lures, then spinners or deep running lures. No luck? Move to deeper water and use your worms.

Tie off a shallow spot and cast to the deep water. Let it sink to the bottom...take the slack out of the line. Put your pole at a 45 degree angle so you can lower it to give the fish some slack. When you do this let the worm sit in the bottom at least 15 minutes. Then reel 'n—in a stop and go fashion, about five feet and stop for two or three minutes—I mean three or four minutes.

Fish your worm slow. Repeat until it is back to the boat. You are not done yet. Raise the worm off the bottom and jiggle it for a while. Bring it in and cast to a different spot. When a bass grabs a worm they can do it in two ways: They will hit it hard if they do this, hit them hard. See if you can cross their eyes and reel in fast with your pole high. The other way: They will pick up the bait easy, mouth it and move off slow.

You will be able to tell this if your line is tight. Lower your rod easy and let him swim off two or three feet then sock it to him. Reel him in three or four minutes.

Next week—big lake fishing and a little about minnow fishing. I'd like to hear about your fishing methods, too.

Here's Daisy with tips to women—

If your hubby or boyfriend likes to use dirty old worms or stinky old fish for bait—and if he wants you to bait the hook (ugh)—get him interested in using lures. That way, you won't have to handle the ugly stuff. And, you can pick out the cute lures you like.

Y'alls that don't know how to swim and don't like to use a life jacket (they make you look fat, anyway)—and don't like or want to go out in a boat, just stand there and enjoy it. He definitely won't want you in the boat then.

If that doesn't work, talk about football. He'll get excited and talk and talk and talk. In case that don't work, do everything wrong and make a lot of noise. Then, tell him you have to go to the ladies for ten minutes.

If you then find up being thirsty in the lake—make sure you have the life jacket on—sit looking or not.

There are two kinds of fishing where you can make noise and talk. They are drift fishing and trolling. Drift fishing is easy—all you have to do is drag a plastic worm behind the boat and wait for a bite. In trolling you have to use a real worm and spinner. You can use a lure but a worm is best. Use a spinner, longhanded hook and sewing thread. Hook the worm head on the hook and draw it up the shank, then tie the head off at the top, so the body of the worm hangs loose as it will move from side to side in the water. Best love 'n.

Here's a tip—if your fisherman brings home a fish with a muddy taste, here's how to make it taste good. Prepare a fish for cooking; boil water, dump the fish in it. Boil for two or three minutes. Remove. Roll in batter and cook your favorite way. The muddy taste will be gone and a good fish flavor remains. Send us your recipes and I'll 'em out and pass them along. See ya. —Daisy.

**Watching Your Ulcer**

What is the best diet for an ulcer—one that does not add too much weight?

Mr. E. T. Wisconsin Dear Mr. T.: Ulcer diets vary depending on the phase you are in. A severe flare-up of an ulcer may require four weeks of a sloppy diet. This consists of hourly feedings of equal parts of milk and cream for the first few days. Later, other foods are added, all of them being non-irritating and bland. The diet graduates slowly to include cereals, eggs, cream, fruit and vegetables. Emphasis is placed on avoiding fried foods, coffee, spices, coarse cereals, raw fruit, desserts and alcohol.

When persons have recovered from an ulcer attack and are free of symptoms they should remain on a continued bland diet. Feedings should be less at each meal and taken more frequently.

Non-irritating, easily digestible food such as lean meats, spaghetti, strained fruit and vegetables, in addition to milk products, is the best of bland diet. Other foods can be added as tolerated.

The additional intake of creamed foods adds calories which tend to add weight. It is more important to recover from an ulcer than to worry about that weight later. The weight can be reduced when the ulcer is under complete control.

**Cutback in state body eyed**

AUSTIN — The Joint Advisory Committee on Government Operations has recommended that the Texas Legislature trim the size and scope of operations of the Texas Department of Community Affairs.

The 18-member committee, better known as the "Halby-Clayton" or "Little Hoover" commission, is made up of state officials, lawmakers and representatives of business and industry charged with seeking out and recommending economies in state government.

The committee has no power other than to submit its proposals to the forthcoming session of the Legislature backed by a year-long study and review of the functions and spending of state agencies under a mandate of the last legislative session.

The full committee met Friday to consider also adopted its recommendation on the state's health and welfare services including the services provided by the Department of Community Affairs.

Adoption by the full committee is the final stage before the committee turns its recommendations into a report to the legislature.

The subcommittee report said its recommendations for limiting the size and shape of state agency for state and federal funds designated by the governor or the Legislature to assist in community development activities at the local level, would eliminate overlapping and duplicative functions and services between TDCA and existing state and federal agencies and result in a "substantial reduction in staff of TDCA."

In a separate recommendation, which was also adopted by the full committee, it called on TDCA to develop a revised appropriations request for the 1979-80 biennium, taking into account the recommended reductions in operations.

## OIL WILDCATting SET IN SOUTH, NORTHWEST TYLER

Eight miles south of Kirbyville in the southeast Call area of Newton County the Murphy Baxter No. 1 George has been completed at 104 barrels a day through a 7/64-inch choke with a flowing tubing pressure of 1,600 pounds.

The Murphy well is producing from the Wilcox formation perforated at 9,316 feet. In the south part of Newton County west of Deweyville, C.E. Anderson Survey, A-913, the Inxco Oil Co.-Bock and Bacon wildcat is reported flowing an ungauged amount of gas and distillate from the Frio sand perforated at 7,092 feet.

Local d in the C.E. Anderson Survey, A-913, no well is about a mile southwest of the Camptown field.

The Houston Oil and Minerals new wildcat discovery southwest of Beaumont

in the Hildebrandt Bayou area of Jefferson County, J.J. French Survey, A-23, is reported flowing 192 barrels of pipeline oil plus 340 thousand cubic feet of gas through a 5/64-inch choke with a flowing pressure of 3,900 pounds.

Drilled to a total depth of 12,665 feet, production casing was set at total depth and perforations made at 11,238-11,256 feet. The well is located in the "Oak Island" area and Taylor's Bayou is part of the producing unit.

Three miles south of Kountze in Section 355, Hardin County, the Skelly Oil Co. No. 1 Southland Paper has been staked as a 14,500-foot wildcat location.

Northwest of Woodville in the Chester area of Tyler County, the Delta Drilling Co. No. 1 Carter Bros. is a 21,000-foot

wildcat location. This is the deepest proposed test filed in the Woodville area that has been the scene of Woodbine production at the 12,000-foot level.

South of Woodville, in the Warren area of Tyler County in the B.E. Willford Survey, A-1073, the Zinn Petroleum of Houston has filed an application to drill a 9,000-foot Wilcox test.

Hassell Horkan of Beaumont has filed an application to re-enter an old Spindletop well, the No. 1 Marsa McLean, located on the West Port Arthur road on the southwest flank. According to the application the re-entry will be to a depth of 4,200 feet.

Amoco Production Co. of Beaumont has staked a 4,200-foot location on the W.P.H. McFaddin 415-acre tract on the south flank of Spindletop in the Humphries Survey.

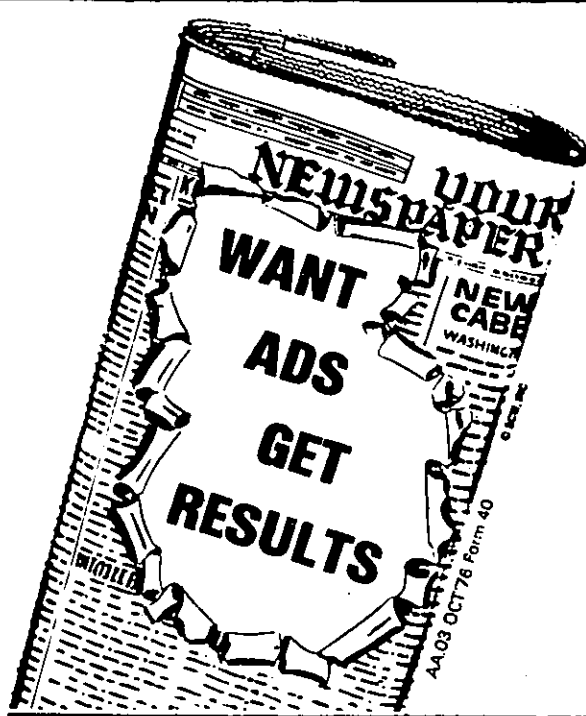

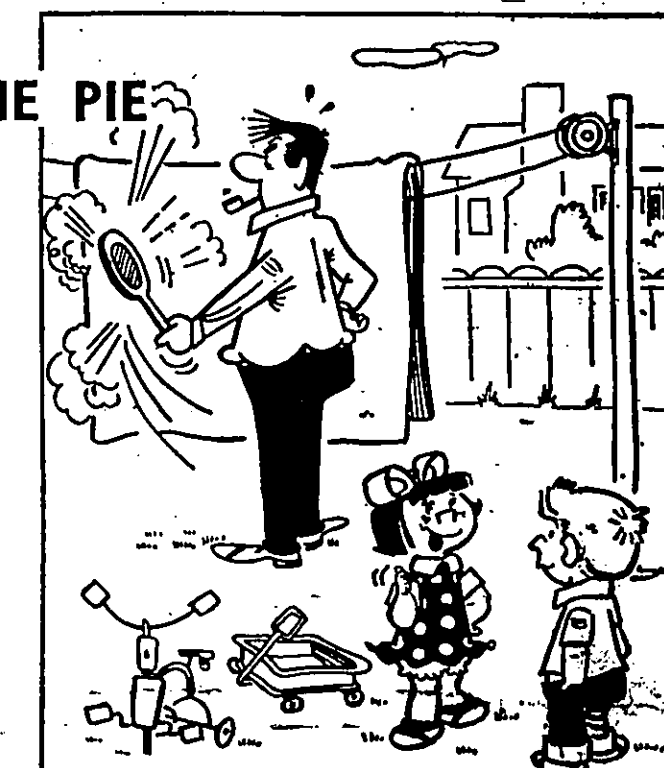

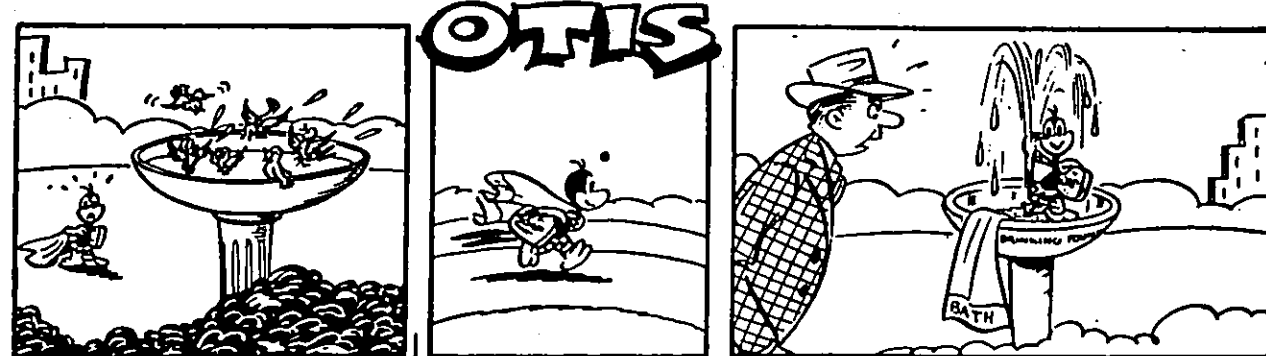
