Genetic Counselor Now In County

The baby seemed normal at birth, he was pink, laughing and beautiful. But later he proved to be the victim of a serious birth defect. He was physically damaged and mentally retarded.

The parents did their best for him but finally the child had to be institutionalized. The parents still yearned for a healthy, normal child. But they dare risk the chance of the same happening again? A few years ago they would have had to make the choice themselves and only after the birth of the second child would they have known if they made the right decision.

It has been recognized that birth defects strike more than 200,000 infants every year in the United States. With genetic counseling, physicians working with the family and genetic clinic, can, in some cases, prevent defects or at least reduce their damaging effects.

But what is genetic counseling? Genetic Counseling provides and interprets medical information based on the expanding knowledge of human genetics, the science of heredity.

Now this service is available to families living in Tyler County.

The Genetics Screening and Counseling Service, operating under the Texas Department of Mental Health Retardation is headquartered in Denton, Texas. The clinic serving our area, Deep East Texas, is located in Lufkin, Texas under the direction of Sandi VanWinkle.

According to Ms. VanWinkle, people who can benefit from genetic counseling are (a) families with known inherited disorders or mental retardation in the family (b) someone with a child suspected of having a disorder (c) someone with a history of repeated miscarriages or spontaneous abortions, and (d) couples with infertility problems.

Not all inherited disorders are apparent at birth. If an inherited disorder is

suspected, testing of the newborn baby, followed by treatment, may prevent the defect or at least reduce the damaging effect the disorder will have on the child," states Ms. VanWinkle.

The fee for Genetic Counseling Service is based on individual family income. There is no charge at all for Laboratory Analysis (tests to determine cause of the

defect). For additional information on this service contact your physician or public health nurse. Or if you prefer, contact Ms. VanWinkle directly. 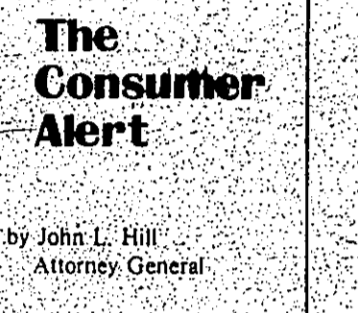

AUSTIN-March 21 was Agriculture Day in Texas, and Tyler County farmers and ranchers can be proud of the \$2,274,000 contribution they make to the economy of their area and the state...

That figure is the amount of cash receipts and government payments in 1975, the most recent figures published by the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Though 1977 may prove to be one of lower profits for agriculture, cash receipts during the year should be substantial. "While stated, production costs have doubled for many regions in the state in the past two years, but overall commodities have been able to stay even with these costs."

Livestock and products in Tyler County were valued in 1975 at \$1,191,000. Crops totaled \$1,083,000.

# Texas Land Commissioner Bob Armstrong Will Crown Dogwood Festival Queen

A royal queen will be crowned in festive ceremonies of the Tyler County Dogwood Festival on Saturday April 2, at 7:30 p.m. in the Dogwood Amphitheater.

Reigning Queen, Jill Crawford of Woodville will pass the crown to one of the lucky princesses who have been chosen by the Kingmen of Tyler County. The Queen's identity is a well-kept secret until coronation and pageant time.

The Dogwood Festival Directors have announced that "Her Royal Majesty", Queen of the 1977 Festival will be crowned by Texas Land Commissioner, Bob Armstrong.

When Armstrong was first elected Land Commissioner in 1970, his goal was to provide wise management of Texas' 22.5 million acres of state-owned land.

"To begin with, we had to start looking at the land as a finite resource, not merely an expendable, revenue-producing tool," Armstrong says. "I wanted to be innovative and to manage the lands."

This philosophy has guided Armstrong in the initiation of new policies for the state's minerals, uplands and coastal ownership.

Armstrong created the first environmental planning division within the General Land Office and directed the first attempts to create manageable blocks of state land in West Texas through land trade legislation.

He initiated the practice of prior review of state-owned tracts up for oil and gas leases to detect possible environmental dangers during drilling and production. This action enabled Texas to hold off shore oil and gas lease sales at a time when the federal government had been enjoined from doing so because of lack of this kind of protective action.

Under Armstrong's leadership, the School Land Board raised the state's royalty income on oil and gas leases from 1/6 to 1/5 of the production. And some tracts are even awarded by royalty bidding. As a result of a cooperative effort with the Attorney General on the "in kind" law suits against major gas producers on state lands, the Land Office is in a position to manage for the first time major gas producers on state lands. some of the state's royalty gas and perhaps sell in areas of the state which my experience natural gas shortages. Of course, income from state oil and gas leases is deposited into the

Permanent endowment for public education in Texas. This fund and the Permanent University Fund has grown from \$1.4 million in 1970 when Armstrong first took office to more than \$2

billion by January of 1976. Armstrong and the General Land Office have been designated, first by Governor Smith and later by Governor Briscoe, to receive federal funds to

create a plan for the orderly development of Texas coastal areas. The Texas Coastal Management Program is one of the most exciting programs in state government today. It's a

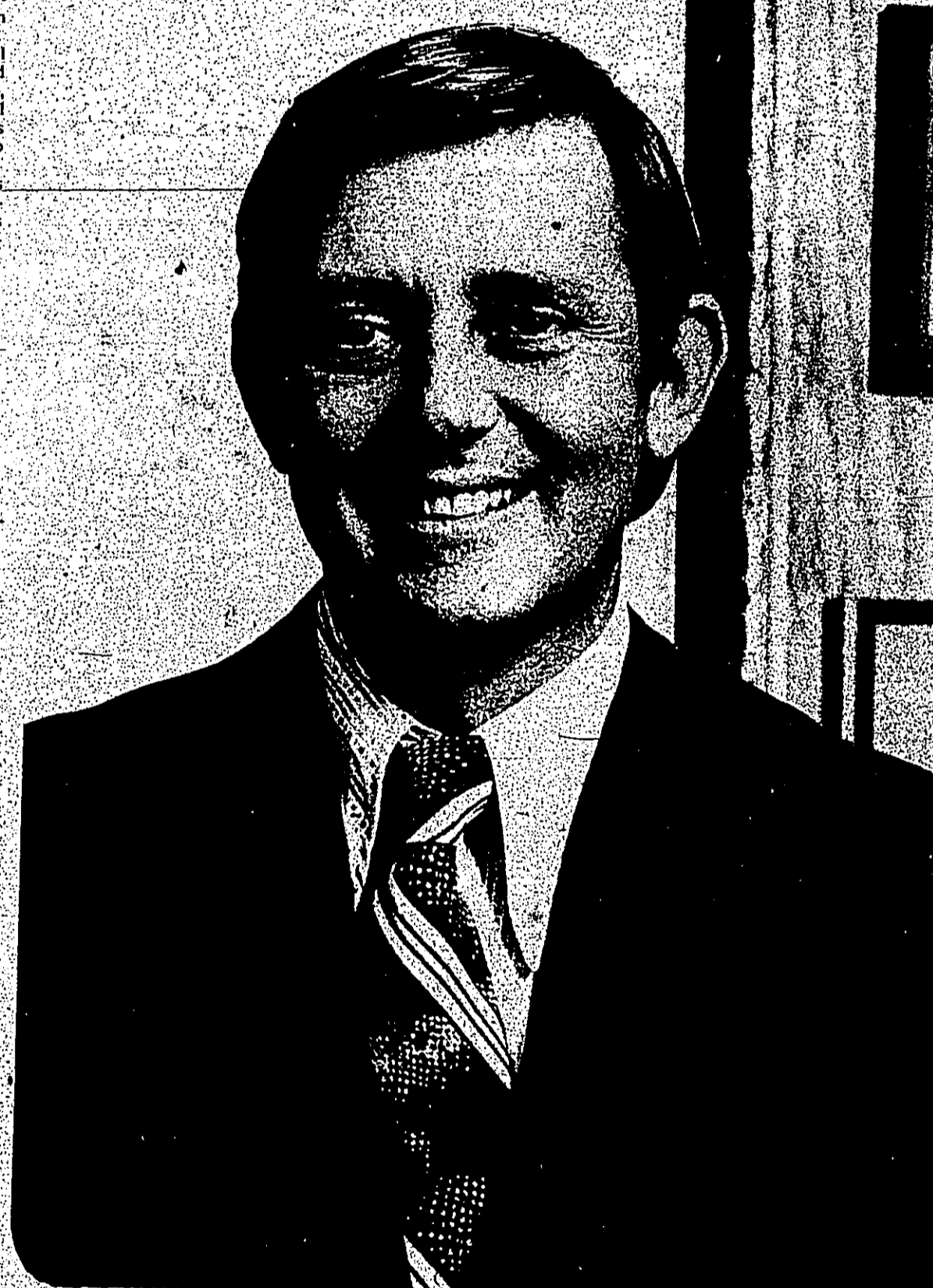
chance to progress and to avoid some real problems," Armstrong says. Legislative recommendations will be available in 1977.

Armstrong's abiding interest in preservation of coastal resources was evident during his three terms as a state representative from Travis County. He was sponsor of the Bay Study Committee's beach bill prohibiting sale of surface rights to submerged lands and requiring permits to dredge sand if the beach is to be affected by dredging. He authored the bill creating the Texas Conservation Foundation. And he was House chairman of Texas for Tax Reform, created to stop a food tax from being added to the 1969 tax bill for Texas. They were successful.

He is an attorney by profession, receiving an LL.B. from the University of Texas School of Law in 1959. He was an ensign in the US Navy from 1953 to 1955.

In 1971 he received one of 200 nation-wide Field & Stream Conservation Awards and in 1969, a Distinguished Service Award from the State Bar of Texas. He was named Outstanding Young Lawyer by the Travis County Bar Association in 1971 and was honorary chairman of the Texas Institute of Architects "Texas: Handle with Care" Campaign in 1972. He is the immediate past president of the Western States Land Commissioners Association, a member of the public land committee of the Interstate Oil Compact Commission, and the Southern Growth Policies Board Advisory Council, the Governor's Energy Advisory Council, the Austin Woods and Waters Club, and the Sierra Club.

Armstrong is married to the former Shannon Harrison of Dallas. They live in Austin with their three children: Marsha Louise, Shannon and Robert Landis Jr. Armstrong is an instrument pilot, rancher and outdoorsman who hunts, fishes, backpacks and enjoys whitewater canoeing.

The CBERs of Tyler County welcome you out-of-town CBERs, and hope you enjoy "The Tyler County Dogwood Festival".

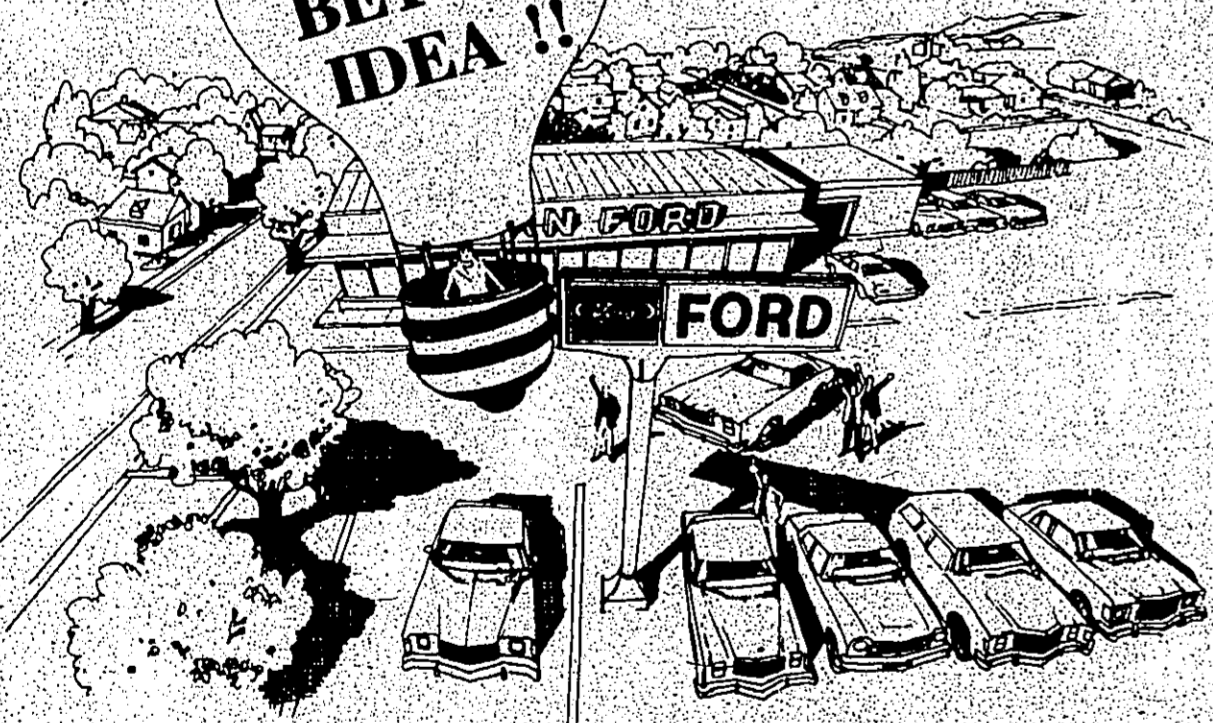

### Price Daniel Sr. Is Mr. East Texas

The Board of Directors of the Tyler County Dogwood Festival has chosen as the 1977 Mr. East Texas, Texas Supreme Court Judge, Price Daniel Sr. of Liberty.

Judge Daniel served three terms as a member of the Texas House of Representatives; was Speaker of the House during his last term; served in the army in World War II; three terms as Attorney General of Texas; four years as United States Senator; and, three terms as Governor of Texas. He has been a Texas Supreme Judge since 1971.

During 1976, Judge Daniel was chairman of the Regional Bicentennial Committee, sponsored by the Atascosita Historical Society for the ten Southeast Texas counties which were carved wholly or in part from the Mexican District of Atascosita. He and Mrs. Daniel also donated 110 acres of land at Liberty as a site for one of the Bicentennial projects.

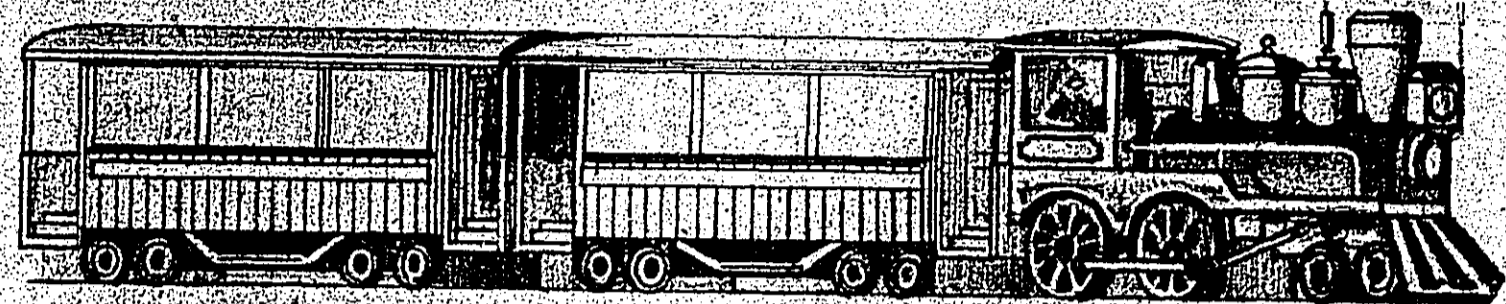
