## Warren Safe Cracked

Burglars entered the Warren High School late Monday night, broke into the Tax Office and got away with approximately \$1280.51 in cash and checks, plus about \$700 worth of postage stamps. Marguerite Dufon, secretary to Tax Office, entered the office around 8 a.m. Tuesday morning to find the room in considerable disorder. She then checked the vault room and found the front of the safe pried off and emptied of the cash bags. Mrs. Dufon said that there was \$931 in cash and \$229.51 in checks. The Tax Office also lost \$130 in petty cash. The burglars also took about \$300,000 in non-negotiable bank certificates of deposit. Two cigar boxes containing loose change belonging to the school cafeteria were left behind.

The burglars then evacuated the building the same way that they entered. The incident happened something between 11 p.m. Monday and 8 a.m. Tuesday morning. Adolph Hryhorchuk, superintendent of the Warren I.S.D., said that the school was empty at approximately 10:45 p.m., after a school board meeting was adjourned, and until 8 a.m. when Mrs. Dufon arrived at work the following morning. Deputies dusted the area for finger prints. Mrs. Dufon, who has worked with the Warren I.S.D. for 15 years said that since her employment in 1963 there have been three break-ins. Sheriff Department could give no subject information now as the investigation procedure continues. Superintendent Hryhorchuk said following the 8 a.m. discovery that it looked "Like it was done by professionals."

## Question Exists On School Board Telephone Polling

The Woodville Independent School District Board of Trustees may be in violation of the Texas Open Meetings Law following an eight party telephone poll conducted by Superintendent Tom Linnam and held on the afternoon of Tuesday, April 26, for the purpose of discussion of the awarding of a \$18,533 electrical contract which was tabled at the April 19 regular meeting of the board.

According to the Attorney General's office both of those "public awareness" requirements need to be established before a school board call meet. The Attorney General's Opinion states that the activity could be a "clear violation" which could result in the bid becoming jeopardized and thereby being voidable.

Linnam said Tuesday afternoon that "as far as I'm concerned the bid's already been awarded." Linnam added to that statement; however, that a meeting would be held tomorrow (Wednesday, May 3) at 7 p.m. to finish beating this horse to death, and said further that "if a telephone meeting is not legal then we'll take this opportunity (Wednesday, May 3) at 7 p.m. to make the action legal."

Linnam told THE BOOSTER that the contract was still being typed and although general agreement had been reached through the telephone conversation on April 26 and in what he described as "instructions" during the April 19 meeting, that it

Linnam said "All I record in the minutes of the meeting is the action that the board takes, not discussion."

The contract won't be sent till after the Wednesday meeting," Linnam said.

Linnam said he was told to get an evaluation from Architect Jack Stanbury, inform the board, then apparently notify the bidder.

Linnam said "was unworkable" said that she was reached and was not asked her opinion on the propriety of authorizing the bid, only that it had been researched by Linnam and attached to the minutes.

According to Woodville Superintendent, Tom Linnam no provision was made to alert the public by posting notice of the meeting (as is provided in the Texas Open Meetings Law) and according to Linnam in no way was the public made aware of the meeting or taken by surprise.

**Mental Health Concept Changing**

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** The following is the first of three parts of a series on mental health care in Texas. The series is prepared by the Deep East Texas Regional Mental Health Association. Services as part of the observance of National Mental Health Month in May.

Using a national scale, the 13 county area served by Mental Health Regional Retardation, the number of persons needing counseling would be an estimated 25,000 persons out of the population of 250,000 people.

At the present time 2,266 persons have received counseling at the five mental health outpatient clinics. The cost of counseling at the MHMR facilities is determined by the income of the family involved and is on a sliding fee scale.

The scale ranges from the lowest of the scale to a family paying the full cost of the services rendered.

Cost of the services for the client is based on the cost of the service to the agency.

Martin cited the example of a family of six whose income is \$4,800 and pays 10 percent of the agency's cost. This means that for individual counseling, which costs the agency \$25, the cost to the family is \$1.25 per counseling session.

**Dates Set For Beef Referendum**

# Jim Browder REPORTS

AUSTIN—The Committee Substitute for House Bill 750, the school finance bill, passed the House of Representatives after five days of intense debate. During this time, over 100 amendments to the bill were proposed. CSHB 750, as it passed, is basically in the same form as the committee's proposal. It has been sent to the Senate for their action on this bill.

CSHB 750 will cost the state about \$95.4 million over the next two years. This bill also increases the state share of financing the Foundation School Program from 75% to 85%. To do this, the state will increase its share of funding for maintenance and operations, transportation, personnel, drivers' education, special education, and equalization aid. In return for the increase in state aid, districts would be required to increase their local property tax rates at the 1977-78 levels and to reduce taxes according to a prescribed formula for the 1978-79 year. There was strong opposition to this provision by those who felt that this money should be used for increased equalization aid rather than for a tax reduction. While I support provisions that would improve equalization, I strongly believe that our property owners are overburdened with school taxes and desperately need some relief.

CSHB 750 does not include any salary increases for teachers. Attempts were made to add such a provision, but failed to be included because of a point of order. No finance bills can be considered until after the 12th day of the Legislative Session unless the bill is designated as an emergency by the governor. Although the governor had designated the school finance bill an emergency, his designation did not include the issue of a teacher's pay raise. A separate bill, CSHB 1597, providing for a 7.5 million increase in teacher salaries, has been reported favorably out of the House Committee on Public Education and will come before the House for debate after we have finished with the Appropriations Bill. I strongly support a pay increase for our teachers.

The debate on CSHB 750 is not over yet. Over the Senate passed its version of the school finance bill. It will have to go to a conference committee which will be composed of members from the House and Senate. Their job will be to try to work out a compromise on any differences between the House and Senate versions of CSHB 750.

I appreciate the interest and support from the many people who called and wrote to me about their views on this bill. I am confident that, overall, CSHB 750 is a bill that will benefit District 16. I hope that all of you will continue to share your views with me on the many major issues that are still before the House. My address is P.O. 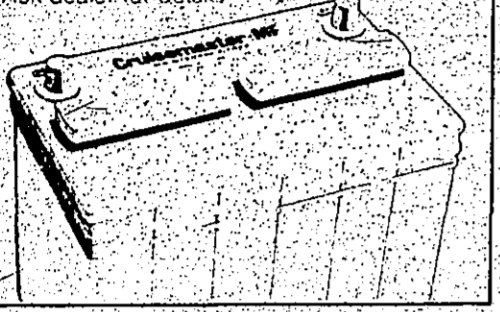
