### Manhunt Subject Caught Tuesday In Teargas Arrest

An early morning tear gas apprehension of Michael Joe Ellis, 21, the subject of an intensive manhunt by Woodville Police authorities ended when Texas Rangers plus the Liberty County Sheriff's office and the Cleveland Police Department collared the man at a Cleveland residence.

Ellis was armed at the time of his arrest with a 9-shot .22 cal. revolver and was in the company of Larry Horton, also of Cleveland, and who is believed to have helped Ellis evade Tyler County and Woodville city authorities after Ellis had reportedly fired several rounds at City Politician Jim Reid.

Charges of Attempted Capital Murder were filed in Woodville following the incident and a bond totaling at least \$250,000 against Ellis was expected at press-time Tuesday night.

Ellis was arraigned in Cleveland, then transported to the Woodville City Magistrate Thomas E. Phillips. He then was to be transported to Lufkin for another arraignment for felony escape charges and habitual criminal charges. He was reportedly under indictment for car theft when he escaped from Lufkin authorities about two months ago.

Ellis tried to "skirt" the Hwy. 190 and U.S. 69 intersection but alert WPD Officer Jim Reid noticed a tailgate lowered, apparently to cover the trucks license plate. He then began pursuit...

County Builder's Discount. Reid said Ellis got out then jumped back in and sped north toward Doucette but not before Reid emptied his revolver at the tires of the vehicle. Officers said one bullet hit its mark causing a tire to "snap" off the truck when it reached Doucette where Reid encountered return fire from Ellis who had been traveling with a 16-year-old juvenile girl who was hunched down on the floorboards of the truck during the gunfire.

Reid said Ellis then made off into the woods resulting in Huntsville bloodhounds to be called in to assist in the search.

No leads were discovered until the truck was reported missing in Colmesneil. Ellis was subsequently spotted in Huntington in the same truck. He was not seen again until the arrest Tuesday morning in Cleveland.

The juvenile girl currently being held by Tyler County authorities is being held for theft in Hardin County and "Accessory to Attempted Capital Murder in Tyler County."

### Vehicle Knocks Down Telephone, Utility Poles

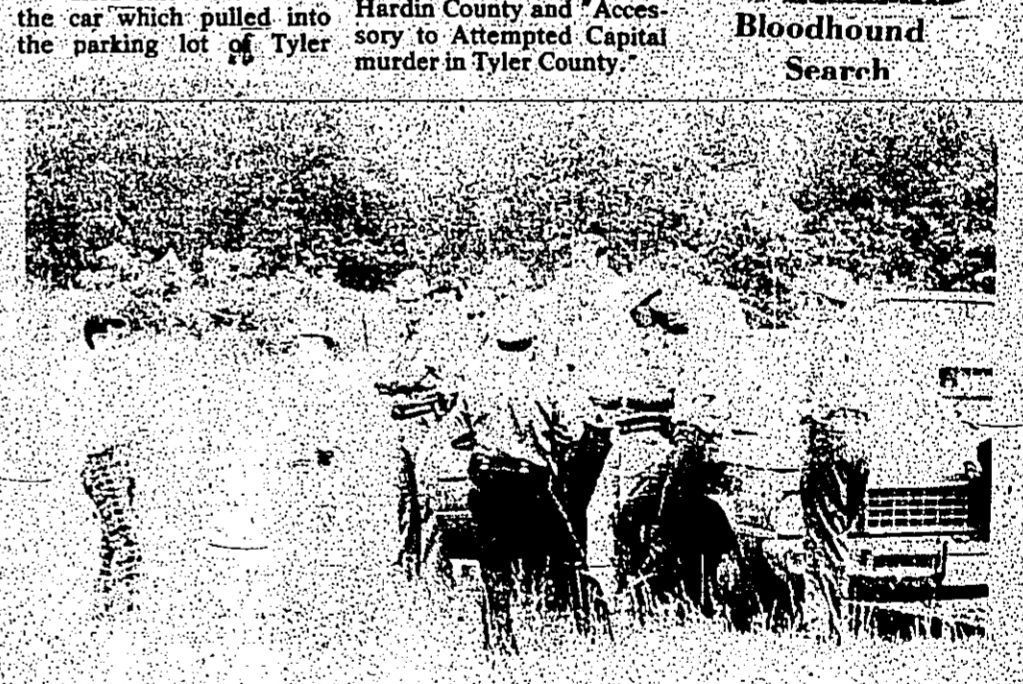
Two power line poles and approximately 1,000 feet of power and phone cables were pulled down early Monday morning on Tower Bluff Road.

Southwestern Bell Telephone authorities theorize that a log truck, possibly loaded too high, was going east on FM 1746 when the vehicle caught the wires which crossed above the road. The vehicle was moving so fast, company officials said that one of the poles were broken into three pieces.

When telephone workmen arrived at the scene, wire and cable were lying across the road and one of the poles was obstructing traffic flow.

The incident occurred sometime between 7 and 8 a.m. when the phone company was notified of some lines being down.

Workmen from both the power company and phone company were busy all day getting the lines, cables and poles in temporary working condition.

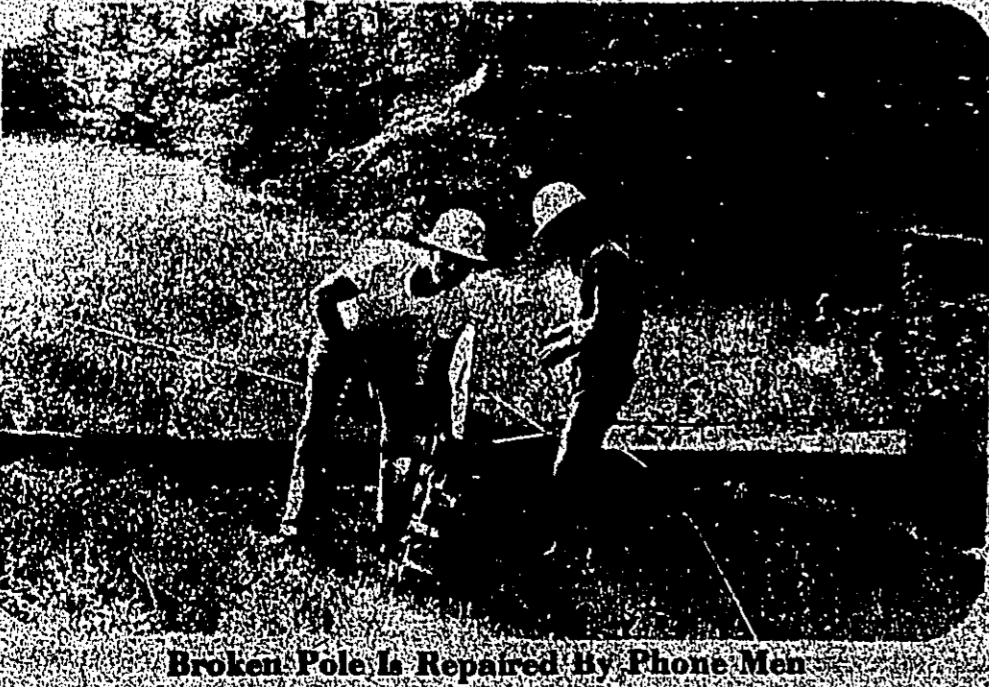

books. Also from 10:30-11:15 a.m. each Tuesday beginning June 14, the state library will sponsor a "Read and Earn" program. Students interested in this project





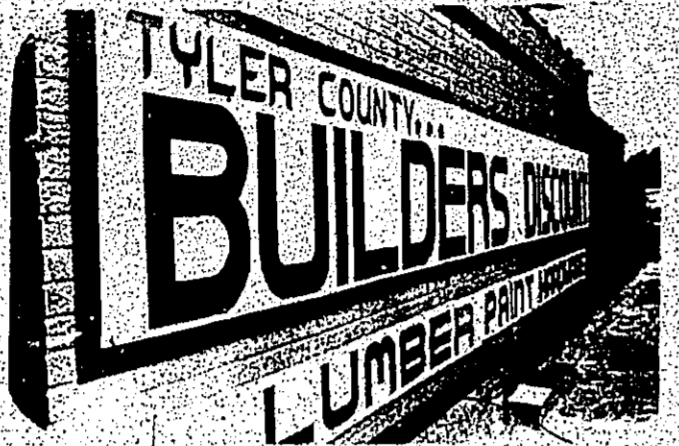
