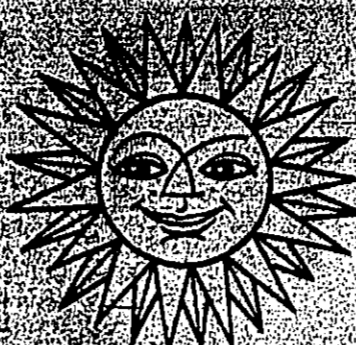

Rate Hearing Soon

The Woodville City Council voted Monday to hire a special attorney to uphold the city's position regarding a recent gas rate increase to the Southwestern Gas Distribution Company of Raywood which serves some 150 customers in the Doucette area.

Southwestern's argument with the City of Woodville according to Company President John Newman is that, "Woodville refuses to recognize that Doucette gas is Doucette gas," and says further that "We would be dedicating to the people of Doucette if we did not oppose this rate increase."

Newman said that his company "Which is a very small distributor" receives services from Woodville which include shipping gas "only 60 feet, metering it then odorizing the fuel."

Newman predicted that his company would have to pass on every penny of whatever rate hike might result from the Railroad Commission hearings after challenging his company's challenge to the rate making structure in Austin.

City Judge Sworn In

Carl Phillips was sworn in last Tuesday as the new City Judge. He replaced his father, T.E. Phillips who had to retire due to an auto related back injury.

Woodville has claimed this far "And very effectively" Newman said, that the Commission did not have jurisdiction in the case because it felt that Southwestern was an industrial or commercial user and not of a residential classification.

Newman said, "We're not just another sawmill." The railroad commission determined Monday that it did have jurisdiction and would hold hearings on the validity of Southwestern's rate appeal soon.

The gas system, which was purchased from the W.N. Christian Brothers in 1969 has not had a rate increase since 1974 according to Newman.

"We're now selling gas to Doucette at a loss," Southwestern Gas Distributing supplies the communities of Raywood, Devers, Nome, Hull, Dolen, Banquette and Doucette.

Newman said his firm appealed to the Commission "for help on the question." The hearing which was originally set for July 21 was postponed according to City Attorney Josiah Wheat.

"Until both sides can prepare their material," Wheat said the Attorney representing Woodville at the hearings would be Railroad Commission hearing specialist Frank Youngblood, of Austin.

Newman said his firm takes the position that it should be allowed to tap a nearby Tennessee Gas Line which would then provide it's own metering and odorizing system. He said this would cost in the neighborhood of \$3,000. He said also, however

that because of recent Federal rulings that "There's a whole lot more explaining to do in getting the request granted." He said the Tennessee Gas pipeline lies only 50 feet away from his system.

"Why should we pay \$10,000 a year for what we can do for less?"

"The Woodville increase is unfair, arbitrary, and all those other words," he said. Newman indicated that the Railroad Commission would cancel their hearing on the matter if the two parties can agree and settle the rate question out of court.

Newman said his rate findings process conducted by the Railroad Commission

would be costly to both sides and, "We hope to settle between ourselves."

Property Update Study Tabled

Tyler County Commissioners Court acted Friday to table "for further study" a property updating program at an estimated cost to set up the program of between \$5,000 and \$10,000, according to County Judge Allen Sturrock.

Adams To Speak In Woodville June 24

State Senator Don Adams will be the principal speaker at the regular monthly meeting of the Deep East Texas Development Association. This meeting will be held at the Woodville Inn, on June 24th, at 10 a.m. The DETDA members will hear several important reports made by committee chairman and also reports from the State and Federal Agencies from the eight counties in this Association.

Senator Adams began his political career in 1968 when he was elected to the Texas House of Representatives. After four years in the house, in 1972, he was elected State Senator for District Three. Senator Adams was re-elected without opposition in 1974.

As a house member, Adams served on a wide variety of Committee assignments including areas like insurance, agriculture, criminal jurisprudence, mental health and mental retardation and common carriers. His second term as a house member included added committee duties in the areas of motor transportation, counties, enrolled and engrossed bills, and he was chairman of the house subcommittee which considered all local bills.

Adams began his first term as a Senator with the

appointment as vice-chairman of the Senate administration committee. He was also a member of the Senate jurisprudence and intergovernmental relations committees and the rules subcommittee.

Adams' second term as Senator included his most important appointment. He was made Chairman of the Senate Administration Committee, which oversees the entire day to day operation of the Texas Senate, its employees, and payroll. During the session the administration committee has the all important task of assigning bills to the local and uncontested calendars. At present, Adams also serves on the Finance Jurisprudence and Texas Constitution Committees as well as the subcommittee on rules and civil matters.

Outside the political arena, Adams has served as Secretary-Treasurer of the Angellina County Bar Association; Secretary-Treasurer of the First Judicial District Bar Association; First Vice President of the Jasper Kiwanis Club; First Vice President of the Jasper Chamber of Commerce; President of the Methodist Men's Organization of the First United Methodist Church of Jasper; Member of the Board of Stewards of the First United Methodist Church of Jasper. In 1970,

Adams was honored with a testimonial tribute from the Texas Firemen's and Fire Marshalls' Association for his work in the Firemen's pension field. In 1971, he was honored by the State Bar of Texas and the Vocational Agriculture Teachers for supporting legislation on their behalf. In 1973, he was again honored by the State Bar, and in 1975, he was honored by the Vocational Homemaking Teachers Association of Texas.

In 1972 Adams was named the Outstanding Young Man of Jasper, Tx. The same year, he was selected by the Texas Jaycees as one of the five outstanding young men in Texas.

Adams received his education in the Jasper Public School System, Schreiner Institute and Baylor University. He graduated from Baylor University Law School summa cum laude in 1963 and was admitted to practice law that same year.

Just recently Adams was unanimously elected President Pro-tempore of the Texas Senate.

Corps Permit Phase III Program To Begin

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will begin Phase III of the Section 404 Permit Program on July 1, 1977. This will require that a permit be secured prior to discharge of dredged or fill material into all waters of the United States. Colonel John P. Wall, district engineer of the Fort Worth District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, has announced that Phase I required a permit for discharge into coastal waters, inland navigable waters of the United States and nearby wetlands. It has been in effect since July 25, 1975. Phase II, which went into effect September 1, 1976, required a permit for the discharge of such material in primary tributaries of inland navigable waters, nearby wetlands and lakes of more than five surface acres.

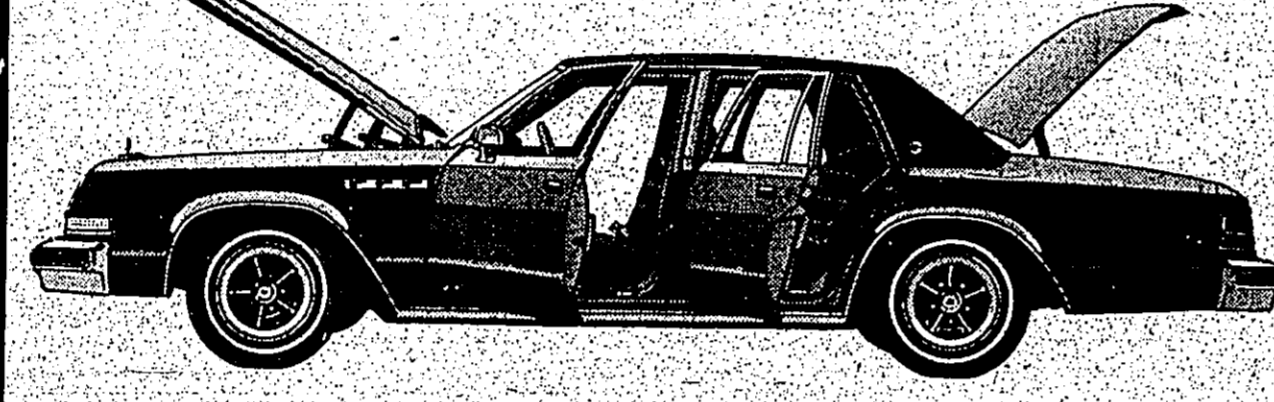
