Steel Firm To Locate In Woodville

Bringing with it an anticipated payroll of over \$600,000 in its first year of operation, the Levingston Shipbuilding Company of Orange has announced it's intent to locate a rolled steel pipe fabrication plant in Woodville with initial operations starting targeted for January, 1978.

The plant, which will locate about two miles north of Woodville on a tract of land held by the Tyler County Industrial Corporation, will employ some 40 persons at

startup time and according to Plant General Manager Dave Hardin, projected estimates of employee needs call for a gradual build up to about 150 workers by the end of the first two years of operation.

Levingston Shipbuilding which is a division of Ashland Oil, Inc. of Ashland, Kentucky is involved in fabrication of a wide variety of vessels and marine structures. Levingston was acquired by Ashland, Inc. in September, 1975 and has maintained high

operating levels through 1976. The company had an operating income of \$3.3 million compared with \$1.1 million the previous year.

Key factors in helping to complete local negotiations with the corporate prospect are F.M. (Polv) Archer, president and Herbert Sutton, vice president of the Tyler County Industrial Corporation and Attorney Secretary Treasurer Harry Stafford. The officers of the Corporation have been very complimentary of cooperative efforts in joining with the

Woodville City Council, the Tyler County Commissioners Court and Chamber of Commerce and Woodville Independent School District in combining efforts locally to provide information an assistance to the incoming industry.

According to General Manager Hardin, "We really picked Woodville because it was centrally located to our market areas in Dallas, Houston and Louisiana. And," he said, "we're also convenient to the Shipyard

operation in Orange."

The industrial building to be built on the approximate 40 acre site which is adjacent to the Southern Pacific Railroad tracks will be 60' x 500'.

The plant will be operated mostly on electrical energy.

Hardin said the company will be hiring metal trades types of employees such as burners, welders, heavy roll operators and press brake operators. Persons interested in employment with the company are asked to write Dave Hardin, P.O. Box 968,

Orange, Texas 77630.

Hardin said he was appreciative of the local assistance generated to interest Levingston in locating in Woodville. "They have answered a lot of questions and shown us around alot." Everyone has been very receptive and most cooperative and we're looking forward to becoming a part of your community."

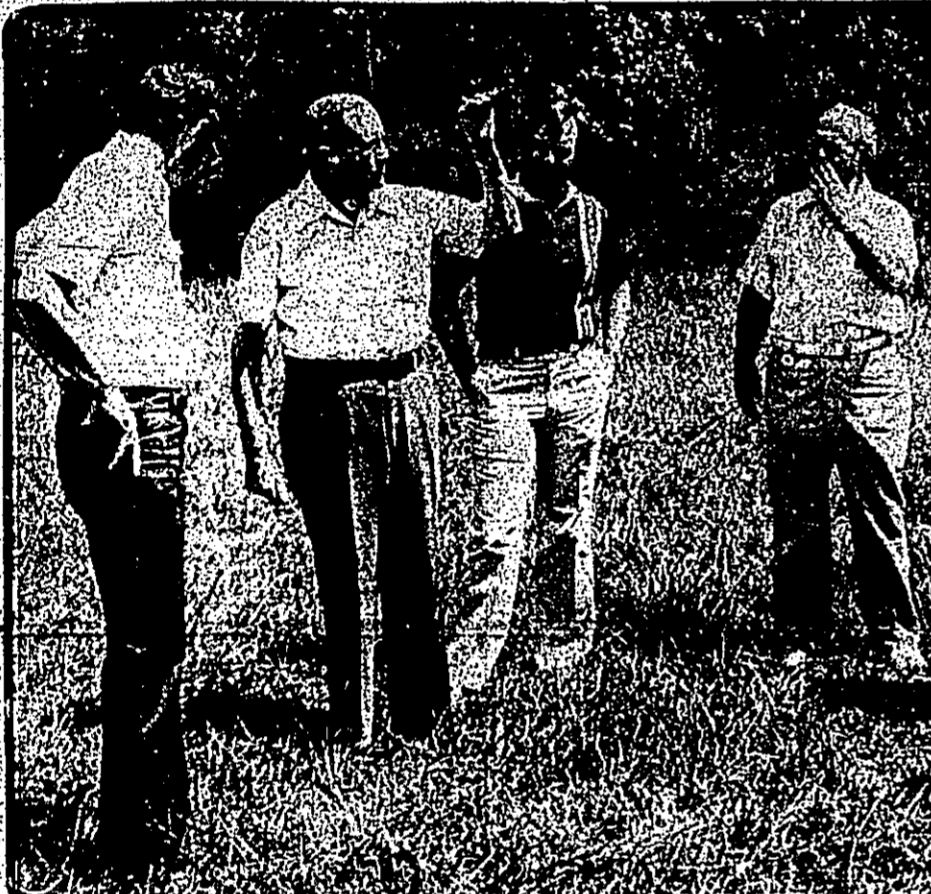
Hardin said the operation would start on a one shift basis and would soon work toward a two shift

work level.

Some clients of the large steel fabricating firm are: Southwestern Fabricators of Houston; Texas Pipe Bending Company; Capital Pipe and Steel; Standard Pipe Systems and Standard Pipe and Supply in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Hardin indicated that after the first two years of operations that the company would be looking toward possible expansion of their product line which could lead, he said, to considerable more employee needs.

Hardin, who was in Woodville Thursday with the Assistant General Manager for the Woodville Plant, Ken Ballard looking over the site indicated earlier that the Ashland Oil, Inc. corporate decision could have come somewhat earlier but due to the July 4 holiday the decision had to be postponed one week. Hardin said, there are still a few minor contract details to be finalized and a few things left to be covered but no reason that the deal shouldn't go through."

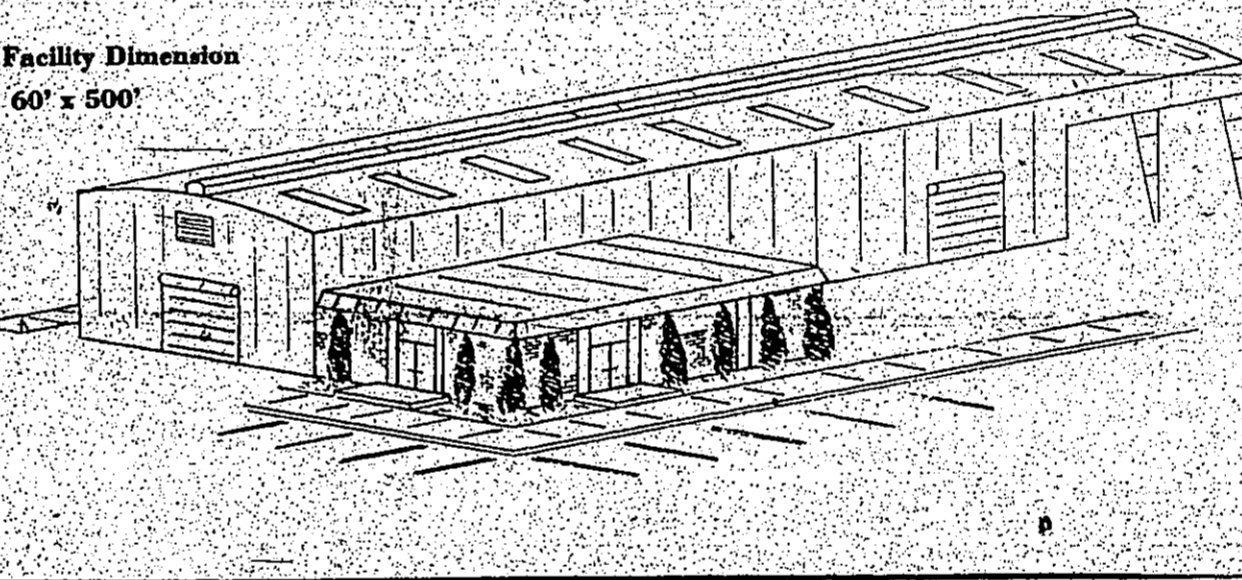

Browder Favors House Bill One

Governor Dolph Briscoe

Monday presented a joint meeting of the House and Senate general guidelines for writing a \$900 million dollar school finance bill. Briscoe stressed, "This special session is for the public schools of Texas and for the children who must attend those schools. They must be first in our attention during this special session. It is my belief that the people of Texas expect swift action on the educational bill. I pledge my support for this cooperative effort to address this issue with all deliberate speed so that the purpose of this session can be achieved in the shortest possible time."

Briscoe encouraged lawmakers to decrease local school district share of operating costs from the current level of \$500 million dollars a year to \$400 million a year or less.

He also recommended a teachers salary raise and a pay boost for other school employees totaling about \$300 million dollars.

Two versions of the school finance legislation had been pre-filed in the House.

According to Tyler County Representative Jim Browder, "Right now, we've got House Bill 1 pertaining to education, we also have House Bill 3 pertaining to education. Basically, the two bills are very similar, the difference in the bills being the local fund assignments.

Equalization aid going into our district," Browder continued, "On House Bill 1 your local Tyler County Fund assessments are lower and the equalization aid goes primarily into the lower income or lower taxable districts, the ones that have less ad valorem property to tax. House Bill 3 increases the equalization aid past the districts that House Bill 1 does and includes some of the larger districts such as Houston, Dallas and Austin."

"Being from a more rural area I would look to House Bill 1 with more favor," Browder explained. "The net to my district with House Bill 1 puts more dollars in there and less cost to tax payers."

Senator Adams was optimistic that school finance legislation would pass within two weeks. Adams felt "The most beneficial thing that could happen for Tyler County land East Texas generally is to use the agricultural values in determining what local funds assessments are as opposed to using the values that are promulgated on a fair market value basis, because when you use the lower agricultural values it means more in state aid to the individual school districts that do not have large industry tax bases."

Since the Senate bill introduced Monday uses a mixture of fair market and agricultural values," Adams said. "We're already half way home." Adams pledged his support in amendment to use one hundred percent agricultural values.

Discussion also took place Monday proposing a joint session Friday to hear evidence concerning State Supreme Court Justice Don Yarborough's alleged misconduct.

Arson Probe Still On



Investigator Vardeman and Fire Marshal Cook with Evidence

"If there is someone in Tyler County that likes to see school buildings burn, then we are in trouble," said Woodville's Fire Marshal, Alva Cook, in reference to the July 4 fire that destroyed 12 classrooms at the Kirby High School in Woodville.

Cook, in an afternoon press conference held July 7, stated that State Arson Investigator, Don Hicks had come to Woodville after city officials had called State Fire Marshal Norwell Carey in Austin, requesting aid in determining the cause of the fire.

After some 10 hours of clearing debris from the school's three main "hot spots," areas where the roof was also burned, Hicks advised that there was "definitely arson involved."

"It is obvious that some type of liquid was thrown on the floors of the speech room, the principles office, and then in the janitor's closet," stated Cook, adding "We have taken samples of the floor areas and sent them to the Department of Public Safety laboratory in Waco and we expect results of the tests in two to four weeks."

Officials speculate that the liquid used was "duplicating fluid a substance found in most schools which is water soluble and able to ignite, leaving plenty of time for the fire to get started and the arsonist to get away."

At this time city officials have no suspects and no leads as to who might have started the fire. Woodville City Police Chief Gary Mattingly said "Any information will be helpful and several rewards are being offered for information that might lead us to the person or persons who started the fire." Under the city ordinance, in effect a \$250.00 reward is offered for the arrest and conviction of the arsonist.

reward the individual with the information must testify in a court of law. The Woodville Independent School District, however, and the insurance company have posted rewards of \$250.00 each for information leading to only the arrest of the suspect with no testimony involved. "These two rewards totaling \$500.00, have no strings attached," stated Mattingly.

Since the beginning of the 76-77 school year, there have been three arson attempts on the Kirby High campus. Luckily the other two were caught in time before any damage was done," said Cook. One of the attempts was at the beginning of the school year at the Junior High. Principle J.C. Clark found the fire in one of the restrooms and extinguished it himself. The other incident happened in February 1977, in the school auditorium. The auditorium had been closed for the day, when someone entered the mens restroom and set fire to the paper towel roll. "A janitor checking the premises for one last time before leaving the building smelled the smoke and called the Woodville fire department. Fortunately no damage was done."

Fire and Police officials do not directly connect these incidents to the recent fire but are looking into all possibilities.

In the past 2 years there have been 12 school buildings in an area triangularly described as point one of Woodville, going from Silas to Jasper and from Jasper to Silas, which have been arson attempts. "We have only had three successful arson attempts in this time. Officials believe that there is a good chance the same person or persons started these fires."

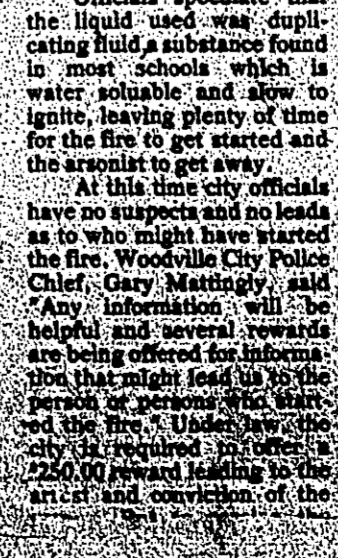

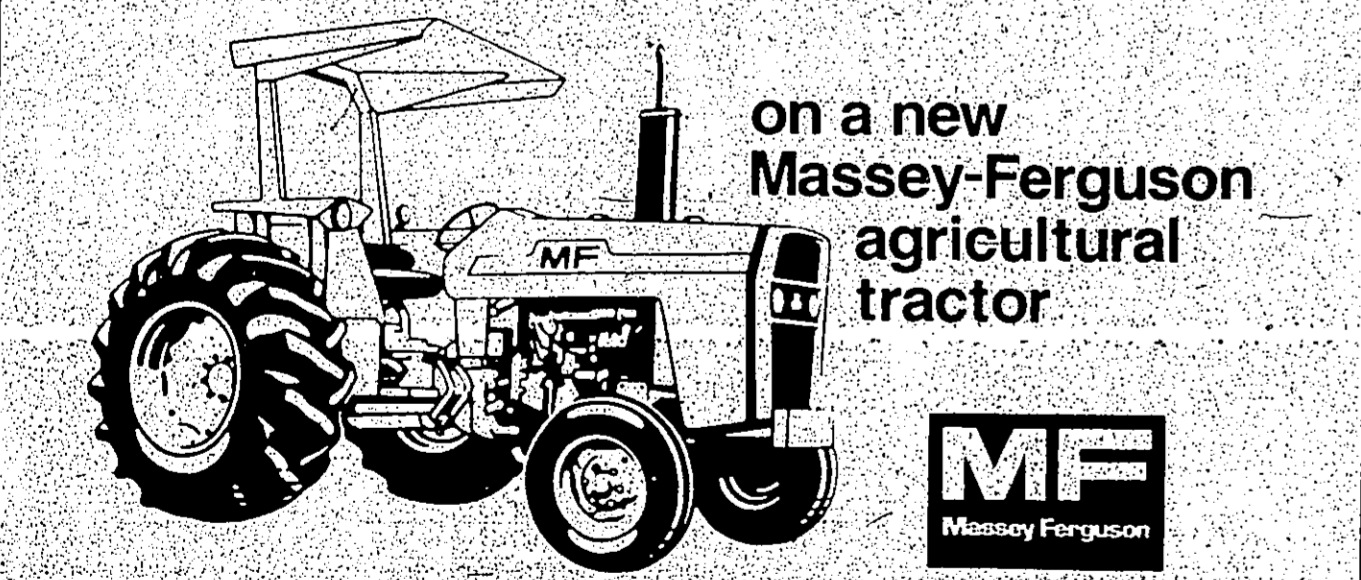
