## NPS Resident Here

With Tyler County being the northern gate to the Big Thicket National Preserve, a National Parks Service Building serving the upper regions of the preserve, is to be located near Woodville, on Highway 287 in the old Temple Easter building with projected opening day set for October 1.

The Big Thicket National Preserve was established in 1974 for the purpose of preserving several areas typical of the Big Thicket region. The Thicket has been acclaimed as a "biological crossroads" well suited for scientific research and recreational activities such as boating, hiking and horseback riding.

The North District Office will be under the supervision of Harold Timmons, District Ranger, who has been with the Parks service for some 13 years and has transferred to Tyler County from Del Rio where he worked at the Amistad Recreational Area. Timmons and his wife have made their home in Ivanhoe.

Working with Timmons will be Russell Elliot, Ranger Technician, who has been with the service for 5 years and has moved to the county from the Everglades in Florida. The North District Office will provide district services such as visitor contact and information and protection

and maintenance for the northern tier of the preserve stated Tom Lubbert, Big Thicket Units in the northern region which the office will supervise are Big Sandy, Menard Creek, Hickory Creek, Savannah, Turkey Creek, Beech Creek and the Upper Neches River Unit.



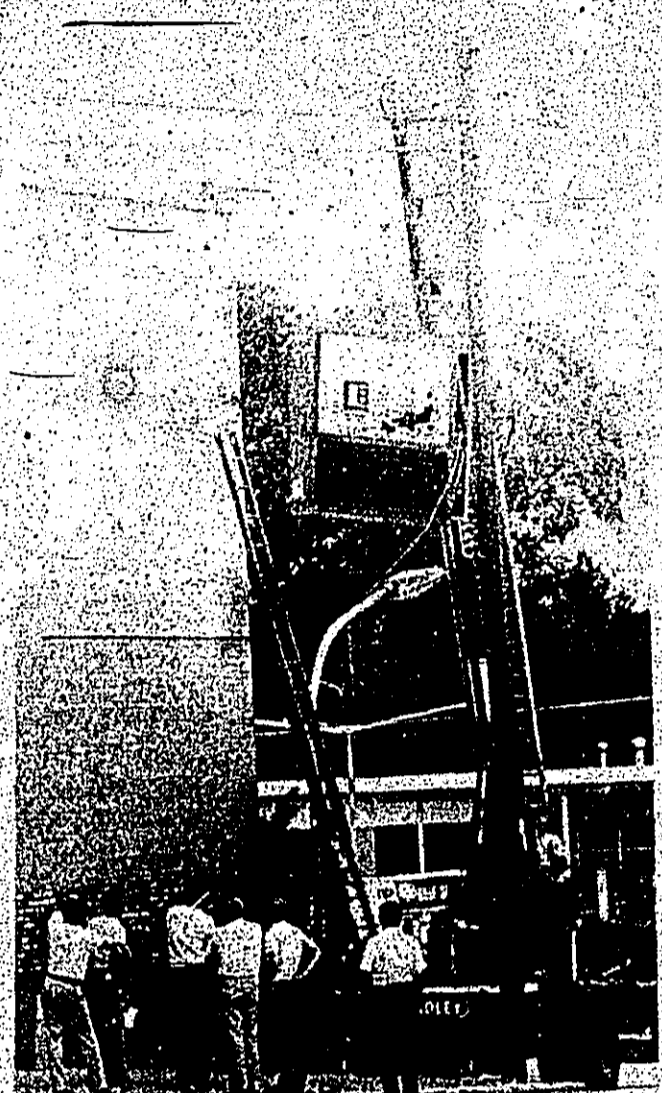

## Watch For Time And Temp

The times, they are a changing, and so is the temperature. The display mechanism is designed to operate continuously throughout the 24-hour day, 365 days every year. People six blocks away will be able to read the display without difficulty because of unique design features which tremendously increase its readability range.

Officials say it will a few days till all the electrical hookups are completed but "it won't be long."

The time function will be controlled by a 60-cycle synchronous motor which constantly guarantees an accurate time reading on the display lampbank. Although a power failure will darken the lampbank, an internal battery source and specially designed circuits automatically assure correct readings on the display when electricity is restored.

## County Still Wrestling With Budget Numbers

With a budget drawn from available resources and set at \$1,324,913.55 for the year, 1978, Tyler County Commissioners Tuesday tried once again to stretch the counties available money a little further.

According to Commissioner Maxie Riley of Precinct 1, state programs that start out funded almost totally by the state, each year fall more and more on county funds, so much to the point, he said, that eventually the county is carrying most of the financial load, without the county having the ability to anticipate such expense when the program was accepted.

One program which was under serious discussion during the busy session is the Aging Service which supplies the Mini Bus to county residents. Commissioners agree that although the program is essential to the county it will mean some \$11,000 to the county during the year 1978. The Aging Service will not be discontinued, but Commis-

sioners say they will seek to find a less expensive way of operating the program.

Also under consideration by the court was the budgeting of funds for a Jailer.

Presently the Jailer is working under a grant which will expire on Sept. 30, 1977. Sheriff Lewis Craven recommended to the court that the Jailer salary be set at the last years deputy compensation until the time he is certified, Craven said.

Commissioners took Craven's recommendation under consideration. The commissioners denied a request from Craven who recommended that a Criminal Investigator funds be discontinued. The grant which the Criminal Investigator is working under now will expire in September of 1978. Cost to Tyler County for the services of a Criminal

investigator, who also works closely with the Police Department in Woodville, as well as all law enforcement agencies in Hardin and Tyler Counties, would be \$1,850.84. Craven indicated to the Court that he was dissatisfied with B.J. Vardeman's (continued on page 2)

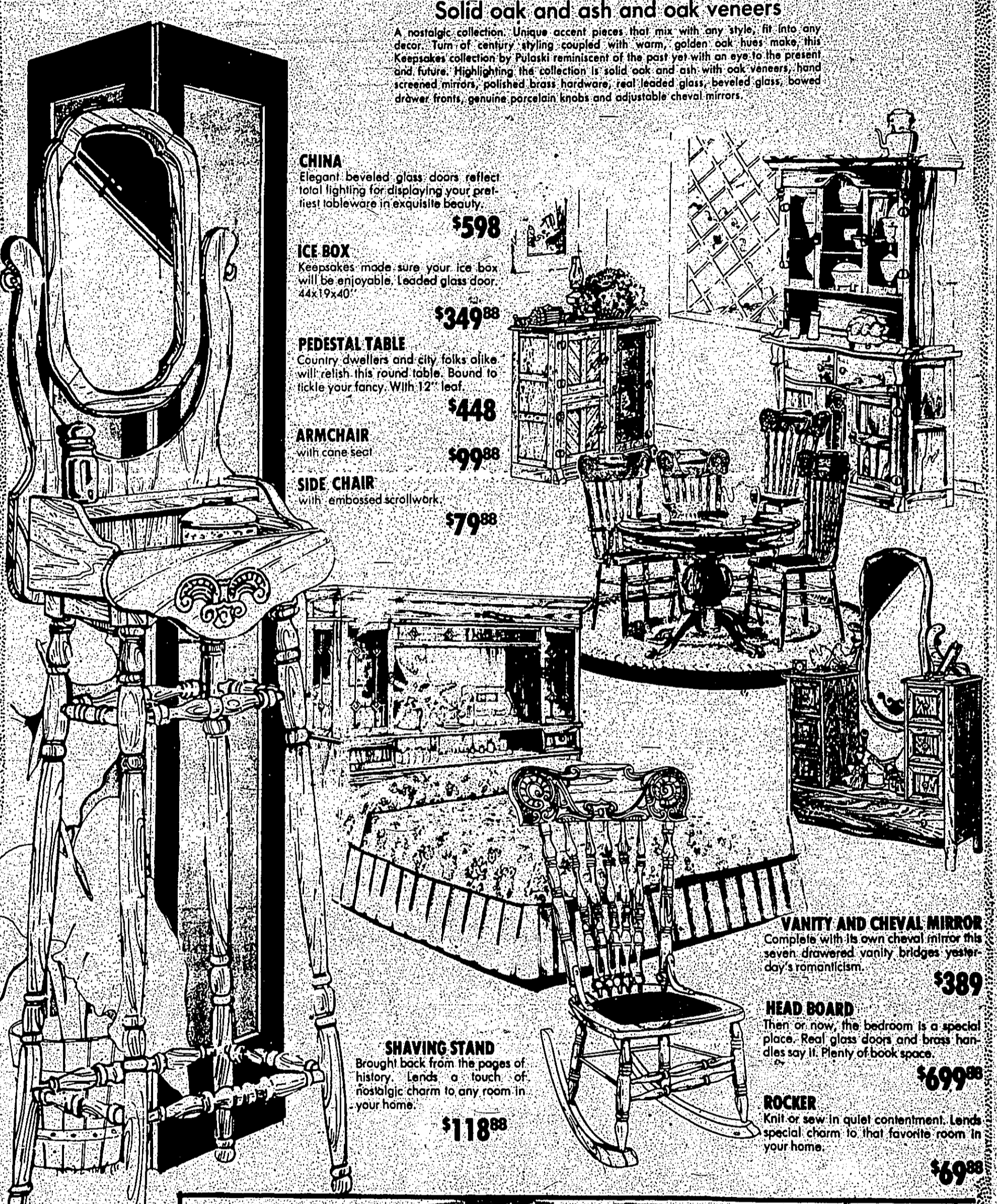

# Gasoline Prices Lower For Labor Day

Texas planning morning trips during the Labor Day Weekend can budget a little less for gasoline than they could two months ago. According to a survey made by the American Automobile Association, the average price of regular gasoline has dropped over 1 cent per gallon since the July Fourth weekend.

The survey of 207 service stations throughout the state showed that regular gas is now selling for an average price of 58.9 cents per gallon, compared to the average of 60.2 cents per gallon revealed by AAA's Independence Day survey.

Prices for unleaded and premium fuel also declined, though by lesser amounts. The current average prices (July 4 prices in parentheses) are: Unleaded, 52.2 (63.0); Premium, 53.9 (64.6). Gasoline prices remain higher than they were last Labor Day Weekend, when AAA's survey revealed average prices of 57.4 for regular, 59.4 for unleaded, and 61.1 for premium.

The survey showed that motorists can save money by shopping around for fuel. The price charged for regular gasoline ranged from 47.9 cents per gallon at a self-service station in Beaumont to 69.9 cents per gallon at a full-service station in Fort Stockton, and for as much as 63.9¢ at Beaumont.

Station operators contacted by AAA for the survey say they expect no supply problems during the Labor Day Weekend, and most stations will be open Sunday.

# Southland-St. Regis Paper Companies To Merge

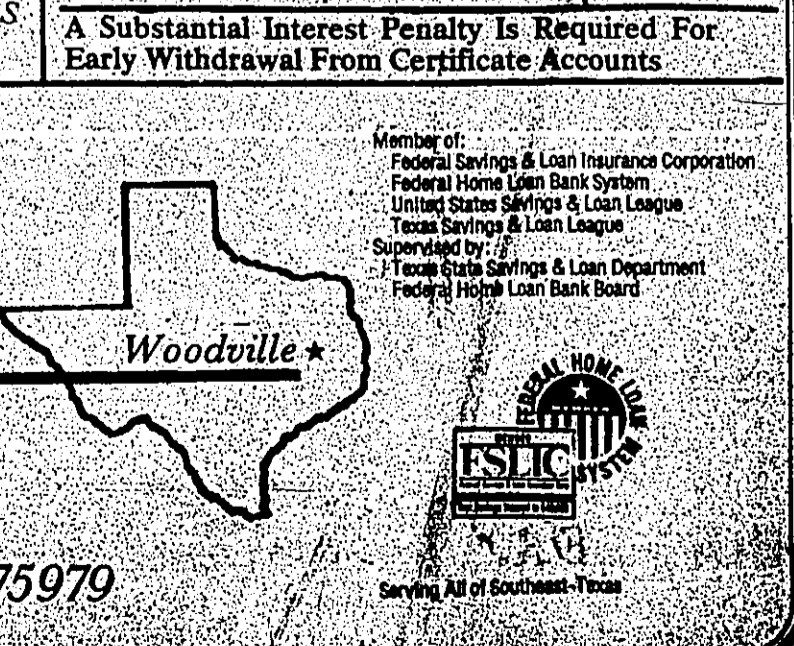


