# City Budget Calls For 25% Tax Hike

In a 1977-78 budget hearing Monday night the Woodville city council agreed on a new budget which calls for an estimated 25 percent increase in city taxes. The plan which is expected to be adopted according to City

Manager Walt Davis, on Wednesday or Thursday Sept. 28 or 29, will affect some 875 taxpayers who live within the city limits of Woodville. Council members quickly reminded those present

at the Monday meeting that the total gross amount of the increase amounted to "only" \$10,000. In detailing some of the specifics of the tax rate increase expected in other areas the report indicated

that sewer charges would be increased from \$3 to \$4 with usage over 10,000 gallons raised 15 cents. The garbage rate will be adjusted upward with the base rate to go from \$2 to \$2.50 and for commercial users the rate will jump from \$5 to \$7. Gas increases are also anticipated but councilmen did not want to predict those increases until Tennessee Gas adjusts the cost to the city.

Estimated cost increases are projected to be \$9,014 in the water department. In other action the council accepted an allocation of revenue sharing expenditures which are up from last year's total of \$32,661. The new figure to be utilized next year totals \$43,494.

The councilmen heard a lengthy report from City Health Inspector Joan Lolodice about progress thus far resulting from state and local inspections of local eating and food handling establishments.

The council praised the Health Inspector and said her services were an "asset to the community" and that the program was "definitely needed."

Lolodice stated that her visits, which now involve some 15 establishments, usually last one hour. "During that time," she said, demerits are given for failure to improve cleanliness or to clear up obvious health hazards.

Total that the city expects to collect from the higher taxation amounts to \$116,623. One expenditure which the city fathers are also planning for is a retirement plan for the city's volunteer fire fighters. That plan calls for an increase cost to the city amounting to \$6,500. The total General Fund budget is expected to reflect an overall \$41,009 increase in the next year. Within the gas department budget an increase of \$66,000 is expected with three new personnel expected to be added to that department.

The councilman Jim Jinnette inquired of Mayor Terry Watts on the progress to date on the installation of the new cablevision system. THE BOOSTER checked with American Cablevision President Don Adam in Bryan who indicated that the problem existed within the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company in that clearance has not yet been given which would allow the cable TV company to install their lines on telephone-owned poles.

Southwestern Bell executive Mark Keister reported that the slowdown is due to new cable company contracts which are being drawn for nationwide use in contracting with cable company firms. Keister said he apologized for the "internal problem" but that he felt that the move on the part of the telephone utility would serve the community, the city and the cable company better. "It has to do with insurance considerations and things like that, we just have to wait," he said.

Adam described the television signals as they are received at the microwave tower as "Really great."

Southwestern Bells Keister said that "Everything has to be 'hunky-dory' before the leasing of the poles can be used by the Cablevision company. He volunteered no anticipated time that the contracts would be ready.

# Commissioners Hold Night Session

Tyler County Commissioners were reprimanded for earlier action on a county officials parking space and were questioned about the legalities of a Sheriff's Department request concerning a county vehicle during a busy regular session held Monday, September 12, at 6:30 p.m. Due to the illness and hospitalization of County Judge Allen Sturrock, Commissioner James "Bo" Jordan presided over the court.

"You give a man a trial before hanging him," Barclay said. Commissioners told Barclay that it had come to their attention that he was not using his assistant to do so. "There are alot of assistants in the courthouse who don't have a space" Commissioner Jordan told Barclay, adding that the parking situation around the courthouse is under study now.

Barclay went on to explain to commissioners that it was true that he does not use his space however, it is for "health reasons" and that he must walk daily for his health but also needs a car available to him at the courthouse in case of emergencies. Commissioners voted to allow Barclay to continue to use the space as he has been until "notified to stop."

In other court action, Commissioner Riley, who said he was speaking for Sheriff Lewis Craven, who was not present at the meeting, asked the court's approval for the city of Colmesneil to fix the old Sheriff's Department car for the use of the newly appointed Law Enforcement Officer, Jessie E. Lewis. According to Colmesneil City Manager, E.C. Hardin, Lewis was hired through a Government grant to work for the city of Colmesneil, not Tyler County.

The question of legality arose from the request that the car be given to the City. County Attorney Jim Allison said that he did not believe the arrangement would be legal since Tyler County does not pay Lewis and that the car is county equipment. The court tabled the request until the legalities could be studied. Also during Monday's meeting, County Auditor Ann Fondren presented to the court a proposed "budgetary monthly report" that would detail county expenses and remaining balances for each month. The report includes all offices and would keep commissioners informed as to how much spending or over spending was done county-wide.

Commissioner Riley labeled the report as "outstanding" and the court voted to accept the plan. Several requests were made by various county officials to attend several upcoming seminars. Approval was given by commissioners for the County Treasurer Austin Fuller to attend a seminar in Galveston, September 21, 22, and 23 and that his assistant, Jean Phillips be allowed to attend on the 23rd. Approval was also given for County Auditor Ann Fondren to attend a conference in Brownsville on September 28, 29 and 30.

According to county officials these seminars and conferences keep the official up to date on the newest laws and procedures. Commissioners, towards the end of the meeting, met with County Attorney Jim Allison in "executive session" to discuss a "personnel matter." After the 20 minute meeting, commissioners reported that there was no motion which needed action.

In other business, commissioners voted to: -Approve Co. Auditor's report; -Tabled for "further study of cost" a request for bulletin boards for courthouses, information and public notices; -Tabled the approval of a new radar system for the County law enforcement; -Accepted a road in the Crystal Creek subdivision, located off of Highway 256 in Precinct 2; and -Accepted two roads in

Adult Basic education is a statewide program for adults who have not completed high school and is free to those who wish to participate. It is financed by the Texas Education Agency.

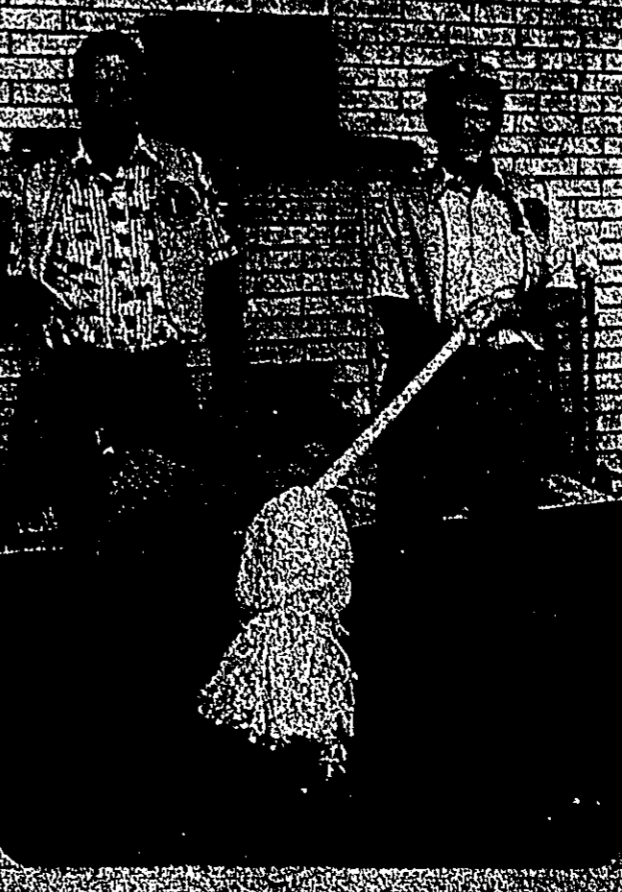

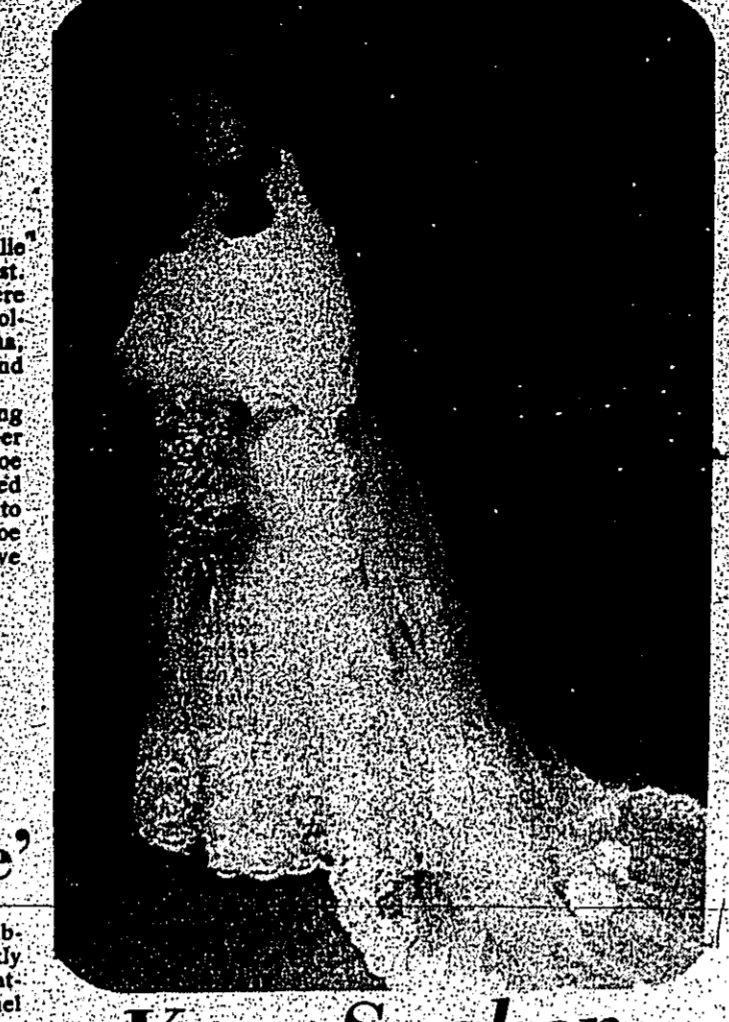
