Cypress Bridge Bids Due

AUSTIN—Bids for the improvement and widening of the Cypress Creek Bridge on U.S. 69 south of Hillister are expected to be received at the Dec. 7-8 letting of the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation.

Bridge approaches will be widened and improved, and the existing 22-foot concrete slab bridge on wooden pilings will be replaced with a modern 44-foot concrete slab bridge on concrete caps and concrete piling.

Construction will be accomplished with a minimum disruption to traffic. However, motorists are cautioned to exercise care while traveling through the construction area.

Lester P. Landgraf of Silsbee, the department's engineer in charge of the work, estimates that about 150 working days will be required to complete the project.

Overall project supervision will be supplied by Beaumont District Engineer Franklin C. Young.

In related news, the State Highway and Public Transportation Commission recently approved the placement of rehabilitation bridges and approaches in five counties, including the Russel Creek Bridge on FM 1745, 2.6 miles northeast of U.S. 287 near Chester.

Other counties included in the \$30 million bridge replacement program are Hardin, Jasper, Newton and Orange.

District Engineer F.C. Young of Beaumont said that the Commission's approval would allow work to proceed on seven bridges in District 20. These include:

Lower Rocky Creek Bridge, five miles west of U.S. 69 on FM 421 in Hardin County.

Cypress Creek Bridge on FM 253, 2.9 miles east of Texas 62 in Jasper County.

Big Cypress Creek Bridge on FM 253, 1.2 miles southwest of Newton County line in Jasper County.

Caney Creek Bridge on Loop 505 in City of Newton, Newton County.

Davis Creek Bridge on FM 1416 5 miles northeast of Live Oak in Newton County.

Ten Mile Creek Bridge on FM 1131, 1.3 miles south east of FM 105 in Orange County.

Russel Creek Bridge in Tyler County.

District Engineer Young has assigned the planning and construction of these bridge improvements to Resident Engineers H.P.R. Smith of Jasper, L.P. Landgraf of Silsbee and C.B. Bond of Orange.

Some 143 bridges throughout the State will be improved or replaced with each of the 25 districts in the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation, having at least two bridges included in the program.

WISD Provisionally Accepts School Bid

A "provisional acceptance" of a low bid totaling \$2,498,000 was given Tuesday night to the Herman Bennett Co. of Brownwood, to build a new high school, gym and vocational building for the Woodville Independent School District.

The "acceptance" of the bid proposal remains subject to the scrutiny of board trustees and District Architect Jack Stansbury who will study the bid proposal, he said, looking for additional areas where the bid might be reduced

possibly allowing any of seven alternates which were added to the bid form.

The "Hermann" Bennett Co. competed with four other firms with base bids ranging up to \$2,898,750.

Architect Stansbury projected the cost of the project to amount to a total of \$2,483,370 in cost speculation which was given to the board in May, 1977. The bid submitted Tuesday night by the Brownwood firm jumped the projected estimate by \$14,630, a figure which board members indicated they were "proud of."

Linam suggested to Board President R.E. Swearingen that the board entertain a resolution of "provisional" acceptance of the bid. Trustees Dr. W.S. Nichols and Harold "Bud" Allison quickly

initiated a motion and second respectively to accept the bid on a "provisional" basis. Both Allison and Nichols have led the board in voting to progress with the building program which culminated in Tuesday's vote.

The board expects to formally ratify Tuesday's action at the next scheduled meeting of the district trustees, which will be held one week earlier in December on Tuesday December 13, at the District Administration Building at 7 p.m. Linam made the request due to the Christmas holidays.

Linam said that representatives from the Herman Bennett Company would probably be on hand to address the board on the qualification of the firm.

The four other companies participating in the bid activity included: the Bella Co. of Beaumont, with a \$2,769,000 base bid; the Mar-Len Co. Inc. of Nederland with a base bid of \$2,898,750; the J.M. Rogers Co. of Houston with a base bid of \$2,603,850; and the Spaw-Glass Co. of Houston with a base bid consideration of \$2,692,000.

Broom Wins Suit County Quits Case

Somewhat reluctantly, the Tyler County commissioners have voted 3-1 to go along with the ruling of a civil appeals court and award back pay plus interest, and an increase in salary to Precinct 2 Justice of the Peace Billie Jean Broom.

After hearing Attorney John Kinney describe the chances for having an appeal heard by the state supreme court as "15 out of a 100," the commissioners made their decision at an emergency meeting Wednesday, Nov. 23.

Kinney and County Attorney Rola Brockman met with the commissioners for approximately a half hour in executive sessions prior to the vote.

Precinct 3 Commissioner Leon Fowler made the motion to accept the court's ruling, explaining that he did not "see anything else to do." Precinct 1 Commissioner Kenneth Lowe seconded the motion.

Precinct 4 Commissioner Bo Jordan and Precinct 1 Commissioner Maxie Riley echoed Fowler's sentiments, but only Jordan voted against the motion.

As a result of the Nov. 10 ruling by the Ninth Supreme Judicial District Court of Civil Appeals, the county will have to pay Broom more than \$12,000 in back pay and interest.

Although the Precinct 2 justice of the peace's salary was \$50 per month when Broom took office on Jan. 2, 1975, she has argued that the county had illegally lowered the salary from \$400 per month.

This contention was based on a state law enacted on May 25, 1973, when the salary was \$400, and it was this law which the appeals court based its decision upon.

Kinney denounced the law, claiming that it would have the "potential to bankrupt small counties." He pointed out that the appeals court had given the county permission to tax its people if it had to in order to pay Broom. He added that the justices of the peace have a powerful lobby in Austin and were responsible for the law.

Justice of the Peace E.A. Sturrock of Precinct 1 defended the law which forbade the county from lowering county employees' salaries from what they were when it went into effect. "I can see why it was passed," said Sturrock, apparently agreeing with opinion that it was to stop the lowering of salaries to punish county employees.

Thanksgiving Gun Battle Results In One Death

HILLISTER—A gunfight at the U.S. 69 bridge over Cypress Creek near here, Thanksgiving Day resulted in the death of one Hillister woman and the jailing of another, charged with murder.

Jimmie Wolf, 27, remained in the Tyler County jail as of Tuesday morning, accused of murdering Bertha Weaver, 38, of Hillister with four shots from a .22 caliber revolver.

According to Tyler County Deputy Floyd Petri, the shooting incident followed a five-mile automobile chase after an argument at Mrs. Wolf's home at approximately 3 p.m. Upon reaching the bridge,

the women stopped and began exchanging gunfire. Mrs. Weaver using a .25-caliber automatic. The dead woman apparently fired twice.

Mrs. Wolf fired five times, hitting Weaver twice in the head, once in the neck and once in the lower back, according to Petri.

Mrs. Wolf surrendered to sheriff's officers after the shooting and was brought before Precinct 4 Justice of the Peace Roy Drake, who set bond at \$25,000.

Funeral services for Mrs. Weaver were held Sunday at Little Baptist Church, with

burial following in the church cemetery.

Mrs. Weaver is survived by two daughters, Melba Jean Powell of California and Maryann Weaver of Silsbee; two sons, Henry Lee and David Weaver, both of Silsbee; seven sisters, Edna Lee, Helen Riggsby, Odessa Downes, Bave Evans and Daisy Lee Powell, all of Hillister; Maryann Brooks of Doucette; and Pala Mae Powell of Conroe; four brothers, James and Ross Powell of Hillister, Clark Powell Jr. of Warren and Sylvester Powell of Woodville; and two grandchildren.

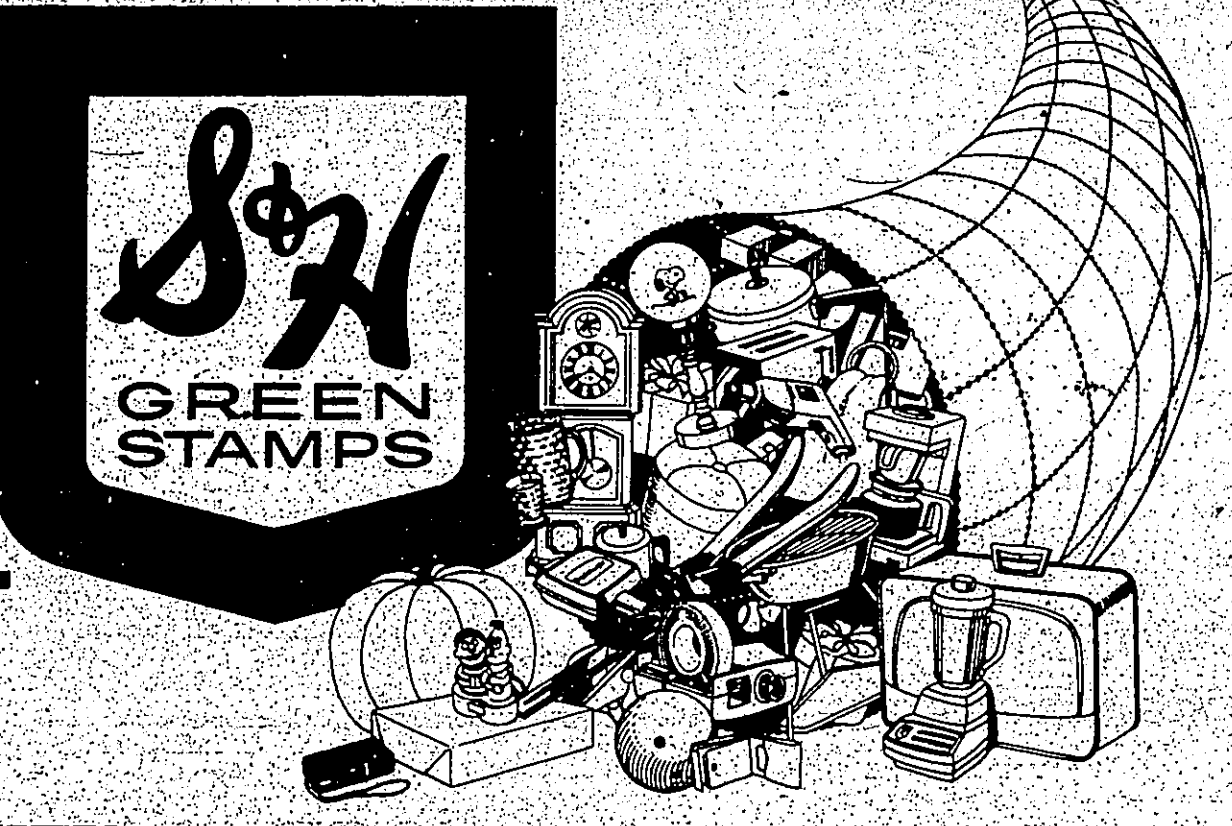

Pork, Fruits Good

COLLEGE STATION—Fruit and pork offer several good values to Texas grocery market shoppers this week, according to Mrs. Genevieve C. Cratt, consumer marketing information specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

FRESH FRUITS—Most economical choices are grapefruit, oranges, tangerines, nectarines, crabapples, apples, grapes, bananas and peaches.

FRESH VEGETABLES—Best buys are potatoes, dry yellow onions, carrots, cooking greens, cabbage, broccoli, hard-shell squash, mushrooms and sweet potatoes.

PORK—Good values include butt-cut roasts, spare ribs cut into chops and rib-end roasts.

POULTRY—Poultry "specials" are likely, since they have had a "back seat" to turkey recently. Egg prices are slightly higher, but Grade A, large-size eggs are generally the best value.

BEEF—Feeder "specials" is a trend, so check for economy buys carefully. Good side beef roasts and steaks, ground beef and beef liver.

CONFECTIONERY—WATKINS WORDS—For baking and cooking economy, use dry milk or evaporated milk mixed with water—either will work in any recipe calling for milk.

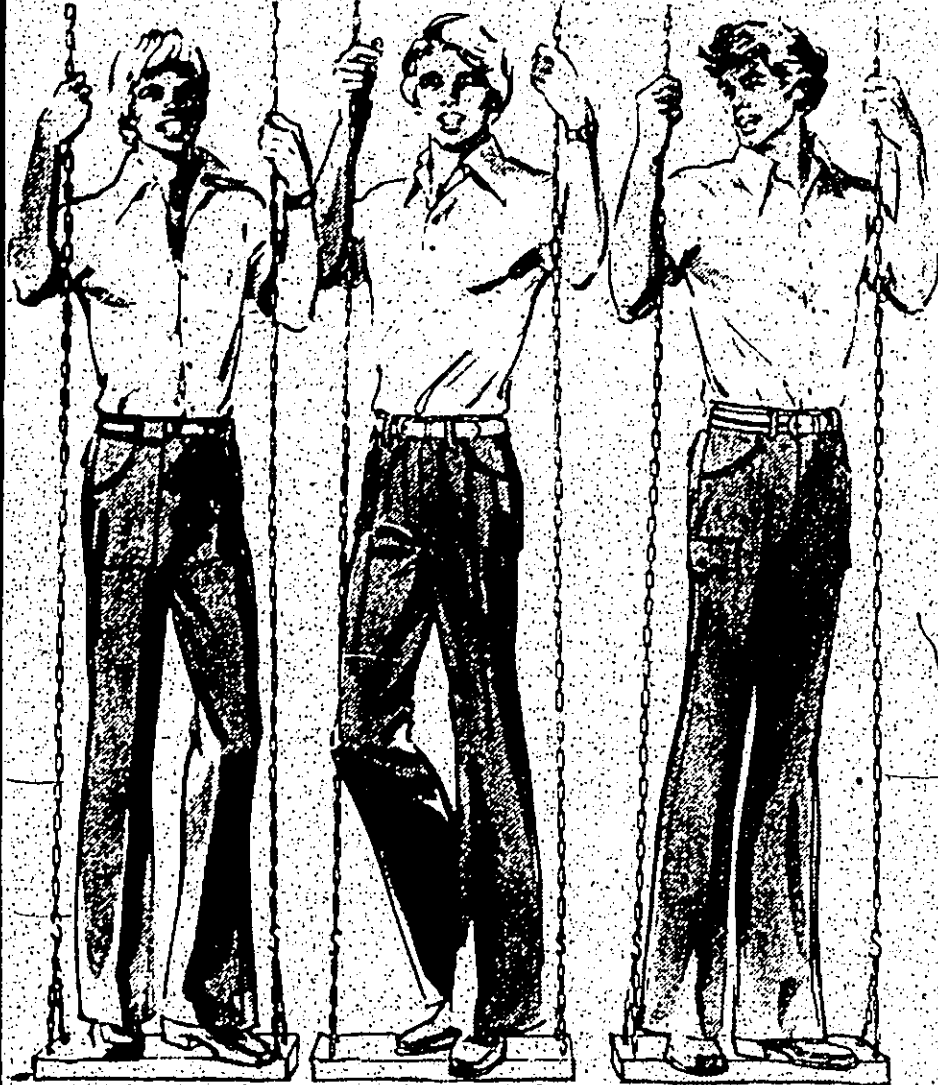

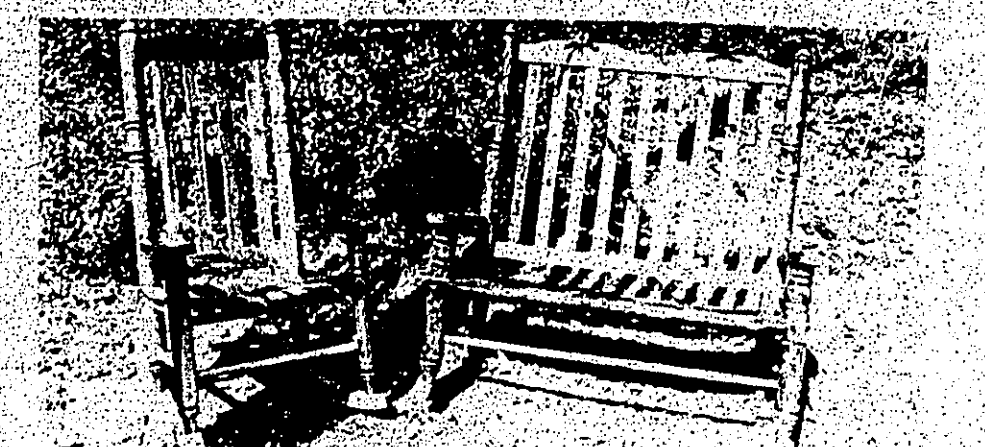
