



just out of high school with nothing to do and no place to go.

The United States was engaged at that time in the battles of World War II, and there were many opportunitles for young nurses. Also at this time the government was paying many of the expenses for nursing school.

"It was then I decided to leave my home in Puerto Rico and travel to the far away city of New Orleans, Louisians to attend the Hotel Dieu School for Nurses, said Rivera, better known in Tyler County as Mrs. Jose Cordero. Hotel Dieu is French for House of God, she said.

During the sixteen year period in which Miss Rivera went to school and worked in New Orleans she nursed patients in most of the hospitals in the city. She did "private duty" where a nurse can choose her own hours and time off. "A nurse can really get closer to a patient under this program," she said.

On September 29, 1949 Nurse Rivera really got her "bell rung" by a young man named Jose Cordero. The bell that rang just happened to be a beautifully chimed wedding bell. They were married that day in New Orleans, and she became Mrs.

During the next seven years the couple began rearing their children: Jose, Carmen, Teresa, and Ralph. In 1960 the couple moved to Texas. They bought a farm 10 miles east of Woodville on FM highway 1746 and raised 1,500 to

1,800 chickens, a few cows and a pig. I learned many new.

things on the farm since I had never lived in the country. I even learned how to milk a cow, "Cordero said.

At that time Mrs.' Cordero was helping on the farm during the day and doubling as a nurse during the night. Her youngest child Ralph was only 21/2 years old then. In 1963 they moved back to Puerto Rico for ten months and

then in 1964 returned to the United States. The family moved to Jasper for a year where Mrs. Cordero worked as a school nurse. In 1965 two things happened in Carmen's life. Her youngest child Carlos was born and then Tyler County Hospital Administrator Krautter; asked her to teach nursing school in Woodville. She did not immediately take

the job, but in 1966 she took the job and traveled from Jasper to Woodville each day to work, The Cordero's soon built a new home in Woodville which was designed by her husband Jose' (Joe). Joe designed the

house in Spanish-American style. Since then Carmen Cordero has devoted fourteen years in service to the Tyler County Hosital in Woodville. She has been a Registered Nurse for thirty years.

She is also an active community member. She participated in the recent "walk-a-thon" which is helping to build a sheltered workshop for the handicapped.

She is also an active member of Our Lady of the Pines

Catholic Church, and is a member of the altar society of that church. The altar society is a group of women who do charify work and participate in "building" the church.

her share of the load during her service in Tyler County and she has done an extremely fine job with the school," said hospital administrator Dick Cordes.

Carmen Cordero has greatly has greatly affected the lives of at least 88 people. These 88 people were her students over the last 14 years. Eighty-four of the students who graduated and passed the state board exam were women. Two students who graduated and passed the state board were men. Since she started teaching only two students have failed to pass the state board exam.

I try to teach my students to be good bedside nurses. I teach them to listen, to have compassion, to practice empathy, to be understanding, kind, and to respect the rights of the patient as an individual," Cordero said.

"Lfind great reward in teaching my students, and in seeing them better themselves in life," she said. "But I also take great joy in being a bedside nurse myself, and having an opportunity to help those in need.

Mrs. Sylvia Odom, a student of Mrs. Cordero's first class in Woodville, is now an employee of the Tyler County Hospital in Woodville.

"Mrs. Cordero is really a good teacher. She instilled in us, the students, the need for nurses; Her influence and help were greatly beneficial in helping me get my R.N. degree at Angelina College. She really understands people and their needs and she is one of the best nurses in the hospital here, "Odom said.



But I can't help being a little braggy this week, as the Boston Red Sox continue to tear the American League East apart, and look better on the field than they

have in years. Being a Red Sox fan for so many years, I always knew the only way we could win a pennant was to outslug the opposition, and winning enough 12-10 ballgames was all too often asking too much, With only three pennants in the last thirty years, my logic seems sound, 🛦

However, this year might be different. (I have been saying that every year for thirty years too.) The Sox finally have some pitching, well, at least till the end of June. Only two old timers on the staff, two new ones we stole from the Yankees and the Cleveland

Indians. Giving away players to be named later, and

several million dollars make the 1978 season more Not that the month of June wasn't fraught with peril. Ever since the expansion teams came into the league, scheduling of home and away games has been a nightmare for the players. The poor Yankees had to go fourteen innings the other night in New York to beat Boston, and then fly to Milwaukee for a doubleheader the next day. (They lost both games.) The ironic thing is

that the next two days, the Yanks didn't play anybody. Boston, Baltimore and New York, the perennial teams at the top of their division for several years, end up playing seventeen games with each other in June, and that performance could well determine where each is in the standings in October.

Baseball as a spectator sport has been "buried" by sports writers and fans alike for years, but this season, attendance records are up all over the league. Boston passed the million mark at home a week ago, and the Houston Astros, who must be as frustrating to their fans, as the Red Sox are with me, are more than 150,000 tickets ahead from this same time last season.

Only one thing bothers me about Boston. It is the smallest ballpark in either league, both in dimension, and seating capacity. All the years Mr. Yawkey owned the ball club, he said they would never sell advertising on the outfield fences, nor would they add seating capacity. He liked it the way it was.

But with his death last year, and subsequent sale of the franchise to new owners, all that may change. Seating is to be increased by about twenty percent. There's only one feature of the ballpark I hope they

never tamper with With a short left field foul line (311 feet from home plate), the pitchers have been given a break, if you can call it that. A 37-foot tall fence extends out in left field, to keep routine fly balls in any other park from ending up cheap home runs. Course, every right-handed hitter in the majors thinks that fence is tailored just for him, and it's amazing how many of them make fools out of them selves trying to pull the ball.

PINES THEATRE **Bureau Supports** On the Square --- Woodville FRIDAY-SATURDA Individual Rights

By MILTON DURHAM The Farm Bureau supports the rights of individual to own and operate his farm and his property in the way that he sees fit so long as it does not negatively affect any

We recommend and support action through legisla-tion, regulation or otherwise to provide maximum protection for the mineral, land, and property rights of farmers and ranchers in Texas. Such action should include meas ures to provide additional safeguards for property

We oppose compulsory land use planning. We feelthat the land owner or operator, with the owner consent, should have the responsibility for his land development, and that the land use planning can best be accomplished

We strongly support soil and water conservation on voluntary basis through such programs as the Great Plains Conservation Program, the Rurual Environmental Assistance Program, and through our local Soil and Water Conservation Districts. We strongly oppose compulsory soil and water conservation practices. We do not feel that laws should be passed permitting public access

1 exas **Joctors** Urge Early Vaccines

Texas doctors are joining plans for a massive immuniza-tion drive aimed at boosting protection levels above 90 percent of the population. The Texas Medical Association (TMA) says this large-scale effort is needed to protect people from diseases which in their most serious forms can cause death gripoline blind. cause death, crippling, blind-ness or brain damage. The U.S. Department of

Health, Education and Welfare estimates that approxi-mately 25-40 percent of U.S. hildren are not immunized against one of seven prevent able, dangerous diseases. It an article in the July issue o Texas Medicine, the TMA monthly journal, Clinton Craven, M.D., of Austin, asks doctors to monitor patients' records and encourage people to get needed immunizations or diptheria, tetanus, pertus sis, polio, measles, rubella and

TMA urges people not to wait for a postcard from their physicians but to update mmunizations now. Check with your physician or local health department to find out what doses are needed and netimes required for admisimps.
TMA says summer is

good time to update immunitions because children genrally are healthier in summe prevented because of ongoing illnesses. Summer munizations - also will provide more protection against diseases which occur nost often in the winter. Dr Craven, a member of TMA's child and adolescent health subcommittee, encourages summer immunizations when nany children already are being examined for school, amp or athletic requirements Physician efforts are part of a state campaign that also will give information to new mothers and home buyers.

The Texas campaign, which involves 27 other groups, is being coordinated with an HEW effort that has commit-

ed 19 million to encouraging

Boat Regulation Changes

Boat owners in Texas hould keep in mind that boats situated or operated on the fresh waters in the state which have permanent sleeping quarters must be equipped with an approved marine sanitation device, a spokes-man for the Texas Department of Water Resources of Water Resources said hursday.

Carry on portable units are acceptable on boats of lessthan 26 feet in length, while boats 26 feet long or longer and all houseboats regardless of length are required to be equipped with permanently installed devices. Game wardens with the

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department who have author ity to inspect boats for compli-ance with TDWR regulations are now checking boats on Texas lakes to see that they are conforming with the

requirements.

Texas law states that,
"No person may discharge sewage, treated or untreated, from a boat into the waters of this State...nor adjacent to the water where such sewage may flow or seep into the waters." Discharge of sewage into freshwaters in Texas is a misdemeanor which, upon convic-tion, is punishable by a fine of not less than 25 nor more than

not less than "25 nor more than "200 the department advises.

To comply with the law and with TDWR regulations, boats which are required to have sanitation devices must be certified and must display a decal which is supplied by the TDWR.
