Ideas Asked

The Deep East Texas that produce identifiable and Council of Governments has viable results been verbally notified of the continuation of the Title VI program under CETA. With this in mind, we are again soliciting proposals for special projects.

These special projects must include new activities with specific objectives that can be accomplished by one or more persons within one year duration. CETA funds will be used to pay participants; however, supplies and equipment must be furnished by your agency. Supervisory sitions may be requested, but that person must also meet the Title VI eligibility criteria. We have been instructed to give special at-

Some examples of special projects include: (1) restoration of a building, (2) improving a playground or equipment (3) recreational program. (4) special education services. (5) beautification, and (6) health services.

Project applications will be reviewed and approved by the Manpower Advisory Council and should be submitted by October 20, 1978. Car Regulations

The make work people in Washington D.C. are still at it apparently, if one is to believe the press reports. This time it is one of the typical alphabet soup agencies, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, and the target is the Ford Motor Company It seems that some seven million Fords, according to the NHTSA, are inclined to drive off by themselves if you leave them unattended with the motor running, No matter that in practically every state of the

Union, it is illegal to leave your car with the motor running, NHTSA Administrator Joan Claybrook thinks she has a live one this time.

And typical of Washington's sense of priorities, Ford is being called to task because some twenty-three: people have been killed because they apparently let their cars run over them. The fact that more than forty thousand Americans kill themselves in motor crashes every year from other causes, most of them driver neglect or drunkeness seems to have escaped Ms. Claybrook's attention. Unless this is another swinging from the heels grandstand play by Ralph Nader, who neither owns a car, or knows how to drive one.

Lest you think I'm touting the Ford Motor Company, I haven't driven a Ford automobile, or owned one in more than twenty-five years. I just have a hunch the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has too. much of our tax dollars to spend, and too many people to figure out ways of spending it.

Certainly the Ford people can't be too overjoyed at he prospect of recalling seven million automobiles. But. apparently Ms. Claybrook is determined to defend all. ... of us against the stupidity of a few.

Small wonder there is a groundswell of resentment against more and bigger government. The make work people may be finally getting the message. Reflecting on the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's actions against the Ford Motor Company reminds me of an experience several years ago in Vashington State

My uncle was a sub-contractor on the Grand Coulee Dam project, building access roads to the construction site, and relocating existing highways that would be inundated when the reservoir behind the dam filled. We stopped one night in a little bitty town a hundred miles from nowhere. The biggest building in town, two stories fall, was the local hotel. The kind that was probably built at the turn of the century, bath and toilet at the end of the hall sert of place.

The old-timey gas light jets were still in place, and a kerosene lamp was on the dresser. These necessities in place, even though a single electric light bulb hung by a drop cord from the center of the ceiling.

. The single light switch was just inside the door, with a card, yellow with age, thumb-tacked to the wall iust above if

Ms. Claybrook would have loved the message on that card. And today, it would have been typical of some of the rules and regulations coming from Washington



A Government That Works

Immediately after Labor Day, the House will face its first key test on whether it has learned any lessons from California's Proposition 13 vote. The outcome of civil service reform will tell us whether Congress is ready to respond to citizens frustration and anger toward government by insisting on competent performance by our public servants.

The Carter Administration's legislation huilds on the concept that citizens will receive effective government service only if it is impartially administered, provides incentives and rewards for outstanding performance, nermits, managers to manage, and provides cimployees with protection against political

Government employees unions and veteruns groups are working overtime in the halls of Congress to maintain the present inflexible civil service. In candid moments, employees, managers and civil service experts acknowledge that the federal government is a bureaucratic maze which stifles the initiative of ded cated government employees while often failing to protect their rights. The accumulation of laws and regulations serves as a shield for

mon-performance. Government is complex enough without permitting it to frustrate good managers by giving them insufficient authority to supervise personnel effectively. Nor should it continue to undermine dedicated civil servants by failure to reward their outstanding performance. When merit violations take place with impunity and pay and promotions are made on the basis of longevity rather than performance, our system

clearly has to be changed." If the House is concerned about the taxpayers, revolt, it will face up to four key issues.
