

American politics, we were told in high school civies, was the art of compromise. The ability of two political parties, often with widely diverse interests arriving at a consensus regarding legislation, and the appropriate goal of government, regarding the private

We are inclined to believe that could be as correct. today, as it has been. But with one glaring weakness, that has grown progressively perverse over the past de

The framers of the Constitution saw the problem we are in today more than 200 years ago. They tried to design a government of checks and balances -- an Executive, Legislative and Judicial department that would prevent the country, or its leaders, from running off in several different directions, and as it would appear to be today; quite out of control.

Remember the phrase, the President proposes - the Congress disposes. That is as it should be. But not to the extent that a proposal from the White House should be swallowed hook, line and sinker by the Congress. or that the Congress on the other hand should become petulant, and thwart the Bresident, just out of spite. We must look more than a little silly to our friends overseas, not to mention our enemies.

Reporters reveling in the President's low rating in the polls. Politicians pontificating for their constituents ears back home, and not much being done in the public

Oldtimer .. BY PHEBE ARMSTRONG If there is one who does not believe the old adage,

"Teachers are born - not made," he has but to meet Lela Sheffield: If he believes that only holders of college degrees are educated people, he has but to talk to Lela Lela and Bill Sheffield are of the stuff that early Tyler County was made. Their modest but comfortable frame house which they built in 1927 is hardly a dozen

miles from the spots their pioneering ancestors settled when they first came to Texas.

Bill's grandfather, Jeff Sheffield, put in the ferry that bore his name and carried traffic across the Neches until a bridge replaced it in 1959.

A few miles northwest of their home is the place Lela's grandfather, William Ratcliff, Jr., was sent home to by General McGruder to make shoes for the Confederate soldiers. His quota was fifteen pairs of shoes. per week which included tanning the leather, making the wooden pegs, and spinning the thread.

Grandfahter Rateliff was only seven when he came with his parents, brothers, and sisters from Mississippi in 1839. They had left Mississippi by wagon, but they anded at Town Bluff. They first moved into a house by the old Town Bluff Masonic Hall near the Snow River (now Neches). 'Later they acquired land between the Beech Creek community and Woodville. He liked to talk about the early days. He told of how

he had seen the first plank sawed off a log in Tyler County. He was a juror in the trial that condemned the white man, James alias Rhode Wilson, who killed Anderson Barkley's slave and later saw that man hanged, the first public hanging in the county. Grandmother Ratcliff was Lucy D. Collier whom he

married in 1853. She was the daughter of James G. Collier, captain in the Confederate army. The Colliers came to Texas to the Beech Creek community in 1852. He donated the land for the Beech Creek cemetery and

Lela's father was Rev. Joe Ratcliff, a Baptist minister. Her mother was Gertrude Hicks of Town Bluff. They were both from large families whose members married and settled in that area. Besides the Collier, Hicks, and Ratcliff families, Lela is related by blood, marriage - and sometimes by intermarriage - to the Walkers, Lazenbys, Perrymans, Parkers, Jordans, Ogdens, etc., etc. That makes her kin to just about everybody around there When Lela finished Beech Creek School at sixteen.

she went to Spurger to study under Mr. P.I. Hunter for her second-grade teaching certificate. Thus qualified to teach in the elementary grades, she started her teaching career at nineteen years of age. Later she attended the Summer Normal in Wood-

ville. Here Mr. E.W. Tubb. Mr. Grover Lowe, and Professor Eastman extended her training so that she received her first-grade certificate which enabled her to teach high school subjects. Lela taught for fifteen years. All but the last stint in Spurger were one-room schools. Often she had pupils 🤚 in as many as eight grades in the one room. No one

had to tell her to make lesson plans - she had to have Decentralization, local them to handle that many levels in one day. When her first-grade certificate was about to expire. during the summer to renew it. After teaching at Beech Creek and Pineville, Lela

took a school at Barber's Hill on Old River near Houston. Bill Sheffield was working there at the time. They were married in her father's home sixty-one years ago. The house is still standing just a whoop and a holler from their place today on Beech Creek Road - FM

This was in 1917 just a few months before he went into the army to serve in World War L. He spent their first wedding anniversary at Camp Mabry in Austin, Notable among Lela's many people who have been teachers was her great aunt. Mary Olivia Rateliff, called Aunt Neb. She was the Mrs. Bill Rigsby who was the first woman teacher in Beaumont and the first woman in Texas to draw and cash a public school voucher. She

opened Mrs. Rigsby's Private School in Beaumont in 1869. School was held in a log cabin about a hundred yards from Hotel Dieu. Students sat on wooden benches and used whatever books were available. Lein and Bill have one daughter who teaches in Port Arthur, but their one grandson is going to be a lawyer - now studying law at Texas Tech. On their sixty-odd acres Bill raises, among other

At her prized possession, the desk her grandfather made, Lela does her church work - she's Historian for the New Bethel Association and dabbles in genealogy. Her own family history could take up all of her time. Lela and Bill Sheffield are people worth knowing. They are the salt of the earth.

#### Dry Weather Hurts Texas Pecan Crop

COLLEGE STATION help in nut development, "Texas size" pecans will be points out Hancock. "In harder to find this fall because addition, moisture is also of the severe dry weather that has plagued the state

since last summer. "Although this year's crop will be short and nuts will generally be small, the quality of pecans will be high, points out B.G. Han-cock, horticulturist with the Texas Agricultural Extension

Texas pecan growers are estimating a crop in the neigh-borhood of 25 to 26 million pounds, down sharply from average production of about 40 million pounds. The nation's crop is estimated at 170 to 180 million pounds, also down from an average of about 200 million pounds.

Texas is the largest producer of native pecans and ranks second nationally to Georgia in total pecan pro-

"This year's crop endur-ed many adversities as far as weather conditions are concerned, notes Hancock. The cycle began with the dry summer of 1977, followed by a cold winter, and continued with an extremely dry spring

The late spring and lack of tree vigor due to dry con-ditions also opened the door for severe damage from the crop's most destructive insect pest, the pecan nut casebearer. Casebearer damage was heavy in many area, particularly where timely sprays were not applied.

Looking over the state. Hancock gives this view of the pecan crop. Best prospects are in the irrigated west-the El Paso Valley, the Trans-Pecos area and the Winter Garden. Production in these areas is all on planted, irrigated orchards. The crop in South Central Texas and the Guif Coast region will be light, with only good crops where orchards were managed properly. Pecan production in the Hill Country will also

be down due to the dry weather. The crop suffered most from dry conditions in the West Cross Timbers and North Central Texas. The severe dry weather in these regions actually caused some tree damage and therefore will have a long-lasting of-

### Return of America's Favorite French Chef

IY JOAN GEUGHEGAN

I had lunch with Julia hild today, but she didn't ook it. Instead, America's avorite French chef was I New York City to projote her new PBS series, Julia Child and Compay," which premiered on aturday, Oct. 7 and will un for 13 weeks.

It's been five years since The French Chef' want no reruns. Julia has spent hose five years "writing a new book," From Julia (hild's Krichen, cooking free-lance writing long cooking demonstrations for charities and licking up the pieces after all those years of TV."

She also admits that she leeded a chance to rest rom her TV work.

However, she's done with re, ing and back with a new les and an accombanyir book, both entitled Julia Child and Compa- a

Unlike her 'French' Chef' series, 'Julia Child and Company' will feature whole menus instead of individual recipes.

Julia can pinpoint one reason for her return, "Just thought it would be fur to do."

She concluded her 'French Chef' series because she felt she had said everything there was to say. But with the new menu format, Julia also has new material. And, she's never at a loss for words.

She comments, It's nice to have a change. You're not cooking in limbo, each recipe is a part of the orchestration of a whole meal. We suggest the menu, but can only do two of three highlights on each episode."

episode.

The 13 shows are based on the solutions to 13 cooking problems. How to throw a low-calorie banquet without anyone catching on; what to serve to 19 guests when you are both cook and butler; if it should rain, how to move a barbeque indoors.

French cooking is the backbone of good cooking, but "people get scared off by French titles," Julia claims. She gives the recipes American names, then adds the French title.

Cooking has changed in the past five years. "Julia Child and Company" will reflect those changes. One major revolution is the food processor.

"A food processor is a normal part of anyone's kitchen," Julia maintains. "It's the most important kitchen invention since the electric mixer." For Julia, anything that makes cooking faster and easier is a must.

"People are tremendously interested in food now," she continues. "They have kitchens that really work. Plus, public food gets worse and worse." There's a need for.

good home cooking.

Moreover, the revolution in French cooking "La Nouvelle Cuisine" leaves 'chefs free to create dishes of their own instead of recipes from 75 years ago, This has lead to ridiculous extremes — cow's udders and oysters. Then there's 'Cuisine Mincure,' diet cooking, French cooking did need modernizing. People are watching their diets, especially tourists."

Julia incorporates her own inventions and American twists into her 13 menus "Americans." she insists, "were not tradition-minded like the French. We've always acted this way - combining French, Spanish or English cooking. We're tree to invent. However, the corned beef and the fish cowder are very American in approach."

Some of Julia's featured inventions are Los Gatos Gateaux, a cake of apricots and meringue, and a beautiful new chocolate cake that's a cross between a cake and a mousse.

If the new series is more spritely than "The French-Chef," it's because "Julia Child and Company" has a slightly larger budget to work with Julia's first


