Tree Fall Kills Man

A 57-year-old Newton man was crushed to death by a tree Friday, Oct. 27 near the New Hope Community. Connie Esker Burnham was sawing a tree when a previously cut tree fell and killed him.

Deputy sheriff Sonny Bivens said that apparently the tree did not fall as Burnham expected. He was found at 8 a.m., about 10 minutes after the accident happened, by his fellow workers. Justice of the Peace Frank Grimes pronounced Burnham dead.

Local AARP For Tax Exempt Bill

The Woodville chapter 792 of the American Association of Retired Persons has announced its approval of the property tax exemption amendment to be voted on November 7.

According to legislative committee chairman Preston Britte, the exemption will help retired persons. The majority of senior citizens live on fixed incomes, and tax exemption help could be essential, he says.

The amendment would provide a \$5,000 exemption for all homeowners from school district property taxes. It would permit the state legislature to enact an additional \$10,000 homeowners exemption from school, district property taxes if over 65 years of age.

It also would freeze the level of property taxes levied by school district on homesteads if over age 65 once the legislature enacts the \$10,000 exemption. Britte points out that these exemptions would be in addition to exemptions already provided for by local taxing authorities.

The freeze would become operation only if the legislature enacts the \$10,000

Dillion May Challenge Ballot

Republican House of Representatives candidate J. "Dillon" Dillion of Woodville said he will wait until after November 3 absentee voting is finished in Orange County before deciding whether to file suit against Orange County for omitting his name from absentee ballots.

Dillion is seeking the seat currently held by Charles Wilson, D-Lufkin, who is seeking re-election.

The mistake was discovered on Tuesday, Oct. 24 after 115 ballots had already been cast. An additional 28,000 general election ballots had to be reprinted for the November 7 election. Hopefully they would be ready in time, but Bennie Johnson, co-owner of Southern Pines Printers was not sure they would be finished.

Sallie Frazier, Orange County clerk said it was an honest mistake, but nothing can be done for the ballots already cast. The omission of a candidate's name is grounds to contest an election if it is close.

Lucille C'ceBaca, deputy director of the secretary of state's elections division, said that circumstances may be that Dillion could file a suit contesting the election or possibly one seeking damages. Dillion has not said what action he plans to take.

He said he initially planned to let it ride. His second impulse was to have all of Orange County thrown out, but he said he did not want the taxpayers to have to pay for it, so he decided to bring it to the public's attention.

Dillion said he has no definite answer on his legal intentions until after absentee voting is finished.

Carlo Hill Group Seeks Home Deeds

A group of thirteen residents on Carlo Hill, and the Woodville Church of Christ (Highway 190) have filed for an accounting of the management of the Georgia Mathews estate by Wilber Carl Bruton.

Bruton was appointed administrator of the Mathews estate upon her death in July 1976. In her will Mathews left all of her real houses to the people living in them at the time of her death.

Bruton allegedly collected rent from the new owners of the homes for some time afterwards. He continued to charge the residents the \$25 a week they were paying when Mathews was alive.

The Church of Christ was given Mathews' home and 50 acres of land. The church is having to keep up the water well which serviced the homes. When the city of Woodville was approached about putting in water lines to Carlo Hill, which is outside the city limits, the city said only when the matter of the deeds to the land is cleared up.

Harry Stafford, counsel for the Church of Christ, said that a hearing was held and Bruton was removed as administrator and Jim Gainey was appointed to the post.

The residents no longer have to pay the rent, but many want to get the deeds to their land, and get back the money they had unnecessarily paid for rent.

Stafford said that they have filed for an accounting of monies collected and disbursed. He said Bruton has filed an accounting and they are now trying to verify its accuracy.

A hearing was scheduled for Friday, Oct. 27 but Bruton did not appear. The residents of the homes cannot get the deeds to their homes until the accounting is finished.

Stafford said many of the citizens still have receipts for rent and hopefully, they will be able to settle with Bruton and the estate.

The case is scheduled to appear before Judge Allan Sturrock but it does not look like the case will be resolved before 1979, Stafford said. The church is hoping that the case will be resolved so they will not have to maintain the water well, which is now serving 13 homes. They are hoping the city will put in a line that will serve the needs of the residents living there. Stafford concluded.

Illegal Aliens Caught

Seven illegal aliens from Mexico were arrested in Tyler County last week and then deported. The Mexicans were arrested by Department of Public Safety officers Jim Deal and Gerald Corbell on Thursday, Oct. 26, and Friday, Oct. 27.

Deal said he was checking the drivers license of a car that had an equipment violation Thursday on North Magnolia St. in Woodville. No one in the car had a drivers license and no one spoke English, Deal said. He deter-

mined that they were illegal aliens and brought them to the jail and called the Border Patrol.

When it was verified they were illegal they were held until the Border Patrol arrived to deport them.

Deal and Corbell arrested three more Mexicans Friday evening on Highway 287 near Chester. Their car passed without an inspection sticker and when the car was stopped it was determined that the travelers were illegal aliens.

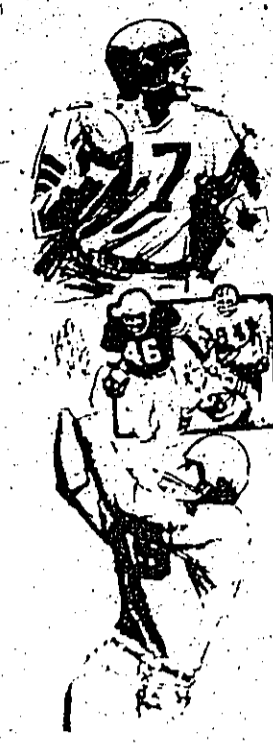

Compare Food Labels

Comparing food labels can help consumers save money, get better nutrition and stay informed. Simply reading labels is important, but careful comparison of several is the real secret of making wise buying choices, because different labels can include different kinds of information. In comparing labels, look for several types of information—all of which must be accurate, according to law, if it appears on a label. Specifically, look for the product's descriptive name, the net weight, a list of contents, the quality or grade if it was graded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture or other government agency, and the name of the plant or company that processed or distributed the food. Also, look for information on the product's nutritive contents and proper storage guidelines. Other possible label information includes freshness dates and assurance that contents were made from wholesome farm products and processed under strict sanitary conditions. On meats, look for the "Inspected for Wholesomeness" emblem of either the state or the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In addition, some labels suggest recipes and serving ideas.

"First You Cry," the dramatic new motion picture-for-television starring Mary Tyler Moore and Anthony Perkins, is the true story of NBC News Correspondent Betty Rollin and her experience with a mastectomy that shook her emotions, her marriage and her outlook on life. It will be broadcast on "The CBS Wednesday Night Movies," Nov. 8.

The real-life account begins when Miss Rollin learns, ironically while working on a television documentary about breast cancer, that she herself has the disease.

Her intimate relations are deeply explored through the reactions of

her husband (played by Perkins), in his first television role in 10 years), David Towers, a former admirer who re-centers her life (Richard Crenna), her best friend, unconventional artist Erica Wells (Jennifer Warren), and her understanding mother (Florence Eldridge).

The story also deals with the special support provided by Miss Rollin's surgeon, Dr. Brennerman (Richard Dysart), whose skill and sensitivity helped her through the trauma of surgery.

Miss Rollin is "really terrifically excited" about the film. She considers the book her "life savor." She explained: "I had to get it down. I had to unleash all those feelings. And to do so, I had to be absolutely honest. I'd say to myself as I was writing it 'You can't say that.' And then I'd say, 'You have to or it won't be real; it won't help you.'"


The author recalls that following her surgery she unleashed these feelings on small things like toothpaste tubes.

"There are all those little things that you can't do at first - like squeeze the toothpaste tube with the hand on the side affected or put on a robe without taking ages," she recalled. "You get mad and desperate about things like that because they unleash an anger about the whole larger situation and you vent it on them."

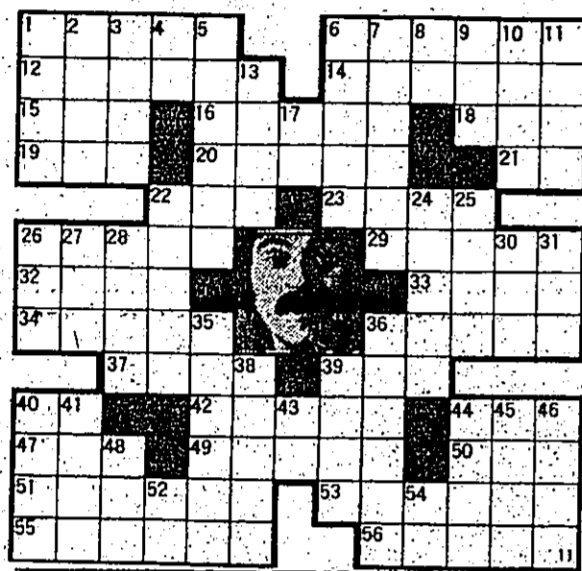

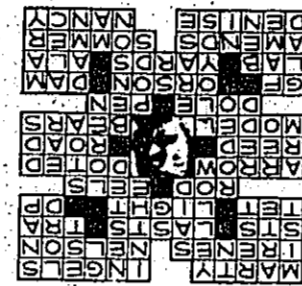

Ozawa's Orchestra Makes Classical Cool

By RICHARD BURGER

The Boston Symphony's Music Director, Seiji Ozawa, via live, closed-circuit TV, gave his very first press conference this week. It was hosted by Michael Steinberg, current director of publications for the Boston Symphony Orchestra.

Ozawa, a musician of both skill and passion, has the honor of conducting his orchestra for the fifth season of PBS's "Evening at Symphony," television's most respected classical music series, and a major subject of the conference.

"We are very lucky to have this situation," declares Ozawa, who finds the broadcasting of his concerts to be a great "stimulation," both for himself and the orchestra.



"It's a marvelous feeling that our program goes all over the United States," he says, "in his broken, Chinese-accented English."

All of the music on these programs is classical, although Ozawa points out that it is intended "not only for the deep music lover." He feels that Evening at Symphony maintains a "balanced" program, and although, as Ozawa admits, the Boston Symphony is regarded by many as "a big tradition orchestra," their repertoire becomes ever more broad-minded under his direction.

Ozawa finds that there is little difference conducting televised and ordinary concerts. He does, however, find one problem: "Probably our enemy in television

shows is light... It's hot. This heat goes to the instruments, and some of the instruments react very much in pitch, so a musician has to be ready to adjust to that. That's difficult. And by the end of the television concert, my head — my dark head — becomes very warm. Maybe that's technology for the future — cool television!"

Ozawa was born in Manchuria in 1935 and lived in China until the age of six. Several years ago he tried to visit his homeland, but was prevented by politics. Then, two years ago, he was invited to China "to see their musical world, and their musical activity, and I was amazed." He wanted very much to conduct their orchestra.

Out of the Medical Series

James Brolin Operates in a Feature Film

In the midst of the mid-Manhattan hustle, two police cars race down a block on Fifth Avenue in the mid-30s and screech to a halt as they round a corner. Two uniformed men rush out of each car and head toward a slightly disheveled man in business suit.

A crowd has gathered, and above the sound of cars, horns, sirens and the patter of feet is heard someone shouting, "Cut!"

A tall man with a face full of whiskers emerges from a recreation vehicle, which serves as a dressing suite for the stars on locations. He doesn't look familiar at first glance. He's dressed in a denim shirt and blue jeans.

At second glance, James Brolin is recognized behind the beard. Pedestrians, who have been drawn to the scene by the commotion start nudging each other and point to Brolin — Dr. Kiley, late of the "Marcus Welby, M.D." series.

James Brolin was never happy in television, not after the first few seasons of "Marcus Welby." He kept praying that the series would be cancelled, and he often pleaded with his producers at Universal Television to release him from the contract. It never happened voluntarily, and Brolin had to wait for "Marcus Welby" to die of natural causes — lack of ratings.

Once the series died, he set his sites on feature films. Although he did several for television, these days, he longs only for theatrical films.

His current involvement is a chase-type movie, "The Night of the Juggler." Although the unusual undertaking has been adapted from a book, which has not sold all that well, producer Jay Weston feels so strongly about this movie that he has raised his own financing. There is no major studio involved.

Brolin has done a number of feature films. Some of the films are unmemorable, like "The Car" and the disastrous "Gable and Lombard." He fared better in "Capricorn One."

"I also have a TV movie coming out which looks good," Brolin says during a break in the shooting. "It's called 'Steele Cowboy,' and it's about a truck driver on the road."

"This is it for me — features," he declared, waving his hand at the camera on the moving pad. "I don't like to say I won't ever do anything in television again, because you never know. But at this point, I want only to do theatrical films."

"It is such a big difference, working for movie

producers, vs. television producers. The movie companies want to spend money to make a better picture. If it costs an extra \$500,000 to improve a scene for a movie, the producer says 'Let's do it.'"

"That never happens in television. The producer gets just so much from the network — his licensing fee. He has to build his fees and profits into that fee. So he wants to keep his budget low. A feature-film producer is willing to spend more to make a better movie that will bring him more dollars at the box office. The television producer knows he only receives what the networks want to give him, and he has no opportunity to increase that amount, unless he can make foreign deals. So he doesn't want to spend more for a better film. He wants to spend less for better profit. I don't blame the TV producer, but I don't want to be part of it."

Brolin speaks of Castellano: "I can understand why he may have had problems getting jobs. He comes very high. How did we get him? We gave him his price."

According to Castellano, who plays a skillful detective who figures out the mistaken-identity crises, "I got to a point where I figured that I had nothing to prove anymore. I knew what I have. So, if I liked the project, and they liked me — were willing to meet my fee — we were in business."

Star Scene Peter Graves Searches for a New Mission

New television series bowing in September used to have until Christmas to make the grade. But times change. Rating somewhere lower than 40th in nationwide popularity polls according to the Nielsen service now means sudden death.

Thus, NBC has already axed Joe Namath's "Waverly Wonders," though critics held out some hopes that the series could smooth out and develop.

Gone, too, is "Mary," Mary Tyler Moore's first crack at a weekly variety show. And not surprisingly. The hold-over affection from her quality situation comedy just wasn't enough. While most critics didn't out and out hate "Mary," they couldn't praise it either. Compared to the great polished spectacles starring Carol Burnett and Julie Andrews, Mary's effort, though sweet, was minor. Variety shows — even the best — have fared poorly in recent years. Still, Mary and her producer husband Grant Tinker are getting the green light from CBS to try again. Something more razzle-dazzle will bow next month.

Well now we know. Osmond Television, headquartered in Provo, Utah, can handle more than the studio-based "Donny and Marie" programs. Osmond engineers dispatched to Tulsa are just winding up coverage of the '78 International Music Festival (country, rock, etc). Roy Clark was the Saturday night headliner. Mel Tillis is doing the finale. Entrepreneur Jim Halsey says a string of radio stations will run lapings of the conclave in future weeks.

Our "The show must go on" note of the week: Personable, quick-witted Nick Yanni is one of the most likable workaholics around, and his health is the last thing he pays attention to. He's television critic to two publications in New York (Soho News and Cue magazine), so he's screening programs daily until his eyes pop.

Recently Yanni took up hosting a live, weekly talk show. Last Monday night his cheeks photographed bright pink because he was walking around with a case of pneumonia that landed him in a hospital early Tuesday a.m. But he wouldn't see a doctor before the program. "One of the guests had flown in from out of town especially. I just couldn't let the panelists down," he whispered hoarsely, but triumphantly, over the phone from his sickbed. "Besides, it turned out to be a good show."

In case you've wondered why Tom Baker, whose

It's been four years since Peter Graves stopped working on "Mission: Impossible." The tall, silver-haired actor became synonymous with intrigue for millions of television viewers around the world. As Jim Phelps, he personified espionage.

Why, of all the spy and intrigue series of the late '60s, was "Mission: Impossible" so popular?

Peter answers, "I don't know. It was unique, but good, unique. Well conceived, well written, and well acted. It was the brainchild of Bruce Geller, now deceased. He kept quality in it. Part of its success was that it was a different version of a con game, the con game made a cut above most spy shows."

"There's a big audience for intrigue shows," he continues. "Mission: Impossible" was the right combination of all the ingredients. Barbara Bain won three Emmys in a row, partly because she had the best women's role in TV.

"There can be a lot of hack writers involved in television, but we didn't use those people. One writer used to complain to me that he could do three 'Lucys,' one 'Bonanza' and a 'Gunsmoke' in the time it took to do a 'Mission: Impossible.'"

Although "Mission: Impossible" was only a TV series, filming the adventure sequences put Peter in some hair-raising binds.

Peter had been working out in the desert on a western when one thrilling situation caught him by the heels. "I had just come out of a movie with Doris Day, 'The Ballad of Josie.' I figured 'Mission: Impossible' would be a cushy break. Instead, the first episode was out on desert where I was supposed to be dying of thirst." When the

rescue helicopter picks up Jim Phelps on a long rope, the pilot said, "If we start coming down, you'll land first. Keep running."

Peter chuckles and admits, "I do less stunts than I used to do. You can get hurt, really hurt."

"One near escape," he continues, "... I was supposed to be blown up in a car by the bad guys. A look-a-like dummy was placed in the car to trick them. I went over to take a look at it, walked 20 feet away, and some dummy tripped the cord." Peter fails to chuckle over that incident. He almost went up in flames, too.

After the thrills and esteem of "Mission: Impossible," Peter isn't desperate to return to TV.

"I'm not that actively looking for a new series," he reveals. "There's been nothing in the last couple of years. Networks changed

their ideas of what to put on: I don't work well in 'Happy Days' or 'Jeffersons.'"

He continues, "I've enjoyed being off it, doing different things. I like the action-intrigue format. I'd like to do something like that."

"Mission: Impossible" was my biggest series in terms of recognition. It plays all over the world, in 85 countries. That's extraordinary attention, more than most U.S. TV series.

"It makes you choose, sure, when you do a new show like that, a new series has to be as good or better, or go off in a different area."

If "Mission: Impossible" was such a fantastic series, why did it fizzle?

"After seven years, it was starting to run down," Peter says. "There was a battle of some kind be-

tween the studio and the network. There weren't fresh ideas."

Since then, Peter has done "Where Have All the People Gone?," a science fiction film about a family on a camping trip in the mountains. Because they're camping, they avoid a nuclear explosion.

Peter will guest-star this season on the Thanksgiving episode of "Love Boat."

"I did a 'Love Boat' for fun," he explains. "I play a minister who falls in love with a stripper." Roz Kelly (she played Ponzie's girlfriend, Pinky Tuscadaro, on "Happy Days") is the stripper. "She turns out to be a good actress," Peter concedes.

"Van Johnson and June Allyson are also in the episode. It's their first time together in 25 years. They play a couple. She's going blind, but won't admit it. It's rather touching."

Peter insists, "I almost never do guest shots. This just appealed to me. Everyone wants to get in on 'Love Boat.'"

Right now, Peter is looking at a pilot possibility for next season. He's also initiated his first production adventure.

The veteran actor excitedly exclaims, "I've bought a book, 'The Man From Yesterday,' a spy thriller for theatrical production. Jack Smith (of 'Airport '77') has written a screen play. It's starting to come together. It's my first production venture. I read it, liked it, thought it was right for me."

Once the script is done, Peter will star as the London-based, American C.I.A. man. "It's a good mystery." He insists that he's not partial to intrigue.

"When you have a successful series, people think of you that way. It's not a preference. I liked the story."
