With holiday baking just around the corner it's time to turn our attention to the subject of churning. Churning, as it was once done, a now a thing of the past. and there, I for one am perfectly willing to let it remain. Tasks on our hill were supposed to be allotted according to age and ability to perform. The suspicion lingers, however, that they were often meted out accord-

ing to the pecking order of the hens of the household. Since there was no other chicken lower in the pecking order, and, since the littlest idiot just big enough to stand by the churn and hang on to the stick with both hands could pump the paddle up and down in the crockful of cream and clabber; it too often fell my lot to dothis onerous job.

Two corners of a huge flour sack cloth knotted at the back of the neck served as protection from the spatters of milk that splashed up through the hole in the lid. Thus conditioned the churner began the long. tedious sentence of servitude.

The pumping was endless. First with the right hand until the arm ached, then with the left, then both. together in a rapid spurt, the plashing went on. Stand awhile, sit awhile and still the end was nowhere in sight. A careful lifting of the lid with the paddle revealed not a single speck of butter

There were ways to alleviate the boredom; but let me stress that these easements had to be strictly in the mind. Any oral activity would have been met with gibes and catcalls from the other siblings not thus doomed. The multiplication tables lent themselves admirably to keeping time to the plashing of the paddle. It was even better if you hummed them silently to a made up rune "Start by pushing down on the stick and say "Two." up on "times", down on "one", up on "are", down on "two" and so on as far as was familiar. There had to be; a slight adjustment in the rhythm when "two times seven." are fourteen was reached. Keeping time with the plunger through all the multiplication tables takes up a. good deal of time. Surely the butter should be ready.

### Compare Food Labels

Comparing food labels can help consumers save money, get better nutrition and stay informed. Simply reading labels

is important, but careful comparison of several is the real secret of making wise buying choices, because different labels can include different kinds of information.
In comparing labels, look
for several types of information-all of which must be

accurate, according to law, if it appears on a label.
Specifically, look for the product's descriptive name. the net weight, a list of contents, the quality or grade if it was graded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture or other government agency, and the name of the plant or company that processed or distributed the food.

Also, look for information on the product's nutritive contents and proper storage

Other possible label information includes freshness dates and assurance that con-tents were made from whole-some farm products and processed under strict sanitary

On meats, look for the Inspected for Wholesomeness" emblem of either the state or the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In addition, some labels suggest recipes and serving ideas.

### Peter Graves Searches for a New Mission

It's been four years since Peter Graves stopped working on "Mission: Impossible." The tall, silver-haired actor became synonymous with intrigue for millions of televison viewers around the world. As Jim Phelps, he personified-espionage.

Right now, Peter is looking at a pilot possibility for next season. He's also initiated-his-first-production adventure.

The veteran actor excitedly exclaims, "I've bought a book, The Man From Yesterday, a spy thriller for theatrical production. Jack Smith (of 'Airport' '77') has written a screen play. It's starting to come together. It's my first production venture. I read it, liked it, thought it was right for me.
