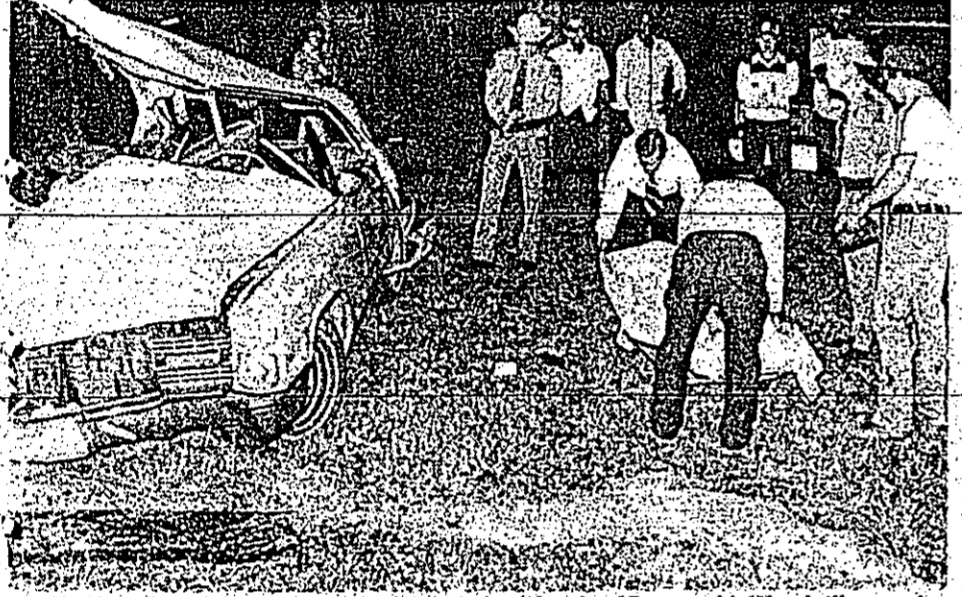
Death Toll Jumps

"When is it going to stop," said Department of Public Safety officer Gerald Corbell, as he walked from investigating a two-car-fatal accident scene after dark, on November 25, just east of Warren.

"They just keep coming and they keep getting killed."

November has proved to be a bad month for motorists in Tyler County, with 6 persons killed, bringing this year's total to 10.

Corbell, who just began duty here about a year ago, had the misfortune of working three of the four "fatals" this month, with partner

Jethro Holmes Rites Held

WOODVILLE—Funeral services for Mr. Jethro Henry Holmes, 84, of Woodville, were held Sunday, November 26, 1978 at 2:00 p.m. in Edwards Funeral Home Chapel, with Rev. Charles Haynes officiating at the services. Burial followed in the City Cemetery in Jasper, Texas.

Mr. Holmes died at 5:45 p.m. Friday, November 24, in Woodville Convalescent Center, after a short illness. A native of San Augustine, Texas, Mr. Holmes had made his home in Woodville for the past 42 years. He received National Coverage in 1933, as one of the leaders in the March on Washington for Veterans of Foreign Wars Bonus. He was a veteran of WWI serving in France. Also, Mr. Holmes received state wide coverage in the past years for his ox cart and twin oxen. Tom and Jerry, traveling as far as San Antonio for the Folk Life Festival.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Dallie V. Holmes; one son, James Holmes, of Woodville; four daughters: Mrs. Marie Walker, from Dam B. area, Mrs. Evelyn Johnson and Barbara Smith both of Woodville, and Mrs. Delmar Seymour of Cleveland, Texas; two brothers: Corbie Holmes of Woodville, and A.D. Holmes of Port Arthur; two sisters, Mrs. Millie Falgout of Bridge City and Mrs. Marie Blankenship of Spurger; fourteen grandchildren; and eight great grandchildren.

Burial was held at 2:00 p.m. in Edwards Funeral Home Chapel, with Rev. Charles Haynes officiating. Interment was in the City Cemetery in Jasper, Texas. Survivors include: Mrs. D. M. Holmes, B.A. Barclay, C.A. Hudson and R.A. Hudson.

With the holiday season just around the corner the BOOSTER felt a review of the past grueling month may result in slowing drivers down

and inhibit persons possibly from mixing alcohol with gasoline.

The following is excerpted from DPS officer's reports for the month of November: Friday, Nov. 10, 12:55 p.m. Five miles south of Warren, a grinding two vehicle head-on crash just after noon, saw a young 17-year old Kountze youth, Gary Wayne Gooch, killed in an accident involving a 18-wheeler fully loaded with liquified caustic acid and headed north to Texarkana.

Officer's reports show the "cause of accident" attributed to "non-experienced unqualified driver."

"Driver education would have come in handy in this case," Officer Corbell said. "The juvenile did not have a driver's license and had just purchased the car the same day of the accident."

Gary Wayne Gooch had celebrated his 17th birthday the day before. His father, Corbell said, drove up on the scene minutes after the accident occurred.

A two-car collision Tuesday, Nov. 14, at 9 p.m. killed a husband and wife, Ralph Sullivan, 48, of Woodville, and Freda Cruse Sullivan, 59, of Woodville; who were traveling north, and 68-year-old Umbra Follie, of Woodville, traveling south. Officers surmise that the Sullivan vehicle crossed the center lane, striking the Follie pickup truck, causing it to flip upside and down an embankment.

On Saturday, November 25, Corbell investigated another fatal one car accident, between Spurger and Fred, leaving a two month old infant dead at the scene. The driver of the vehicle, according to officers, swerved off the road at some 60 miles per hour, into a large oak tree, head on, leaving three persons seriously injured. Driver of the vehicle, George Scott, 23, of Beaumont, was left with two broken legs, a broken hand, a brain concussion and massive internal injuries. Scott faces charges of involuntary manslaughter with a motor vehicle and for driving without a license.

Injured in that accident also, were Donald Ray Gill, 27, of Woodville, listed in serious condition at John Sealy Hospital in Galveston; and 15-year old, Vanessa Broussard, the mother of the infant, which succumbed in the wreck.

"Cause of accident" listed as "Speed" and driving while intoxicated.

Also, on Saturday, Nov. 25 at 6:25 p.m., one mile east of Warren on FM 1943, Officer Corbell worked another fatal accident which left another 17-year-old dead at the scene.

Killed was George Pleasant Bean, Jr., 17, of Woodville, a passenger in a 1966 Cadillac car driven by Bobby Jean Judaleit, 18. Officer reports indicate that the Judaleit driven vehicle failed to negotiate a turn at high speed and drifted across the center line, hitting a westbound jeep driven by Glen Knott, 25, of Spurger, head on. Knott was treated and released from Tyler County hospital.

According to Officer Corbell, the same 1966 Cadillac, driven by Judaleit and with Bean as a passenger and one other youth, was stopped in the same vicinity, and issued a warning and suggestion from Officer Corbell to go directly home. Corbell said he stopped the three and issued a warning for a muffler violation. Corbell said he made the contact with the youth about 12:15 a.m. the night before.

"With Christmas coming up and the holidays, we've got to let the people know to stop driving fast and to slow down and drive defensively," Corbell said.

The officer said that of the accidents occurring in November, that seven vehicles were "total" and six lives lost. "It's got to stop," he said.

Funds Still Sought For Drug Dog

Funds are still being sought to enable the Sheriff's Department to purchase a Narcotic Detection Dog and train personnel in handling the dog. Commissioners Court has indicated a "favorable" interest in the purchase but feel that they need a demonstration of such an animal's work and more public input before they can

consider the possibility of allocating funds for this purpose. The purchase price of the animal is \$5,000 which includes the dog and training of personnel in handling it. This price is up \$1,500 from the time the last article appeared in the BOOSTER concerning the project. According to Sheriff's Deputy, Butch Kraus, this is still the best price on the market for this type of dog. As soon as half of the cost can be garnered, a contract can be signed and thus, the chance of inflation raising the price again, can be avoided.

If the \$5,000 can be

raised, the dog would become the property of the people of Tyler County. It would be maintained by the handler and available for use by all of the county's law enforcement agents. According to Kraus, two people would be trained to handle the animal, himself and another official, so that the dog and a handler can be on call 24 hours a day.

If the purchase goes through, Kraus would assume the responsibility for sheltering the dog and he would make arrangements for care of the dog should he be out of town, so that the dog would remain available at all times.

"The drug problem in Tyler County has not gone away in the past few weeks," according to Kraus, "and the problem is growing every day." He states that it goes as far as to involve 13-year-old children. Kraus reports that Lufkin Chief of Police Latham feels that use of the Narcotic Detection Dog in Lufkin has resulted in a 95% elimination of the drug problem in the Lufkin schools.

Kraus states that a detection dog would probably be worth 3 or 4 other employees added to the department.

WOODVILLE—The United States has considerable energy resources, and it is up to all Americans to decide if and how those resources are going to be used and developed.

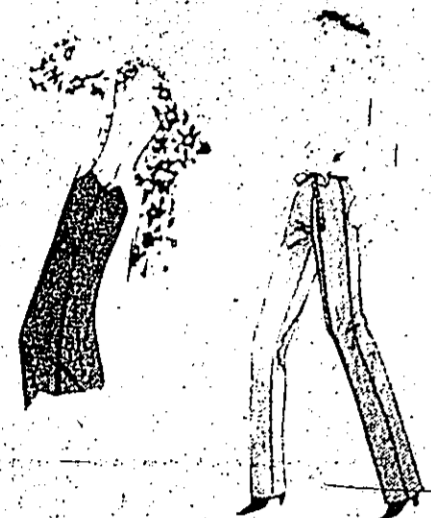

Texas Farm Bureau Announces Awards

DALLAS—Texas Farm Bureau announced its annual awards in the fields of membership, information and public relations, and safety for numerous county Farm Bureaus during the state convention at the Dallas Hilton this week.

The state's largest farm organization reports a gain of 13,882 members in the past fiscal year ending Oct. 31, bringing the total to 228,197 member families. The convention brings more than 1,100 voting delegates from the 212 organized Farm Bureau counties to the 45th annual state meeting to formulate policies on state issues, as well as recommendations to the American Farm Bureau Federation on national and international affairs.

The AFBF national convention will be held in Miami Beach in January.

Gillespie County Farm Bureau received the special membership award for having done the most to promote membership awareness in the county.

Six county Farm Bureaus were presented with awards for having done the most outstanding job of information and public relations in their respective counties. Judged according to membership categories, first and second place awards were given. Winners in the Low Membership category are Lampasas, first place, and Karnes, second place. In the Middle Membership category, Colorado won first place, and Guadalupe was second. Bear County won first place in the High Membership group, with Ellis coming second.

Harris County received three special membership awards for the largest number of new members, the largest gain, and the largest total membership. Lampasas County received a special membership award for the

largest continuous gain in membership of 31 percent.

The ten counties with the largest number of members (in descending order) are: Harris, McLennan, Fort Bend, Van Zandt, Wharton, Fayette, Ellis, Hidalgo, Bell and Nacogoches.

The top ten counties with the largest number of new members are Harris, Brazos, Van Zandt, Hunt, Hidalgo, Brazoria, Dallas, McLennan, Grayson and Shelby.

The counties recording the largest gains (which include renewals and new members) are Harris, Brazoria, Dallas, Hunt, Jasper, Tyler, Fort Bend, Burleson, Palo Pinto and Montgomery.

Three counties are included in the '95 Plus Club which means they renewed at least 95 percent of their 1977 members. They include Rockwall, Hemphill and Blanco. Others in the top ten counties in renewal percentages are Jackson, Briscoe, San Patricio, Llano, McCulloch, Goliad and Matagorda.

District 11 was "Honor District" for having the largest district gain of 3,178 members for a total district membership of 31,275. Counties in District 11 are Austin, Brazoria, Brazos, Chambers, Fayette, Fort Bend, Grimes, Harris, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, Washington and Wharton.

The "Merit District" for having the highest percentage of renewals was District 12 with 90.06 percent. Counties in District 12 are Bee, Caldwell, Calhoun, DeWitt, Goddard, Gonzales, Guadalupe, Jackson, Karnes, Lavaca, Refugio, Victoria and Wilson.

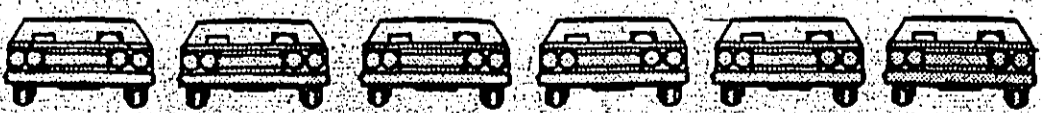

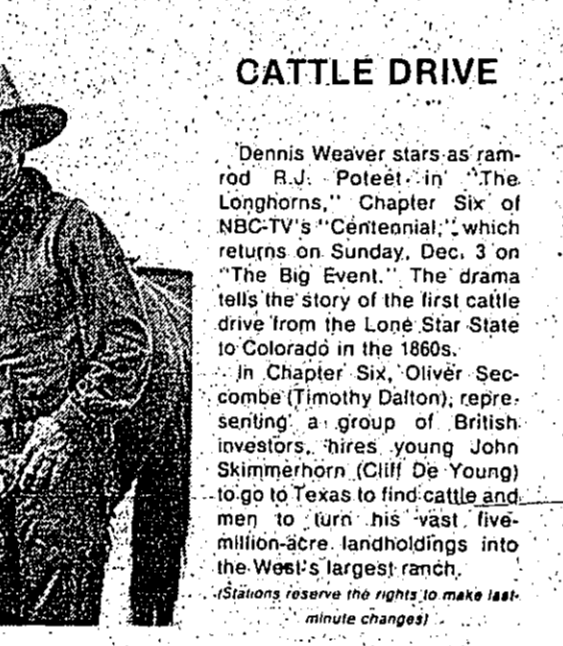

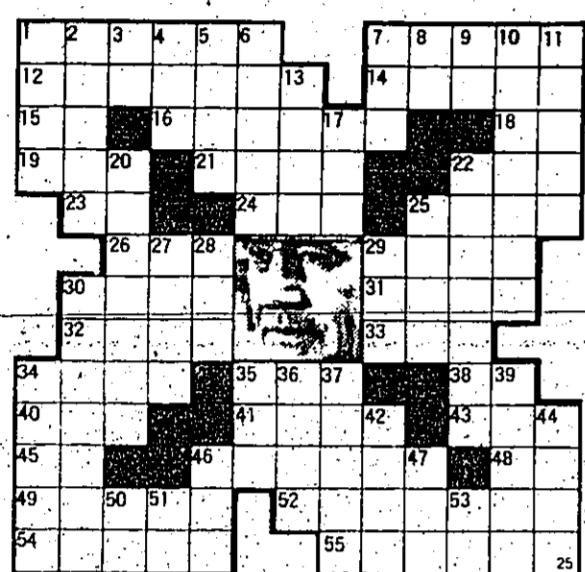

"Joey and Redhawk," the first young people's weekday miniseries, will broadcast Monday, Dec. 4 through Friday, Dec. 8 on CBS.

"Joey and Redhawk" is the story of two 14-year-old boys from completely different backgrounds who meet under strange circumstances and resolve some of the difficulties and heartaches of growing up and dealing with the adult world as, together, they face hardships, dangers and challenges in the Colorado Rockies.

Joey Harker (Chris Petersen), a sensitive, intelligent boy from a middle-class Ohio family, is being forced by his father to emulate the achievements of an accomplished, athletic older brother who

died in a tragic accident. Redhawk (Guillermo San Juan), a full-blooded Indian, is in conflict with older, traditional Indian ways and values being imposed by the white world. Though their initial relationship is wary and short-tempered, their mutual respect increases as they discover more about each other. Alone, and in an emergency situation, which requires great courage and strength, the boys find, through their independence, a new self-worth.

All About People You Love to Hate

When author Grace Metalious first wrote the novel "Peyton Place," she presented a slice of small town life never before examined in a mass media work. Behind the surface friendliness and morality, stories of extramarital affairs, accidental pregnancies and other scandals quickly became sources of

shame, gossip and blackmail. That best-selling tale became a successful film and television series, and it now has a worthy successor in the CBC drama "Dallas."

The similarities are apparent though, the setting has escalated from a relatively peaceful hamlet to bustling Dallas, Tx.

"Dallas" has its wealthy and its not-so-wealthy residents, those who inherit power and others who wage a constant struggle to gain it, those who enjoy controlling others and those who won't stand for it.

The central figures in the story comprise the Ewing family, one of the most powerful clans in contemporary Texas. Widely recognized as a major force in the state's oil industry, the Ewings live, love and bicker on the grounds of their sprawling Southfork Ranch, a true mansion for so-called "beautiful people."

The family patriarch, Jock (Jim Davis), is a man who literally built his own empire. He worked in the oil fields himself, doing hard labor, which gave him a healthy physique that remains with him even as he approaches old age. Jock is a stubborn, fiercely independent man with a one-track mind ... matched in character by his somewhat more patient and compassionate wife, Ellie (Barbara Bel Geddes).

Jock and Ellie parented three boys. One of them, Gary, left the Ewing spread after an embarrassing situation involving

a girl's pregnancy, and the ongoing problem of power within the family drove him away. The other two sons remain, helping to run matters in an extremely uneasy and often explosive alliance.

J.R. Ewing (Larry Hagman) is a man driven by corruption, greed and dirty dealing — all elements that he considers merely tools of survival. J.R. allows nothing to stand in his way — not even his own brother, Bobby (Patrick Duffy), who is rightfully supposed to be in on all Ewing corporate decisions.

On the other hand, Bobby is the family idealist, not ashamed of his clan's reputation of being all-powerful, but also not in the habit of using that reputation in a selfish way. The ultimate instance in which Bobby proved that he does his own thing was his marriage to the beautiful Pamela Barnes (Victoria Principal).

Pam's background is in direct opposition to that of the Ewings. Her family has no money, she was a recognized town flirt before meeting Bobby, and she has a highly structured morality. She is constantly in conflict with the rest of her new family over some matter, especially when it comes down to J.R. and his underhanded maneuvers. Pam is the most sympathetic character; she is the loner trying to stave off total domination.

J.R. is also backed by a woman, his pushy wife, Sue Ellen (Linda Gray). Though she has the faintest trace of humanity, she's out to become the First Lady of Southfork Ranch ... and she fears that losing her husband will permanently keep her away from that dream. Sue Ellen does virtually all she can to hold onto her man.

Meanwhile, watching the action "mostly" from the sidelines are Lucy Ewing (Charlene Tilton), Gary's

daughter who was taken in by the family, and Ray Krebbs (Steve Kanaly), a hired hand who finds it hard to keep his mind off the attractive ladies surrounding him.

"Dallas" had its roots in a five-part miniseries that aired last spring. It is unique among current shows in that the sympathy factor is very hard to find. The program's major premise is soundly based on the "people-you-love-to-hate" theory, since many of the stories depict Ewing family members tossing morals and honesty to the wind and working toward self-serving results.

Many of the program's stars have lengthy acting backgrounds. Jim Davis is a veteran Western star who has been in the profession for decades, as has Barbara Bel Geddes, who created many memorable roles on Broadway and in films.

The two Ewing sons are portrayed by a pair of actors well established in the television medium. Larry Hagman has appeared in several series, including "I Dream Of Jeannie" and "The Good Life," as well as feature films including "Stardust."

Patrick Duffy became well known last year in a somewhat lesser role, that of "The Man From Atlantis," during which he spent much more time in a water tank than in the magnificent vehicles he's permitted to drive in "Dallas."

Victoria Principal is also backed by an impressive list of screen credits, notably "Earthquake" and "The Life and Times of Judge Roy Bean" with Paul Newman. "Dallas" marks her TV series debut.

They may be people you love to hate, but the feuding Ewing clan is one of television's most unusual families. They make CBC's "Dallas" an interesting place to visit, even if you wouldn't want to live there.

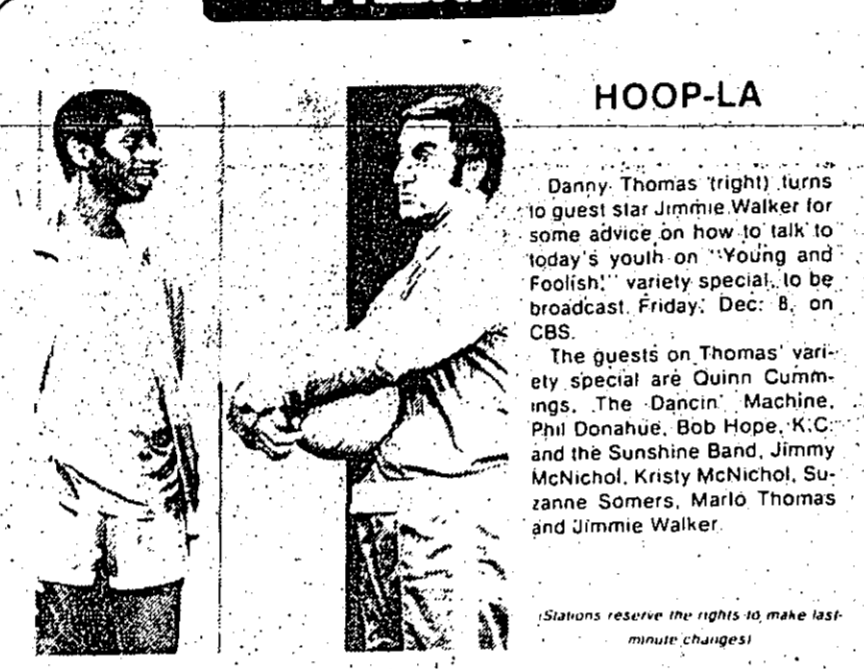
