## Sheltered Workshop Gets \$10,000 Check

**DIBOLL** - The T.L.L. Temple Foundation has awarded a \$10,000 grant to the Tyler County Mental and Physical Handicap Association, Inc. to fund its sheltered workshop in Woodville, according to Foundation trustee Ward Burke.

Funds will be used to remodel the building which will house the workshop, according to Maxie Riley, president of the Tyler County Mental and Physical Handicap Association. The workshop is scheduled to open June 1, 1980.

Citizens in the Woodville area have raised nearly \$10,000 for the workshop through various community activities, including a Bike-A-Thon which raised nearly \$5,000. Other funding for the workshop has come from the Texas Rehabilitation Commission, which endorses the center.

T.L.L. Temple Foundation grants to various agencies and institutions in East Texas total \$111,145 for fiscal year 1980.

Formed expressly for the purpose of creating a sheltered workshop, the Tyler County Mental and Physical Handicap Association is in its first year of operation. The new workshop will assist mentally and physically handicapped citizens in Tyler County in learning basic work skills in a sheltered environment.

### Majority Of One

Dear President Carter:  
It's getting where I'm almost afraid to go to my bank anymore. Everytime I look, my savings are getting smaller, and smaller. At first I thought they were making a mistake on my account, but there's no mistake. Another villain has been taking my money for years, and I never realized it. Mr. President, your government, "of the bureaucrats, by the bureaucrats, and for the bureaucrats," is the culprit. Raising my taxes is no way to fight inflation.

Remember when you said that high gasoline prices were "crippling the American economy?" Well, can you tell me how your new ten cent per gallon tax on gasoline is going to lower my cost of living? That new tax of yours is going to generate over \$10 billion in new revenue, does that mean I can expect a check? And what new government agency will you create to oversee it?

See what I mean Mr. President? Everytime you turn around there's another tax, another government department, more bodies, more desks, more telephones, postage, coffee breaks, more government pensions, paid vacations, and nonsense. And before you know it, you need another tax to administrate the waste the first tax produced.

This has got to stop now. We cannot go on paying for runaway inflation, and runaway taxes too. That's simply too much to ask of any reasonable person.

If you really want to stop inflation, consider this: create an incentive to stop government bureaucracy, waste, and countless taxes. The solution is simple: decrease the salary for President and all members of Congress by the same percentage as the current rate of inflation.

That way, if reckless government spending and bureaucracy send us all to the poor house, the ones that put us there will be the first to arrive.

Remember the "good old days" Mr. President, when government provided for a common defense, a system of currency, and little else? Today I can't take ten steps without bumping into someone who works for the government. Now understand me, some of my best friends are government employees. And we've spent many long hours discussing how "The System" works, and they're just as upset as I am. You see, they pay taxes too.

My theory of economics is simple. Working people create 100% of all our nation's wealth. They plow the fields, educate the minds, provide the clothes for our backs, the food for our nourishment, they pave the roads, run the machines, they sweat and toil building a better life for themselves, their children, and their nation. And in the end, government taxes the fruits of their labors, leaving little in return.

The goose that lays the golden eggs is beginning to have second thoughts.

And Mr. President, next time you're down this way, come see us in Tyler County. It's a wonderful, relaxing place, and there are a bunch of people around here who'd really like to talk to you.

### Speed Crackdown Begun By THP

WOODVILLE -- Texas Highway Patrol troopers are going "under cover" in an attempt to better enforce the 55 mph speed limit, according to THP Sgt. Russell Davis of the Livingston office.

In the past, THP troopers were required to remain in plain sight while utilizing radar devices to detect speeding cars, Davis said, adding under the new program, THP personnel may utilize the "natural terrain" and some troopers will be in multi-colored unmarked cars.

The plan, which is now in effect in Tyler County, has been ordered by Col. James B. Adams and is designed to increase the department's effectiveness in dealing with persons who use "fuzz busters" and CB radios in avoiding speeding tickets as well as to reduce the death toll on Texas highways, according to the sergeant.

Traffic deaths in Texas have increased from 3,276 in 1976 to 4,209 in 1979. California is one of the few states in which the number of traffic deaths surpasses those of Texas, Davis said. Although he did not know how the death toll in the two states compares on a per capita basis, he speculated that if compared, "we'd lose severely."

In Tyler County, 12 persons were killed in 1978 and six died in 1979. Although rural accidents have claimed no lives in the county so far this year,

Davis said he felt the county is "keeping up" with the state averages.

In an attempt to reduce fatalities in Tyler County, the Texas Highway Patrol is encouraging support of the 55 mph speed limit as well as the other traffic laws and soliciting the public's assistance in an effort to make our local highways safe in a combined effort, he added.

Prior to this time, the use of radar by the Texas Highway Patrol has been a visibly open operation to the public. As a result, employment of radar detectors and CB radios have restricted a highway patrolman's ability to deal with those habitual violators. In some instances this has resulted in a misconception by the motoring public that "we were not enforcing the speed law fairly."

Col. Adams, who recently assumed leadership of the THP from Col. Wilson E. Spill, has set two goals for 1980, according to Davis. "They are to effect a reduction of fatalities and to achieve greater compliance of the 55 mph speed limit."

"Excessive speeds and DWI continue to be major factors in relation to our traffic fatalities and, as a result, Col. Adams has instructed more aggressive enforcement efforts," Davis said. "This has resulted in utilization of unmarked vehicles, concealed radar detectors and utilization of natural terrain for concealment in an effort to achieve compliance with the Texas traffic laws."

Admission will be \$1 for adults and 50¢ for children with all proceeds going to the pageant. Senior citizens will be admitted free of charge. The two days will be highlighted by the Indian Pow-wow at the Livingston Rodeo arena located 2 miles south on Highway 146. The Pow-wow will begin at 7:30 P.M. featuring the crowning of Miss Indian Texas.

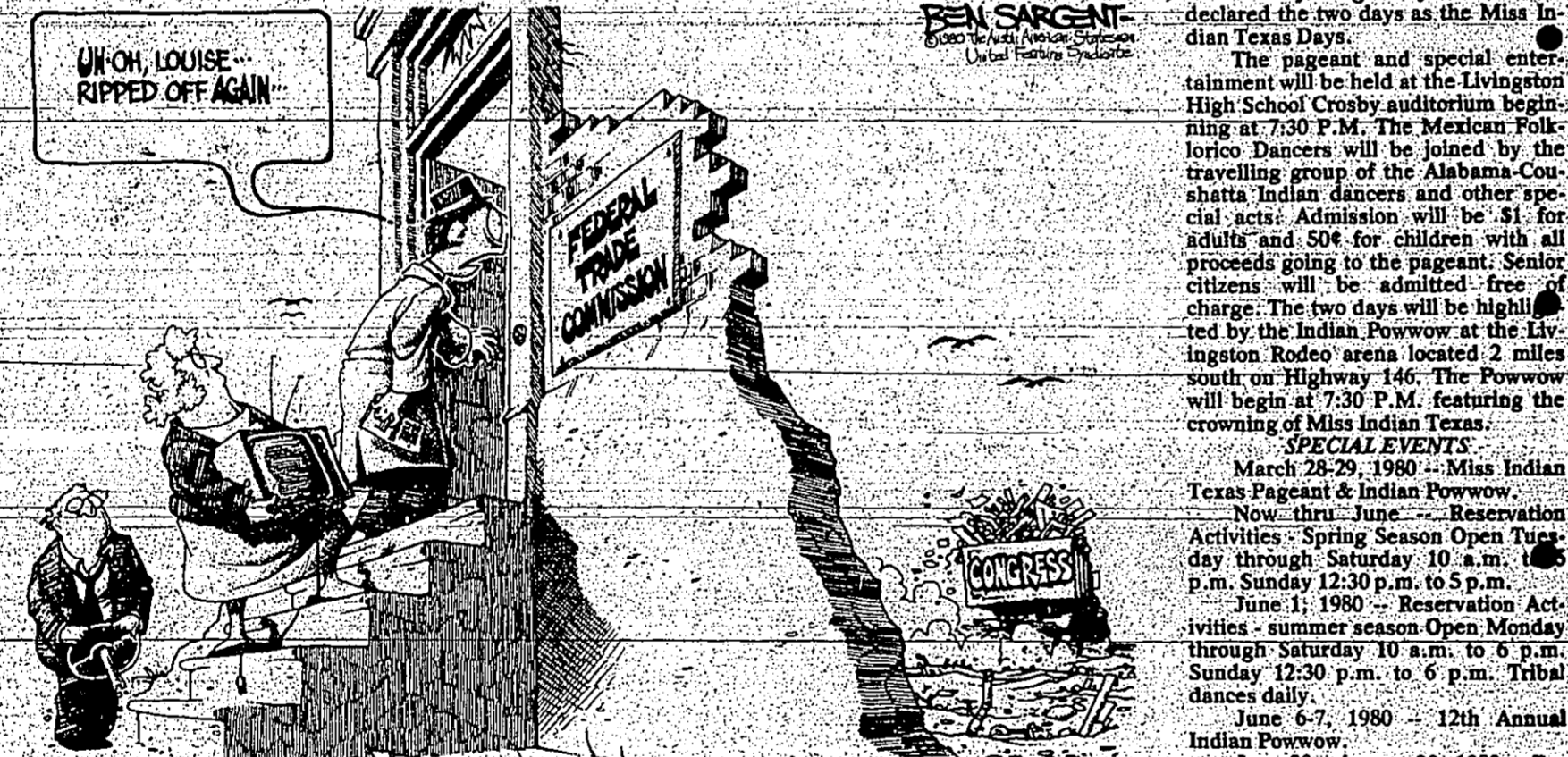

A large group of downtown retailers met in an organizational meeting Friday to discuss ways to improve business conditions in a three block area in the Woodville Central Business District. The group, which agreed to meet again at the Community Room of the Citizens State Bank on Thursday, April 24, identified as an immediate goal an incorporation process which will be drawn and presented for the organizing board's approval at that meeting.

According to Don Cole, a local architect and consultant in the project, "The merchants have got to lean together and organize in a downtown revitalization effort."

### Davis To Release Tax Book

Walton Davis, tax assessor-collector for the city of Woodville, recently announced the availability of a new 12-page pamphlet which may help local residents save on their property taxes.

According to Davis, the pamphlet explains how the property tax system in Texas operates, and highlights possible tax savings available to citizens.

The publication was developed by the State Property Tax Board in accordance with Senate Bill 621, passed by the Texas Legislature in 1979.

Information in the pamphlet is applicable to property taxes collected by all levels of local government, including counties, cities and school districts.

Davis noted that while cities may not offer a general homestead exemption, such as is available from school districts and counties, the city of Woodville does offer locally adopted exemptions for citizens age 65 or older.

He pointed out that the city of Woodville also offers exemptions for disabled veterans, also eligible for exemptions of the U.S. Coast Guard and the American Bureau of Shipping.

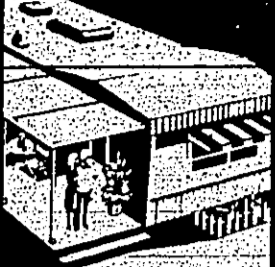

No signs except Official traffic control signs are permitted within the limits of the Highway and Public Right of Way of State Transportation at 713-892-7311, Ext. 200 for Maintenance crews of further information the Department are authorized to issue permits to those erecting campaign signs from State right of way.

The Highway Beautification Act, which became law in 1972, controls the erection of signs on property adjacent to Interstate and Primary Highways. Highways are issued by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, or a new sign for advertising must be created by the State License to part of the newly established U.S. Labor Department in 1915.

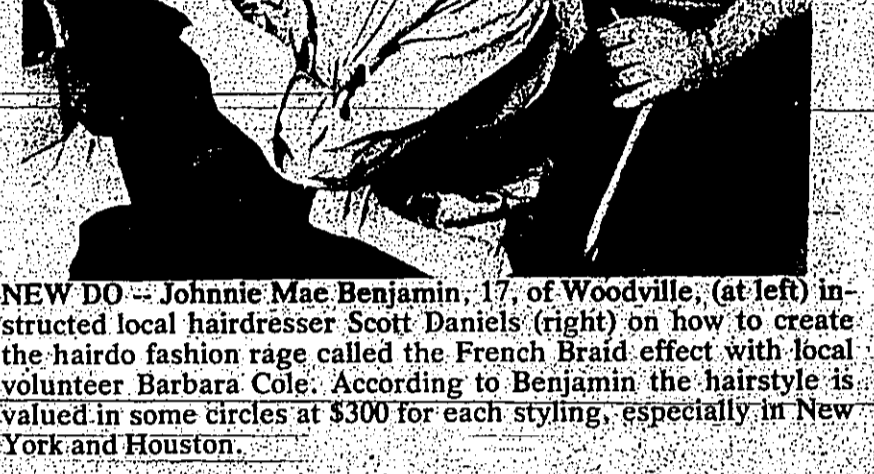
