Hodges Gardens Easter Service Set

The unique Hodges Gardens Easter Service will be held again this year in Louisiana's famous "Garden in the Forest" located between Many and Leesville, Louisiana, on U.S. Highway 171. Now in its twenty-sixth year, the traditional Easter program features the Centenary College Choir and church choirs in the vicinity of Hodges Gardens under the direction of Dr. Will K. Andress.

The service will begin at 5:00 a.m. Easter Morning, April 6 with the Hodges Gardens gates opening at 3:00 a.m. Admission is free. An illuminated cross reflecting in the Hodges Gardens lake will set the mood for the inspirational, non-denominational music and narration beginning in the predawn darkness and ending with the joyous proclamation of the Resurrection as the sun rises over the lake.

Although seating is planned, Hodges Gardens management suggests that visitors bring their own folding chairs and warm clothing and blankets for the predawn chill. After the program ends at sunrise, Hodges Gardens will be cleared and the gates reopened as soon as possible with regular admission prices in effect.

Visitors to Hodges Gardens Easter Day can expect to see a colorful array of spring flowers in bloom including dogwood, azaleas, columbine, geraniums, begonias, pansies, and English daisies. They can also enjoy picnicking and egg hunting in one of Hodges Gardens' two picnic areas and an enjoyable excursion boat ride on the lake.

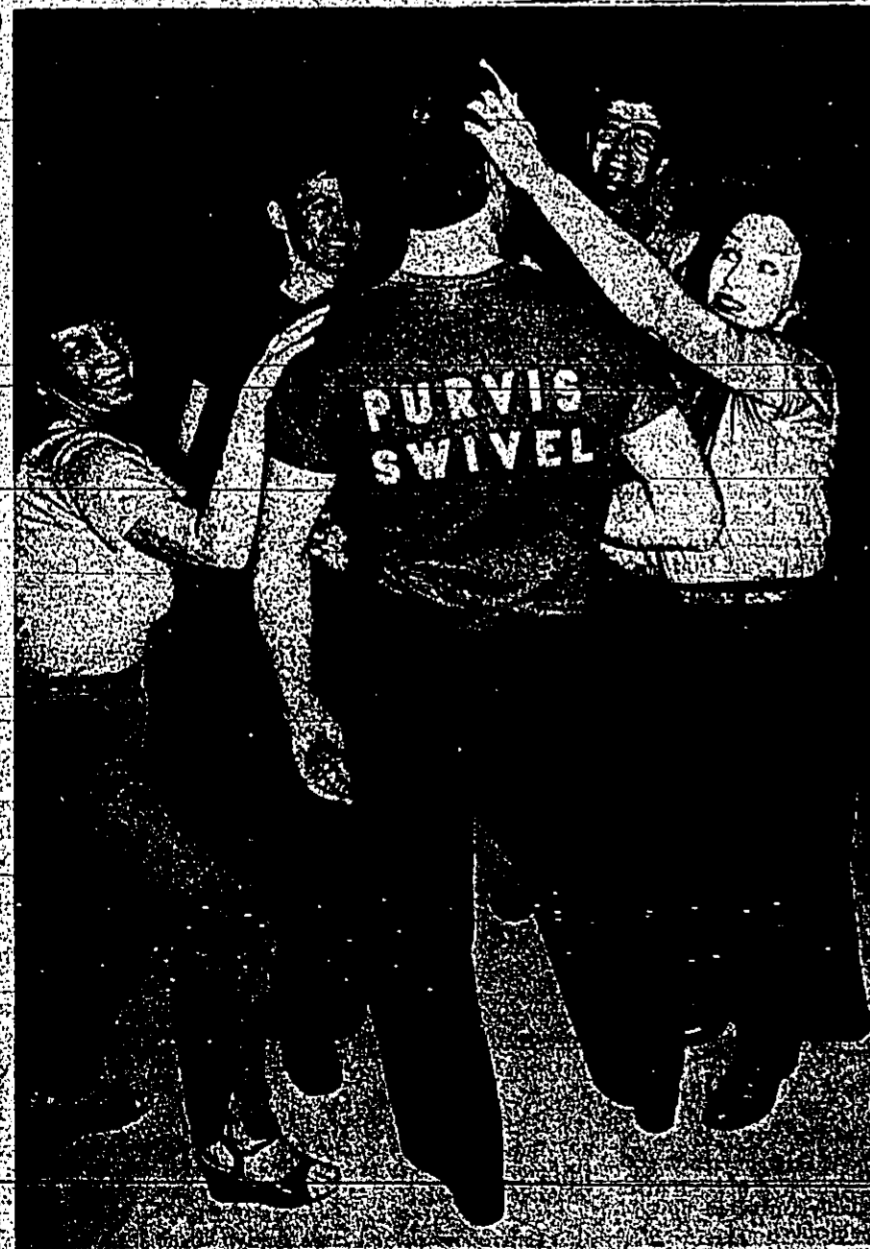
According to President Maxie Riley, the items to be covered in the meeting will include committee status reports and any new business.

Wilson Candidate For Congress

The following is a statement of candidacy of incumbent Congressman Charles Wilson:

"I am taking this opportunity to announce that I am a Democratic candidate for re-election to the U.S. House of Representatives from the Second Congressional District of Texas.

The United States is facing serious problems on several fronts, and the need for strong leadership throughout this decade is indisputable. After serving the people of East Texas in Congress for four terms, I am in an excellent position to influence important decisions on our economy and the national defense.

"I am a member of the House Appropriations Committee, one of the most powerful committees in Congress because of its control over the purse strings of the federal government. This committee has been and will

continue to be a major forum for the continuing effort to balance the federal budget.

"I am also a member of three subcommittees of the full Appropriations Committee: Defense, Foreign Operations and District of Columbia. In my tenure as chairman of the District of Columbia subcommittee, I succeeded in saving the taxpayers roughly \$120 million by forcing Washington's city government to cut back spending.

"I gave up that chairmanship in order to accept a seat on the increasingly more important Defense subcommittee. As a member of that panel, I will have a more direct influence on the Pentagon's annual budget.

"In order to meet the challenges ahead, I believe the United States must increase the amount of money we spend annually on defense. I am in favor of at least a one-half party with the Soviet Union in terms of mil-

itary strength because I believe the Russian threat to our national security is very real.

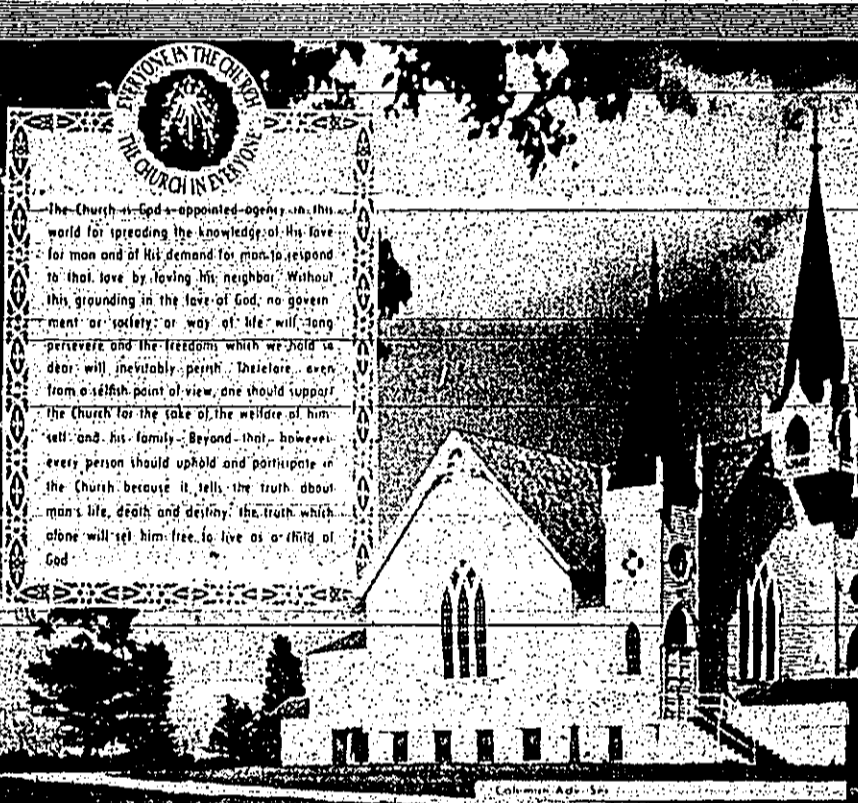

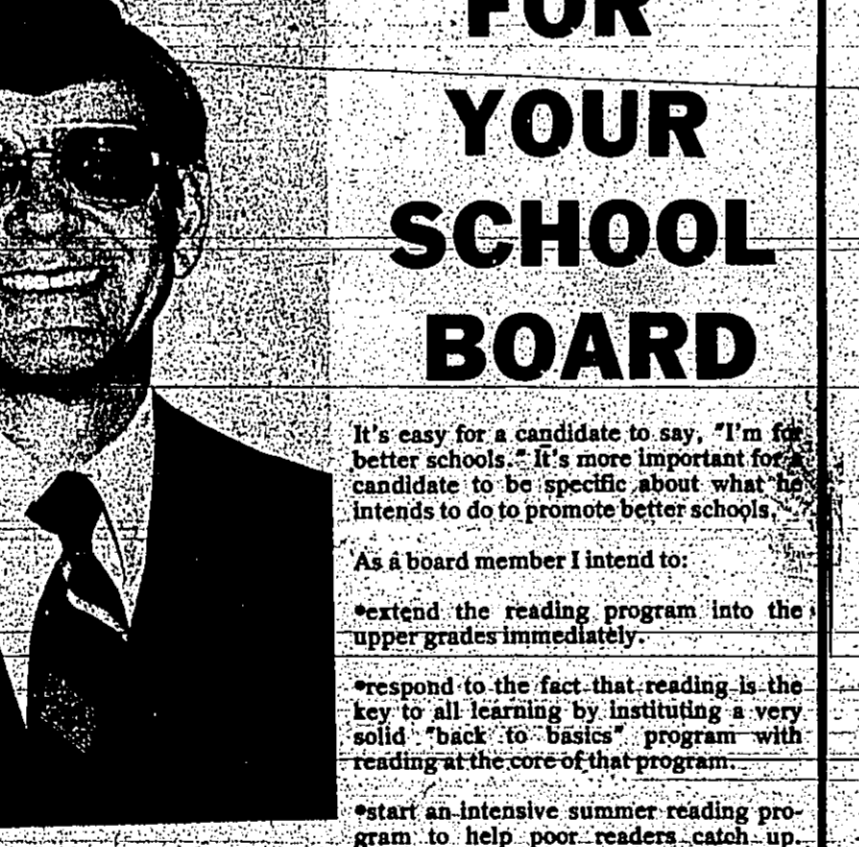

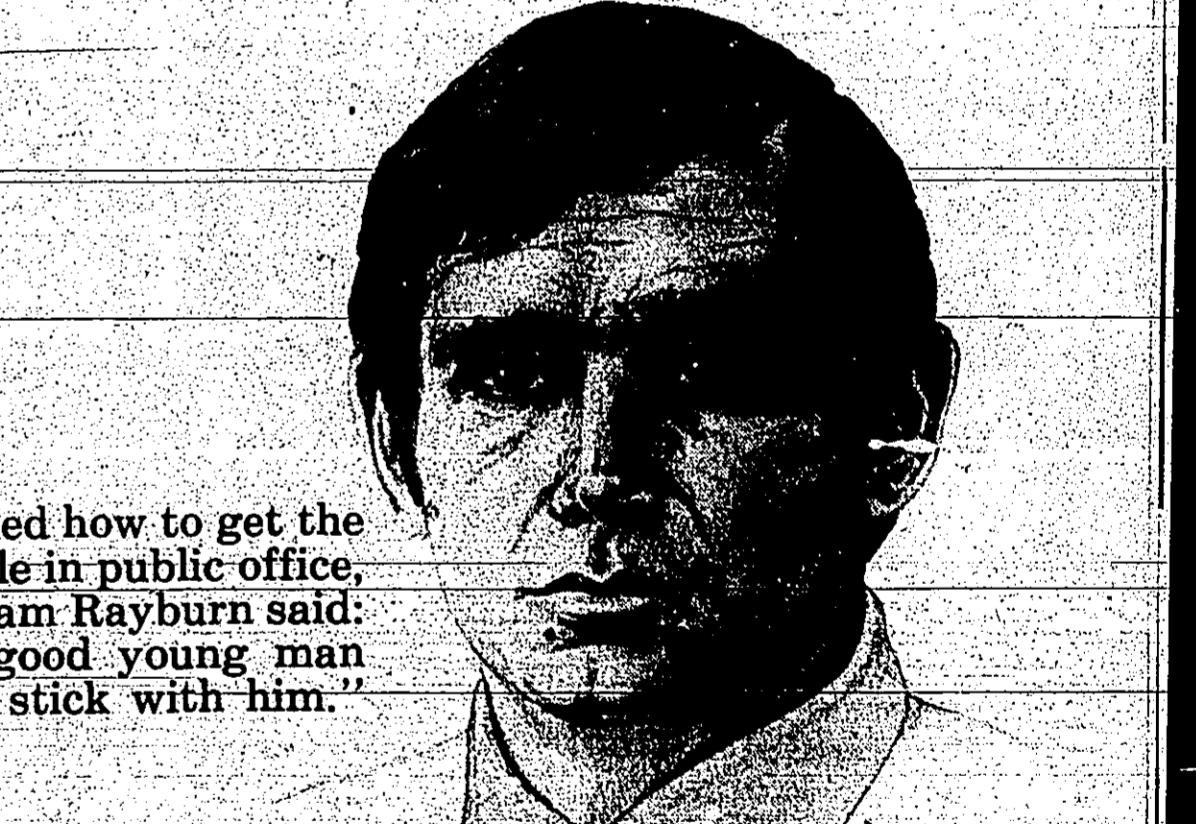

Curriculum Panel To Recommend Changes

AUSTIN - The Curriculum Study Panel, a 24-member committee appointed to examine and recommend possible changes in Texas public school curricula, will hold a series of regional public hearings throughout the state from April 14 through May 14.

The 20 public hearings are designed to help the panel gather the Richardson and professional opinion necessary to build a more effective public school curriculum, according to Joe Butler of Houston, chairman.

Butler, who also chairs the State Board of Education, said the committee will complete its work by December 1, 1980. Its three major products to be presented to the Texas Legislature will include:

(1) A realistic and relevant statement of the desired elements to be included in a well-balanced curriculum.

(2) A description of a "basic curriculum" which could offer students the opportunity to progress toward the Texas Goals for Public School Education.

(3) Proposed changes in both law and State Board of Education policies to ensure implementation of the "basic curriculum" throughout the state.

While the school districts traditionally carry the major responsibility for curriculum, both the Texas Legislature and the State Board of Education to make sure specific elements are included in every district.

As a result, Texas has always had a state core around which local curricula are built.

The full Curriculum Study Panel will meet May 7 to 9 p.m. at the smaller steering committee meetings beginning on October 25, 1979 to review reports from the Texas Education Agency staff and identify issues.

The state curriculum is re-fashioned from time to time by the Texas Legislature and the State Board of Education.

Mrs. Leverage, who also serves on the State Board of Education, believes the panel will identify the issues clearly as it determines its recommendations to the Legislature.

We all believe the advice from parents, educators, and other citizens generated by these public hearings will enable us to focus on specific issues," Mrs. Leverage says.

Panel members include six members of the State Board of Education, the 11 members of the Senate Education Committee, five members of the House Education Committee, and two members of the Governor's Advisory Committee on Education.

Representatives of all education professional organizations will have the opportunity to present their views at a special April 9 hearing to be held in the Senate Chamber of the State Capitol in Austin. The sessions will be scheduled from 9:30 a.m. to noon and from 1:30 p.m. to 5 p.m. to conclude.

Weekly Agriculture Update

The extremely cold weather at the first of March may have taken its toll on the East Texas peach crop. According to Dr. Terry Menges, horticulturist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, approximately 65 percent of the peach buds at Overton received damage from the sub-freezing weather. Both early and late maturing varieties were affected.

Some varieties received almost 100 percent bud damage. Dr. Menges says that a commercial crop of peaches can be set if as many as 12 percent of the buds are good. Damage to the peach crop varied throughout the state.

If a producer desires to check the damage in his orchard or on a tree in the backyard, it is a simple procedure. Pull 20 to 30 buds. Cut the buds lengthwise. The pistil part of the flower should be green in color. If the pistil is dark colored or has a brown spot on it, it is dead and cannot set fruit.

Damaged buds will still produce flowers. However, pollen cannot move into the pistil to form the fruit. Only time will tell just how much damage was done to this year's peach crop. Good management will be extremely important in taking care of the good buds that remain.

Fee for the conference, which includes lunch, is \$12.00 per person and \$20 per married couple, if paid by April 5. Registration will continue at 8:00 a.m. on the day of the conference; the price after the April 5 deadline, is \$15.00 per person. The program begins at 9 a.m. and ends at 3:30 p.m.

Family History is now the country's No. 1 indoor hobby. The conference, always the highlight of the Society's year, will be especially so this year when Bill Linder, a supervisory archivist at the National Archives in Washington, D.C. speaks. A native Texan and graduate of the University of Texas, he has conducted genealogical tours in London and Edinburgh. He is the author of several books, including "How to Trace Your Family History," which is a basic guide to genealogy for beginners. Nugent Blasts

'No Boaters'

AUSTIN - Railroad Commissioner James E. (Jim) Nugent today blasted proposed federal rules which could prohibit weekend motorboating.

"These rules discriminate against an industry and a segment of the population in a way that is totally unacceptable," Nugent said in testimony to be presented to the U.S. Department of Energy.

"A pleasure or fishing boat represents a substantial investment for a working family and their only opportunity to enjoy it may be on the weekend," Nugent stated.

"Prohibiting weekend use would be tantamount to confiscation of that investment."

At issue is a provision being considered by the Department of Energy for inclusion in federal conservation plans. The regulation could be activated by the President to include one or both weekend days.

Nugent also noted that "one man's recreation is another man's vocation," referring to the hundreds of restaurants, motels, marinas and other businesses which depend on weekend water recreation for their livelihood.

"The commercial life of numerous coastal and lakeside communities would be devastated," the Commissioner said.

Nugent stressed that any measures which "cut that deep" must be borne in equal measure by all non-essential energy users and must not fall exclusively on one industry or one group of people.

"I don't think the federal government should be telling people, 'you can drive your car on vacation, but you can't go fishing,' or 'football games are in this year, but water skiing is out,'" Nugent concluded.

Bass Fishing Goes To College

The course will be team taught by several outstanding bass fishermen in the area.

Registration for the bass fishing course is presently being conducted in Room 111 of the Administration Building at Angelina College from 8 A.M. - 4 P.M. After 4 P.M., students may register in Room 104 of the same building until 9 P.M. Cost for the course is \$20.

Wilson Sponsors Bill To Balance Budget

WASHINGTON — A bill recently introduced in the House of Representatives by Jim Wright, Democrat of Texas, would automatically balance the federal budget in January of each fiscal year.

Introduced by House Majority Leader Jim Wright, the proposal has received endorsements from both Democratic and Republican members of the House.

In the state of Texas, the Automatic Budget Board gives us foolproof protection against budget deficits. Whenever budget appropriations exceed the amount of money in the

state treasury, that board just cuts the budget," Wilson said.

"There is no reason we can't adopt a similar strategy to keep the national budget in line."

In the last four years, Congress has had some success with the budget, reducing the deficit from \$66 billion in 1976 to \$29 billion in the 1980 budget, Wilson said.

"And at this very moment, the House Budget Committee is trying to figure out how to leave a surplus in the 1981 budget."

"But we can't leave the budget up to political whim every year," Wilson said.

The Wright budget bill has four important provisions:

"An effective and permanent mechanism of enforcement;

A means by which mid-course corrections can be made;

Restrictions that keep spending priorities under Congressional jurisdiction and not in the hands of the Administration; and

A carefully devised escape hatch that would allow flexibility to unbalance the budget when either Congress or the

President can demonstrate the need to respond to a real emergency.

"This bill would require an impartial statistical review of the budget every January three months into the fiscal year. If we find ourselves with a deficit we didn't expect, every controllable expenditure will then be automatically reduced by the percentage necessary to bring the budget into balance over the remainder of the fiscal year," Wilson said.

Because each budget item would be reduced across the board, the President could not tamper with Congress' original priorities, Wilson added.

"And if we find our-

selves in an emergency that legitimately calls for deficit spending, the President would be allowed to submit to Congress a specific request to allow deficit spending."

Congress would have 15 days to approve the recommendation, and everyone voting for it would have to acknowledge they were doing so knowing it would mean an unbalanced budget that year, Wilson said.

The federal government has had a balanced budget only once in the last 20 years. "It's pretty clear we need to reform the budget process so we can respond to skyrocketing oil prices or interest rates without deficit spending ourselves into disaster," Wilson said.

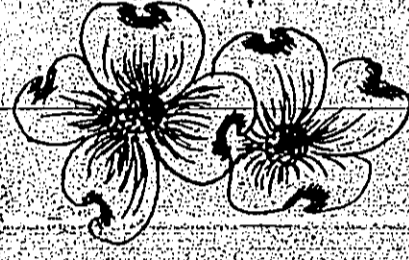
SELECTION OF THE DOGWOOD FESTIVAL QUEEN

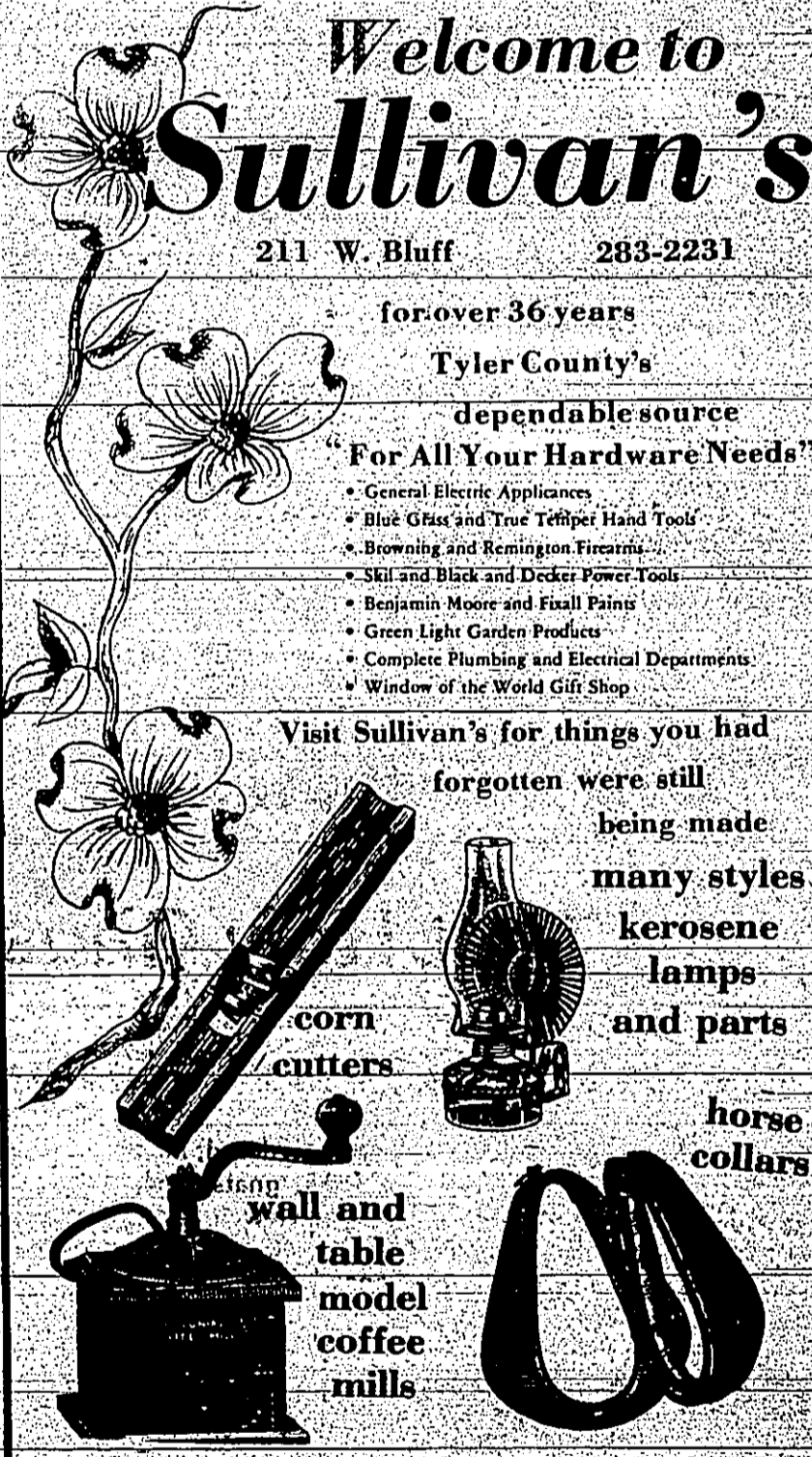
