## Ft. Polk Commanding General To Attend

### Workshop Dedication Is June 12

Area leaders will gather Thursday, June 12, at 10 a.m. to dedicate the new Tyler County Sheltered Workshop at 203 Willow Street in Woodville.

Guest speaker will be The Honorable Roy Blake, State Senator for District 3 in Texas. Also addressing the gathering will be Major General Joseph T. Palastra, Jr., from Ft. Polk, Louisiana, a military detachment from Ft. Polk under General Palastra's command assisted greatly in refurbishing the building for the workshop and in bringing it into compliance with federal, state and local codes.

Assisting these men in the ribbon cutting will be Judge Allen Sturrock of Tyler County, County Commissioner Maxie Riley, Mayor Doug Tolbert, Bob Boykin, Chairman of the Tyler County Advisory Council, and Executive Director of Deep East Texas MHRM Services, the agency administering the workshop program.

The workshop is one of seven local offices of the Texas Employment Commission, Mondays or Wednesdays, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. The offices are located in the old Dixie Furniture building in Corrigan.

## Fondren Says "Phooey" To Tarver's Claim

In what was billed by courthouse observers as a definite "pre-election political news" conference, Tyler County Jailer Melvin Tarver said "the controversy" between the County Auditor, Ann Fondren, and Sheriff's candidate Leon Fowler was more than just that.

Tarver called the media gathering he said "because I'm trying to prove that I'm not lying... I'm tired of being accused of not doing my duties."

Tarver, who invited the area news media to hear his complaint, alleged that Fondren had participated in holding up a pay increase he was due. He said the problem began also on January 15, 1979, when Leon Fowler allegedly slugged Tarver in a reported altercation in the Tyler County Courthouse, after which Tarver filed misdemeanor charges of assault.

When asked if he would turn in the monthly reports to either Ann Fondren or the Commissioners' Court

## Poll Watchers May Be Used This Saturday

Verbal requests for poll watchers to act as official observers in the upcoming Democratic Party Primary election runoff have been made to the office of Democratic Party Chairman Morris Clemmons who said, "If they want them, they'll have to get on their horse to get them approved."

According to Clemmons, both sides of an issue or a contest "have the right to have an official party watcher to observe the voting activity at the polls."

The hotly contested Sheriff's race will no doubt see incumbent Lewis Craven meet challenger Leon Fowler at the courthouse square when the vote counting begins at 7 p.m. on Saturday night.

Polls will open countywide at 7 a.m. Craven will attempt to pick up a 200-vote percentage deficit in trying to overcome Leon Fowler's vote count in the primary as Fowler earned a total of 1,500 votes to Craven's total of only 1,300. Craven was able to upset Her-

man Nolen in the last election after Nolen had built a lead in the first voting activity.

According to Democratic Party Chairman Clemmons, absentee balloting is running high and very even to previous election years. "There seems to be a lot more interest in this one."

In another local race for constable Precinct 1, Tommy Latta will try to overcome Jack Burns in his bid for that position. Latta was outrun by Burns in the first contest but earned runoff place for a second chance.

For State Representative District 16, the cousin of the current office holder Jim Browder, Larry Browder of Goldspring, will face Ed Norwood of Liberty for that position.

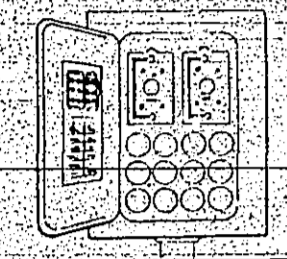

WHAT IS THE FUSE BOX OR CIRCUIT BREAKER? Do you know what they look like? To find one of the other, look on the walls for a small metal door that is usually painted closed so it won't open or painted open so it won't close. These boxes you'll just have to hunt for (sometimes in kitchens, closets, basements, stairwells, etc.) Behind its door, a fuse box looks like this:



When the circuit overloads the tab melts, which breaks the circuit and cuts the electricity to that area. ALWAYS make sure fuses are properly inserted into the slots. One of the smartest things you can do is label each fuse control. It only takes a couple of minutes and saves a lot of stumbling and fumbling when darkness strikes. To do this, you can use a permanent marker or a piece of tape on the progress while you toss the fuses one at a time. He can tell you what goes on and off. Before removing the fuse, pull the main switch, if possible. If not, carefully unscrew the fuse with your fingers, touching only the outer edge. Replace the new fuse in the same position. Label each switch, including the other parts of the panel box.



CIRCUIT BREAKERS

Through these breakers, service entry wires are protected from the power lines. They have two circuit breakers. One is for the main service and the other is for the branch circuits. The main breaker is usually on the left and the branch breakers are on the right. They are usually labeled with the name of the circuit they control. When the main breaker is tripped, it cuts off power to the entire house. When a branch breaker is tripped, it only cuts off power to that specific circuit. 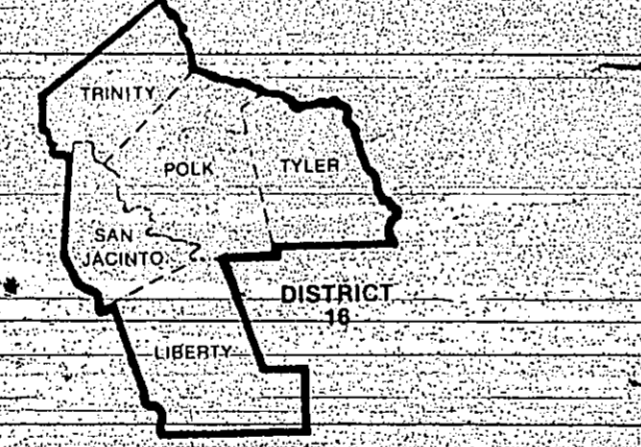

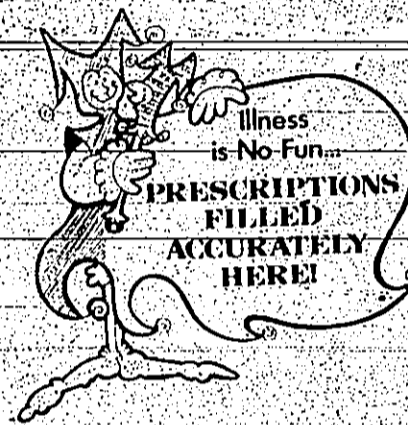
