Allison Chevrolet of Colmesneil was the latest Monday night in a series of burglaries that have been plaguing Tyler County in the last week with reported thefts hitting four other prominent businesses in Woodville.

Allison said he was notified of the robbery when his service manager, Sam Rivers, reported for work about 6:45 a.m. Tuesday morning.

It's probably lucky that no one surprised them," said Mrs. Allison, who pointed to a dress which was used to hold the hot torch. "Somebody

might have gotten hurt if they were interrupted," she added.

Texas Ranger Roscoe Davis was called in on the case, and officers are tracing leads and dusting for fingerprints in the case.

Burglars hit just south of Woodville last Thursday night, also, getting away with a 1975 Mark IV Lincoln Continental red and white in color, belonging to Dale Hinsley of Dale's Exhaust Service. Hinsley said his business and two others nearby Boykin Lumber and Phillips Heating and Air Conditioning, were also burglarized on the same night.

# Chamber Hears Publicity Plan

The Tyler County Chamber of Commerce held its regular monthly meeting Monday and heard a presentation from the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation Publicity Director, David DeLong, who reported to the Chamber a five-year publicity plan to attract people to the reservation between Woodville and Livingston.

DeLong said the plan, which was subject to Tribal Council approval, included a re-design of the familiar Alabama-Coushatta billboards and a new emphasis on the Reservation and the surrounding communities as being "a special part of Texas."

DeLong said he was trying to put together more emphasis on motor coach tours to the area and was currently exploring a cooperative effort with communities from Huntsville to the Texas eastern border on Highway 190 to work together, "because we have something in common to sell."

The council membership present gave DeLong their full support in his plan.

In other chamber action, the Board acted to encourage the police and sheriff's departments in Tyler County to expand their manpower so as to become more of a factor in controlling drug abuse in Tyler County.

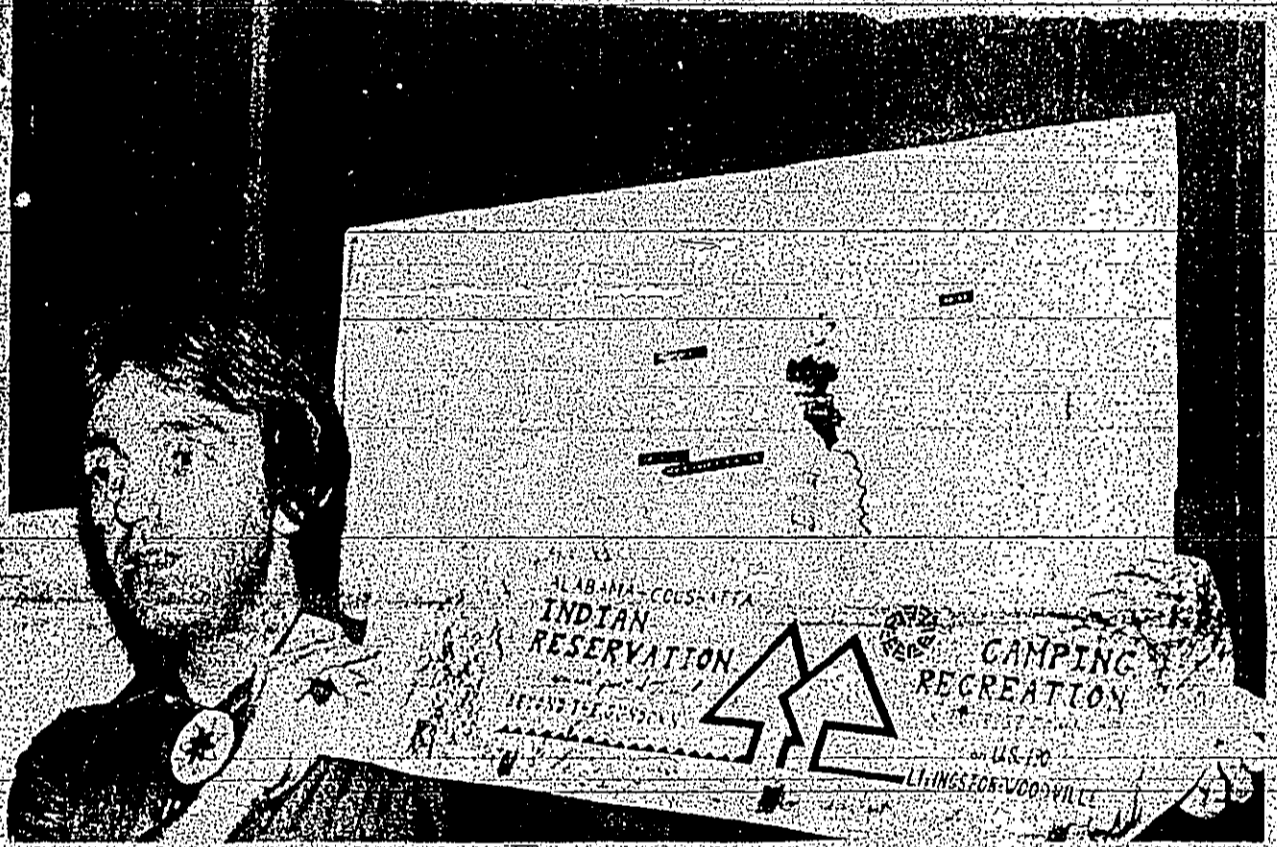
According to Dr. Harold Herrington, who made an appeal to the Chamber in directing that message to the law enforcement agencies in the county, following the meeting that "Community knowledge that the Chamber has voted to do this will have an impact on the agencies. We need to come up with the dollars to help them (law officers) get the drug enforcement training they need to help rid the county of the problem."

Herrington said that over 100 persons had attended meetings thus far which were designed to educate the public about drug abuse in Tyler County.

Herrington reported that the membership in the Concerned Citizens Against Drug Abuse group was growing rapidly and said a formal organization, ready to act, will be ready by Jan. 1, 1981.

Herrington said, "It's important that the Chamber go on record as being in favor of these departments beefing up their staffs to beat this problem."

Discussion by the Chamber directors also centered on January Annual Banquet planning, nominating committee work that needs to be completed and general discussion of the County position in appeal to the bus lines, which presently serve the county, to retain the bus route service currently scheduled here.

The Citizens State Bank will be closed Monday, Oct. 13 in observance of Columbus Day. Business office hours will resume as usual the following day, according to officials of the bank.

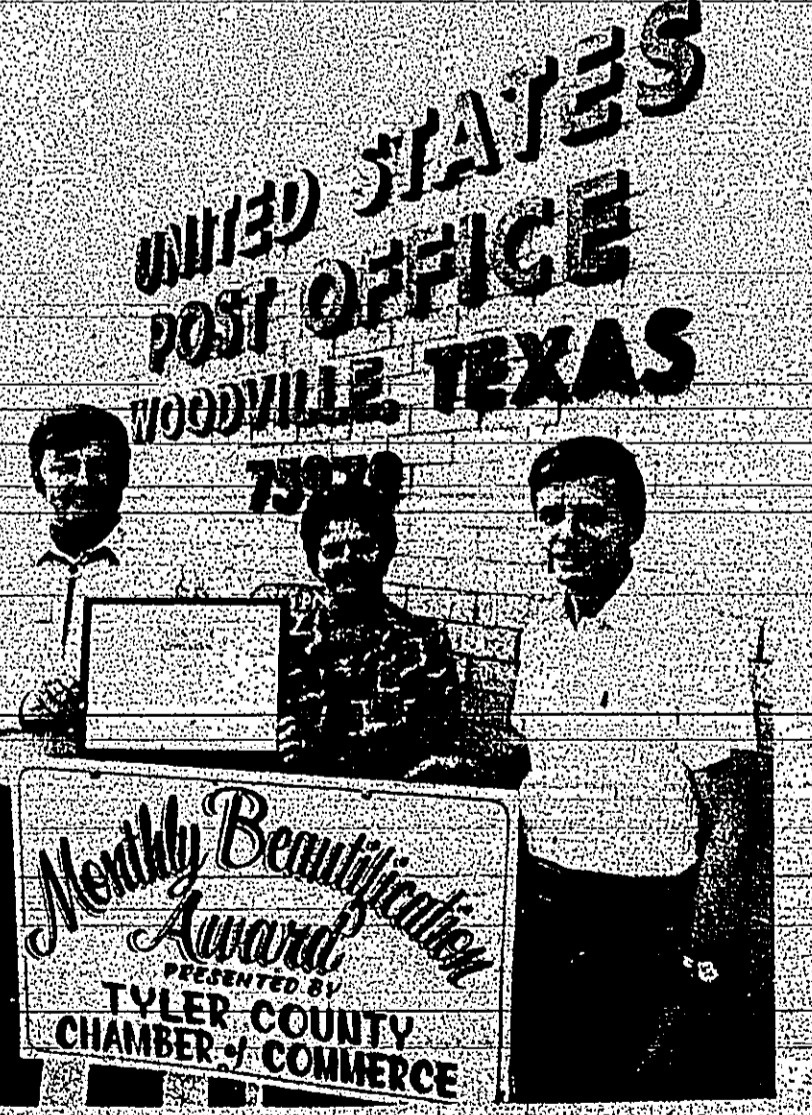

# Horticulture Short Course Set For Oct. 13-16

A Horticulture short course for adults will be held Oct. 13, 14, 15, 16 under the sponsorship of the Woodville High School Vocational Agriculture Department, according to Mr. Aubrey Bradley, Superintendent, and Mr. Joe Glasscock, Teacher of Vocational Agriculture. The short course is being sponsored by the Vocational Agriculture Department of Woodville High School & Agriculture Committee of the Tyler County Program Building Committee.

Mr. John Williamson, Horticulture Specialist with the Vocational Agriculture Division of the Texas Education Agency and the Department of Horticulture at Texas A&M University, will do the instructing in the course. He is headquartered at Texas A&M University.

Mr. Williamson holds B.S. and M.S. degrees in Agricultural Education. He is qualified as a certified teacher of horticulture in the Vocational Agriculture Program in Texas.

The short course at Woodville is scheduled to begin Oct. 13, 1980 at 7:00 PM in the Vocational Agriculture Building. Other meetings in the series of 4 will be held at the same place. During the dates the short course is in progress, Mr. Williamson will be available to assist enrollees with individual problems and to provide on-the-farm and in-the-home instruction, according to Joe Glasscock, Voc-Ag Teacher.

Persons interested in attending the short course should write or call the teacher of vocational agriculture, Mr. Joe Glasscock. An entry fee of \$5.00 will be charged. Horticulture Short Course certificates will be presented to enrollees who attend all of the training sessions.

Mr. Williamson states that the short course can be adjusted to wishes and interests of the people enrolled but that he expects to cover such subjects as plant growth and development, propagating media, plant propagation, vegetable gardening, developing and maintaining the landscape, establishing and caring for lawns, house plants, and greenhouse production, operation and management.

Demonstrations will be given and class enrollees will have the opportunity to perform the skills demonstrated.

Short courses in Horticulture, as well as in other subject matter, are now available to adults throughout the state under a cooperative program between the Texas Education Agency and Texas A&M University.

This cooperative program is designed to make the services of specialists available to conduct short courses under the supervision of public schools. Such a program will enable teachers of vocational agriculture to provide

improved educational services to farm people. Specialists are now available in the fields of beef cattle, farm electric wiring, horticulture, farm arc welding, swine production, tractor maintenance, oxy-acetylene welding, and pasture management.

Often you can team jackets with several dresses, skirts and pants.

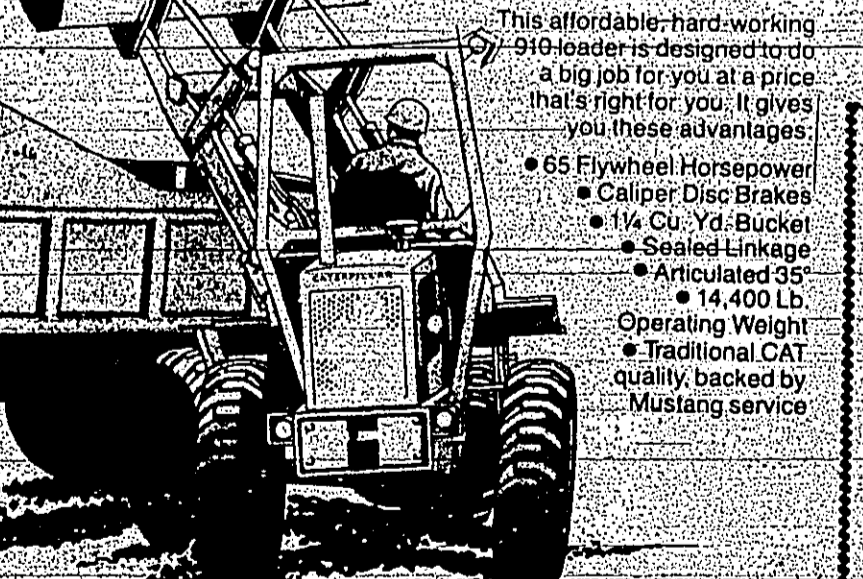
Make a list of new items needed to complete various ensembles. These items might be accessories such as belts, blouses or scarves.
