



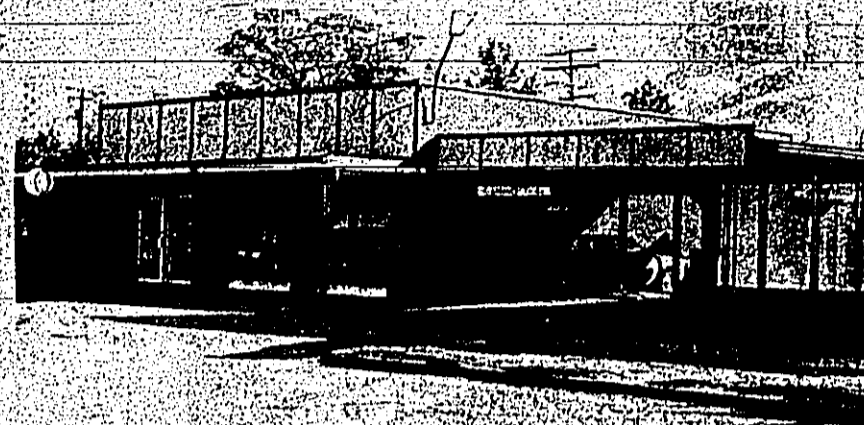

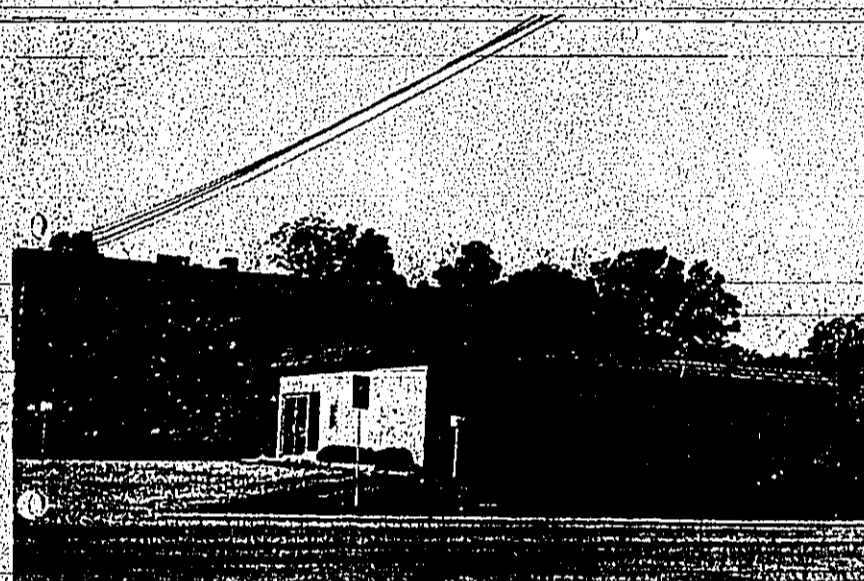
## County Election Returns

### Parent Blasts Trustees

Backed up with a petition bearing 159 names of parents and interested persons in the Warren Independent School District, Jane Worthy blasted the Warren School trustees at their regular meeting on Tuesday, Oct. 28, citing the absence of qualified teachers primarily, but adding to that a list of "other deficiencies" which the board was asked to report back to her on at the next meeting.

In a 45-minute appeal to the trustees, Mrs. Worthy listed the following

general parent grievances which she asked the board to answer "as soon as possible, because we feel that our children are not receiving the quality of education that they should be getting."

Mrs. Worthy pointed towards problems which she said existed in the science department; problems relating to methods of group punishment; failure of the district to respond to a parent's complaint when asked for assistance in regards to a hearing de-

fect in a student which the parents claim has affected the child's grades.

Austin—Here is something that may be of interest to those of you who have experienced or will experience the heart-sinking feeling of returning to the space where your car was parked only to discover an empty spot.

You will be happy to know that the legislature of Texas has recognized this as a problem area and passed legislation governing under what circumstances you may be towed legally at your own expense, as well as when you may recover expenses incurred due to an illegal tow.

Article 670g-2 of the Texas Revised Civil Statutes addresses the removal of unauthorized vehicles from parking facilities or public highways.

This statute gives the parking facility owner or towing company the right to remove and store any unauthorized vehicle without the consent and at the expense of the owner or operator of the vehicle. If a sign or signs are prominently displayed specifying when any park in the facilities and stating that all vehicles are prohibited, the signs must be illuminated from all entrances to the parking facility; however, they need not be illuminated if the parking facility owner or towing company also has a pecuniary interest in the towing company or if the towing company has a pecuniary interest in the parking facility. That is, no consideration may pass between these entities in connection with the removal of a vehicle from a parking facility.

AUSTIN — House Speaker Bill Clayton cleared last week of charges of influence peddling, has indicated he will run again for Speaker.

Clayton said he will make a formal announcement of his candidacy sometime this week. Already the first person to announce an unprecedented three-term campaign, Clayton seeks a fourth term against State Rep. John Bryant, D-Dallas.

A third candidate, Gib Lewis, D-Fort Worth, is a top member of Clayton's conservative team in the Legislature. Lewis held the factor to Clayton's legislative supporters rallied around the candidacy of Lewis, who did a superb job of preventing a splintering into lesser factions. Lewis reportedly maintained a 90-plus vote (70 votes needed to win), and stood stronger than other announced candidates who eventually pledged to him or Bryant.

 REMOVING DOORS

Removing doors does not mean a lot of work. It's simple, although there are several variations in design that affect the process. Some bottom supported doors can be removed by lifting them straight up (far enough to clear the bottom track), then angling the lower part of the door outward. (Patio doors usually are heavy, lifting them out takes a stout pair of arms.)

Some top hung doors can also be lifted straight up and off the track. Most require additional positioning or angling because the top wheels are usually locked into their tracks to prevent them from jumping off the rails every time they are opened. Some doors employ a spring loaded cover mechanism for this purpose. Others have key openings so it is possible to lift the door up and out only at one point along the track. These openings are usually located in the door's about half-way open and this easy to get at each side.

## Superintendent Attends Meeting

LIVINGSTON Roland Poncho, Superintendent of the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation, outside Livingston, is currently in Spokane, Washington attending the 37th Annual Convention of the National Congress of American Indians. The theme of the convention is "Family of Nations... Action for Survival".

Poncho reported that the week-long session was to hear delegates from all of the major political campaigns, including President Carter's. Meetings are slated on a variety of topics facing the united tribes such as economic development, alcoholism and drug abuse; human resources and education. "Social services are a high priority for us on the Reservation right now," Poncho emphasized before leaving for Washington.

He had only been back at his desk for five days following a shorter trip to Dallas, where he gave the welcoming address to teachers and counselors from all around the United States assembled for the 12th Annual National Indian Education Association. Poncho is the Executive Director of the Indian Reservation Head Start Project in Livingston. Also in Dallas, to perform as part of the meeting's opening program were James Sylvestre, Lyndon Alec, Stephanie Battise, Lori Poncho and Cindi Poncho, all members of the Alabama-Coushatta's famed "Ma-Ski-La Dancers."

Once back in Livingston, Poncho will resume his primary task to stimulate the sagging tribal economy. "Our tourist operations must remain first-class. From these revenues we fund our other, more necessary projects, such as medical services and caring for our elderly."

Poncho was appointed superintendent by the Texas Indian Commission last June. The Alabama-Coushatta Tribe is one of the two tribes under the administration of the Commission. The other tribe, the Jigua Indians, reside at Ystia del Sur, Pueblo in El Paso. The Indian Commission's office, under Executive Director, Walt Broemer, is located in Livingston.

The business arm of the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation, Tribal Enterprises, operates a year-round camping, recreation and tourist complex on 4,500 acres of the Piney Woods section of the Big Thicket in East Texas. For more details on

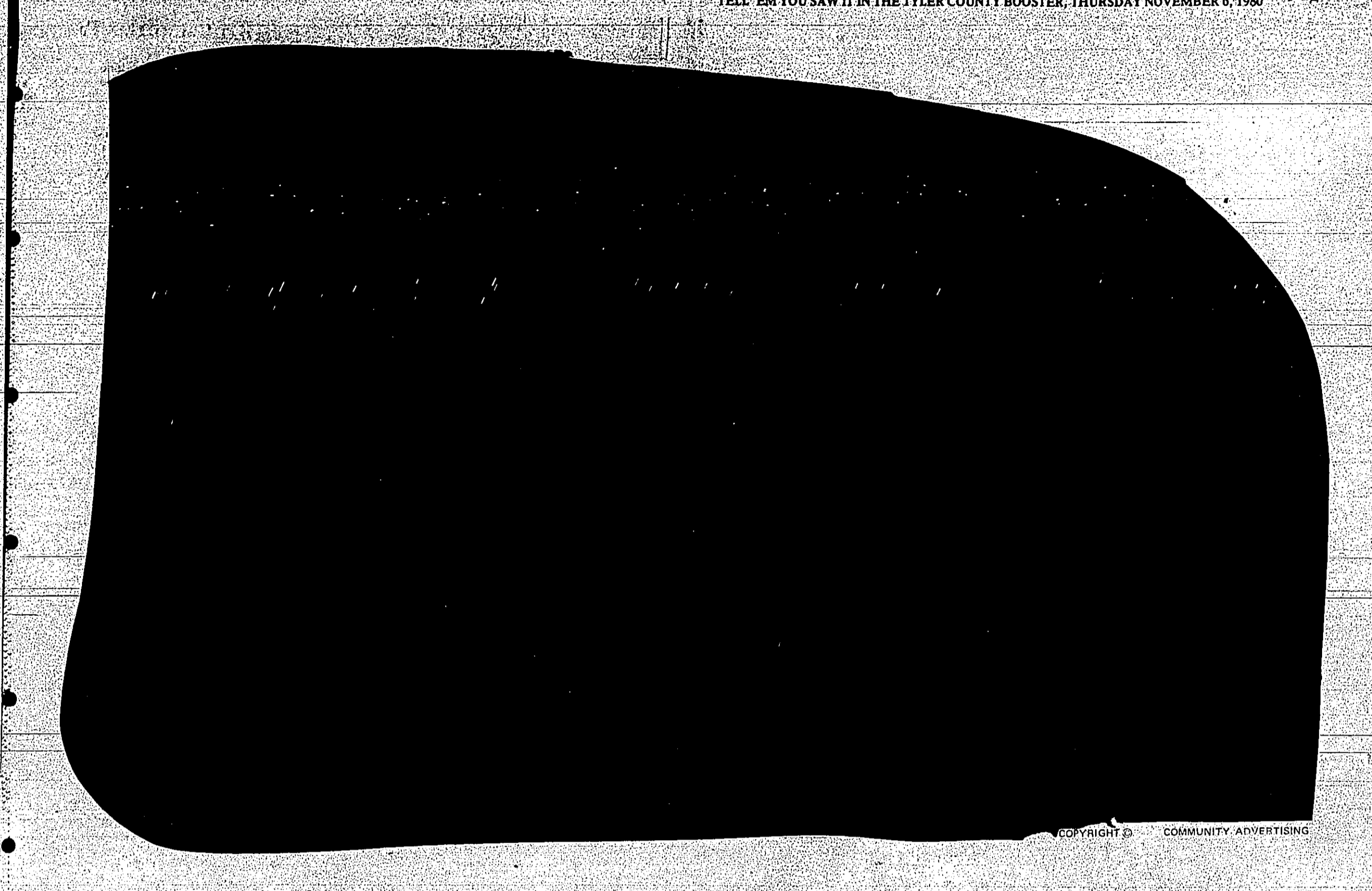

In addition, the Texas Highway Patrol investigated 5 Rural Motor Vehicle Accidents in which 6 persons were injured. Through September of this year, there have been 130 Rural Accidents

in Tyler County, killing 3 persons and injuring 84 people. During the same 9-month period in 1979, there were 146 Rural Traffic Accidents killing 4 and injuring 63 persons. The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 370 Rural Accidents, killing 17 persons and injuring 153 people.

### Adapt Recipes To Microwave

Keep those "old time" favorite recipes for microwave cooking.

Many foods adapt easily and taste like they were cooked conventionally. Some guidelines will help in converting recipes to microwave cooking.

Select a similar microwave recipe with approximately the same amount of main ingredients - meat, cheese, vegetables - for comparison.

Reduce the amount of liquid by one-fourth. Add more liquid during cooking if necessary.

Reduce seasoning slightly, especially strong flavorings such as garlic, oregano or bay leaf. It is much safer to add more later than to have seasonings overpower the flavor.

Reduce the amount of fat by one-half.

Use the dish size, covering, instructions, microwave techniques and timing recommended in the microwave recipes used for comparison.

If not following a microwave recipe for comparison, reduce cooking time to one-fourth of the original recipe. Cook longer if necessary.

On the other hand, there are a few recipes not suited to microwave cooking.

Do not attempt to deep fry in the microwave - this eliminates the preparation of fried chicken or steak, hash browns or french fries.

Foods that normally form a crust, such as popovers, pancakes, pizza and double crust pies, will not work because they either become soggy on the bottom or simply do not form a crust.

Dried beans, rice and pasta need time to absorb moisture and the speed of the microwave cooking does not allow sufficient time for this to occur.

Yeast bread recipes will not convert from conventional recipes.

However, all of these foods will reheat in a microwave oven.
