Motel/Cinema Plan Growing

The Tyler County Industrial Finance Corporation appealed to the Woodville City Council again Monday in an attempt to get the city to ante up approximately \$5-\$10,000, which that group says could lead to a possible \$500,000 investment for outside investors who might consider building a motel/cinema complex here.

The Industrial Finance Corporation say they need assistance from the City for the investors, who have not been named as yet, to be able to "bank" on a Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant dollar commitment which would assist that group in obtaining needed city infrastructure

which would service the motel/cinema complex. Another problem facing the Finance Corporation is the inadequate availability of land which could be offered to an investor for such purposes so that organization is requesting that the city consider incorporating another one half mile area out from the existing boundaries from the city.

Council all but approved the annexation idea saying that couldn't be considered now, not until speculators could indicate some idea of their intent in building such a project.

The council did approve the rewriting of and joining of two resolutions which would free up the necessary dollars from Community Develop-

ment Block Grant monies to be used in the development of municipal services to the commercial complex project site.

Don Cole, who was present at the council meeting, with Dr. Harold Herrington, said, "We appreciate the progressiveness and open mindedness of the council in hearing our request."

In other council action, the city fathers tabled contract consideration with the Tyler County Airport for terminal funding, and spending some \$1,500 from Tourism Fund to help defray the cost of the building.

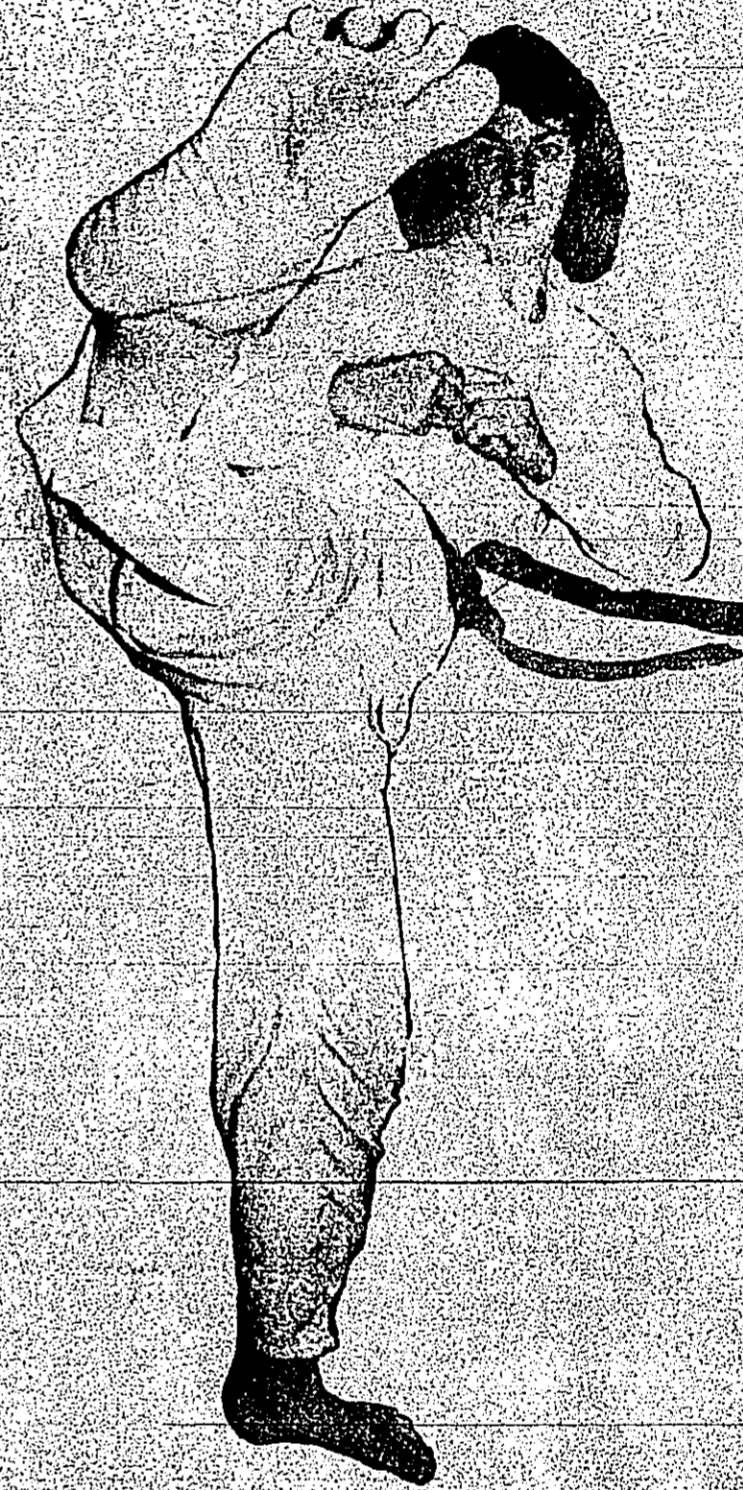

Tax Class Offered

The Agricultural Committee and the Tyler County Young Farmers will hold a meeting Tuesday, November 25th at 7 p.m. in the Vocational Agriculture Building in the Woodville School.

The purpose of the meeting is to help the farmers to sum up their years activities and make tax management decisions. Expenditures of the right kind can reduce taxable income. Transactions needed to reduce taxable income must be made prior to January 31st.

A second meeting will be held January 12th. The purpose of this meeting will be to review all tax management matters pertaining to the 1980 Tax Return.

Wayne Taylor, Area Economist with the Agricultural Extension Service from Overton, will be our guest speaker.

With the economy the way it is, record keeping and good tax management are essential for saving tax dollars.

Emergency Farm Loans Available

Emergency loans for farmers, ranchers, or aquaculture operators are available through county offices of the Farmers Home Administration (FmHA), I.G. Vaden, FmHA County Supervisor, said recently.

Vaden asked that those who need farm credit as a result of the 1980 drought make their needs known at the Farmers Home Administration office at 609 S. Chestnut, Lufkin, Texas.

Applications for assistance in the disaster-stricken counties will be accepted by Farmers Home until July 30, 1981 for physical losses and production losses.

FmHA loans covering actual physical and production losses may be used to replace installations, equipment, or buildings (including homes) lost through this disaster. Funds may be used to buy feed, seed, fertilizer, livestock, or to meet interest and de-

preciation payments on current real estate and chattel debts. Other loans, beyond actual losses, can be made for annual operating expenses or to make major adjustments in a farming (or ranching or aquaculture) operation.

"Funds can be used for essential operating and living costs," Vaden said.

Hunt Accident

A gunshot wound in the thigh was the only injury that 21-year-old Danny McInnis sustained as he was hunting south of Woodville about 3:30 p.m. Tuesday.

McInnis apparently was crossing a fence when he set his 22 caliber rifle on the fence as it fell and discharged.

McInnis was taken to Tyler County Hospital by members of his family.

Loans covering actual losses are made at an interest rate of five percent and are scheduled for repayment as rapidly as feasible consistent with the applicant's reasonable ability to pay. Loans beyond actual losses have various maturities, depending upon the purpose of the loan.

The interest rate for short-term loans for farm operating purposes is five (5) percent. Long-term loans are being made at an interest rate of eleven (11) percent.

To be eligible for an emergency loan, an applicant must have suffered losses from the disaster and be unable to get credit from other sources.

Emergency loans can be used to help the farmer restore damaged farm operations and additional loans based upon the emergency designation can be used to reorganize the farm for greater efficiency and better production.

Palbearers were Kenneth Lowe, Joe Franklin, Lloyd Collins, Horace David, John Tolat and Dick Whitworth.

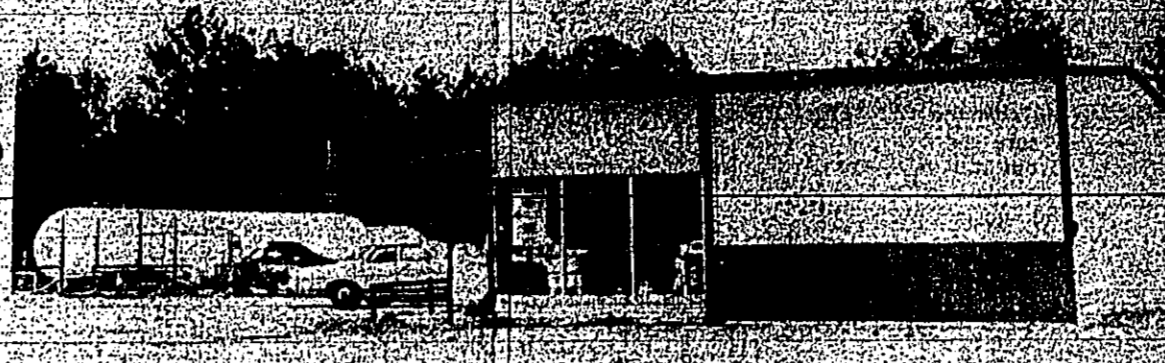
NOEL DOUGLAS WIGLEY

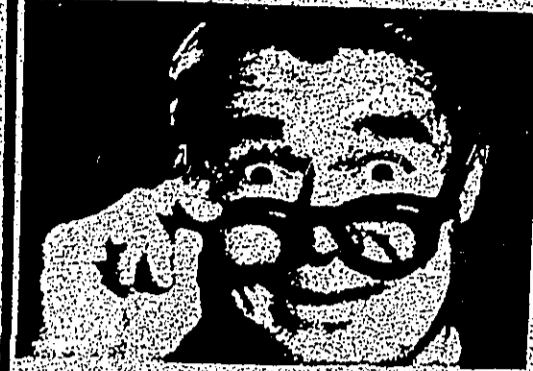

Karate Class Teaches Calm, Order In Life

"If everyone used the martial arts, there would be less crime." So say the members of the Woodville Karate Academy of Texas which teaches the Japanese style of Shoto-Kan Karate, a martial art which asks the body to join with the mind in a harmonious blend of confidence which makes those who know it have a certain look of calm.

Meeting every Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 6:30 p.m. in the building, called a "Dojo," behind Ray's Fried Chicken, about 20 devoted class members meet for rigid instruction and exercise which disciplines each member to the Shoto-Kan style of the art.

The classes begin with stretching exercises which then lead to the defense basics: punches, kicks, blocks and stance.

The pre-arranged form that the group follows is called "Kata," a sequence of movements learned by persons to develop coordination of technique.

The Shoto-Kan style of Karate uses about 16 out of a possible 90 sequenced movements known to the art.

The Karate expert, in disciplining himself, assumes himself to be surrounded by enemies. This affords him a 360 degree control of his environment.

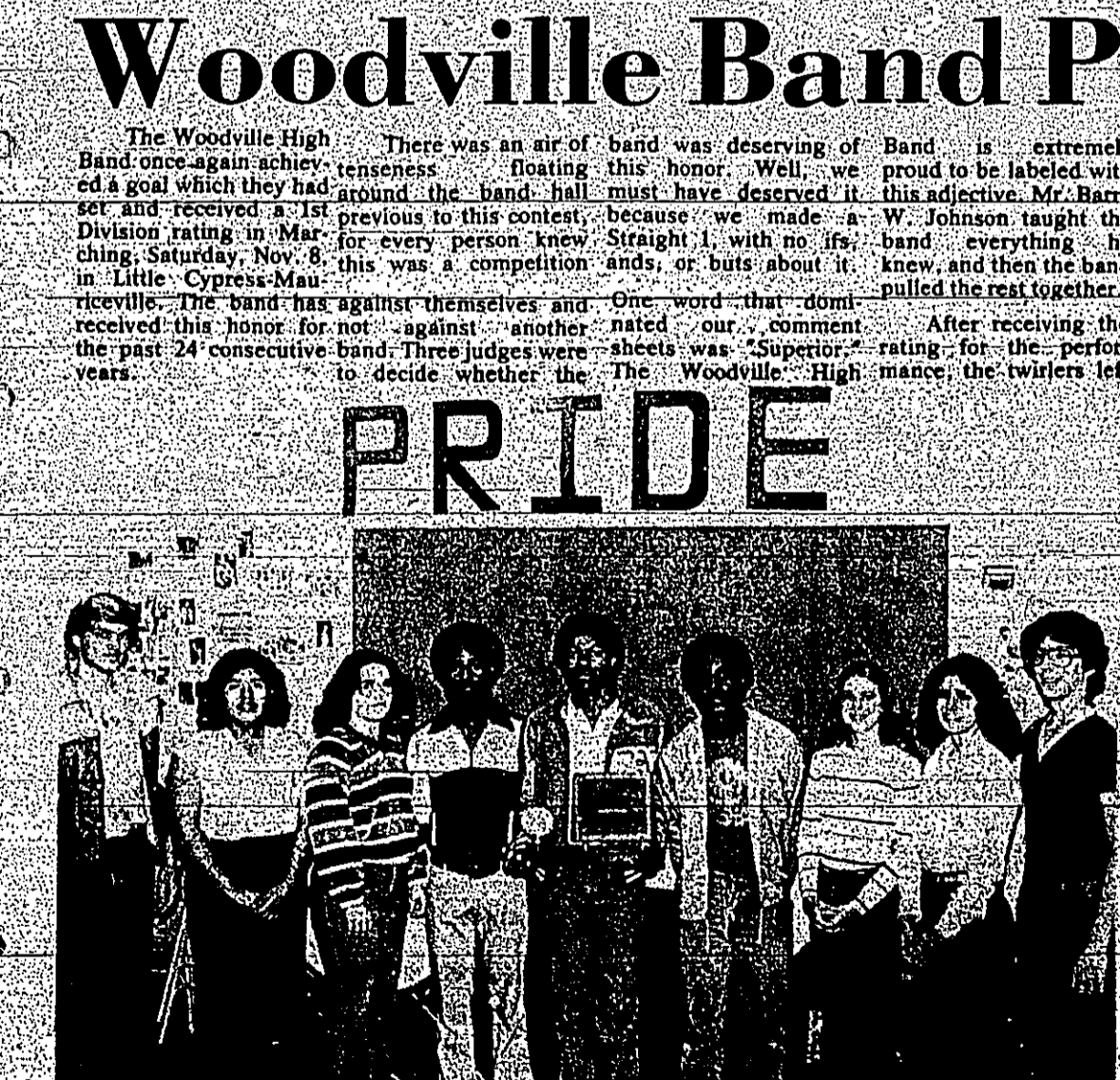

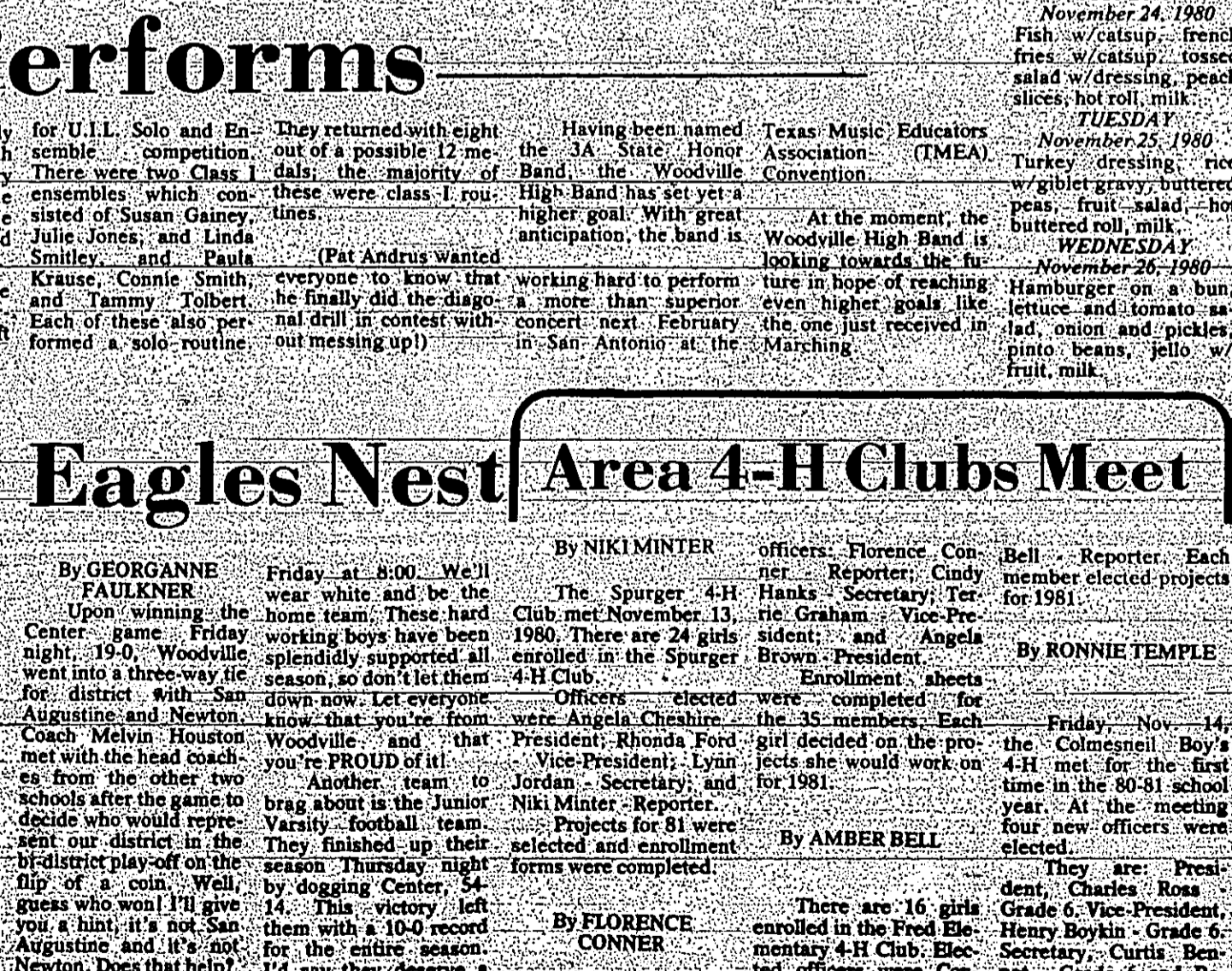

Smoke Poultry With Ease

COLLEGE STA- After the injection process, place the bird in the curing vat (cooler or ice chest) filled with the remainder of the brine and add a small amount of additional ice to insure a temperature of 34-36 degrees F.

Remove the bird after 48 hours in the curing solution and drain thoroughly (about 15 minutes), recommends Dr. James H. Denton, poultry marketing specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System.

All that is needed to cure and smoke poultry at home is a curing vat, a small electric curing ingredients, ice a yard cooler, that will hold the temperature between 170-200 degrees F. is suitable for a smoker. A 55-gallon drum-type smoker works well, says the specialist. Use some type of green wood, such as green hickory, pecan or oak.

Keep smoking the bird until it takes on a light brown color. This usually takes 6-12 hours for turkeys and 4-6 hours for chickens. The bird is done when the muscle temperature reaches 162 degrees F. or when a slight twist will loosen the drumstick, says Denton.

A turkey or chicken will shrink about 20 percent with this smoking and cooking process. The finished product is completely cooked and will keep in the refrigerator for two weeks. Of course, it can be frozen for longer storage.

**Winter Brings
Dandruff Flurries**

Winter means thousands of flurries of little white flakes will start falling even in the warm parts of Texas. It's not snow that's affecting people all across the state. The winter dandruff season is going strong.

Santa Claus, Friend Or Foe?

COLLEGE STATION—Treat Santa Claus as the spirit of joy and giving, advises Diane Welch, a family life education specialist.

"Children will then probably place Santa beside their pleasant imaginary friends of childhood.

"Santa can help a child grasp abstract concepts, learn about fantasy and reality and develop a caring, sharing and giving nature," the specialist points out.

Mrs. Welch is with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System.

Parents greatly influence how their children react to Santa, she says.

"Some parents are concerned about honesty. They feel their child will see the Santa Claus myth as a form of deception.

"At the other end of the spectrum, some parents use Santa as a means of getting 'good' behavior from their children in exchange for promises of gifts.

"In between these two groups are parents that tolerate the myth but do not exploit it," Mrs. Welch explains.

These parents allow their children to exercise their fullest imaginations about Santa, participate in the excitement of preparing for Santa's arrival but encourage them to revise their understanding in terms of their age and maturity, she says.

For example, the pre-school child is often fascinated by all the arrangements surrounding Christmas. They are anxious to take an active part in getting ready.

However, their sense of time is limited and they are continuously asking when Santa is to arrive.

Many parents are innovative in the way they use the "mark-off" techniques to give the child a sense of knowing how many days are yet to pass, the specialist suggests.

At five or six years of age, children are interested in the details and spirit of Christmas. This goes along with their interest in fantasy.

Although still involved with imagination about reindeer and a "fat man" that takes away cookies, children ages five and six can better grasp and understand what Christmas is all about.

By ages seven and eight, a child probably knows about the reality of Santa but may want to continue the illusion of mystery and legend.
