Alabama - Coushatta Tribal Dinner Held

LIVINGSTON, TX—The Tribal Council's Annual Christmas Dinner was held Thursday, December 18 on the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation in the Inn of the Twelve Clans Restaurant. Nearly three hundred tribal members attended the festivities where Betty Thompson was named "Employee of the Year" in recognition of her nineteen years' service to the accounting office.

Also honored at the banquet were Oscar F. Landry of Livingston and Howard N. Martin of Houston for their contributions in the area of public relations on behalf of the Tribes. The two men were instrumental in the Polk County Historical Commission's "Indian Trails" project. Also cited was Leona Sylestine for her exquisite beadwork presented last spring to all of the Texas Tourist Counselors.

Jerry Collins, the personnel director for Texas Foundries in Lufkin, was awarded a citation for "Outstanding Community Service" to the Alabama-Coushatta Indians. Texas Foundries is an equal opportunity employer.

Tribal members Clayton M. Sylestine and Burke Walker were presented with certificates of recognition for "Dedicated Service" on Tribal Council. Both men have served over a dozen terms on the seven-member governing board.

Budget Called 'Tight' For '81

Tyler County Commissioners passed what County Judge Allen Sturrock tagged as "A tight budget" for the next operating year. The court has estimated an expenditure of \$1,775,557.

Predicting an estimated revenue of \$1,708,974, the county will be accommodating a population which has grown to 14,069 persons. The 10.89 percent increase in the cost of the county doing business next year has been created, commissioners say, because of this year's inflationary trends and increased cost of materials and labor. Incoming revenues are only anticipated to increase by a 7.78 percent figure.

According to County Auditor Ann Fondren, ad valorem taxes account for 57.04 percent of the revenues derived from a tax rate of \$1.35 per \$100 valuation. In amending the predicted budgetary needs of the county, the court allowed a \$5,000 provision for the Tyler County Sheltered Workshop.

Commissioners stipulated, however, that the Sheltered Workshop organizational board, The Tyler County Mental & Physical Handicap Association, had to first demonstrate their need for those dollars before the court would agree to hand them over.

In other business the court awarded a tractor bid to Oil City Tractors of Beaumont; agreed to help foster children for Christmas; and set Wednesday Dec. 31 as the swearing-in day for all new and re-elected county officials. The ceremony will be held at 10 a.m.

November Free Of Fatal Accidents

Sergeant Russell Davis of the Tyler County Highway Patrol announced and injuring 110 people. During the same eleven-month period in 1979, there were 173 Rural Fatal Accidents. In addition the Texas Highway Patrol investigated 16 Rural Motor Vehicle Accidents in which 12 persons were injured. Through November of this year, there have been 166 Rural accidents in

the 16 counties comprising District 2B. The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 468 Rural Accidents which killed 24 persons and injured 230 people.

Why Did A Sailer Become A Farrier?

After spending a

large part of his life at sea, Thomas Jordan now has his feet on firm ground once again. The

Tyler County native has purchased 50 acres between Hillister and Spurger where he is making a living as a blacksmith.

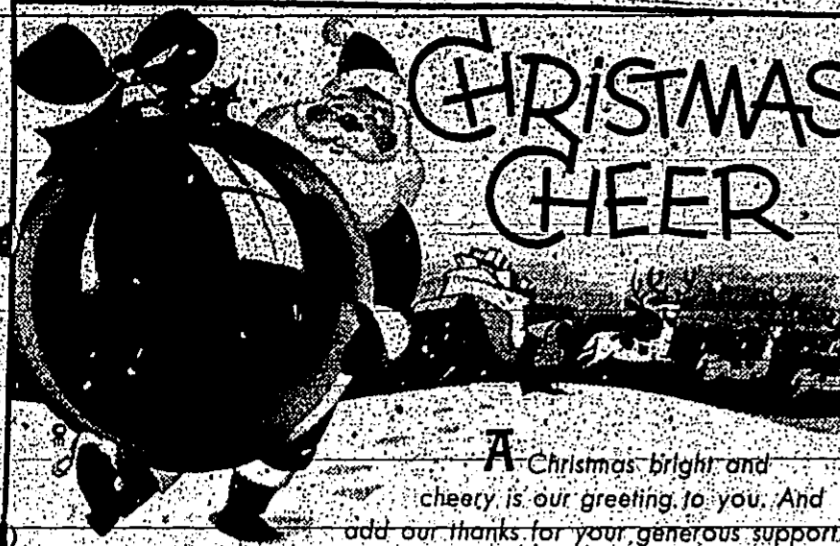
Tom didn't really plan to make a career of the Navy when he first enlisted. "All of a sudden I'd been in ten years, and I figured I was stuck," he says.

When he retired after 20 years, Tom decided to pursue a life-long dream of becoming a blacksmith. The G.I. Bill allowed him to attend the Oklahoma Farrier College in Sperry (near Tulsa).

During the eight-week course Tom and 33 classmates took care of over 300 horses. They learned to make shoes "from scratch" with forge and anvil, ways of treating diseases of the leg by packing the hoof with medicine, and

which shoes to use for what purpose. By the end of the course they had put shoes on horses, donkeys and even a cow.

And they had learned that there is a lot more to being a blacksmith than just packing up a horse's hoof and nailing a shoe onto it.

FOR A PERFECT FIT—After trimming the hoof, Tom Jordan files away the excess prior to attaching the shoe. The horse doesn't mind the "operation" at all.

According to Tom, some horse owners sadly neglect their horse's feet. They don't realize that neglecting a horse's hooves can cause crippling and deformities. A horse should have his hooves trimmed every four to six weeks, and shod every six to eight weeks.

Tom says that week-end horsemen — people who live out of the area and only visit their horses occasionally — are often likely to ignore a problem until it becomes serious.

Sadly, horse owners often opt for destroying any horse that seems chronically lame, when trimming the hoof and corrective shoes could often heal the horse.

Tom Jordan hates to see good horses killed. He says that almost any horse, with a little work and care, could at least be "a good pet for a kid."

Tom hopes to work with local veterinarians in salvaging some of those seemingly "hopeless" cases.

Right now Tom uses manufactured horse shoes. He hopes to get a forge soon, so he can make special corrective shoes that some horses need. If a horse needed constant attention Tom could stable it at his place. Eventually, he plans to get a portable forge, so he can treat sick horses from the back of his pickup truck.

Although somewhat limited by the lack of a

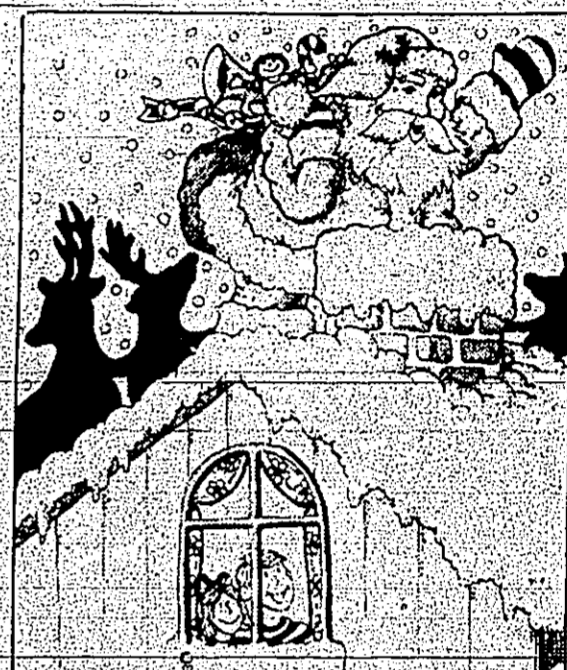
forge, Tom is already performing miracles by corrective trimming.

When Tom bought Wilson for his daughter, the horse's front hooves were at almost right angles to his body. Thanks to Tom's efforts, the hooves now point almost straight ahead.

He hopes he'll be able to help other horses with similar problems.

"I'm not lookin' to make a killing," says Tom. "I just want to help out the little guy with a couple of horses."

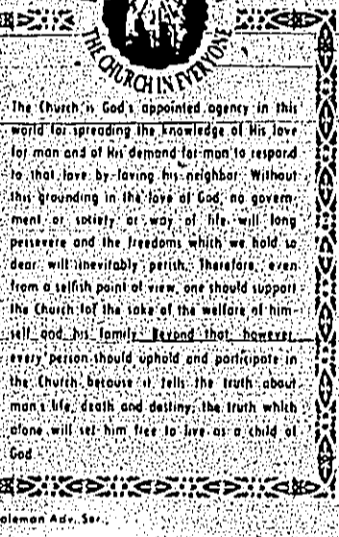
RICHARD WORTHY WILSON

Commission Approves Bond Program

AUSTIN—Texas Industrial Commission Executive Director Gerald Brown today announced the results of the state's industrial revenue bond (IRB) program for the first full year of operation.

The Texas Industrial Commission (TIC) is the state agency responsible for establishing IRB guidelines and administering the program. To date, IRBs have financed more than \$234,700,000 in projects creating an estimated 6,300 new jobs. These direct employment positions will, in turn, generate nearly 11,000 jobs indirectly.

According to Gerald Brown, it is almost impossible to put a dollar value on what the IRB program has done for Texas. "When you consider the new technologies, the diversified economic base, and the incomes that will be affected by these new projects, the economic impact will be in the billions," Brown said.

When the 60th Legislature passed the Development Corporation Act of 1979, their intent was to stimulate capital investment and create productive jobs. At that time, 48 other states, including all those surrounding Texas, offered this financial incentive and Texas was losing many industrial locations.

"We are more than pleased with the first year's results," Brown said. "Texas is not only getting more of its share of new plant locations, but we are also making it financially attractive for many of our home-grown, existing industries to expand their in-state operations." Approximately one-third of the applications approved by TIC were for expansion projects.

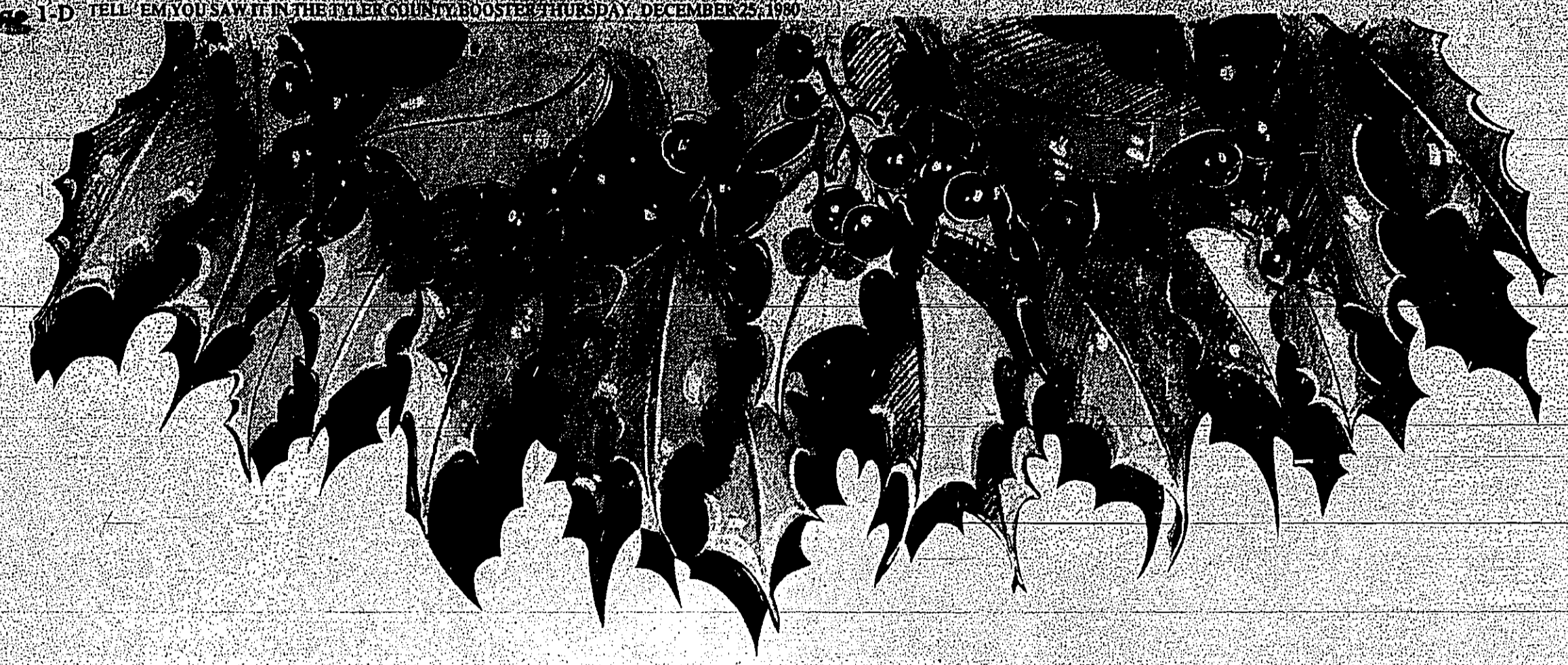
Projects approved range from heavy manufacturing operations to warehouse/distribution centers. The smallest issue was for \$700,000 to finance a new chemical manufacturing company in Freeport, and the largest was \$54,125,000 port facility in Texas City.

The Development Corporation Act of 1979, sponsored by Sen. Ed Howard of Texas and Rep. Tim Voth of Ohio, made IRB financing in Texas a reality. Under this act, more than 200 Texas cities and municipalities have set up their own industrial development corporation. These local, non-profit corporations grant initial approval of IRB applications. However, final approval must come from the Texas Industrial Commission.

"Industrial revenue bonds are much more restricted and well regulated in Texas than in most other states," Brown said. "Because we (TIC) have the responsibility of giving final approval on all bond applications in the state, we can make sure the type of project fits our strict guidelines and thus prevent misuse of funds."

Revenue bonds provide a method of financing for the capital cost of land, building and equipment. Although Texas has a variety of limiting interest rates to 10 percent, rates on approved projects have gone as low as six and five-eighths percent.

Considering a current prime rate approaching 20 percent, this represents a significant savings to industry. A recent Attorney General's opinion allows floating interest rates on private placement issues, but not to exceed the 10 percent ceiling.

Sharing seasons greetings with a long distance call is a growing Christmas tradition for Southeast Texas and again this year telephone customers can realize savings by following a few tips while placing calls.

According to Jim Lydon, staff manager of public relations, Southwestern Bell anticipates approximately 3,000,000 calls will be placed to and from the 713 area code this Christmas Day, a 20 percent increase from last year. More than 390,000 of those calls will be operator-assisted and locally 1,010 operators will be giving up part of their Christmas Day to help in handling the high volume of calls.

In order to save both time and money, Lydon suggests following these tips:

—Dial direct whenever possible because one-plus rates are cheaper than operator-assisted calls.

—To avoid delays in completing calls, the best time to place a call is between 1:00 and 5:00 p.m.

—Say hello when rates are low by calling during discount periods for both intrastate and interstate calls. Evening discount rates between 25% and 35% will be in effect from 8:00 to 11:00 p.m. Christmas Day and even lower night rates are in effect from 11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. Complete details are included in the directory customer guide pages.

Obtain numbers to be called ahead of time. If directory assistance is needed, call well in advance of Christmas Day.

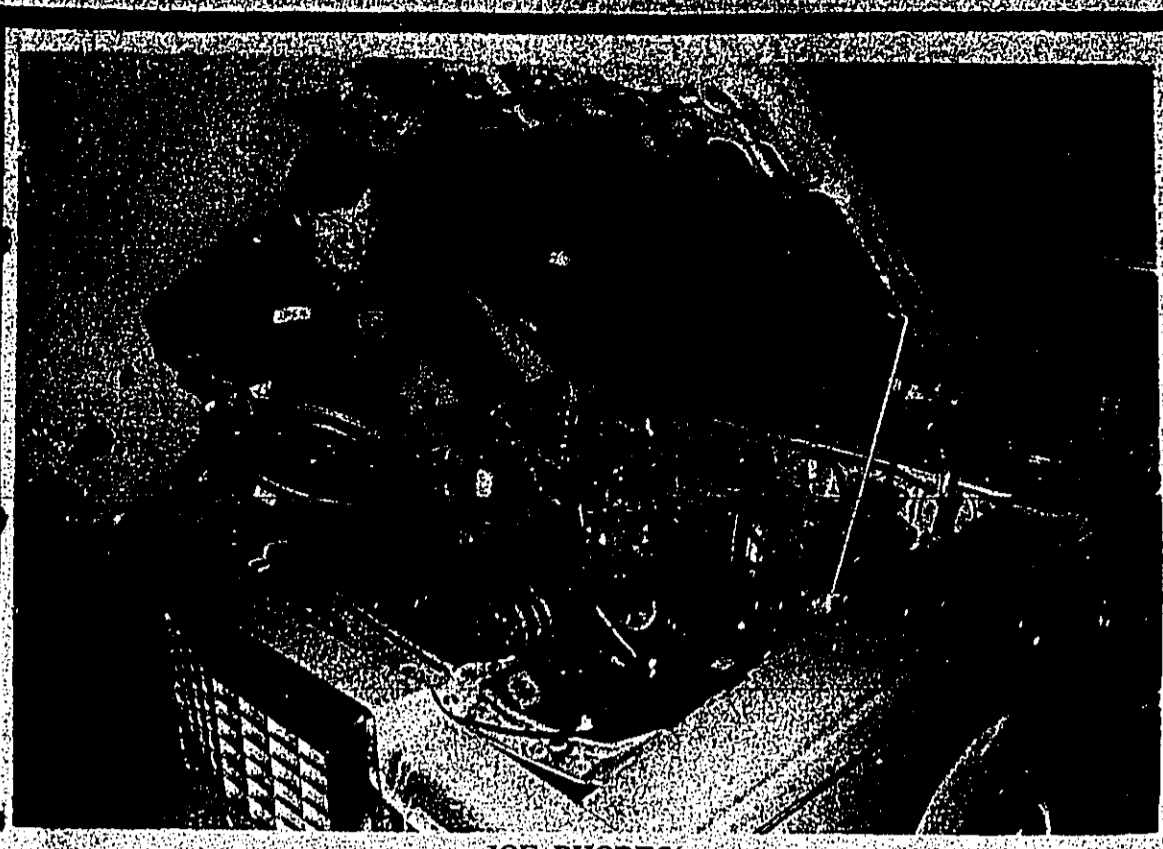

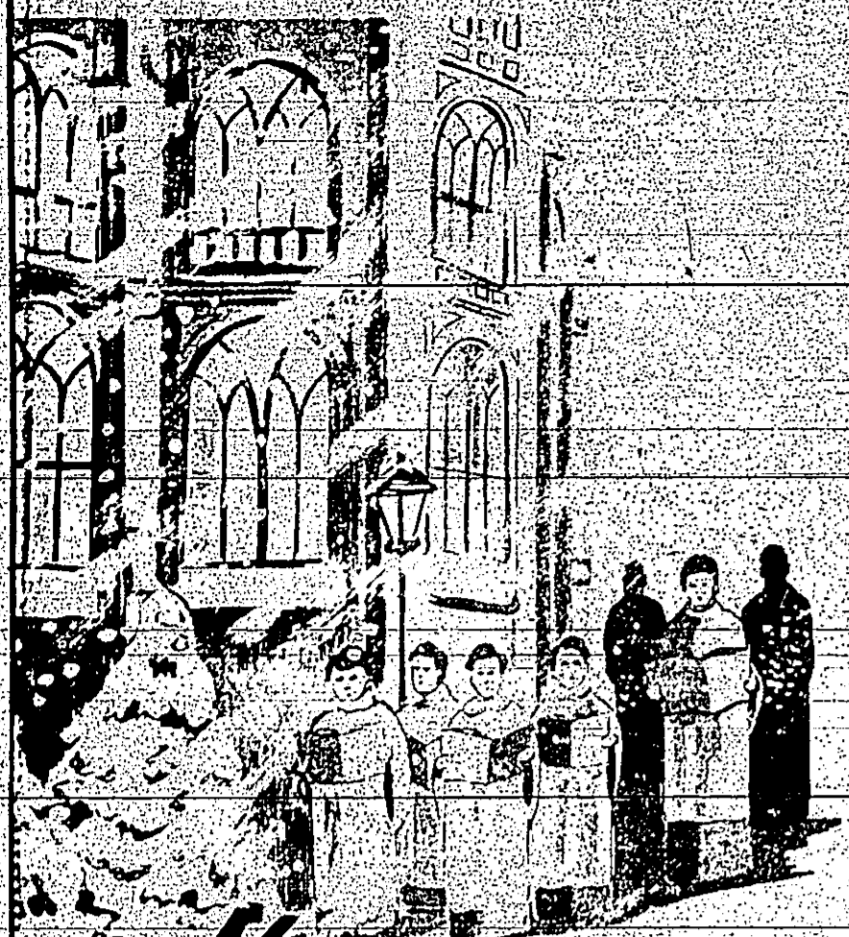

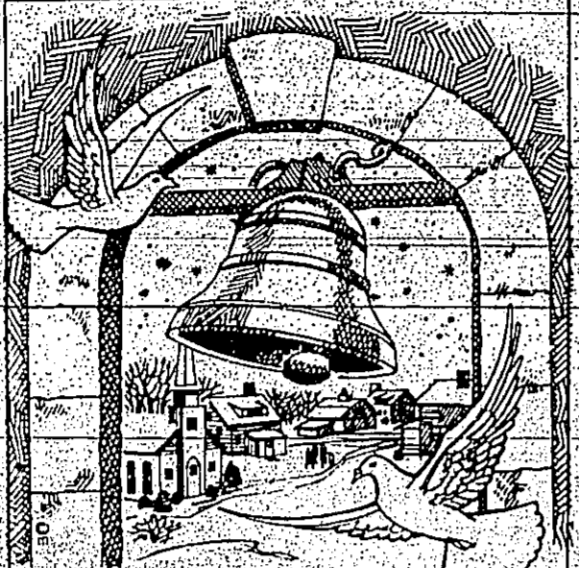
