Elections, Fires Are Top 1980 Stories

January 3, 1980
A charge has been filed against Artie Books, 17, in the charge of molesting Lester Wayne Chambers, 24, of Boger.

January 10, 1980
A 39-year-old white male believed to be the robber of the Chester State Bank on February 20, 1979, is in custody in Spokane, Washington, according to a report this week from the Tyler County Sheriff's Department.

January 24, 1980
A Houston couple drowned apparently late Sunday when their car left the highway and plunged into Lake Steinhagen at the bridge crossing on Highway 190 at Dam B.

January 24, 1980
Found dead in their vehicle at approximately 3:15 p.m. Monday were Harold Smith, 64, and Melba Smith, 54, of 6110 Winfield, Houston. They were driving a 1975 Ford LTD.

January 31, 1980
A large turnout is expected for the Annual Banquet of the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce Friday at 7:30 p.m. at the Woodville Inn.

February 7, 1980
Orman L. Marsh of Woodville was named Tyler County's "Outstanding Citizen" for 1979 at the annual Tyler County Chamber of Commerce Banquet Friday night at the Woodville Inn.

February 14, 1980
Tyler County Commissioners approved operational funds for the Tyler County Historical Commission during a short commissioner's court meeting Monday.

February 21, 1980
Charles Lee, 23, of Hillister went on trial Tuesday in District Court in Woodville for the aggravated rape of a Tyler County woman on October 14, 1979.

February 28, 1980
A seven-man, five-woman jury found Charles Lee of Hillister guilty of aggravated rape and assessed his punishment at 20 years in the Texas Department of Corrections last Friday in the District Courtroom of the Tyler County Courthouse.

March 6, 1980
Tyler County Dogwood Festival Directors have selected Beaumont Businessman Herbert E. Dishman as the recipient of the 1980 "Mr. East Texas" award.

March 13, 1980
The Tyler County Mental & Physical Handicap Association's sheltered workshop for mentally and physically handicapped persons moved a step closer to reality last Thursday night.

March 20, 1980
During a meeting of the TCM&PHA board of directors, Maxie Riley, president, informed the group that Temple Industries had donated \$10,000 to the workshop project. Riley's announcement of the gift was made only minutes before the organization voted to accept a proposal from the U.S. Army to do actual construction and remodeling work on the workshop building. The organization is utilizing the former Veterans of Foreign Wars building in Woodville.

March 20, 1980
The 37th Annual Tyler County Dogwood Festival officially gets underway March 28 and 29 with Western Weekend. A full week of events follows with the climax on Saturday, April 5, with the Dogwood Coronation and Pageant in the open-air amphitheater.

March 27, 1980
The 1980 Dogwood Festival Western Weekend Trailride Parade will step off at 2 p.m. this Saturday, March 29, with the participation of over 15 trailride groups converging on Tyler County for the historic event which started some 37 years ago.

April 3, 1980
The 1980 version of the Dogwood Western Weekend was declared a success by coordinators after last Saturday's rip roaring parade and rodeo which outlined omnipotent blunder clouds and an early morning swan-pour which set a few trailriders some before completing the parade.

April 10, 1980
Vivacious Gita Temple of Colmesneil was crowned Dogwood Festival Queen at Pageant and Coronation ceremonies held Saturday night before a full house under the stars crowd in Woodville.

April 24, 1980

May 1, 1980
Members of the Deep East Texas Development Association passed a resolution requesting more funds from the Texas Highway Department for roadwork on US 190 at a meeting at the Crown Colony Restaurant in Lufkin Friday.

The stretch of Highway 190 between Woodville and Livingston in Tyler and Polk counties is one of the most dangerous in the state, according to J.L. Beard of the highway department. The hoped-for extra funding would make more passing lanes and other improvements possible, Beard said.

May 8, 1980
Tyler County voters turned out in record numbers Saturday with some 46 percent of the electorate casting ballots in an election which will see a runoff result on June 7 in a "hot" sheriff's race as well as a precinct 1 Constable race along with a Commissioner's race in precinct 3.

May 15, 1980
An impassioned plea for "help" stemming from alleged threats on his life, which were reportedly made by Sheriff Lewis Craven and his son, Gary in March, 1977 were revealed Monday by Michael Ross Sidoric, formerly of Colmesneil, who while reading partial copies of a prepared text said that the Sheriff told him and his fiancée, Jane Beaman, "That someone might find us lying face down in the dirt with a slug in us."

Sidoric indicated that others in Tyler County were living in the same kind of fear and that "There is a conspiracy of silence about this kind of thing that needs to stop."

Craven responded to Sidoric's accusations by saying, "You're lying, lying like a dog trotting down the road."

May 22, 1980
Responding this week to allegations that he threatened the life of Michael Ross Sidoric, of Austin, Gary Craven, son of Tyler County Sheriff Lewis Craven, said Monday, "What Mike said was false... I don't know why he said those things... neither me or any member of my family has threatened him."

May 29, 1980
Pister H. Garrison, Mayor of Lufkin, was presented the Ralph W. Steen Deep East Texas Citizen of the Year award by last year's recipient, San Jacinto County Judge K.P. Bryant at the well-attended annual Deep East Texas Council of Governments awards luncheon.

June 5, 1980
Verbal requests for poll watchers to act as official observers in the upcoming Democratic Party Primary election runoff have been made to the office of Democratic Party Chairman Morris Clemmons who said, "If they want them; they'll have to get on their horse to get them approved."

June 12, 1980
Senator Roy Blake of Nacogdoches will speak at the dedication ceremonies of the Sheltered Workshop For The Handicapped in Woodville and San Augustine on Thursday, June 12. The ceremony in Woodville is scheduled to begin at 10 a.m. and the ceremony in San Augustine will begin at 2 p.m. The Tyler County Sheltered Workshop is located at 203 Willow St. in Woodville and the Sabine-San Augustine County Sheltered Workshop is located at 124 East Columbia St. in San Augustine.

June 19, 1980
Miss Tyler County, Bethwyn Bingham, leaves for Fort Worth and the Miss Texas Pageant on July 5th. She will be accompanied by her manager and chaperone, Mrs. Harold Pryor, and Miss Kimberly Pryor, granddaughter of Mrs. Pryor. Bethwyn will have a busy week with rehearsals and many other activities.

June 26, 1980
Austin Fuller, President of the Deep East Texas Development Association, announced recently that the regular monthly meeting of the Association will be in Nacogdoches County and will be held at 10 a.m. on Friday, June 27, 1980 at the Holiday Inn.

July 3, 1980
Texas House Speaker Bill Clayton told members of the Deep East Texas Development Association Friday to resist asking for Federal Funds and the stumbling blocks that come along with accepting those funds.

July 10, 1980
Inflation and the continuing need to pour billions of dollars into Texas telephone growth are prime factors in Southwestern Bell's request for \$326.3 million in new rates filed recently with the Texas Public Utility Commission.

July 24, 1980
Tyler County Commissioners voted Friday to let the question of reimbursement of legal fees for Tyler County Sheriff Lewis Craven remain on the table. The \$4,431 legal fee was incurred by the Sheriff as a result of a federal investigation of his department following accusations of abuse in the Charles Lee rape trial.

Commissioners were reluctant to approve payment because Craven neglected to seek county approval before hiring outside legal assistance.

July 31, 1980
An early morning fire that completely razed the Woodville Elementary School in little more than an hour is currently under intense investigation by the State Fire Marshall's office along with local authorities who suspect arson.

Firemen fought courageously to stem the blaze and managed to save three classrooms and four portable buildings. Assistance was given by onlookers who carried important papers from classrooms not in immediate danger from the fire.

August 7, 1980
The July 26 arson-suspected fire which destroyed the Woodville Elementary School has prompted the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce to begin soliciting funds for a "Chamber of Commerce Reward Campaign" which Chamber officials hope will help flush out the person or persons involved.

August 21, 1980
"We're the ones that are doing the begging," said Jefferson County Disaster Coordinator L.D. Farrow who was invited by Austin Fuller, civil defense coordinator, to attend a meeting last Thursday called hurriedly as a result of the near-miss Hurricane Allen which prompted county officials to call in experts to help Tyler County serve as a "host" county in case of a mass evacuation.

August 28, 1980
Woodville Independent School Board Trustees accepted the resignation of School Superintendent Tom P. Linaug August 23 at 7 p.m. in a special called meeting and in related action voted to "turn over school board investigation materials" to the district attorney's office for further study.

September 4, 1980
State Senator Roy Blake of Nacogdoches addressed members of the Woodville Lions Club at their noon meeting on September 4th at the Lions Club Building in Woodville. He discussed some of the issues to be considered by the Texas Legislature in 1981 and accepted questions from the audience.

September 11, 1980
"We're giving them the chance to tell us what we want to know," said City Attorney Josiah Wheat at Monday's City Council meeting in considering the upcoming open public hearing on Tuesday, Oct. 7, at 7 p.m. designed, the council said, to glean public preferences for or against a comprehensive zoning ordinance here.

September 18, 1980
Resigning formally early Monday when he turned in his badge to Sheriff Lewis Craven, Deputy Sheriff Jack Gentry said that "Being a deputy in Tyler County was like beating your head against a stone wall."

October 2, 1980
"We're not just spitting in the wind," said County Judge Allen Sturrock as he reviewed a final copy of a letter sent to other County Judges and Commissioners in calling for support of 11 specific "alternatives" to aid valiant taxres Judge Sturrock hopes will become priorities of the Governor "as he looks for ways to work with local county governments."

October 9, 1980
Allison Chevrolet of Colmesneil was the latest Monday night in a series of burglaries that have been plaguing Tyler County in the last week with reported thefts hitting four other prominent businesses in Woodville.

Burglars hit just south of Woodville last Thursday night, also getting away with a 1975 Mark IV Lincoln Continental belonging to Dale Hinsley of Dale's Exhaust Service. Hinsley said his business and two other nearby Boykin Lumber and Philip Heating and Air Conditioning, were burglarized on the same night.

October 16, 1980
The first in a series of zoning hearings was held Tuesday, Oct. 7, at Woodville City Hall last week with City Council drawing fire from several residents who took direct aim at the municipal governing body here.

Citizens in the audience seemed to feel that zoning would "set prices on your property" and "couldn't be another form of controls" be used, such as deed restrictions?

Council took no action as a result of the meeting.

October 23, 1980
The Tyler County Historical Commission may be taking a giant step in the near future as they consider the possible acquisition of the Heritage Garden Village which would make that non-profit historical preservation organization caretakers of one of the largest historical concessions in the state of Texas.

October 30, 1980
An early morning 4:45 a.m. call to the Spurger Fire Department sent 17 Spurger volunteers to a suspected arson fire which demolished the L & J Grocery at the corner of Hwy 92 and FM 1013.

November 6, 1980
A group of investors from central Texas has purchased controlling interest of the First State Bank of Colmesneil and the Chester State Bank of Chester. They are Richard L. Giescke, Don Schautteet, Roy W. Richard, and J.B. McClanahan.

November 13, 1980
Woodville City Council Monday awarded the administration of a third-year Community Development Block Grant program to the Jasper firm of Waxman and Semetko, Inc., who in competition with the Deep East Texas Council of Governments, underbid that agency by \$8,747 for the project.

November 20, 1980
A rash of break-ins in Colmesneil last Tuesday kept Tyler County Sheriff's officers puzzled as they have no clues yet as to the break-ins which hit six colmesneil businesses.

November 27, 1980
Persons in the Warren Community were awakened to what Postmaster Floyd Innman called "Bombs going off" at 4 a.m. Monday morning when a 119-car Southern Pacific train derailed, spilling 15 box cars and two engines in accordion fashion alongside the track.

The accident, according to Southern Pacific officials, is being blamed on defective track in the area, which near the Hwy 69 underpass.

December 4, 1980
Woodville has recently received \$187,500 additional funding for Housing Rehabilitation which is being funded by the Department of Housing and Urban Development, providing money for general home improvements, according to Walt Davis, Woodville City Manager.

December 11, 1980
Elated over a "successful meeting" Tuesday with House Speaker Bill Clayton, a bevy of East Texas county leaders headed by Tyler County Judge Allen Sturrock, Tyler County Commissioner Maxie Riley and Deep East Texas Council of Governments Executive Director Bill Langford came home pleased with "the excellent reception and hearing" they were given in seeking the House speaker's assistance in helping the area leaders try to hold onto tax dollars for road and bridge maintenance and repair in rural East Texas.

December 18, 1980
Tyler County Commissioners met Friday hoping to approve their 1981 budget, but ran into problems when they had to explain the loss of anticipated dollar needs in Colmesneil: Elect Jerry Mahan's Precinct 3. Mahan was visiting in place of Commissioner Leon Fowler, who was in Austin Friday winding up a Sheriff Short Course before he takes off replacing Lewis Craven on "January 1."

December 25, 1980
Tyler County Commissioners passed what County Judge Allen Sturrock tagged as "A tight budget" for the next operating year. The court has estimated an expenditure of \$1,775,557.

Inspiration Of The Old Testament II

We are discussing the inspiration of the Old Testament. Inspiration is found in the exalted conception of God in his writings. Only a slight familiarity with the ideas of deity prevalent among the nations surrounding the Jews, and the basic submission with which the Jews themselves yielded to the religious influence exerted upon them by other people, is sufficient to show the origin of the divine character portrayed in this volume.

We further trace the divine hand in the Old Testament by the unity of its purpose. The student of the history of the Jews and the influence exerted by the sacred teachers upon their people discloses the purpose pursued throughout: all the works of their instruction. That purpose is to bring man nearer to God and his blessings. That one writer should have followed a single purpose throughout one book, or even all his works, is not remarkable; but that many men, living in ages distinct from each other, under circumstances wholly different, should have pursued one principal object — that object contrary to the tendencies of their times, is not only extraordinary, but is indicative of supernatural direction.

One can only conclude that there was a higher power behind it all. That power was God. God planned the whole and arranged all the parts. Man was his agent through whom it was performed.

It is thus that we can understand how Moses' anthem of creation glides into Isaiah's oratorio of the Messiah; and by sinking into Jeremiah's weeping, it falls into Ezekiel's chorus; and changes into Daniel's lyrics.





Real Estate-Mortgage/Tax Report In

According to the Sales Tax Activity for month of 1979, Tyler County for the month of November, reflected for November, 1980 mortgage loan volume was \$223,819.75, an increase of \$524,245.00 in the same month of 1979. The largest loan reflected for November, 1980 was \$175,000.00 and the same figure for November, 1979 was \$145,000.00.

Nationally, the Federal Home Loan Bank Board reports that mortgage lending commitments in October fell nearly 20% from the same month in 1979. This could lead to a further decline in sales of existing homes and construction of new homes.

The Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation reported that the average interest rate being charged across the country by savings and loan associations reached 14.3% plus average origination charges of 1.7% of the amount of the loan.

While new deposits exceeded withdrawals across the country by a substantial margin, over one-half of the deposits were in money market certificates rather than in the lower yielding passbook accounts. This factor would indicate continued pressure on savings and loan associations to impose higher interest rates on loans to offset the higher cost of money to the associations.

According to the Real Estate Barometer published by Stewart Title Guaranty Company, housing starts for the first nine months of this year were down 31.7% across the country. The number of existing single family houses sold during the first eight months was down by 26.7%. The median sales price increased during this period from \$57,700.00 to \$64,900.00 nationally.

Turkeys Doing Well

AUSTIN -- Hunters
and biologists in the
field report fairly stable
wild turkey populations
in Texas despite dry
weather during the
spring and summer
which limited nesting
success.

Good hatches from
the two previous years
fortunately provided
enough adult birds to
maintain the turkey
crop through the dry
summer. With continued
rainfall through the
winter and early spring
an outstanding hatch
could be possible this
spring, according to Don
Wilson, upland game
program leader for the
Texas Parks and Wild-
life Department.

The outstanding
acorn crop this fall
across most of the
state which helped put
white-tailed deer in good
body condition also
benefited the turkey
population. "The turkeys
have pretty good food
and cover right now,
and there should be
plenty of birds for the
1981 spring gobbler
season set for April 18
through May 3, 1981,"
Wilson said. This year a
spring gobbler season
will be offered in 72
counties, compared to 62
counties last spring. The
spring season limit
statewide is one gobbler
per hunter.

Dry weather during
the spring reduced the
hen-poult count to an
average of only six
poult per 100 hens in
the counties surveyed by
biologists, Wilson point-
ed out. This was well
below production of the
two previous springs, he
said.
