Projected \$2 Million Sport Center Planned

A \$2 million dollar recreation-on-wheels center "for the entire family" is planned soon and is scheduled to be located at the presently unused site of the old Drive-In movie theater located at the south city limits of Woodville.

According to workers who were on-site Tuesday, burning rubbish and picking up debris, the center will provide strictly supervised roller skating and other sports on wheels, all designed for clean family fun entertainment.

The five acre tract will provide enough room, the cleanup crew said, to house an approximate 20,000 square foot metallic building which will serve as the central roller skating arena.

A recreation-type center is something that Chamber of Commerce officials and officials of the City of Woodville have been working on for several years.

The roller rink itself will be housed in the 20,000-square-foot facility which will also contain a snack bar which, according to the workers on the scene Tuesday, will offer "ground chuck hamburgers."

The workmen also emphasized the strict discipline rule observance which will be enforced at the arena.

The skating rink itself will utilize an elaborate sound system which will play the top 40 music, some disco, and country and western music.

The skating surface will be a modern plastic "no-noise" floor.

The workmen said also the project should be completed sometime soon, but not later than January 1st and that when the full project is completed sometime two or three years from now the cost of the project will center at approximately \$2 million.

When one Woodville resident heard about the skating rink she said, "It's about time Woodville got a roller rink... why didn't they have one when I was a kid?"

Rep. Jerry Clark To Visit Rotary

AUSTIN, TX.—State Representative Jerry Clark of Buna will address the Woodville Rotary Club at 12:00 Noon on Wednesday, July 8, at the Woodville Inn.

The third-term democrat was invited by the Woodville Rotary Club to discuss the recently concluded Regular Session of the 67th Legislature and to discuss issues to be addressed in the special session beginning July 13.

The meeting will provide club members an opportunity to meet and talk with Rep. Clark who hopes to represent the area in coming years. Woodville and the rest of Tyler County will apparently be added to state representative district 5 that Rep. Clark has represented since he won a special election in March 1978. The new district, renumbered district 14, will include Tyler, Hardin, Jasper and Sabine counties and the southern part of San Augustine County.

The thirty-seven year old Buna native owns and operates a dairy farm and is involved in agricultural business. He is married to the former Janette Hicks of Jasper and is the father of two children, Jerilyn and Joel.

Rep. Clark's legislative responsibilities include serving as vice-chairman of the Committee on Energy Resources and as a member of the

Committee on Natural Resources. His primary piece of legislation during the 67th legislative session strengthens the laws regulating the disposal of hazardous chemical waste.

Rep. Clark's other public service activities include an April briefing in Washington by the Reagan administration, membership on the Western States Forestry Task Force, membership on the Southwest Regional Energy Council, and membership on the Energy Committee of the Southern Legislative Conference.

SPORT ON WHEELS FACILITY PLANNED — A 20,000 square foot air conditioned roller skating rink and "sports-on-wheels complex for the entire family" is being developed and is scheduled to be located at the old outdoor movie theater five acre tract just south of the Woodville City limits.

The facility will have a full-size skating rink with an elaborate music system, a go-kart track and other sports that are reportedly family oriented. Persons close to the project say that strict discipline rules will be enforced at the facility.

DETDA Has Promising Reports

An overflow crowd was on hand such agencies as the Nacogdoches Forest Service, the Deep East Texas Development Association, and the Deep East Texas Water Supply System, which has just initiated a five-year program of seedling county roadways with wild flowers leading up to the 150th Texas Meeting this month at the birthday of Texas in 1986. James Fredonia Inn in Nacogdoches, Dominic of the Texas Highway Department reported on the start of \$7.6 million in highway projects for our area. Dennis Gerald of the Texas Forest Service followed up on an earlier story of a 90-95% survival rate for pine seedlings due to the abundance of rainfall. Last year at this time, the drought conditions were leading up to a year of 70-80% losses. Gerald also pointed out that the TFS was initiating a new plan for fire suppression. A mobile base station for fire fighting is being worked out with the area's counties. Along the same lines was a reminder of the Forest Day scheduled for September 19 in San Augustine. Events for the day will include contests, tours and seminars. At this time eight timber companies are supporting the events.

Angela Quillin of the Angelina-Neches River Authority thanked St. Regis for the donation of a water testing device that will allow the authority to test for heavy metal water contamination. Prior to the donation no public agency in the area had such testing capability.

Ron Willis of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments announced the swearing-in of this year's slate of officers which were re-elected from last term with the exception of Polk County Judge Wayne Baker, who is the new 3rd Vice President. It was learned that the COG has begun work redesigning four area counties as well as other contract work to the extent that federal cutbacks have been to a large extent offset. One new COG program was outlined that will help coordinate emergency medical services in the area. A resolution is being sought to head this project.

John Jadowski, public information officer of the Trinity River Authority, presented a background sketch and present operations of the authority. The TRA is the state

second largest river authority second, the fact that it is not a taxing authority. All projects developed must be able to pay back their cost. According to Jadowski, TRA is concerned with improved living conditions and a healthy economy within its jurisdiction and is working closely with the people it serves.

DETDA's next meeting will be July 24 at 10 a.m. in Jasper. All citizens concerned with the Deep East Texas development and the quality of life in the area are urged to attend.
