





HOME CURES FOR COLDS AND FLU Sooner of later, no matter how hard we may try to fight it, most everyone comes down with colds. With that problem in mind, we've collected a few home-rem edy suggestions that are every bit as good as the myriad of anti-cold drugs mentioned on TV and radio . but don't strain either your pocketbook or your body

natural defense system. First of all, a reader (who claims he hasn't had "the bug" in the 16 years since he discovered his cure) sent along the following personally tested instructions for a remedy for colds and flu. Willard Olney got the brainstorm for his treatment after reading an article which pointed out that a fever will naturally halt the course of a pesky cold or flu virus. (That's why you feel better after a fever breaks.) Olney concluded that he could head off many illnesses if he simply raised his own body temperature before the virus settled in. At the first symptoms of a cold or flu (headache

scratchy throat, sore muscles, fatigue . . . you know all the miserable signs). Olney goes home in the evening and soaks-for as long as he can stand it-in a very hot bath. (For safety's sake, be sure the water doesn't exceed 105 °F if you try it!) Then, when his body temperature registers about 102°F. Willard gets out of the tub. (It's a good idea to get help when standing up ... hot water baths can make you dizzy!) Next, he climbs into bed—under plenty of extra blankets-to roast, shucking off the covers

So, next time you start feeling poorly, you might consider taking Olney's advice: Just draw yourself a hot bath and save the money you might have spent on worthless "mira-However, if it's too late—and you've already let a vi-

rus get the best of you, another reader, Marj Watkins, has a few suggestions on how to handle a fever.

If your temperature is under 102 F, Ms. Watkins suggests you eat chilled custard, jello, applesance, and small amounts of lean beef. Drink apricot juice, lemon ade, fresh or reconstituted frozen orange-juice; or chilled rose-hip or mint tea-along with 1,000 milligrams of vitamin C-every two hours. Keep warm and For a fever of over 102°F. Mari adds, you should sip

cool liquids reinforced with about 1/2 teaspoon of powdered ascorbic acid (the same substance that a sprinkled on fresh fruit to prevent browning) or dissolved vitamin C tablets (1,000 milligrams per cupful). Standar bed. Lightly wash your face, hands, arms, and neck with a pool, wet cloth, continually cooled in a basin of cold water. (Do consult a doctor if sore throat, vomiting, abdominal pain, or chest congestion are also present... or if home remedies fail to bring you relief.) The lady also recommends that a percon recovering from a fever stay indoors—and preferably in bed—until the temperature has been normal for a full 12 hours, or

For the past two years, we have seen a slight trade surplus, but this ear a substantial deficit is projected. What happened? American workers are still productive, and the quality trialized nations have "caught up" with us in many respects. But in fact, in many industries American com-

Japan and Western European nations often subsidize heir export industries, enabling them to sell goods in the U.S. much cheaper than even our own manufacturers. On the other end of the trade balance, these same nations set up trade barriers to restrict American companies' ability to sell abroad. The U.S. has rejected the idea of setting up comparable barriers, because we believe truly free trade is

the best path to prosperity for us and for the rest of the Some of our problems have been the result of restrictions which stem from our own laws. For instance, the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, designed with the noble ntention of outlawing attempts to bribe foreign officials, has had the effect of making foreign trade more cumbersome and expensive because of certain meaningless restrictions and red tape.

Similarly, our tax structure has penalized Americans working abroad: I am pleased to note, however, that one of the provisions in the tax relief package passed this.

summer will bring relief on that score. 'Our government also has neglected to take actions which could help our industries be more competitive in the world market without setting up trade barriers. For example, the Export Trading Company Act of 1981, which was bassed by the Senate, but is held up in committee in the louse, would help small- and medium-sized businesses ombine their marketing and promotional activities so they can compete more effectively.

Yet, even if we overcome all of our internally imposed barriers to effective competition, we will still face problems dealing with countries which provide direct ubsidies to their own industries and restrict ours.

This situation will require improving our trade posture through world negotiations. While we should avoid the temptation to throw up counter-productive barriers in the name of protection, we must let our trading partners now we expect fairness and equity in our dealing with

I am pleased that the Administration is working toward this end through efficient, timely, and certain enforcement of the fair trade provisions of U.S. trade laws ind the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT). GATT is the multilateral agreement subscribed to by 85 overnments which together account for more than fourfifths of world trade. Substantial reduction on tariffs and other barriers to trade is its principal aim. This Administration has aggressively and efficiently pursued U.S. trade rights under GATT. Of particular interest to Texas will be negotiations

than it has ever been. has had serious difficulties attracting volunteers with high school diplomas, reports that 78 percent of its male recruits last year were high school graduates, up almost 30 percent from the year before. According to the Pentagon, 60 percent of those eligible for reenlistment last year signed up for additional hitches, up about

6 percent from 1980. -. But, as you probably know, I have been skeptical of the allvolunteer system since President Nixon ended the draft in 1973, and I am convinced that our manpower weakness is at least as serious a threat to national security as weaknesses in our weapons systems.

-Of--course, should applaud any improvement in the caliber of our military personnel and the Pentagon's remake us all sleep a little better at night.

But we are misleading ourselves if we accept the Pentagon's new statistics as proof positive that the all-volunteer force is a success, that it is the best way to run an army.

The Administration says improved recruit- : ment and reenlistment are the direct result of higher military pay and improved educational benefits. I certainly don't begrudge our men and women in uniform enough money to keep them from having to live off food stamps.

But a factor the Administration has not mentioned is the effect economic conditions have on recruitment. A high unemployment rate makes military service a more attractive option to young people who might otherwise end up pounding the pavement looking for jobs that aren't there....

If the economy takes a turn for the better, we can count on recruitment and reenlistment taking a turn for the worse.

The Pentagon also left out the fact that we are still having problems filling the tanks of the National Guard and the reserves, both obviously critical to military preparedness.

The goal is readi ness, to be prepared to mobilize our armed forces literally at a moment's notice. when 25 percent of the young men reaching the age of 18 don't even register with the Selective Service, it's clear that we have a serioud mobilization problem.
