
Repair, Shop Owner Dorman, Taylor, 41, who has been waging a strong individual effort against IRS claims against him said he expected the seizure and began informing the agents when they entered his property that "They were viola-ting my rights and were subject to fines of up to \$10,000 for conspiracy to threaten or oppress or intimidate me in anyway."

Agents who mustered at the courthouse square while coordinating their seizure activities with the County Sheriff's office were seen readying themselves with bullet proof vests and loading their weapons.
