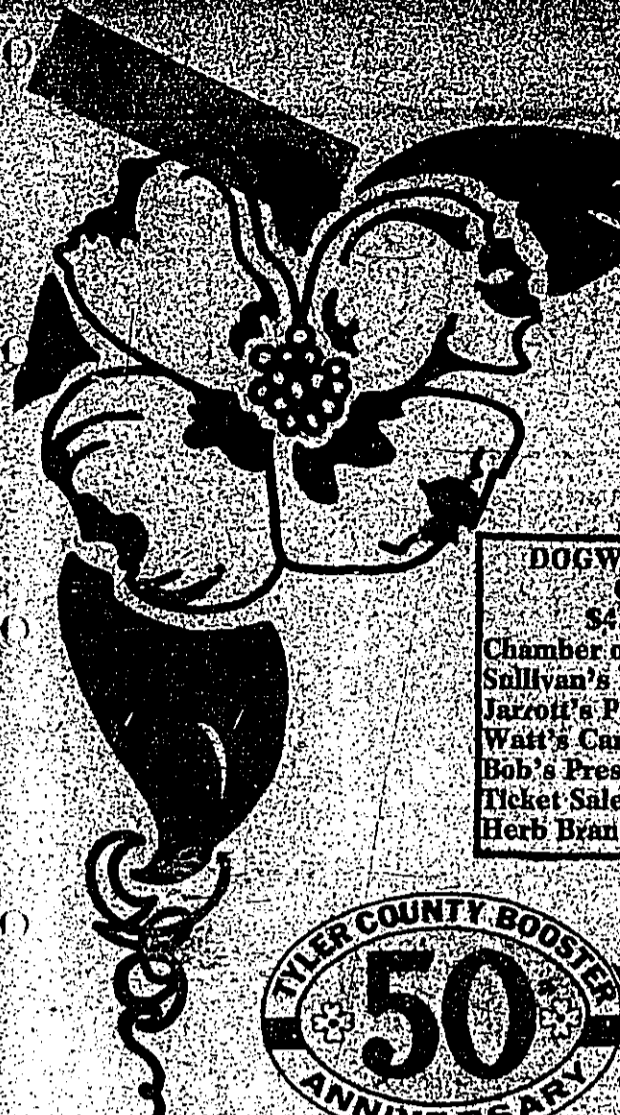
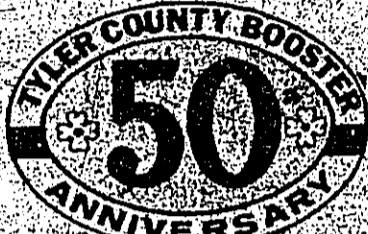

"GOOD TO BE BACK"... State Senator Roy Blake of Nacogdoches visited the Woodville Rotary Club last week reporting of his voting record in the last term and indicated to the group that he was going to target "water" as the key of his next term of office, if elected.

Blake Puts Water As Emphasis

State Senator Roy Blake of Nacogdoches said Wednesday at a Rotary Club meeting at the Woodville Inn that he would continue to push for continued Mental Health, Mental Retardation funding for his district, higher salaries for the Texas Highway Patrolmen, and said he would vote also for the unincorporated area county one-cent sales tax as a buffer to higher property taxes that are just over the hill.

Blake said also that his next administration, if re-elected, would be to focus on the area's water supply. He said "Nothing is more important than out water and sewer systems." Blake noted the recent appointment of Lufkin attorney John Stover to the Texas State Water Commission, as a move he hoped "would bring emphasis back to his district." Blake recounted his voting record in the Senate remarking that he voted on

"every issue and was" extremely pleased with his success with the lateral road fund, the registration fees which resulted in some \$185,000 a year returned to Tyler County. He also referred to some 24 other bills he helped initiate into law.

"But the greatest thing is to get out and see the people", Blake said. Blake said a group would be departing from Tyler County on May 27 for a Visit with Commissioner Denman of the Texas Highway Department. Blake urged that as many Tyler County officials attend as possible.

Latta To Survey County

Woodville-Tommy Latta, candidate for Tyler County Judge, will seek the opinions of Tyler County voters through a series of questionnaires he will distribute county-wide commencing next week.

He said Tyler County badly needs a new County Judge who can provide new ideas and new leadership and reassure County residents that large individual tax increases can be avoided.

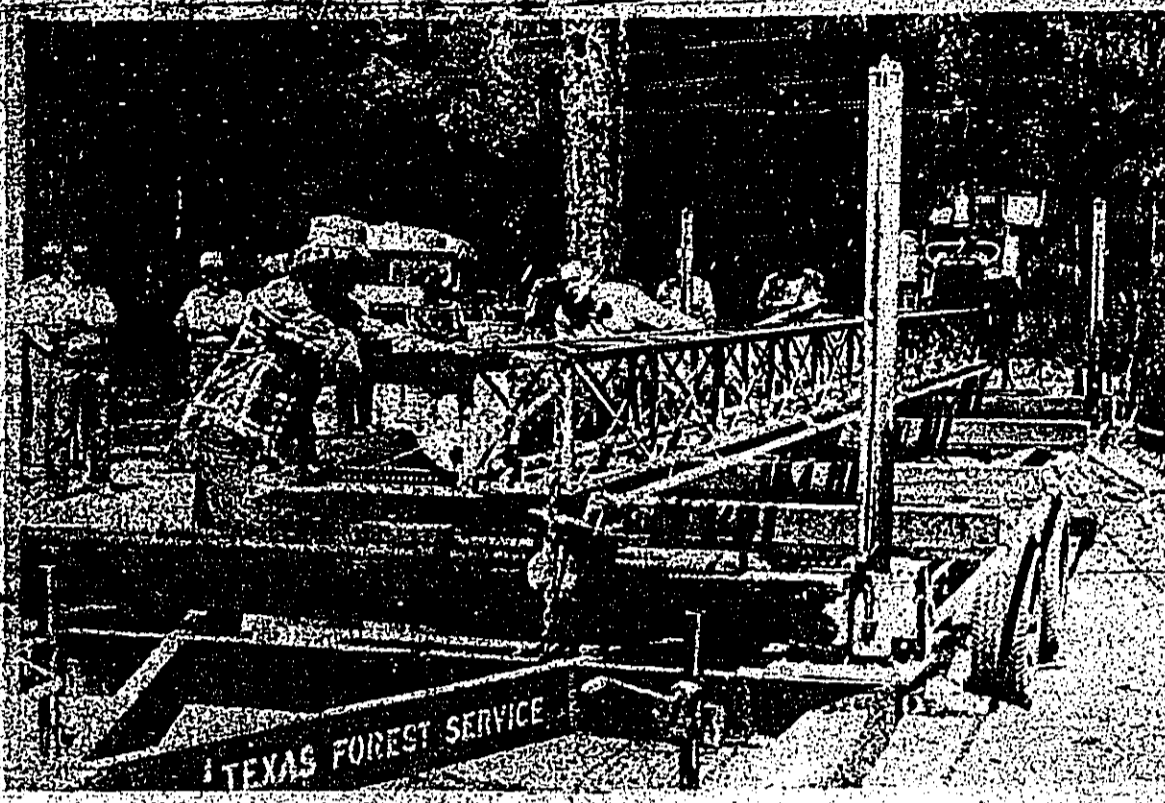

Forestry Tour In County

A unique portable sawmill demonstration was observed by more than fifty men, women and young people assembled at the John Henry Kirby Forest site south of Warren was only a part of the day long forestry tour held Saturday, Mar. 13.

Elmer R. Oates, of Woodville and Chairman of the Tyler County Program Building Committee was responsible for the overall tour program. Among those present and contributing to the informative tour were: Irvin Grillo of Woodville and Chairman of the Forestry Committee; Herb Branch with International Paper Co. and a member of the Forestry Com.; Daryl Ward with Temple Essex and a Forestry Com. member; Gary Lacom, Area IV Forester with the Texas Forest Service and a Forestry Com. member; Dr. Michael J. Walters, schell from Texas A&M University, Extension Forester and Project Supervisor in Forestry.

Actual machine planting was observed and discussed by several members of the Forest Service. Hand planting versus machine planting was discussed. A new row planting rather than chisel planting of loblolly and long-leaf pines was demonstrated. Several plantations were shown.

Among other special guests were G. G. "Doc" Gibson, retired professor from A&M and past Director of the Texas Agriculture Extension Service, and Val Blanchette of Colmesville, Chairman of the "Long Leaf" Soil Conservation District.

Special thanks was demonstrated by every one (by hearty appetites) to Robert Dixon, Representative of TA Post of the Beaumont office, who prepared and served the noon buffet provided by TAP.

The tour ended with a Christmas Tree Farm demonstration by the group returning to Woodville via local Agriculture Extension Service Agent Clinton Currie's farm. The other half visited a farm near Kountze where several put in orders for Christmas 1982.

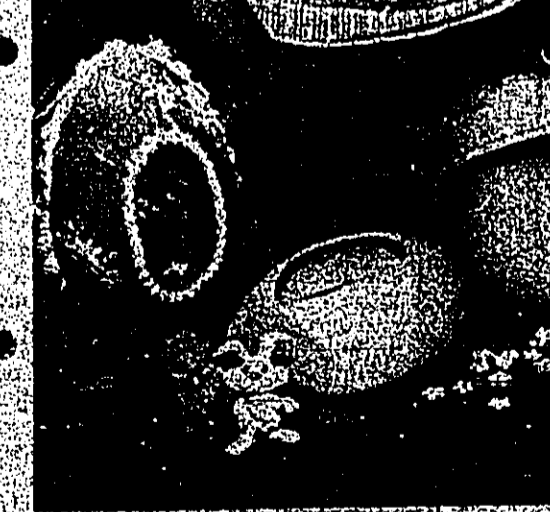

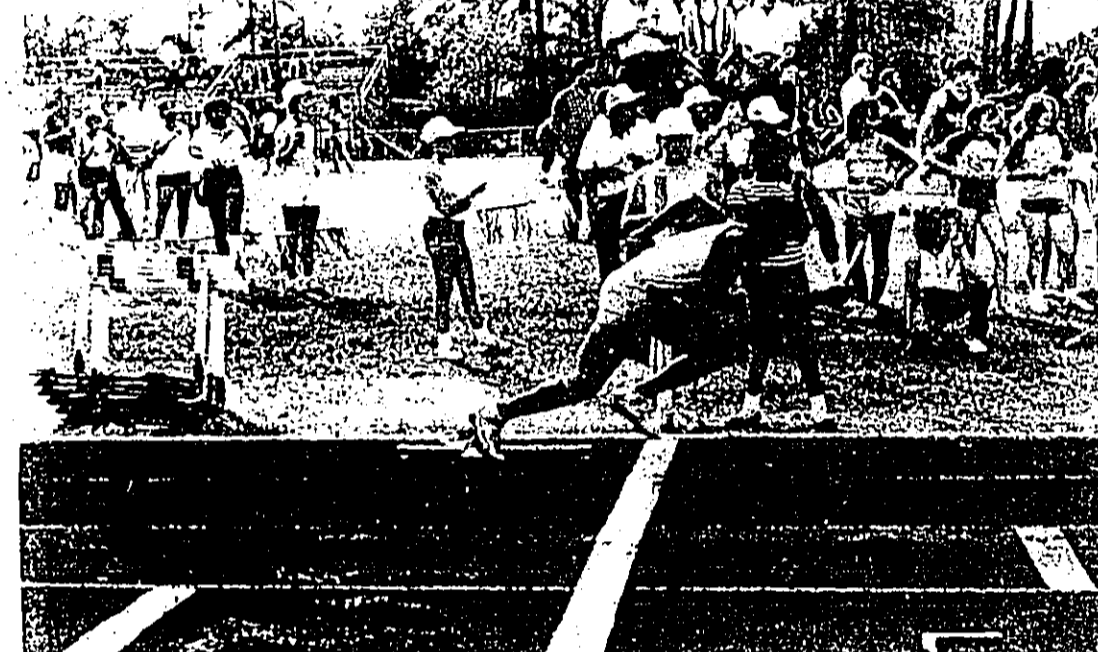

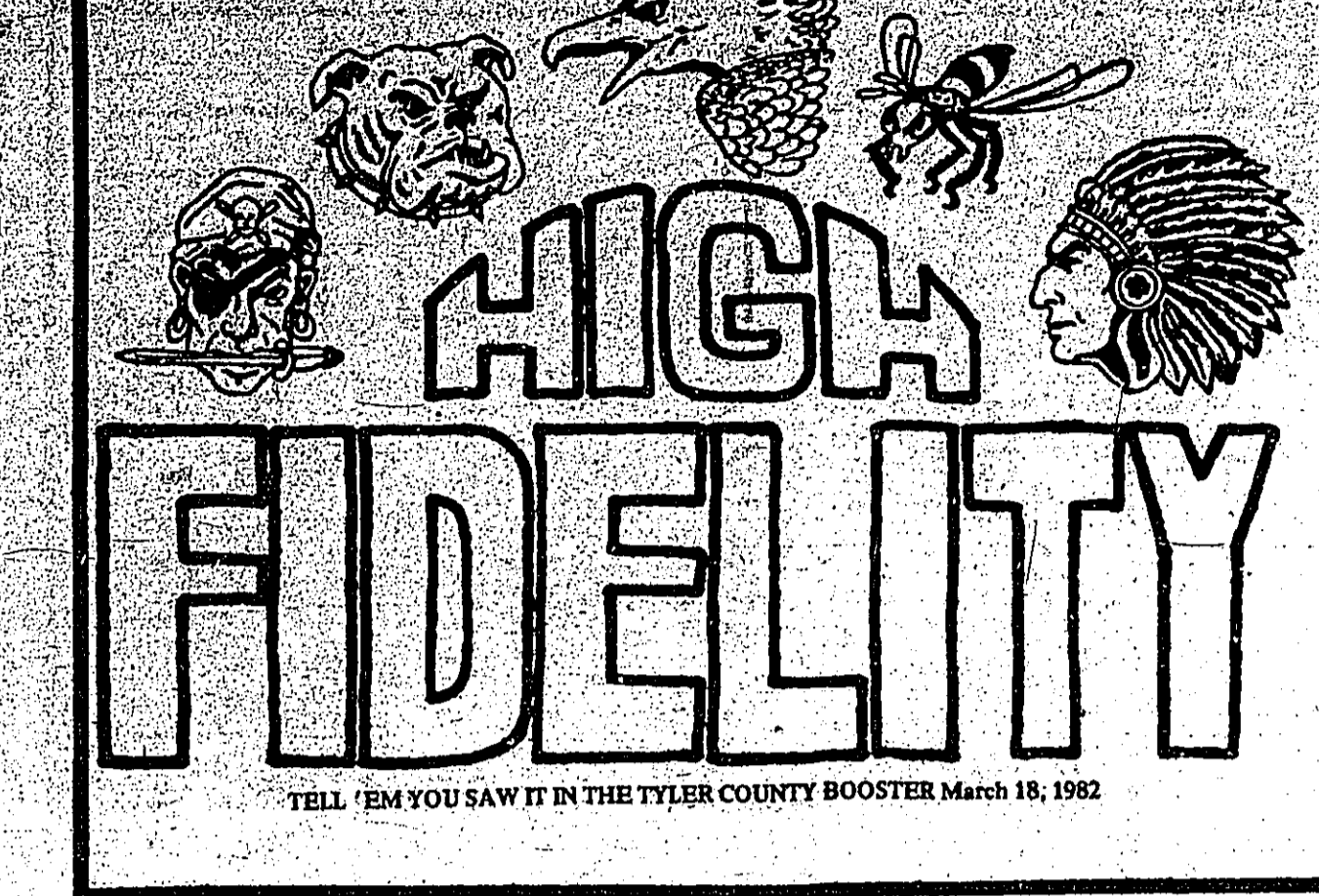

Abernethy Is 1982's Mr. East Texas

The 1982 Mr. East Texas is a native son with international experience and a broad field of intellectual interests.

Born in Altus, Oklahoma, Francis Edward Abernethy grew up in Palestine and Nacogdoches, where in 1943 he graduated from high school, and from which he undertook his first international excursion as a gunner's mate in the Navy during World War II.

From 1946-49 he completed work on a B.A. degree in English and speech at what was then Stephen F. Austin State College, and then spent a period of study at the University of Neuchatel in Switzerland. Returning to the United States, he completed work in 1951 on an M.A. degree in English at Louisiana State University and began teaching at Woodville High School.

Intent on a career in college teaching, Abernethy then returned to LSU to complete work in 1956 on a Ph.D. degree in English and to serve as a teaching assistant.

From 1956-65 he taught English at what was then Lamar State College and then returned home to join the English faculty at SFA where he is currently serving as professor of English.

Meanwhile, he continued to travel abroad during the summers, when he participated in bio-geological expeditions to Mexico and Central America. His interest in biology had been whetted during summers between graduate work in Louisiana, where he worked with the state wildlife and fish commission.

Abernethy's academic specialty, however, has been folklore, a field in which he has written and edited several books and in which he has published scores of articles. The international reputation he enjoys has resulted in his being chosen successively counselor, vice-president, president, and, since 1971, secretary-editor of the prestigious Texas Folklore Society. As secretary-editor, Abernethy follows in the footsteps of such famed Texas folklorists as J. Frank Dobie and Mody Boatright, but he has added a dimension missing in his predecessors: Abernethy is also a noted folk singer and musician. He is a member of a local group, the East Texas Spring Ensemble, that has appeared on local, state, and national folklore programs.

Presented each year to the East Texas who best exemplifies the spirit and quality of leadership which advances, shapes, and gives direction to the growth and progress of East Texas.

History Of Dogwood Western Weekend

In 1958, approximately 75 riders formed on Highway 190 West at Dickens County Line Store and road to Woodville, arriving in time to participate in the Annual Street Parade. This was the beginning of the now famous Western Weekend portion of the Dogwood Festival.

Gilbert Wright was Parade Chairman, and the first slate of officers were: Charles Dickens, Trail Boss; Bill Barrett, Asst. Trail Boss; Paul Walker, Chief Scout; Leon Dickens, Jr., Scout; Clay Stephenson Parker, Secretary; and Zora Lee Walker, Secretary.

As Abernethie and many others helped get the first ride organized and perfected. Through the years other trail rides such as Carter Trail Riders, Tejas Saddle Club, Spurger Brush Riders, Youth Night Riders, Baytown Rough Riders, Tri-County Trail Blazers, Tyler County Youth Riders, Corrigan Trail Riders, Wildwood Stables and Schwab City Trail Riders have joined in, coming to Woodville from all directions, to make the Western Day Parade, which is second in numbers, only to the Houston Fat Stock Show Parade.

In 1967 the Tyler County Dogwood Festival Western Weekend was established by the Dogwood Festival at the request of the Trail Bosses of the various Trail Rides. Bob Belt was appointed Director and Max Graham as Assistant Director. The Tyler County Dogwood Festival Steering Committee was organized with Walter Santos, Don Crowe, Paul Walker, Charles Dickens, Bill Barrett, John Carter and James Chapman planning the events.

The Parade will have more than 1,500 horses. Such famous groups as the Jefferson County Mounted Drill Team, the Orange County Drill Team, San Augustine 4H Club Drill Team, Owens County Sausage Stage Coach and Horses, Angolina County Sheriff Poase, Triple D Riders and Cowboy John and Black Bart have made the Parade one of the most colorful and exciting parades of its kind. It has been estimated that 10,000 spectators watch this parade annually.

Through the continuous efforts and hard work of many people these Western Day activities have become a very successful and entertaining part of the Dogwood Festival.

Texas State Railroad Iron Horses At Rusk

Despite an occasional nip in the air, the springtime greening of East Texas is beginning to appear. And that means that the Iron Horses of the Texas State Railroad Historical Park soon will arouse from their winter slumber for the 1982 operating season.

Supr. Curtis Pruitt today announced that the park staff is working steadily toward resumption of runs by the old steam locomotives here and in Palestine on Mar. 20. Seasonal workers spent Mar. 16 and 17, cleaning the two trains used by the tourist railroad.

A significant change in the new season will be the resumption of the full 50-mile round trip between the steam's railroad's two stations. The schedule calls for trains to leave from each station at 11 a.m. and arrive at the opposite depot at 4:20 p.m. After a lunch break, passengers will reboard and return to their original departure point at 3 p.m.

Because the two trains will meet at approximately the mid-point of the time, all trains will depart promptly at 11 a.m. "Thus," said the superintendent, "we encourage visitors to allow themselves adequate time for the trip to the railroad's two stations. We certainly don't want anyone left behind."

Weekend schedules will be followed during the spring, Mar. 20 through May 30, and a five-day schedule, Thursday through Monday, will be effective from May 31 through Labor Day, Sept. 6. The fall schedule, weekends only, will be effective Sept. 11 through Oct. 31.

Tours through the locomotive cab are conducted from 10:15 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. to give visitors an opportunity to see the gadgets and levers used to control the old steamers. Staff members will be on hand to answer questions during the tour, noted Pruitt.

The season opening will coincide with the Palestine Dogwood Festival scheduled the last two weekends in March and the first weekend in April. The annual festival features a number of activities scattered over the three weekends. A complete schedule may be obtained by contacting the Palestine Chamber of Commerce.

Pruitt added that reservations are recommended. Texas residents may call 31-500-442-8951 for reservations. Out-of-state residents should call 214-683-2561, he noted.

Tickets are \$6 for adults and \$4 for youngsters, 3-12 years of age.

Ag Report

As leaves green up this spring, splotchy brown areas may appear. These are probably areas infested with brown patch disease last fall, says Dr. George Philley, plant pathologist for the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station Service. It is probably not necessary to treat these areas now with a fungicide as they will likely recover and begin to grow.

Philley says that wheat in East Texas is about two to three weeks behind in its normal growth. This fact, coupled with strong winds, has decreased the probability of foliage diseases on wheat. Normally, foliage diseases occur when the growth is lush and the wheat remains moist for longer periods.

Fruit tree spraying time has arrived in East Texas, Philley says. No insecticides should be applied until after pollination or, better yet, very few insects are active and the delay in applying insecticides will help protect the bees. However, fungicides should be applied for dieback control at the pink bud and full bloom stages.

Recommendations for insect and disease control on fruit trees are available at county Extension offices throughout the area. If quality fruit is to be produced, a disease and insect control program must be carried out throughout the year, Philley emphasizes.

16-Year-Old Gets 'Heroism Award'

Dallas-Kim Bryant, a 16-year-old Hopkins County farm girl who risked her life in saving her father from an attack by an angered bull last November, received the Rural Heroism Award Monday at the annual meeting of the Texas Safety Association.

The presentation is made annually by the Texas Farm and Ranch Safety Council. Ben Bullard, Waco, assistant safety director of the Texas Farm Bureau, is president of the Council.

Kim and her father, Lyle Bryant of Peetless near Sulphur Springs, had the unpleasant but routine task of driving their bull back home after it had strayed onto a neighbor's property. Heading the instruction she had learned in younger years, Kim took along the whip she routinely used to work the cattle.

drove the animal toward home, passing through the neighbor's pen onto the road. But midway through the pen, with Lyle Bryant only four feet from the bull, the animal turned and charged. Bryant was rammed against the fence, then tossed into the air twice; the second time landing on the bull's head. As her father rolled to the ground, with the bull continuing his attack, Kim began to look at the bull with her whip.

At first, the bull disregarded Kim's attack and continued butting her father. Suddenly, Kim remembered some advice from her grandfather - if you ever want a cow's attention, he said, crack them across the bridge of the nose.

Dragging her father with one arm, and with the whip wrapped around her other hand, she struck a hard blow to the bull's nose with

the whip handle. The animal paused, so she hit him several times. The stunned bull was motionless as she dragged her father safely from the pen, closing the gate behind her.

Due to his daughter's courage, Bryant suffered only one broken rib, a minor shoulder fracture, numerous cuts, bruises and punctures. After a nine-day stay in the hospital, he was back on the farm.

Ralph Nader At Lamar April 7

Ralph Nader, the leading figure in consumer affairs in the United States, will appear on the Lamar University campus on April 7 in the ballroom of the Setzer Student Center.

The 8 p.m. lecture will mark the second appearance by Nader at Lamar. He last lectured in McDonald Gym in 1972.

Nader has been called everything from muckraker to consumer crusader to public defender. He is, as Time Magazine noted, "the U.S.'s toughest customer."

He is being sponsored at Lamar by the Forum Committee of the Setzer Student Center Council. Admission to the lecture is \$1 for Lamar students, \$1.50 for high school student and senior citizens and \$2 for the public, said Nydia Thomas, chairman of the committee.

The crusading attorney who first made headlines in 1965 with his book UNSAFE AT ANY SPEED, the scathing indictment of the auto industry for producing unsafe vehicles, has been responsible for at least six major federal consumer protection laws, for the recall of millions of defective motor vehicles and for many lives saved.

Today, Nader speaks of the growing "imperialism" of multinational corporations and of the convergence of giant corporate and government powers that he says resembles the textbook definition of corporate socialism.
