## Gas System Shutdown Seen

A Tyler County brand of New Federalism has hit the community of Doucette with the action of Woodville City Council Monday night as they acted to file a suit against the Tyler County Minority Outreach organization which is now acting as administrator of the Doucette Gas System which will be cut off soon by Woodville City Fathers because of a \$12,000 debt owed the City.

pleaded with the council for "an extra 30 days to heat the financially broken down and leaking system."  
Woodville City Mayor Doug Tolbert rejected Butler's plea saying "time is just going to mean a higher bill."  
The council did give the group till Friday, April 23 to meet with the customers and their TCMO organization to put together a plan of operation to tackle the problem.  
An official source said Tuesday

that the suit action "was merely to test the communities reaction to the problem and would probably not be instituted."  
Butler said his organization "had been led into the project by McNeal Adams, an engineer and the group now felt they were misguided since they found several important discrepancies."  
Butler pleaded with the council to let them have 30 days to recondition the gas system and get a competent

bookkeeper and a competent auditor to run the project.  
Mayor Tolbert suggested to Butler that he excuse himself from the project and turn it over to someone that can handle it. "You've got a wildcat by the tail and you'd better turn him loose," said Councilman John Gilchrist.  
Woodville City Manager Walt Davis told the group that Tenneco, supplier of gas, would give 10 days to Woodville to pay its bill with 20 percent interest.  
Councilmen were angered when it was reported that serious leaks existed in the system and that no steps had been taken thus far to correct them.  
Woodville Councilman Gordon Anderson said "If I were you I'd be up there right now fixing the leaks."  
Butler told the council that he needed 30 days "So his group could formulate a system to keep the gas system alive."  
Doucette businessman Durwood Ling said "You've sorta bumped a stump when you talk about buying the Doucette system. The way I see it there's nothing to buy."  
Woodville Councilman John Gilchrist who termed his council motion "political suicide" was seconded by Kenneth George who told Butler that the move was "something that the council didn't want to do."  
The City of Woodville put a deadline of 11 days on the TCMO to come up with the money to bring their bill current also ordered City Attorney Joseph Wheat to draw up a lien on the Gas System bill the money was paid.  
The Woodville City Council following the appeal from Butler heard a report from Davis about a new 7.2 cent hike in gas prices.

The Warren Independent School District will mark its 100th year of existence with a special centennial celebration on May 22, according to Warren ISD Superintendent Adolph Hryhorchuk.  
Special speaker for the event will be Texas State Commissioner of Education, Raymon L. Bynum. The school district is the oldest school system in Tyler County, starting its first school year in 1881-82. Centennial Committee chairman LaVern Hatton is currently researching all the past records of the school district. Minutes of school board meetings dating back to 1918 are being carefully researched so that an accurate history of the district may be presented at this celebration.  
Various dignitaries, past school board members, administrators, former faculty members and students are being invited to attend the special commemoration which will be held at the High School Football Stadium. Observances are also scheduled in the Warren High School plant featuring Warren School District in years gone by. Special centennial jubilee awards

will be presented to outstanding students.  
A special Centennial Banner is being designed and made by Polly Swinney. A unique antique collection will be presented by George Isaacks, 23 year faculty member of Warren. Persons with old photographs, news clippings and historical data or articles are urged to contact Mrs. Hatton at the school administration office if they wish to contribute to the displays planned.

## Homemakers Meet

The Freestrong County Extension Homemakers will host the District 9 Annual Meeting of the Texas Extension Homemakers Association, April 14 at Lakeside Methodist Assembly, which is located between Tucker and Ekhart on Highway 294 in Anderson County. The Texas Extension Homemakers Organization was established in 1926 by 399 women whose primary purpose was to establish a \$200 yearly scholarship for a deserving 4-H girl. This organization has grown to more than 21,000 members giving six \$550 yearly scholarships. Texas Extension Homemakers are affiliated with the National Extension Homemakers Council and is the largest women's organization in the United States. They have a six-point educational program in every county of the State, promoting safety and health, citizenship and legislation, family life and family resources, cultural arts and international understanding, leadership and programs to meet the needs of the young homemaker. Mrs. Elva Richards, State TEHA Vice-President of Port Arthur will bring the keynote address. Prior to being elected to the office by the Vice-President, she held offices in her local club and county council. She was the first lady to be elected to serve as Chairman of the Jefferson County Building Department. She has also served as District II TEHA Chairman and TEHA Treasurer. Three workshops are planned for the afternoon. Mr. Lloyd Allison, with the Texas Department of Public Safety, stationed in Anderson County, will address the group on Driving Safety including the effect of alcohol and drugs on driving. Vice-President, J. W. Joiner, Jr., will address the group on Leadership Potentiality. The singers travel and live in a converted 1961 Trailways bus. They log about 35,000 miles a year and are booked to give concerts, revivals and Bible conferences 50 weeks of the year. "God has called us to minister to others," claims Oliver. 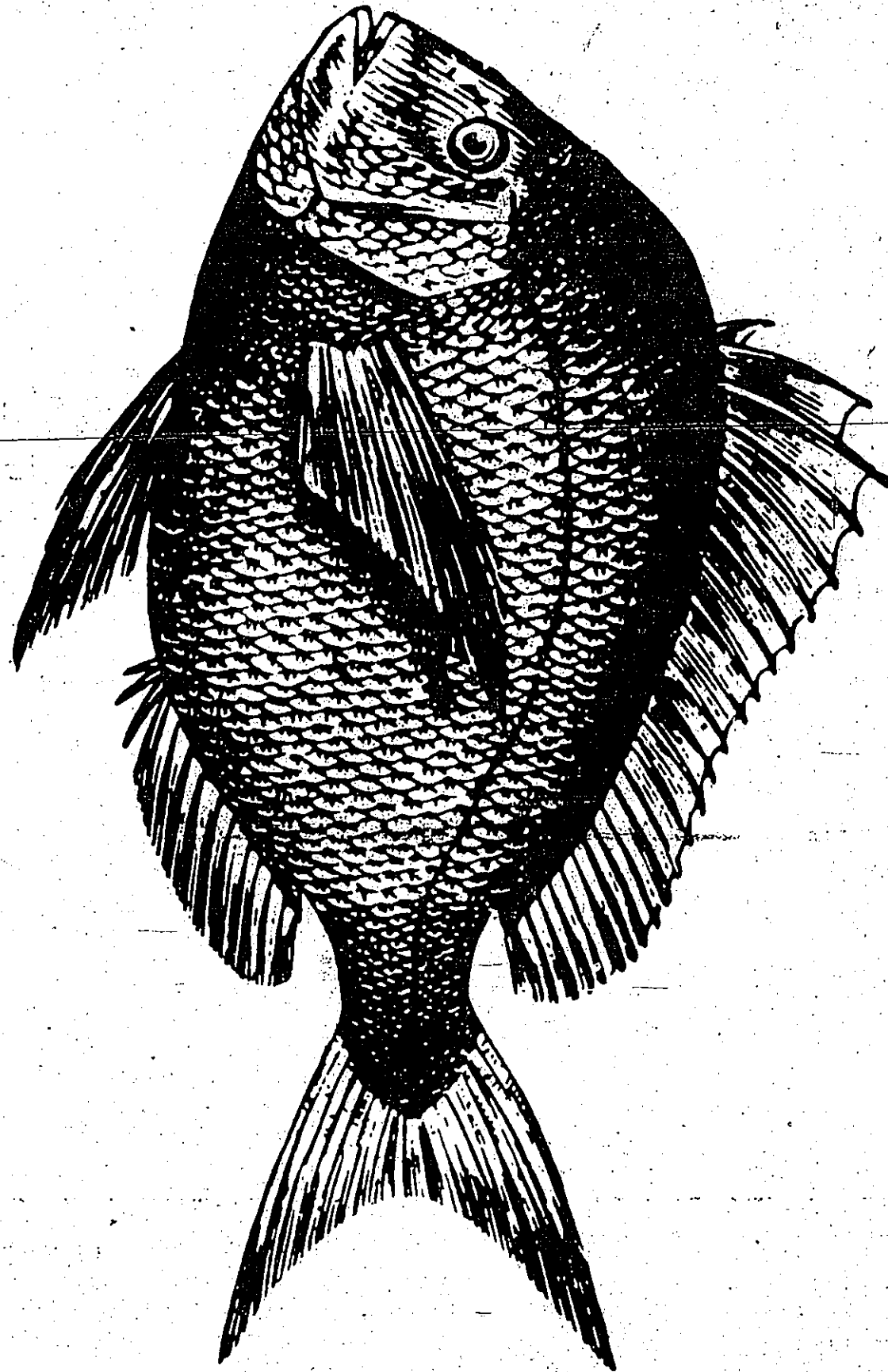
