

"First, determine the scope of the project. Second, identify those potential 'career' volunteers to head up lengthy projects," she says. Then focus on other


retired people for short term projects or those requiring intermittent involvement. Examples of such projects would be a public television fund-raising drive held annually or a series of educational programs on personal safety,
