





Woodville and **Chester Students** Take Drivers Education

Mr. Melvin Houston and Elton Spurlock are in the process of teaching 42 students in the classroom and actual driving phase of driver training. The district also has a large portable simulator driving building from Region V to aid their teaching program. The students spend 12 one hour sessions in the simulator and it is really a driving experience. 42 students from Woodville and 20 from Chester will use the simulator for the -next several days.

Mrs. Brenda Williamson from Reion V Education Service, Center Driver Education Program, is the operator and instructor with the simulator. All students, parents received the following letter

### Dear Parents:

During the coming weeks, your teenager will narrowly escape a head-on collision, react to a dangerous skid on an icy road, and cope with s high-speed blowout on a busy expressway.

But don't worry. Your teenager will be sitting safely behind the wheel of a driving simulator. The simulator's unique ability to give students realistic statement in meeting emergencies is only one of the reasons it has been adopted by your high school. Conventional behine-the-wheel training involves a one-to-one teacher-student ratio. Today, simulators are used in thousands of high

schools and colleges throughout the country thelp train nearly a million drivers annually. As your teenager responds to the filmed traffic recorded and displayed for the instructor. In addition, the student response feature of the driving simulator provides the student with immediat feedback when responses called for are not pro-

perly executed.

The driving simulator is a fully equipped, featuring all the essential elements and controls of an actual automobile: t has a realistic steering ratio, many operational dashboard instruments, and functioning brake and accelerator pedals...to name a few of its real-life features.

The instructor console provides immediate monitoring of driver reactions to various traffic situa-

tions that appear on the screen. Not only does the console show whether your son or daughter took the right action. It also indicaters whether the action was properly executed. For example, if a right turn is indicated, the console will show when the turn was made, if it was made at the prope time and in the correct degree.

The instructor console records responses in ker

The instructor console records responses in key driving areas, such as signaling, steering, braking, speed and acceleration. This provides the instructor with a profile of driving skills for later use in evaluating and helping individual students. While the instructor console automatically records a programmed scoring sequence, the feacher often circulates among the simulator cars assisting students with individual problems. Instructors may also use a combination of namual and automatic scoring methods. Both methods enable them to inferpret the information obtained so that they may evaluate the progress made by each student. may evaluate the progress made by each student.
Instructors and students alike have found that simulation training helps develop perceptual and decision-making capabilities and make on the street instruction more meaningful. This decline is because of the quality and increased consumer acceptance of the homegrown product.

Crawfish production has also increased in recent years. Louislana is the number one pro-ducer with about 30 million pounds annually. Texas ranks second among crawfish producing states with an annual production of three to four million pounds. The success of Louisiana production is highly dependent upon the wild crop harvest from the vast Achafalaya Basin. Lower than normai water levels during the past two years have resulted in below normal production.

Other species currently being utilized for culture in freshwater include tilapia, redfish and freshwater shrimp. With increasing pres-sure on the nation's natural resources, aquaculture as an industry should continue to grow in the United States and particularly in the South.

First of all, try to find out how long it will be before your freezer is working again, says Dr. Al Wagner, food technologist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Texas A&M University System.

A fully loaded freezer will stay cold enough to keep food frozen for two days, notes Wagner, while one half-full will only keep food cold for a day. The main thing is to keep the freezer closed and not to check the food regularly.




