District Clerk Brown Named 'Outstanding'

Tyler County District Clerk Patricia Brown has been selected "Outstanding District Clerk" for 1981-82 by the Texas Association of County and District Clerks. The award is presented once a year "in recognition of distinguished public service, civic participation and contributions to the Association."
Members are made up of County and District Clerks from the 254 Counties in Texas. According to Patricia Brown, "they usually chose someone from one of the big counties; I was shocked - still am shocked."
Patricia Brown is completing her second four-year term as District Clerk of Tyler County. She is a candidate for re-election in November with no opposition. The only time she has faced opposition for election to the office she holds was eight years ago. She faced three other opponents in her successful bid to succeed retiring District Clerk Hilda Coats. Brown had

previously worked in the County Court in Tyler County. These are School Superintendent's Office and Judge Clyde E. Smith, Jr. and Judge Monte Lawlis. Five major types of unpaid unofficial deputy in the District Clerk's office. "You could say Hilda Coats was my inspiration." In addition to adult criminal cases, these include juvenile criminal cases, civil lawsuits, tax judgments, divorce and adoption cases. Her office also handles the collection of child support payments. Patricia finds the most difficult and frustrating cases to be involved with are "where divorcing parents are contesting custody of their children. The most rewarding cases

Country Club Improvements Eyed

Future improvements may be on the drawing board for the "more or less" 160 acre, 9-hole Dogwood Country Club and Golf Course this week if the proceeds from a \$325,000 loan from the Chester State Bank are applied toward property improvements there which owner Don Cole says he's aware are needed, "but doesn't want to be tied to any schedule of completion on."
Even though parking lot expansion work has already begun, Cole

says that there is "no public correlation" between the public document regarding the loan, filed at the courthouse on June 3, stating further that all of that is not coincidental with our plans... it doesn't tell the complete story... it's just not what it appears to be."
Cole, however, referred several times in a telephone interview Tuesday, while in Houston, to "preparation for sequential development" of the Country Club which is 13 years old this year and which started out with

the leadership of Morris Clemmons and many other dedicated Tyler Countyans as the Pine Hills Rural Recreational Development, Inc. in Tyler County, opening September 6, 1967, with some 220 members.
Cole referred to the Club as "a private piece of investment property for profit" and the term "Tyler County facility" may be misleading because, he said, "it's a private for profit investment. All public rights were defaulted when the property was

bought."
Cole said "each of the improvements will be made one after the other... when we're ready."
Cole said Tuesday that he didn't want to see the "curious" suggestions about the country club. That comment despite the closure recently of the facility and the major earthmoving work associated with the re-development of the parking lot area and back up sign "Closed for Repairs".
Cole said however that "The Club is not closed only for repairs and

Kohlrabi An odd-looking little vegetable with turnip-like leaves growing out of a bulblike stem, kohlrabi was once available only at farm markets. Now that it's turning up in more and more supermarkets, you may have seen it and wondered what it is, how to prepare it. The bulb is the part usually eaten, either cooked or raw. The taste? Somewhere between a turnip and a cabbage (the name means "cabbage turnip" in German). Here, some buying tips plus ways to use this delightfully different vegetable. Note: Kohlrabi is a good source of vitamin C and great for dieters - one cup cooked provides only about 40 calories.

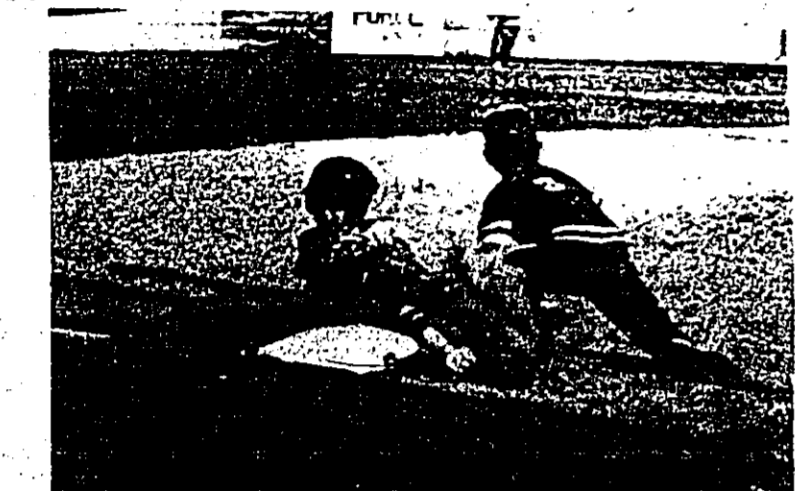
It was so hot on the lake Friday that it made Ken promise to change his way of living and I also thought about the heat quite a bit myself.

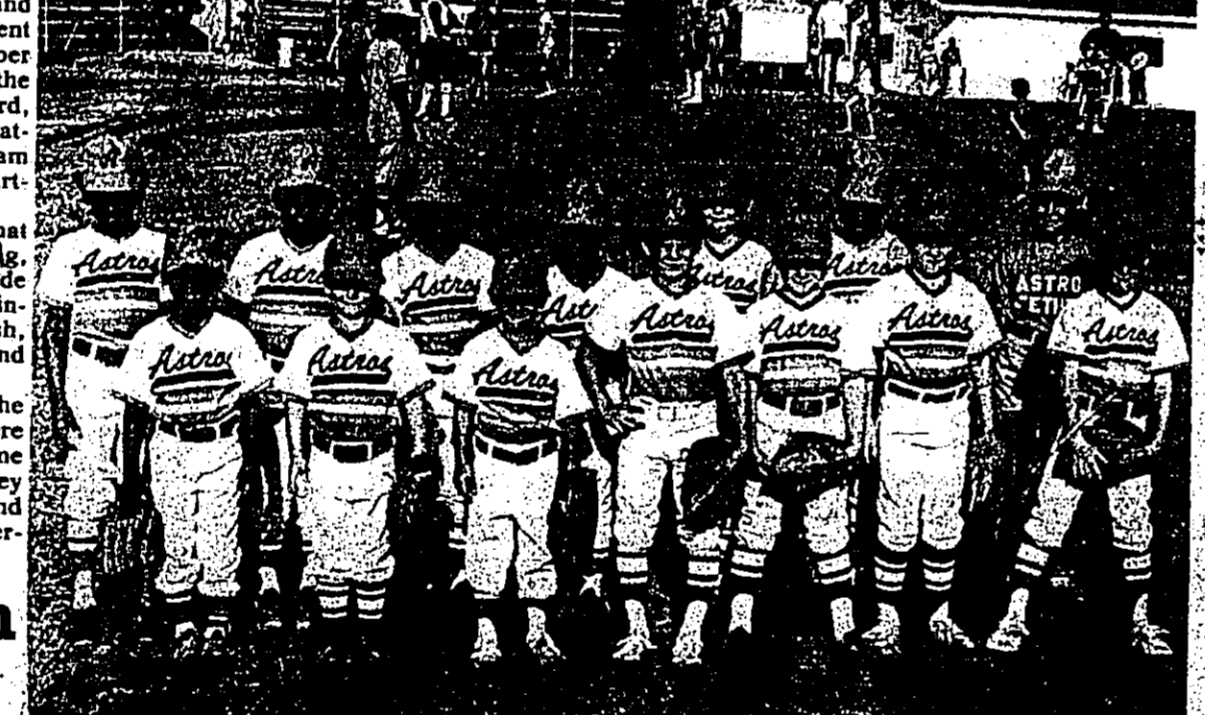

Introducing Southwestern Bell's new Big Fish Award

If you catch a big fish in Texas, you may be eligible for a "Big Fish Award" from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Department officials said many anglers apparently are unaware of the program. Records show that at least eight largemouth bass over 12 pounds have been caught from Texas lakes, but only three of the anglers applied for the big fish certificates.

"Both the fisherman and the department benefit from this program," noted Inland Fisheries Branch Director Ernest Simmons. "It gives recognition to the angler and helps the department monitor the progress of its fishery programs."

Simmons said minimum weight requirements have been established for the various species. For instance, largemouth bass must weigh at least 12 pounds; five saltwater species also are included. Qualifying fish must be caught on hook and line in Texas waters, measured for total length and weighed on an inspected scale certified by the Texas Department of Agriculture. The certificate of weight must be signed by a witness.

Application forms for the awards are available from department offices across the state and at some fishing license outlets. The forms also may be obtained by writing the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, 4200 Smith School Road, Austin, TX 78744, or by calling toll-free 1-800-792-1112.

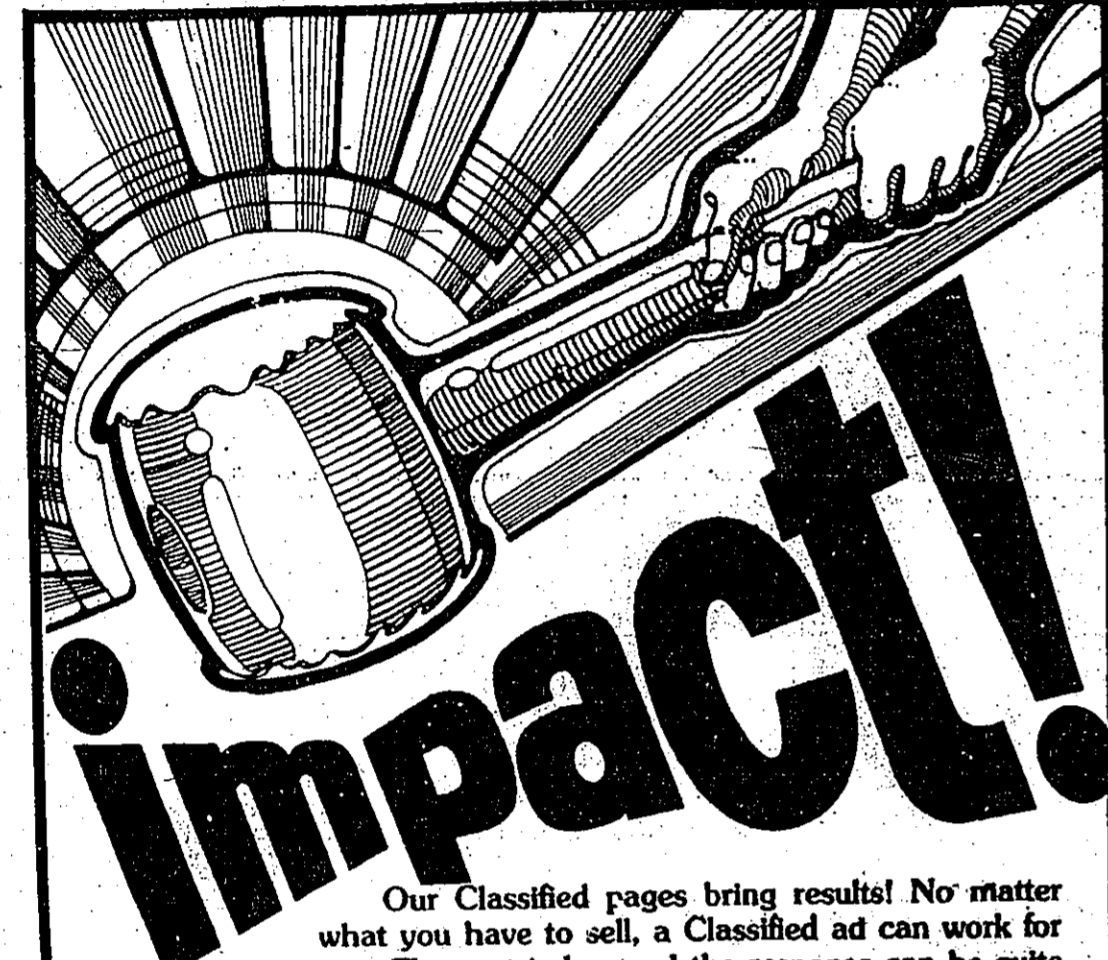

Students attending the entire seminar will receive eight hours credit toward their state certification and basic, intermediate or advanced firefighter classification.

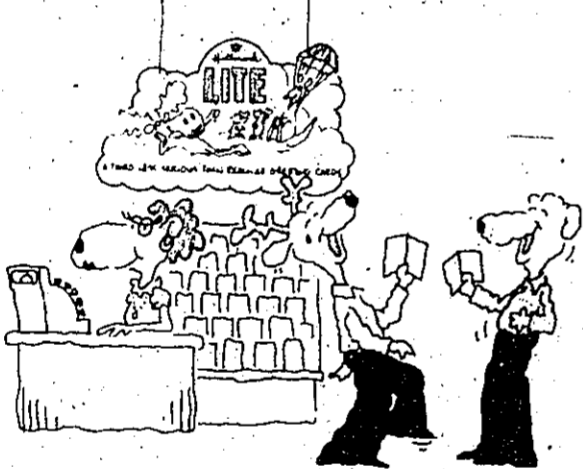
Cost for the seminar will be \$4 per student. Instructors will attend from area fire departments, Texas Department of Public Safety and Lamar University.

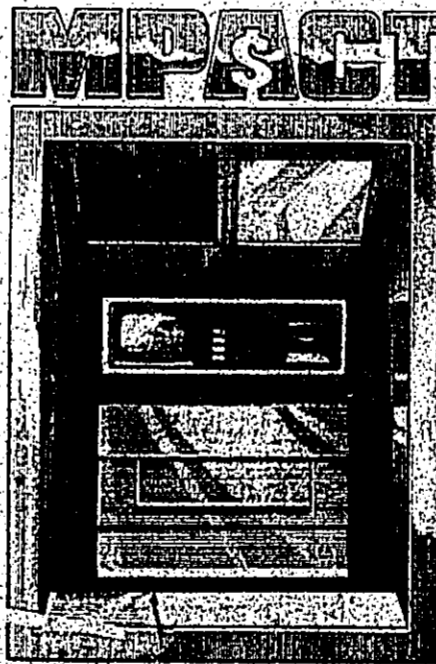
