Bell Asks Help In Cable Problem

Southwestern Bell is enlisting the help of its customers in cutting the number of cut cables and telephone service wires. According to Gene Thacker, community relations manager for the company, excavation work, as large as placing a sewer line to as minor as putting in a new mail box, can lead to a cut telephone wire.

Thacker said many telephone service disruptions can be avoided if digging projects are reported to the company 24 hours in advance. "By calling the operator and asking for Enterprise 9800, callers can request that a company representative come by their place and identify the buried cable routes where there'll be digging," he said. Digging by property owners often places the telephone service wire, or the wire leading from the company's major cable to a single home or business, in jeopardy. "When a customer's phone is out, it really doesn't make much difference if it's a major cable or a service wire that's cut," he said. "The customer is still inconvenienced until it can be repaired."

Hints To The Consumer

Over the years, the biggest winners have been Brooks Robinson, the Baltimore Oriole's magnificent third baseman, who has won the Gold Glove (1960-75) and pitcher Jim Kaat, who has won it three times (1962-75) and two in the National League (1976-77). Kaat has the most Gold Gloves in the history of the National League (and the American League) with 10. Shortstop Mark Belanger with eight.

The only brothers to win the Rawlings award are Ken Boyer of the Cardinals, a five-time winner, and Clete Boyer, who won the Gold Glove in 1969. Boyer was traded to the Atlanta Braves after being traded from the Cardinals to the Chicago White Sox once.

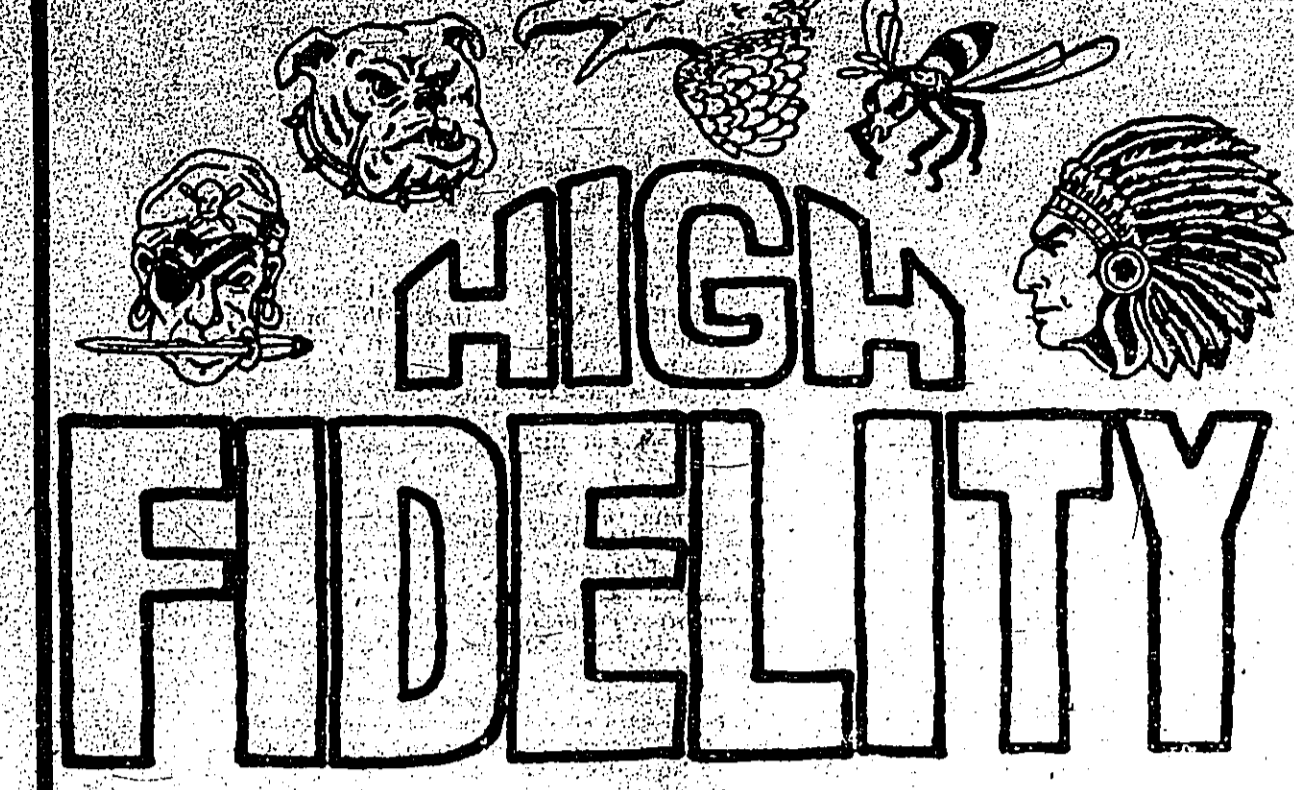

Report Address Change

Social Security benefit checks whose checks are deposited directly to a bank or other financial institution received a notice in late June reminding them to report any change of address to the Social Security office. The notice, which also included information about the July "cost-of-living" increase and the higher Medicare medical insurance premium, went to approximately 11.5 million beneficiaries. Failure to report a change of address could affect the continued receipt of their Social Security checks.

The notice stated that although the checks are not sent directly to a person's home, Social Security must have the correct mailing address so that it can send him or her important information about changes in Social Security that may affect his or her monthly payment amount. Social Security officials have no way of knowing if a person is still living or otherwise eligible to receive benefits if the financial institution by law cannot disclose that information. Monthly Social Security payments can be stopped if the agency cannot locate a beneficiary to verify continued eligibility, the notice stated.

People can call, write, or visit any Social Security office to report a change of address. The report should include both the old and new home address.

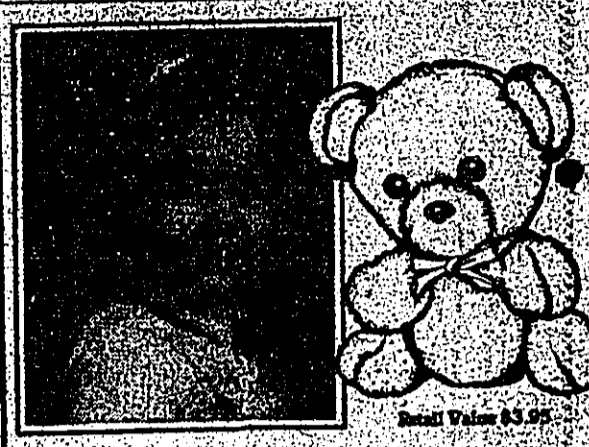

ASCS Invites Program Comments

Tyler County farmers and other interested persons are invited to submit comments and suggestions concerning conservation and environmental programs to USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service.

The programs include the agricultural conservation, emergency conservation and water bank programs.

County ASC official Kathy O. Lowe said the written recommendations must be received in Washington by September 1 to be considered.

ASCS conservation programs are designed to encourage farmers to voluntarily perform pollution abatement, soil, water and emergency conservation measures. The programs authorize cost-share funds for farmers who could not or would not perform such practices to use existing federal assistance.

USDA is also holding a public meeting on September 9 to review program recommendations made by State and county agricultural conservation review groups. The meeting will begin at 9 a.m. in Room 4900 of USDA's South Building.
