

Times are tough, Tighten your belts. Pinch your pennies. Almost daily Americans are being asked to sacrifice to help

bring the country out of recession. Can they be blamed for getting angry when the very lawmakers asking for the sacrifices make laws to enrich themselves? I think not. Members of Congress made a big mistake last year by voting themselves increased tax breaks and more outside in-

come. I voted against it and did not claim it on my tax return. What Congress did was lift a \$3,000 limit on tax deductions for living expenses members incur in Washington. The change permits depreciation of a residence in Washington and allows a daily "expense account." With this "expense account," members of Congress have a choice of itemizing their actual expenses or taking up to a \$75

blanket deduction for each "congressional day." They do not even have to account for that \$75. To give you an idea of the effect of this change, the IRS allowed 241 "congressional days" for 1981, when Congress only met for 165 days. Under this new change in the law, that would have added up to \$18,075 in tax deductions for members of Congress, deductions that wouldn't have to be accounted for.

I believe those tax breaks are wrong and cannot argue with those who say Congress took a "back door" means of avoiding voting itself a pay raise.

All other taxpayers in this country have to justify their tax deductions. There is not a single other business or profession allowed this generous a deal. Why should Congress set itself apart I strongly support repeal of these business tax deductions for

Congress.

The action Congress took last fall to give itself a "back door," pay increase, to give its members a special tax break that other Americans don't have—at a time when spending on other government programs was being cut; at a time when recession was throwing many Americans out of work-was wrong. Congress sent the wrong signal to the American people. A change in signals would be in order.
