GARDENING...WITH NATURAL PEST CONTROLS!

More people are gardening in this country today than ever before . . . and more and more of those gardeners are discovering that they don't need chemical pesticides to control the insects that attack their vegetable plots. There are many natural pest control methods that a wise gardener can use. To name only a few: companion planting and natural repellents, organic sprays and dusts, in toxicants, "good" microbic agents, insect predators and parasites, birds, poultry, small animals, resistant varieties of plants; and lizards and other reptiles. Nature works in wondrous ways ... and, in most cases, it's worth trying a few of her "time

tested" bug control ideas before dousing your future food with harsh, wide spectrum, chlorinated hydrocarbon pesticides. The larger "animated bug catchers" more than earn their keep around the veg etable patch. Geese, ducks, chickens, tords, snakes, birds, skunks, and other small feathered, scaled, and furry friends will constantly patrol the garden... if we let them. For instance, a single house wren will feed 500 spiders and caterpillars to its young during one summer afternoon . . . a swallow can devour 1,000 leaf hoppers in 12 hours . . . a Baltimore oriole can consume 17 hairy caterpillars a minute . . . and a brown

thrasher can eat over 6,000 insects a day!

Many insect pests are surprisingly fastidious eaters and are repelled by any plant other than those they prefer to devour. You can help protect your vegetables, then, by interplanting them with borage, lavender, sage, parsley, dill, and other aromatic berbs. Marigolds seem especially distasteful to large numbers of bugs ... so set out a

goodly number of these flowers among your produce plantings.

Don't stop there, though ... send your youngsters out it, collect lidybugs and lace wings to live in your garden! Adult ladybugs and the larvae or lacewings have a voracious appetite for aphids, mealybugs, cottony cushion scales, while flies, spirier mites. and some thrips.

But how can you handle the pesky little shalls and slugs, wet weather critters that

can cut your seedlings off before the plants even get n good start? Just remember that the alimy raiders are basically night operators—they like to hide ouring the day—and give them handy places to creep into: old grapefruit holls placed round side up. perhaps, or little "caves" made of broken acraps of shingle. Then, every morning, make the rounds of these traps and destroy (or at least deport) the troublesome gustropods

the rounds of these traps and destroy (or at least deport) the troublesome gustropods that have cozed their way under the collectors.

And don't forget that enails (the ones with shells) and slugs (the ones without) LOVE beer! Bury a few saucers or lids so that their upper edges are flush with the ground surface, and fill the containers half full of brew in the evening. By the following dawn, the receptacles will be as packed with drunken bodies as the doorways of any big city's akid row. And if the lids contain no slugs or smalls. Then your garden doesn't either. You've already taught them all.

Although much is made of the insect-tating ability of the praying mantis, few of its champions mention that this predator devours almost as many beneficial bugs as bad. At worst, however, the praying mantis is probably marginally beneficial in the "good versus half haset battle and—since it is a rather poble creature to have in the garden should be protected. Just don't expect an egg case or two of mantises to exert any outstanding bloingical past control in your vegetable patch.

# 'The Most Humbling Experience Of My Life

On Sunday morning, August 1, before 7 a.m., cars loaded with handicapped and crippled children, along with one parent and one sponsoring Lions Club member, began converging at the meeting spot - the Gateway Shopping Center parking lot in Beaumont. They came from all over deep East Texas. At 7 a.m. they began boarding a chartered bus, (thanks to the Beaumont Founders Lions Club, who were nice enough to underwrite the chartering of the bus, then, offering transportation to each traveler for a reasonable fee.) Our destination was the camp of the Lions Club of Texas at Kerrville, a beautiful, extensive, facility located on 500 acres of land 2 or 3 miles south of the city on State Hwy 27.

The event was the fourth and final 2 weeks camp session for some 250 handicapped and crippled children from all over-Texas. They came from Amarillo to Brownsville; Texarkana to El Paso and points in between.

The Lions Club of Texas provides, (at no expense to the camper), two weeks of fun and fellowship for these kids ages 7 thru 16. Every conceivable activity is planned to fit the various physical capabilities and limitations of the camper Campers are classified and grouped according to their individual disabilities. Those groups, with common or like handicaps are assigned their dormitories which will be home-base for the next 2 weeks.

The medical and nursing staffs; the large group of trained counselors (mostly college students); and, the Camp Director and his staff comprise a highly efficient organization.

Friday night, at the end of the camp session is "Awards Night" - the highlight of the camp session. Most every camper will receive at least one award for a wide variety of possible achievements. Parents are urged to be present for

Each camp session accommodates approximately 250 campers. That means, for the 4-camp sessions of the season, some 1,000 kids have experienced one of the most memorable times of

As I stood in the huge recreation building watching the long registration lines of handicapped and crippled children, I saw kids with every conceivable deformity. Kids confined through no fault of their own - in these "life-time cages" of physical disabilities. Still, their faces were cheerful and eager - eager with anticipation of good things to come.

I experienced a variety of strong emotions as I stood and watched those courageous kids. First, a sudden flash of pity quickly banished - for who could show pity before that group of brave and courageous youngsters? Then, a sense of shame ashamed of any complaining I have done about my, comparatively, insignificant aches, pains and ailments. Then a deep sense of humility - humble before Almighty God for things beyond human understanding. Finally, a feeling of gratefulness - grateful for my, comparatively, good health - realizing that, except for the Grace of God, I could be as one of those Talking Real Estate standing in that line.

Elections Update

At the request of Governor Clements, the Secretary of State's Office will undertake a comprehensive analysis of the election systems employed by other States. Governor Clements. noting the dissatisfaction of Texas voters with their election process as set forth in the survey for the Secretary of State's May I primary election analysis, commissioned the study of the various election systems nationwide for the purpose of developing solutions to offset Texas' low voter turnout and increased election cost trends. Findings of the analysis will be made available to the Governor, State leaders, and members of the 68th Texas Legislature prior to commence ment of the 1983 legislative session.

On July 23, 1982, the Secretary of State was joined in Austin by state and federal law enforcement officials and prosecutorial officials for the purpose of announcing the formation and objectives of a State/Federal Voter Fraud Task Force. Since assuming the Office of the Secretary of State. numerous incidents of voting irregularities have been brought to the attention of this Office which could very well involve violations of federal and state law. On-going investigations of alleged election law violations are being conducted by the Texas Rangers in Duval, Jim Hogg, Starr, Webb, and Zapata counties. Alleged violations of election laws will be turned over to the appropriate authorities for investigation by the Texas Rangers. It is the goal of the Voter Fraud Task Force to put election law offenders on notice that elections in Texas will be conducted honestly and those who violate those laws will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.
In an effort to inform the citizens of Texas of the crime of election fraud and in addition to offer state rewards for those who provide information leading to arrest and indictment of election law offenders, the Crime Stoppers Advisory Council, October, 1982 public service announcement will feature election fraud as its topic. Any citizen observing instances of election irregularities is encouraged to call the

October 3, 1982, in order to vote in the November 2nd, general election. To be eligible to vote, potential voters must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age on the day of the election, a resident of the county or political: subdivision conducting the election, and registered to vote. Young Texans may register to vote if they are at least 17 years and 10 months of age, but may not vote until they reach 18 years of age. To register to vote, Texans should complete a postage-paid voter registration application and mail it or present the card in person to the voter registrar in their
