## W.I.S.D. Trustees Hear 1982-83 Budget Plan

Woodville School District Trustees wrestled Tuesday night with a proposed school budget for the upcoming 1982-83 year producing figures which will reflect an approximate 12.88 percent decrease from last year but was conditioned by teacher insurance requests in a prior executive session meeting which officials say "will balance the interests of teachers against the interests of the taxpayers."

According to Aubrey Bradley, "It's too easy for people to get misled into believing that just because we're projecting a decrease in our budget

that, for example, taxes won't go up."

The board will have the final say as to what the projected expenditures will be but the 12.88 percent decrease was brought about by the lack of a major building program funds as required to build the new Middle School this past year.

The 1981-82 estimated budget figure totaled \$4,674,894 while the new proposed 1982-83 figured Tuesday is \$4,072,966.

Tuesday's action, required by law, in meeting an August 20 deadline, forces the district to project "without

knowing what our actual tax bill will be to set a rate."

"People are tired of taxes...you hear it all the time", Bradley said.

Bradley said also, prior to the meeting, that he expected the tax rate of \$1.50 per hundred valuation to go down "...but I can't say how much."

"For the individual taxpayer it will depend on their own property revaluation."

"Right now we don't know what our rolls are...we don't know what we're going to have to tax. We're figuring everything based on estimates given to us by the State and our local appraisal offices. We're trying to guess based on their figures."

"But, by the same token, the board continued on page 4-A

## Will Rogers Jr. Guest For R.S.V.P. Program

Friday, Aug. 20, is a red letter day for local senior citizens, who plan to join in a program of recognition for all 1,600 Retired Senior Volunteers in the Deep East Texas region.

Scheduled at the Lufkin Civic Center, the event will include a luncheon and volunteer awards presentation by Will Rogers, Jr., oldest son of the American humorist and national favorite who 47 years ago was tragically killed in an Alaskan airplane accident. Although admission is by ticket only, tickets are free of charge to any RSVP volunteer.

An outstanding program of entertainment will be provided during the banquet meal. Highlight of the day will be recognition of some very unique and outstanding RSVP volunteers, followed by a short address by Mr. Rogers. Now a seventy-one year old senior citizen himself, Will Rogers, Jr., has been a newspaper publisher, foreign correspondent, United States Congressman, movie actor, lecturer, and TV host and commentator.

Formerly Special Assistant to the U. S. Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Rogers has long been an interested and active advocate for Native Americans. He is a member of the National Congress of American Indians and is honorary Chairman of ARROW, a national organization for Indian Welfare. As a part-time consultant to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, he still makes occasional trips for the Indian Bureau. He and his wife Collier have two sons, Carl and Clem, the latter of whom is a full blooded Navaho Indian adopted by them.

While in Deep East Texas, Rogers will be touring the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation, where he will meet with a newly formed chapter of RSVP volunteers who live on the Reservation. He will present their membership ribbons to them and review the plans for their project with Chief Robert Fulton Battise, the only Indian Chief in the United States who is also an RSVP volunteer.

The Retired Senior Volunteer Program is in its 10th year of operation in Deep East Texas. It is sponsored by DETCOG, the Deep East Texas Council of Governments, and includes volunteers in Shelby, Sabine, San Augustine, Nacogdoches, Angelina, Trinity, Houston, Polk, Jasper, Tyler, and San Jacinto counties. Deep East Texas volunteers average approximately 20,000 hours of service every month and more than 200,000 annually to the schools, libraries, museums, hospitals, day care centers, and nursing homes in their area where they work free of charge.

There are no dues required to belong to RSVP, only a senior citizen's willingness to devote time to a non-profit community related activity of institution. Information about the program may be obtained by calling RSVP Director Delores Wheeler at 569-9463 in Nacogdoches. Area RSVP offices are located in the Senior Citizen Centers in Lufkin, Crockett, Jasper, Nacogdoches, and Timpson.

## Commissioners Kill Oil And Gas Bids

Tyler County Commissioners Court last Friday rejected all bids received for oil and gas and deciding instead to negotiate individually with suppliers. Commissioners also cancelled the current contract for fuel with H. L. Jackson of Woodville.

Commissioners had requested that suppliers charge the county a set price above their tank car cost. Suppliers also were asked to provide the county with a copy of their notification of any price increases or decreases. None of the bids submitted contained these provisions.

Commissioner Maxie Riley estimated that the county spends \$10,000 a month in fuel costs. He said that he was charged \$1.16 per gallon for gasoline last month which is considerably above the bid submitted by H. L. Jackson's \$1.088 per gallon. On a motion by Commissioner Mahan, Commissioners cancelled the existing contract with Jackson and will get their gas where they can find the lowest price until new contracts for fuel can be negotiated.

In other business Commissioners received two bids to carpet the County Clerk's office. A \$1,746 bid was submitted by Collins Paint and Decorating Center of Woodville. A bid of \$1,395.24, submitted by Watts Carpet Center of Woodville, was accepted on a motion by Commissioner Mahan.

Commissioners on a motion by Maxie Riley told the County Extension office to request permission of Commissioners Court before over-riding their yearly travel budget in the future. Also discussed was a \$113 monthly bill for the airport pay phone. Commissioners on a motion by Commissioner Riley agreed to pay all bills submitted by County Auditor Ann Nichols.

Finally, Commissioners approved a correction in the auto serial number on warrants issued on a truck purchased for Precinct 3. They approved the appointment of Dr. Brian Babin of Woodville as an election judge for Box 18, Precinct 2.

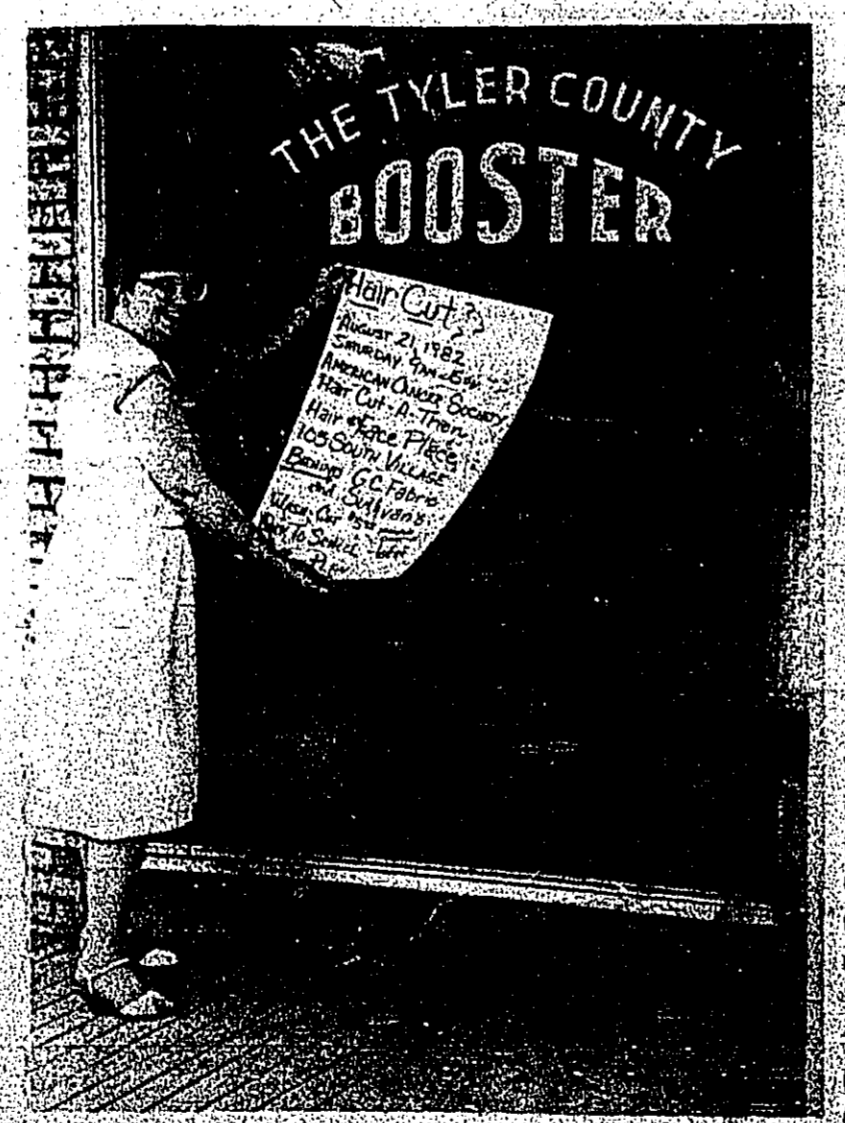

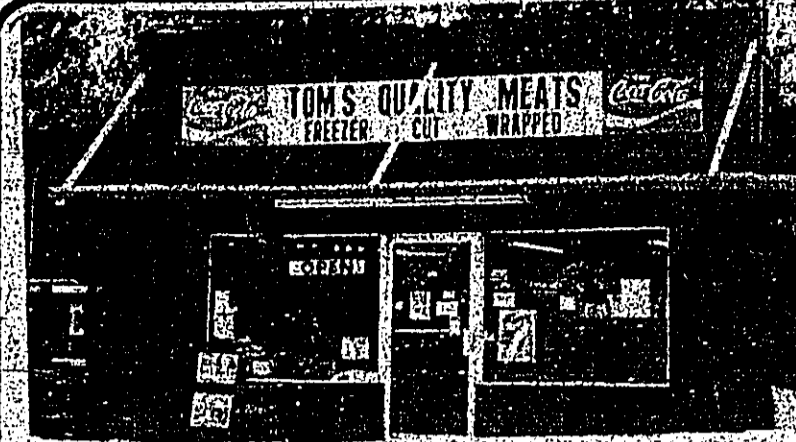

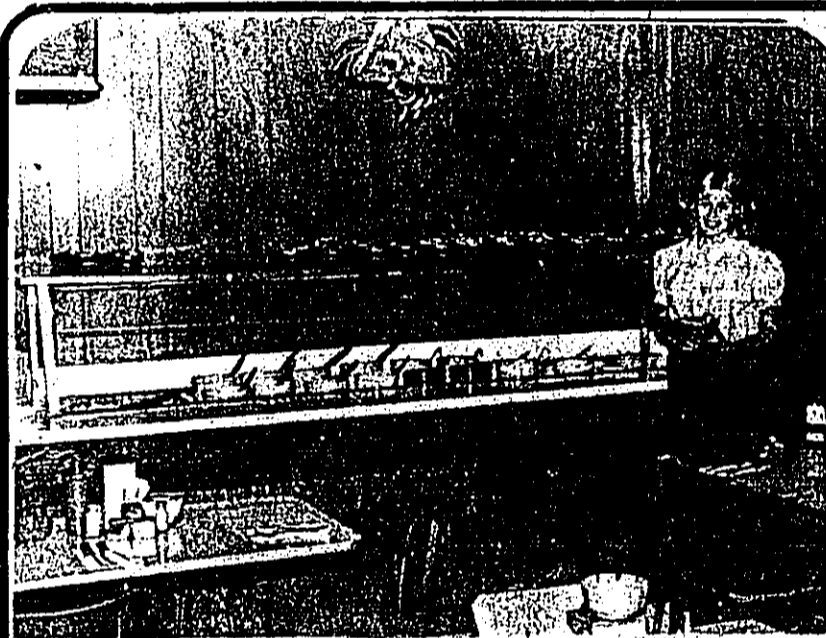
