school bus. Most children killed in pupil transportation are not injured or killed on the bus. Most are struck by motorists who fail to stop for the flashing red lights on the school bus. The area around the stopped bus is sometimes called the death zone.

Drive responsibly by knowing and reacting to these important rules of the road: Flashing amber lights are a pre-warning that the

buss is preparing to stop.

Flashing red lights means that the bus is stopped to load or unload school passengers.

Coming from either direction, you must stop when you see the flashing red lights. Stop at least 20 feet from the bus. Proceed only after these signs have ended and any children are safely on the other side of the roadway.

ney's sacrifices may have been somewhat more than those of the 335 baccalaureate graduates at Lamar University's summer commencement Saturday (August 14).
Sirmons and McKinney, teacher's aides in the Silsbee school district, started to Lamar together in 1977 and survived similar trials and tribulations in pursuing degrees in elementary education.

Both attended virtually the same classes while driving to Beaumont daily for evening classes and summer school courses,
"I had never attended college before 1977, explained Sirmons, 48, "I was a wife and the mother of two teenage boys (Steve Sirmons graduated from Lamar in 1980 and Rex attended Lamar last fall) and working full-time.

"In April (1982), my husband died due to leukemia. In May, Rex was injured in an accident at work that required amputation of two fingers. There were numerous times when a decision had to be made as to whether to continue my studies

or drop out of school. "Somehow, I managed to continue, and, a August 14, 1982 has become a reality.' Sirmons added that she missed only three class days during her five years at Lamar. All absences were due to deaths in the family, inclu-

ding that of her father in Oct., 1980.
