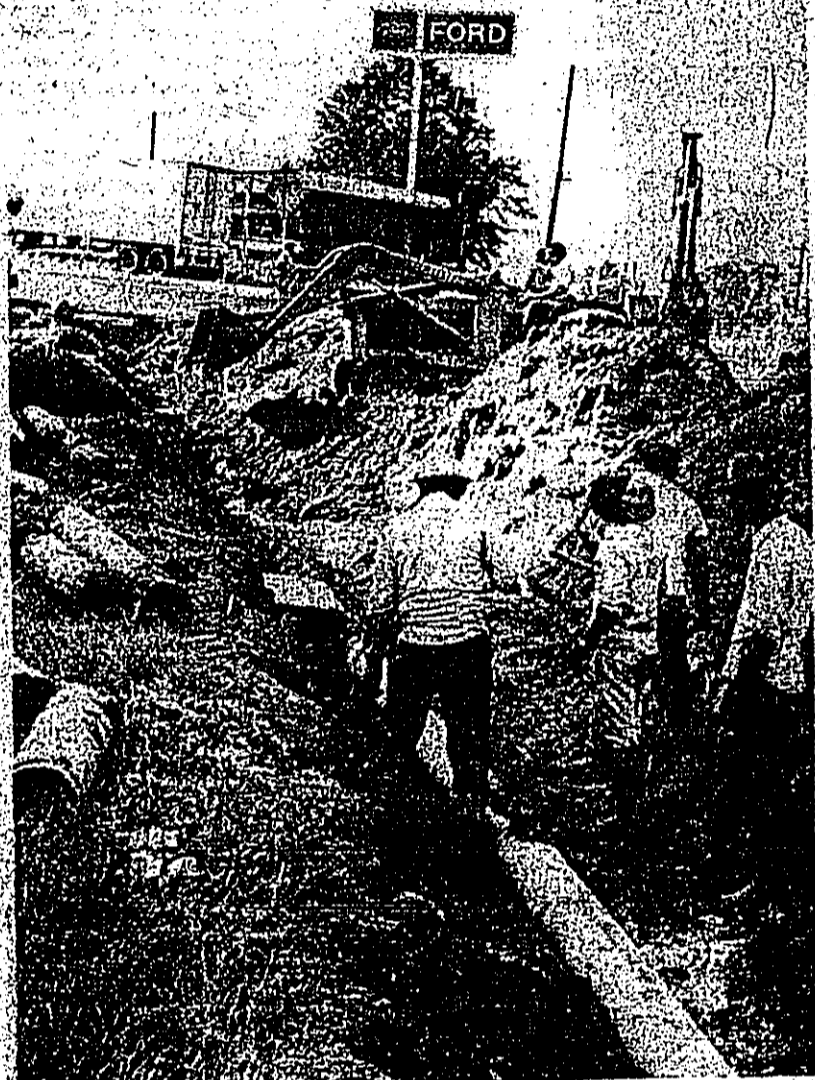

Cutbacks, Layoffs Hit Area

A recent downturn in the economy has caused two major Woodville industrial concerns, Levingston Industrial Products of Wood-

ville has reduced a workforce which at one time had reached a total of 90 personnel, down to 18 employees at the Woodville plant. One Levingston employee stated, "We're just not getting the orders...we've got a lot of stuff bid out so, we just have to wait."

The firm, which is owned by Ed Paden of Orange, who also is an owner of the Levingston Armadillo plant, a fiberglass manufacturer, which is located in Tyler, has assigned plant operations here to Woody Gaines, an Orange resident. Former plant operation manager Dave Hardin will now work in sales for the firm. According to a company employer, "No further layoffs are anticipated."

Another major Woodville industry, Keller Aluminum products of Texas, has according to Plant Manager John Crane, had to curtail the firm's work week to four days. Crane said that orders from across the country have fallen off drastically after a three month rally in May, June, and July. Keller will also be facing soon the slower winter months as it depends on housing starts and other fair weather building considerations for its sales.

Seniors Funding To Be Cut

Funding sources to enhance the lives of senior citizens who live in Tyler County appear to be threatened and substantially reduced in fiscal year 1983, according to figures released Thursday at a public hearing held at the Deep East Texas Area Agency on Aging Council in Lufkin.

The funds which are identified as Title 3-B Services funds, and which had been used to provide services in the areas of transportation, health activities, escort services, information referral services, and recreation are those scheduled to be reduced, according to Marsha Jones, Deep East Texas Council of Governments Director of the East Texas Area on Aging.

According to the regional proposal, funds will be reduced by \$2,454 from current funding of \$16,355 to a new total of \$13,901. A reduction of 15 percent. Nutritional funding schedules were not included as part of the discussion of the meeting held Thursday. Those funds are budgeted under Title 3-C planning.

The smaller counties get hurt the most if we stay with the original proposal for funding," said Area on Aging Staffer, Pam Heath.

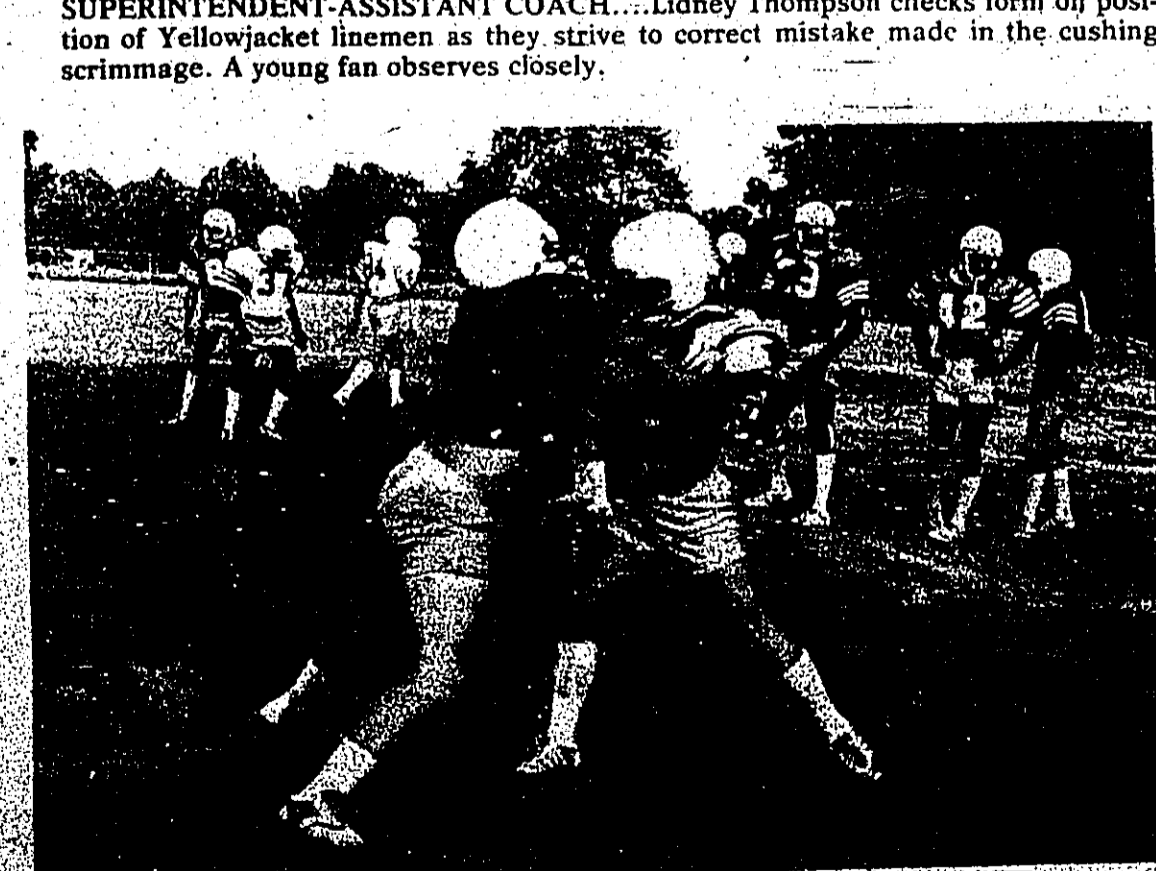

The United States Celebrates Another Bicentennial

Austin-The United States is celebrating another bicentennial this year, although this one has not been accompanied by the red-white-and-blue hoopla that saturated the country in 1976.

In was in 1782, six years after the U.S. declared its independence from England, that Congress adopted the bald eagle to adorn the national seal and ever since then the bird that inspired the symbol has steadily declined in number. The July issue of Texas Parks & Wildlife magazine takes a look at the problems that have beset the bald eagle and the prognosis for its future.

According to the magazine, habitat loss, shooting, pesticides and even electrocution have reduced bald eagle populations to the point that they are classified as endangered in 43 of the lower 48 states, including Texas, and threatened in the other five. But things may be looking up for the bald eagle in its bicentennial year. In Texas, as well as in many other states, bald eagle populations are showing modest increases.

And as for the other ideas for the national seal that were considered between 1776 and 1782--if Thomas Jefferson had had his way, the seal would have depicted the children of Israel wandering through the wilderness. Or it could have been a wild turkey or an image of Moses dividing the Red Sea, both of which were suggested by Benjamin Franklin.

AUSTIN - Texas ranks 28th in state per capita expenditures for public libraries and ranks 38th in local per capita expenditures. The state is currently spending 31 cents per capita for support and local expenditures amount to \$4.07 per capita making the combined state and local expenditures \$4.38 per capita. During the last biennium, the state per capita contribution was only 17 cents even though funding was increased by 88 percent in the current biennium, the resulting appropriation is woefully inadequate. Public libraries have fought for survival for many years and most have operated on a "shoestring." One of the chief reasons they have suffered such problems is that they have never received widespread public support. The contribution a library makes to citizens of a city or county is difficult if not impossible to measure. Probably the best way to see the contribution that one makes to an area is to compare the area with one that has no library. We have so many demands for funding increases from every agency of state government that we have neglected our public libraries. We spend billions on public education each year but make only token provision for the people with inquiring minds who are no longer in school. Instead for the most part, these people are forced to rely on the electronic and printed media for answers to their questions. We seem to assume that all education occurs within classrooms and that it ends with graduation from a public school or university. This should not be the case at all because virtually all formal education provides a student with the tools with which to learn. Formal education should never be considered an ending but rather a bright new beginning. A world of information is already available in public libraries of this state but there could be a great deal more if adequate funds were available. All of our citizens of this state, whether they reside in urban areas or in rural areas, would have direct access to a public library, collection of current materials, and indirect access via interlibrary loan and by other means, to all of the materials in our state and our nation. The greatest argument against increased state funding for public libraries has always been "we can't afford it." With all of our other demands, we just don't have the money. The reverse is actually true. I am of the opinion that we can't afford not to increase our support of libraries. By increasing support to \$1.50 per capita, we can make a giant step forward. In so doing, we can secure a great benefit for every public library in Texas from the very smallest to the largest. This would increase state funding by less than \$20 million which represents a very small proportion of the state budget. Many good people have closed ranks and are working every day in behalf of public libraries. If they hadn't, it is likely that we would not have many libraries. I'm sold on their cause and am going to work to get enough state funds appropriated to provide a valuable resource for each and every citizen of this state.

you and the LAW
PRESENTED BY THE STATE BAR OF TEXAS

Q: Recently, I was stopped by a highway patrolman for speeding. My driver's license says I should have glasses on to drive a car. I was wearing contact lenses when the officer stopped me; he made me remove the contacts to prove I had them. Did he have the right to require that?

A: Under the law, the department of Public Safety is authorized to issue driver's licenses which are restricted in various ways including requiring the use of corrective lenses while operating a motor vehicle. Peace officers are authorized to enforce the laws of the state of Texas. It is a reasonable request that a peace officer require the use of contact lenses to show the officer that such corrective lenses were in fact in use.

Q: I sold my car to a person who is paying me \$25 a week until he paid in full. At that time, I will sign title over to her. If she has a wreck or is involved in some wrong doing, can I be held liable since the title is in her name?

A: Although your sale agreement may specify otherwise, the certificate of title Conservator would be in your name as owner, and you are presumed to own the vehicle. Depending on the facts, you could be sued and found liable for negligent treatment of your vehicle. If the buyer did not have a driver's license and you knew he, however, from your questions it appears that you have surrendered custody and control and are merely a lien holder. Telephone the Motor Vehicle Division of the State Highway Department to discuss whether title should be changed while you are selling the car.

Q: My husband and I are divorced. We have a 10-year old son who lives with me. My ex wants the boy to go to live with him, but my son wants to stay here with me. At what age may a child refuse to go with his father?

A: To change custody, the father must file a Motion to Modify, showing a material and substantial change in circumstances; that is, to explain Mother as Managing Conservator would be in the child's best interest. A child may be allowed to testify to his preference, and this factor may be taken into consideration. However, the judge alone will make the decision based on the standard of "the child's best interests."

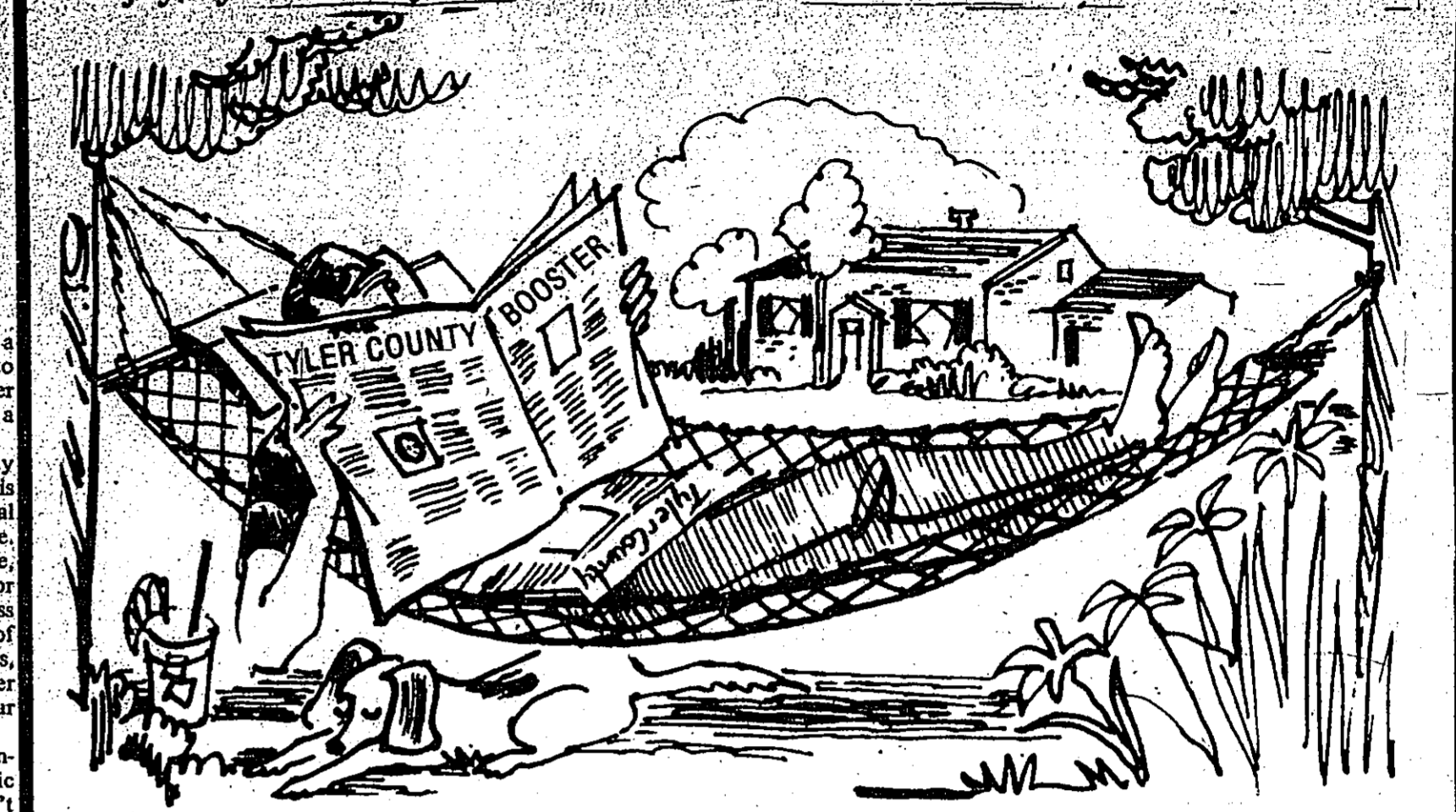

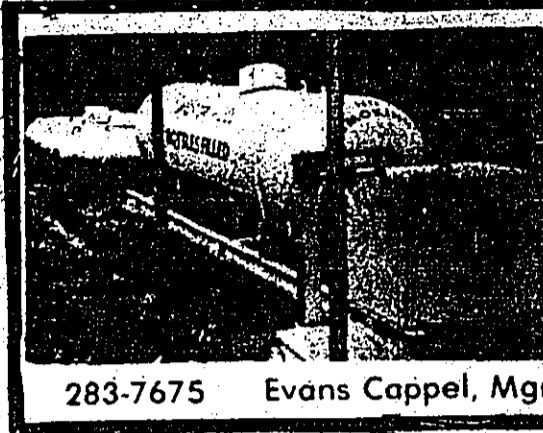
