## Raze Marijuana Field

Persistence by the Tyler County Sheriff's office resulted in the arrest, Tuesday, of two 27-year-old men who were apprehended about five miles east of Woodville while reportedly harvesting by topping, the stalks of a marijuana field.

According to Sheriff Leon Fowler, two crews of officers had been dispatched to the 24 acre fenced location off Pope Mill Road. Both teams worked toward the field with the help of walkie talkies.

Fowler said, "We got to about 50 steps and saw them topping the stalks

of marijuana, then they spotted the other team." Fowler said that one of the men, Richard Coco, had bolted from the scene disregarding warning shots. Fowler said that one of the men, Richard Coco, had bolted from the scene, disregarding warning shots, but was recovered about 1 and a half hours later as he exited onto a utility power line lane.

Fowler said that officers had been called in from the Texas Department of Corrections who enlisted dogs to help in the search.

The other man arrested at the scene was Thomas B. Mabry, also of Beaumont.

The field measured some 25 x 50 yards in size and had officers actively harvesting the weed for the balance of the afternoon. The evidence is currently stored in the evidence room of the Tyler County Sheriff's office.

Estimated value, according to Fowler, is \$100,000.

The men were arrested each with two bags weighing about five pounds each.

Fowler said that the Texas Department of Corrections had used a helicopter to help the local officers find the weed patch earlier and were also able to discover another tract of the illegal drop.

## Board Acts On Insurance, Autos, Calendar

The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees voted Tuesday night to accept the Knapp Ford Company of Woodville's bid of \$10,074 for a new school automobile.

The board accepted the State Farm Insurance Company's bid on Vehicle Insurance and Kelly Butane Company of Buna's bid on propane.

The following changes in the school calendar in-service days will be set: Sept. 27 and Jan. 17 will be deleted and Oct. 11 and Feb. 21 will be added.

School Group Insurance was discussed. Superintendent Adolph Hryhorchuk stated that other insurance programs are being investigated and will be reported on at a later date.

The board approved the bus routes and voted to pay Carl Swinney \$720 for the private transportation of his daughter to and from school. The total amount will be divided into monthly payments.

A budget study was made and several items changed. The board will act on the new budget at a special meeting Aug. 30.

Superintendent Hryhorchuk reported there had been some problems with the new policy of not allowing students to make lunch charges. He also pointed out the problem of teachers, having to spend too much classroom time with record keeping and collecting lunch money. Pat Long,

Fred Elementary teacher said that she has to spend two hours of classroom time on Monday mornings carrying out these duties.

Carolyn Perkins, high school teacher, introduced the officers for the Warren Chapter of Texas State Teachers' Association. They are: Carolyn Perkins, president; Pat Long, vice-president; Linda Whisenant, secretary; Bobby Gene Martin, treasurer. She stated that two of the on-going goals of TSTA are to provide the best possible education for the students and to maintain a good relationship with the Administration and Board of Trustees.

Following Executive Session, the board approved the substitute teacher list and employed the following teachers: Nancy Rogers, 8th grade English; Donna Baty, Jr., High Physical Education and Girls Athletics; Mary Walters, 1st grade, Fred Elementary.

## Adopt Budget

The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees adopted the 1982-83 Budget in the amount of \$2,952,888 subject to estimated revenues to be ascertained by the 1982-83 tax rate. In a Special Called Meeting Monday night, the new Budget represents an 18.08% increase over the 1981-82 Budget. The Board also amended the 1981-82 Budget in the amount of \$65,142.77.

The Board declared null and void the propane contract extended to Kelly Butane of Buna because Kelly Butane was unable to provide the propane at their bid price. The Board accepted the 57¢ per gallon bid from Propane Supply of Woodville.

Conditions was discussed, and Superintendent Hryhorchuk reported that many students did not attend school last year on a regular basis because of the No Exemption Policy. He said that the low attendance cost the District \$35,000 last year. Board Member Kenneth George requested a comparative study of attendance last year when the No Exemption Policy was in effect versus the previous year when it was not. Gregory said, "I am not convinced we should do away with the No Exemption Policy. The Test Exemption Policy will be discussed at the next Board Meeting, Sept. 28."

Following Executive Session, the Board voted to employ Sue Allen as High School Business Teacher.

## Small Business Dollars Available

The Board of Directors of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments at the April meeting authorized the establishment of a Certified Development Corporation for the Deep East Texas Region. The purpose of the proposed corporation is to help communities by stimulating the growth and expansion of small business within a defined area of operation. Through this joint federal government/private sector program, financing for the acquisition of land

and building construction, expansion, renovation, and equipment is available to small business concerns.

The new corporation will work with private lenders in cooperative effort to provide long-term moderate interest rate loans for small business for capital investments. Industrial and commercial companies with net worth less than \$6 million and average net profits after taxes of less than \$2 million over the last two years will be

qualified to apply for loans from the CDC. The small business applicant must provide at least 10 percent of the project costs with 50 percent to be provided by a private lending institution. The remaining 40 percent, not to exceed \$500,000 can be provided through the CDC. The local CDC will provide its 40 percent share of the loan participation from funds provided by the Small Business Administration through the newly-created Federal Financing Bank. The Federal Financing Bank raises funds through the sale of debentures. These debentures, are not tax-exempt and do not compete with the municipal bond market.

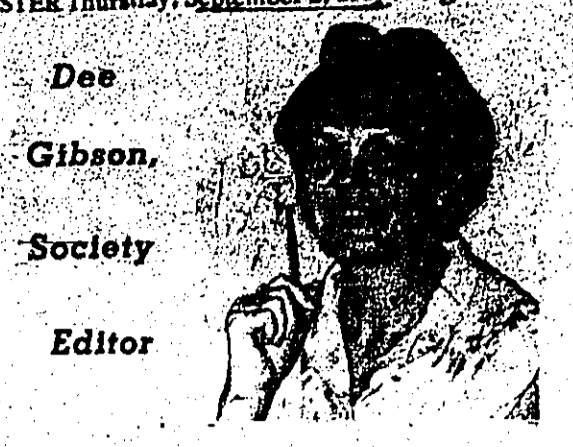

Report From Senator Roy Blake

The Governor will call the Legislature into Special Session on Sept. 7 to try to replenish the depleted Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund. This will be necessary if employers of Texas are to be spared an increase in contributions in excess of 200 percent.

The Governor proposes to borrow from the Federal Unemployment Trust Fund. Texas employers currently pay 0.7 percent of the first \$6000 of each of their workers' salaries into the Federal Fund, and Texas is currently getting less than 48 percent of those funds back. It's not really borrowing in the strictest sense of the word, although the money will have to be paid back.

An employer with high turnover and numerous chargeable claims can see his/her experience rate go as high as 4 percent.

As you can see, an employer with the 0.1 percent experience rate pays \$6 per year per employee, while an employer with the 4 percent experience rate pays \$240 per year per employee.

The 56000 wage base on which contributions are made has remained constant for a number of years, but the maximum weekly benefits have not. In addition, it's just not good business. It's like an insurance company paying out huge and more claims without increasing premiums. It may work for awhile but not over the long haul.
