

# Tyler County Hospital Gets \$17,585 Match

Diboll, Tex.—The T. L. L. Temple Foundation has awarded \$17,585 to the Tyler County Hospital to assist in the purchase of additional emergency room equipment.

Dede Cordes, president of the Tyler County Hospital Auxiliary, said equipment will include four telemetry receivers, and an electrocardiogram transmitter.

The funds from the Foundation represent a matching grant to the hospital, equaling the funds raised by the auxiliary at their recent County Caper June 19.

Foundation trustee Ward R. Burke said, "This grant represents the Foundation's continuing interest in modern hospital facilities to serve our East Texas communities. We were able to provide \$38,000 to Tyler County Hospital in 1977 for electric beds in patient areas, and are glad to be able to assist in the purchase of new emergency care equipment."

The T. L. L. Temple Foundation was created in honor of the founder of the Southern Pine Lumber Company, which merged with Eastex Incorporated to form Temple-Eastex Incorporated.

Grants by the Foundation express the appreciation of the Temple family for the contributions Company employees have made and are making toward the progress of East Texas institutions and organizations, in order to improve the quality of life for all area citizens.

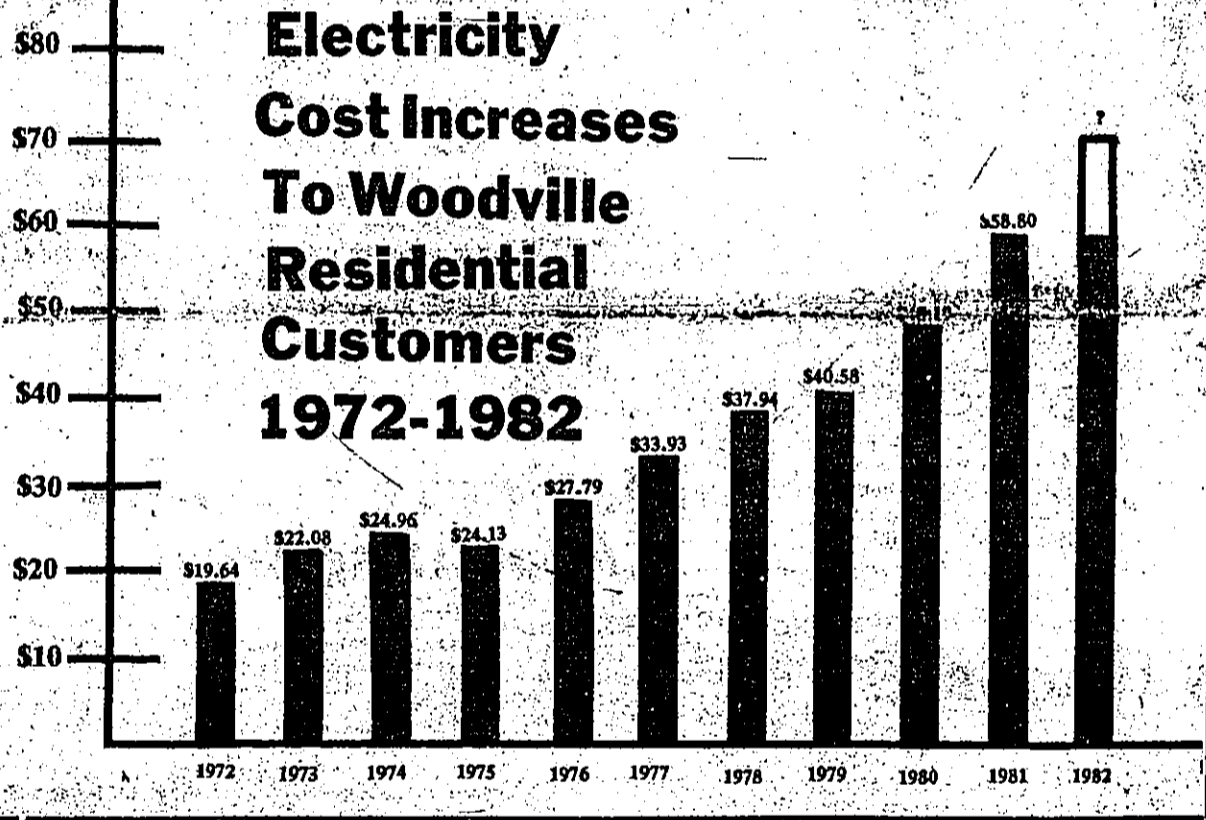

## Says Woodville City Council 'Let Rate Hike Ride'

The Woodville City Fathers met in regular session Monday and told the local electrical service provider (Gulf States) here to hold off on a 17 percent rate hike request for Woodville city customers.

Arden Loughmiller, representing Gulf States Utilities offices in Beaumont, told the council that "the amount we are requesting can be defended on the basis of our needs."

Loughmiller said further, "We're staying ahead of demand and expect to have the nuclear reactor in Louisiana online by 1985 but anticipate a need for more power before that."

City Mayor Doug Tolbert responded saying "Everyone's concerned about these increasing power rates...if they weren't concerned they wouldn't be circulating these petitions."

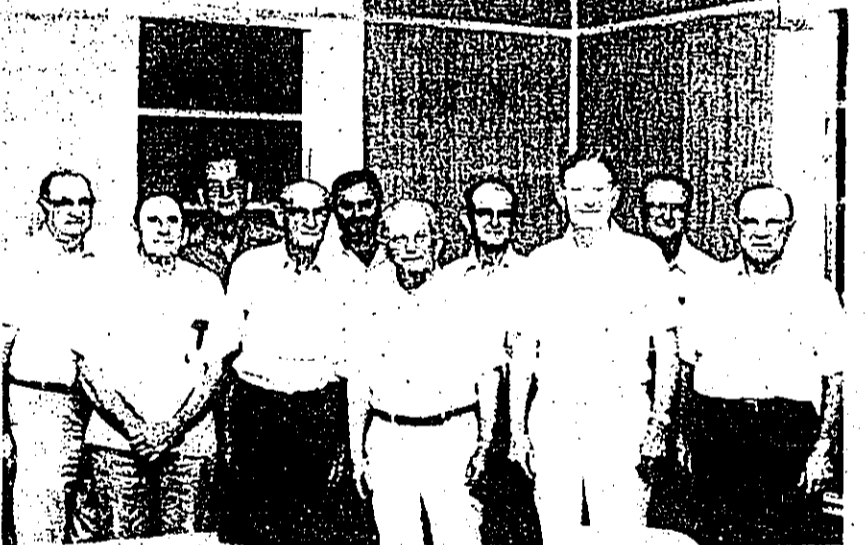
Alderman Dr. Malcolm Radford said, "It's time these rates started going the other way."

Councilman Gordon Anderson said, "I really can't see that the City of Woodville is qualified to make this decision."

On a motion by Dr. Brian Babin which was seconded by Kenneth George, the council acted "to let the rate increase ride" and not to recommend that it be approved.

In other city action, the council voted to name the new park developed through Community Development Block Grants "The Woodville City Park."

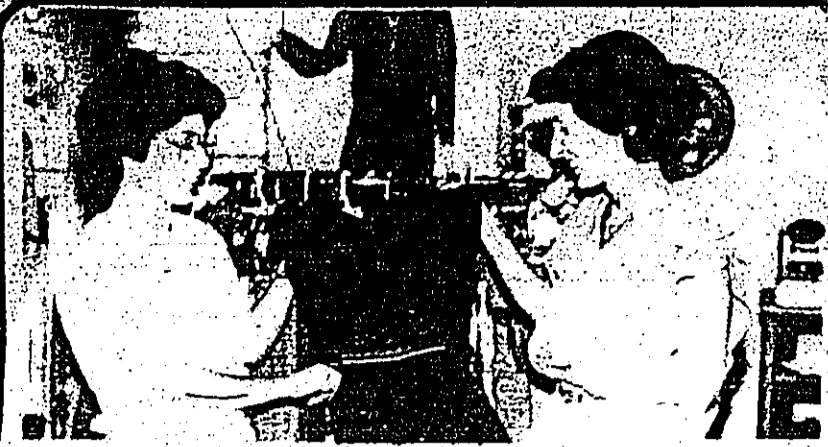
