Rockland Lake Dam Report Due

A Corps of Engineers \$100,000 repint still considered "in house" but due to be released at the end of this month recommends removal of the Rockland Lake and Dam Project from the "inactive" list allowing the Corps of Engineers to proceed with precon struction planning.

Leland Wilson, project engineer for the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers' Office in Fort Worth, and who is in charge of the Neches River Basin Study, said Friday, "We are recommending further detailed pre-construction planning on this Rockland Lake and Dam project. Previous estimates from Wilson's office indicated that the detailed planning and preliminary impact studies stage of the project will take 12 years while actual construction of a three-mile wide and 23 mile long water storage reservoir will take only 8 years.


