





Heat the oven to broll. Place the split muffins into a punch bowl and add pineapple juice. Add on a baking sheet, brush with oil; broil until light lice cubes or a molded ice ring. Serves 15 to 20. brown. Reduce oven temperature to 400 degrees F. Spread 1 generous tablespoon pizza sauce onto each muffin. Trim corners from cheese slices to 2 cups water make circles. Cut out a Jack-O-Lantern face on 4 packages plain gelatin each circle of cheese with a paring knife. Place 1 cheese face on each muffin; bake until cheese

rate is at its post-Depression peak. And sure enough a populist has arisen to rations and the middlemen, to save the family farmer. His name is Jim Hightower and a twist of fate has made him Democratic nominee for Texas Agriculture Commission-. Deep down the farmers know that the answer to their distress is the answer to most other distressed American industries: worldwide economic recovery, led by lower interest rates, led by the elimination of inflation. Unfortunately all that takes time and many farmers will not be around to see and so they are drawn to Hightower, with his homespun humor and his promise to

shake up the status quo. Fred Thornberry is Hightower's Republican opponent, and a vastly better choice for agriculture commissioner. He is a farmer himself, his family having been in the business since 1880. He holds three college degrees, including a doctorate in agriculture from Texas A&M. Thornberry is an internationally known poultry specialist, serving as an adviser to producers in more than 30 nations. Until he entered this campaign he was Agricultural Extension Service group supervisor for Texas A&M.

Thornberry knows agriculture, inside and out. Hightower, on the other hand, has had little to do with the subject. His college career was spent in government and international affairs. He is a former editor of the Texas Observer, a liberal journal of lost causes, and was campaign coordinator for Fred Harris, an Oklahoma populist who ran for president in 1976. Hightower's last political effort was a race for railroad commis sloner, which he lost

Hightower has written two books, "Hard Tomaloes, Hard Times" and "Eat Your Heart Out," in which he attacks land grant institutions (like A&M) and the agricultural scientists who led the green revolution. 4-H clubs are a "frivolous diversion of tax dollars." He derisively quotes an A&M pro-fessor as saying, "We don't teach Cotton Pickin' 102 anymore," as if Hightower would have us return to those thrilling but back-

If you're wondering about Hightower's 'populism," you're not alone. In the August edition of "Mother Jones," he says: "I constantly call myself a populist, it's in all my campaign literature.
