Hop In!

Booster Reporter Balloons 15 Miles

Hot Air Balloon pilots Bill Murtorff and Mary Gargotta of Houston were sitting in their pickup truck at the Mari-Fairway Foods parking lot around 7 a.m. Sunday morning. As a reporter for the Tyler County Booster, I am there to take pictures of them unloading and launching their hot air balloon, "Lazy Day."

Bill and Mary had brought the multicolored "Lazy Day" to Woodville to help Wal-Mart and Fairway Foods raise money for the Tyler County Youth Development Center on Friday and Saturday. Today, though, Bill was preparing for a morning of untethered flight, exploring the wilds of Tyler County. Mary, with her newly acquired map of Tyler County, will follow along on the ground. The huge red, green, blue and yellow balloon is rolled up in a large brown canvas bag and sits in the back of the pick-up truck along with a large fan and a huge cane basket.

As I am the only one available, I help turn the basket on its side and pull the balloon out in front of the basket in a straight line. Mary and I then pull the balloon out from the sides. The two of us then hold open the lower edge, "mouth," of the balloon while Bill uses the large fan to fill the balloon with air. Once the balloon begins to fill, Bill cuts in a large propane gas burner which thrusts hot air into the balloon and soon the lighter than aircraft, "Lazy Day" is tugging the basket upright urging skyward.

As Bill makes final preparation to launch he looks over to me, smiles and says, "Well, hop in."

As we rise we find what wind there is comes from the east so we begin moving west, quickly leaving Wal-Mart-Fairway Foods parking lot.

We are moving with the wind so there is no wind blowing against us; the air around us is calm and we do not feel cold. Yet we are moving at tree-top level at about ten miles per hour across the outskirts of Woodville, just above Cobb Mill Road. Unlike an airplane, it is quiet in the balloon basket. You can hear sounds from the houses and cars on the ground and even carry on conversations with people below. A voice comes up from the trees below. "Hello, nice morning isn't it?" and we reply.

At regular intervals Bill turns on the valve on the large chrome propane burner from which "Lazy Day" gets her hot air to stay aloft. The propane burner sounds like a gas hot water heater only much louder. When the burner is off you are left with genuine silence. There is nothing between us and the ground except for the basket.

Riding at tree-top level the trees

reveal a patchwork of fall colors; faded browns, reds and dark greens against the backdrop of ground itself, colored by fallen leaves and faded green grasses.

Using the propane burner, Bill is able to increase our altitude to where we are able to pick up a wind which moves us on a more northerly course. We cross the Livingston Highway west of Heritage Gardens and decrease our altitude gradually to where we actually bump the ground at the Tyler County Airport.

I had thought earlier that Woodville seemed especially quiet this Sunday morning. The reason soon became apparent. Riding northwest of Woodville toward Highway 256, the woods, fields and roads are full of deer hunters. All through this area the woods are one vast armed camp.

At one point we watch a group of about twelve deer "scared up" by "Lazy Day's" propane burner gracefully bound across an open field. A little later we waved at a deer hunter in a pick-up truck who was moving down a dirt road and trying to point out to him a large buck which was further down the same road, running in his direction.

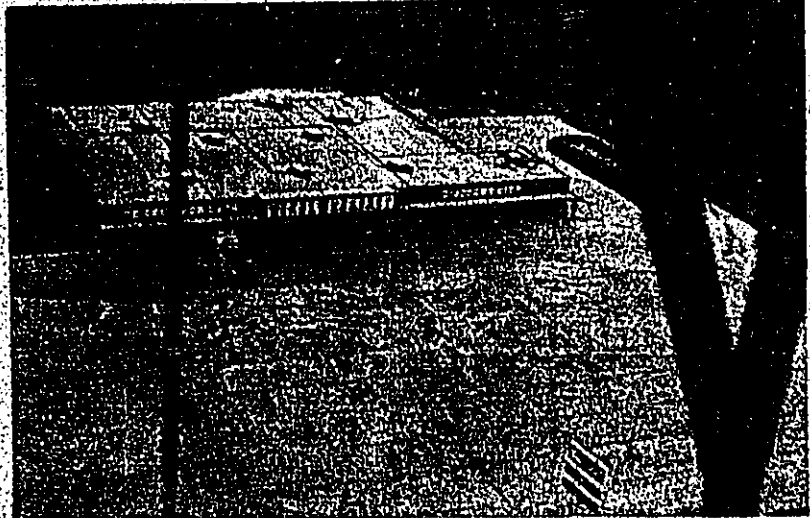
We paralleled Highway 256 to its intersection with the Chester Highway (Highway 287). Then we followed the Chester Highway northwest.

"Lazy Day" had been floating for about an hour and Bill began to look for a field to land in. We found that most fields that were clean enough for landing were crossed by utility lines. As we floated across one pasture we found that all the cattle in the pasture were coming to the edge of the pasture nearest us. As "Lazy Day" passed over the pasture, the whole group froze, eyes wide and necks turned up, then turned and ran to the other end of the pasture when Bill surged more fuel to the flame.

Finally within eyesight of downtown Chester, Bill decided to land on the highway. We crossed some utility wires then bumped the highway once, went back into the air and finally back down again. Bill pulled the cord which releases the hot air out of the top of the balloon and as we hit we turned the basket forward on to its side. We then got out and began pulling the fast deflating balloon off the highway. "Lazy Day" has landed across the street from J. E. Seamon's house in the outskirts of Chester. As I go to the nearest house to call and leave a message so Mary can find us, I am met at the door by three very wide-eyed, open-mouthed small children, Godette, Brint and Bret Williams. I doubt if they would have been any more amazed had the space shuttle Columbia, landed two days early in front of their house.

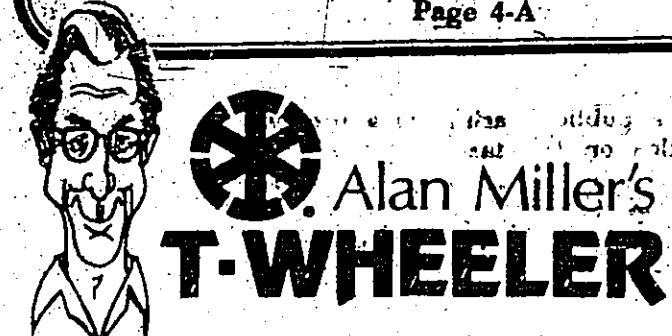

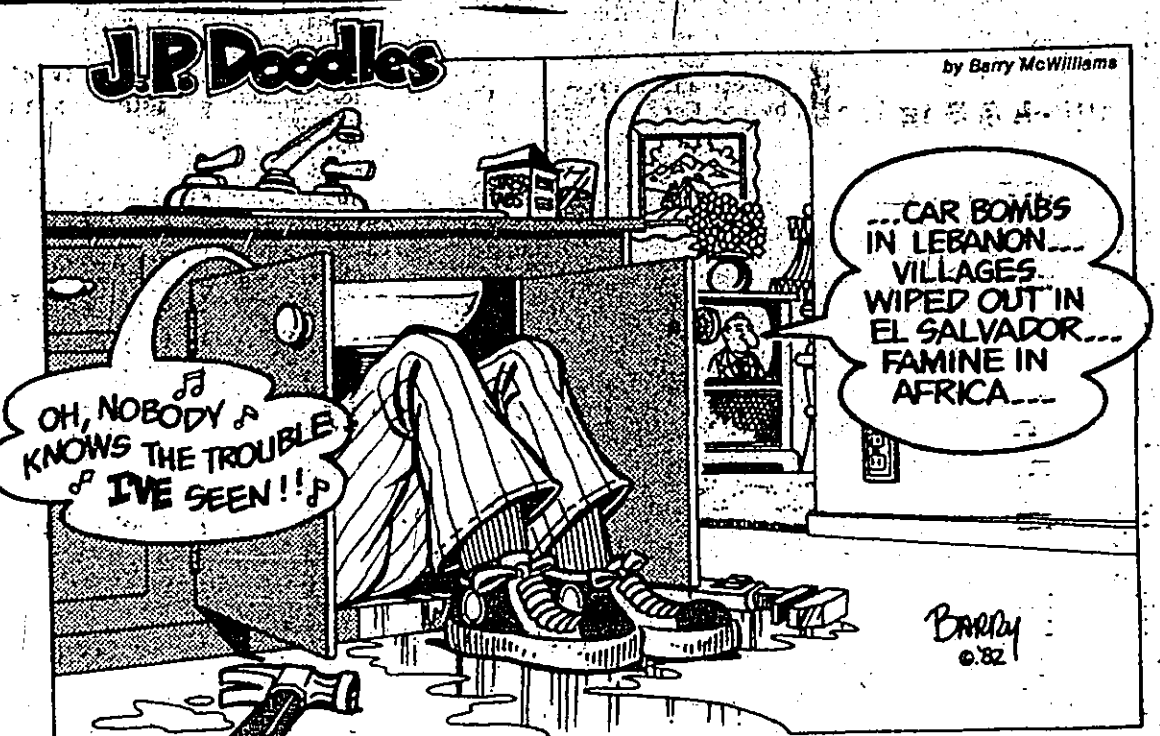
So Mr. Weisinger calls Mr. Goodwrench and says "the water tank doesn't have a hole where it's supposed to have a hole. I need one with a hole in it."

River Basin Plan

According to Wilson, this project is not currently expected in the foreseeable future to be economically feasible. Lake Rockland however, is seen as a viable economically feasible project and approved by the Corps of Engineers and funded for planning and construction by Congress, may join its twin Lake Rayburn as a multiple purpose water reservoir by the middle of the 1990's. As currently foreseen Lake Rockland would function as a source of hydro-power, flood control for the lower Neches, recreation and as needed water source for industries, agriculture and cities throughout East and Southeast Texas. With the completion of Lake Rockland, a comprehensive plan for development of the water resources of the Neches River Basin authorized by Congress thirty-seven years ago would at last be complete.

AUSTIN—It's hard to resist smiling younger who rings your doorbell and asks you to subscribe to a magazine to help him earn a college scholarship. It's especially difficult when he adds that part of the purchase price of the subscription will be donated to charity—and even more enticing when the price you are quoted seems very reasonable.

But our Consumer Protection Division attorneys say they have received reports of traveling magazine "crews" working one part of the State and moving to another, selling magazine subscription contracts on the basis of fraud and deception.

Consumers are not the only persons defrauded in such operations. In many cases, the youngsters working on the crew also have been the victims of misrepresentation. They have responded to classified newspaper advertisements which promise glamorous jobs involving travel, resort hotel stays, and the opportunity to meet interesting people. Such jobs are said to be "available to the right applicants." Remember, the typical sales pitch in such magazine sales operations is that you will pay only "pennies per week." Remember, though, that 48 pennies per week equals \$24.96 per year, so it's important to consider the total price you are agreeing to pay.

You also should be aware that some magazine sales operations have failed to provide the subscriptions even though they were paid in advance for them.

If you have a consumer complaint involving door-to-door sales of magazines or other items, get in touch with the Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division nearest you.

 Q. Motor oil cans bear inscriptions such as SAE 10W, 20W/30, 30, 10W/40. What do these terms mean? How do I know what to buy?

A. Numbers such as SAE 10W, 20W/30 or 10W/40 are Society of Automotive Engineers designations directly relating to the viscosity of a particular lubricant. The lower the viscosity, the easier the oil will flow. If you want, generally, a low number for cold operation, higher for warm. A "W" simply means, say experts at Gulf Oil, that the product has been tested at low temperature and is a "winter grade" product with two designations such as 10W/40 indicates that the product is multi-viscosity. That means that when cold, the product performs like a 10W fluid, and when warmed as the engine operating temperature increases, performs like an SAE 40 product.

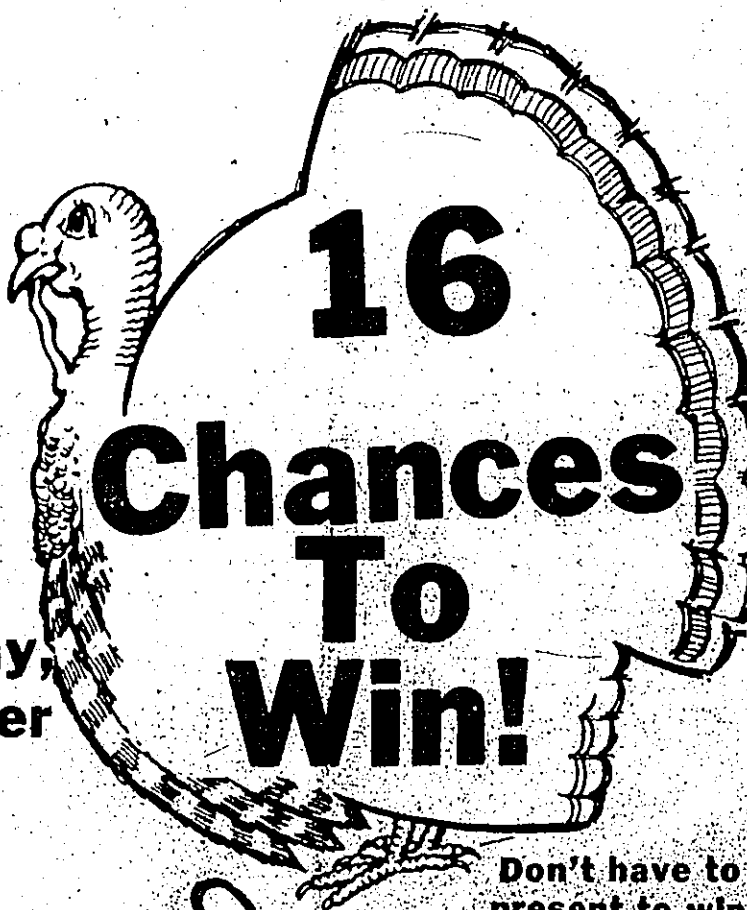
