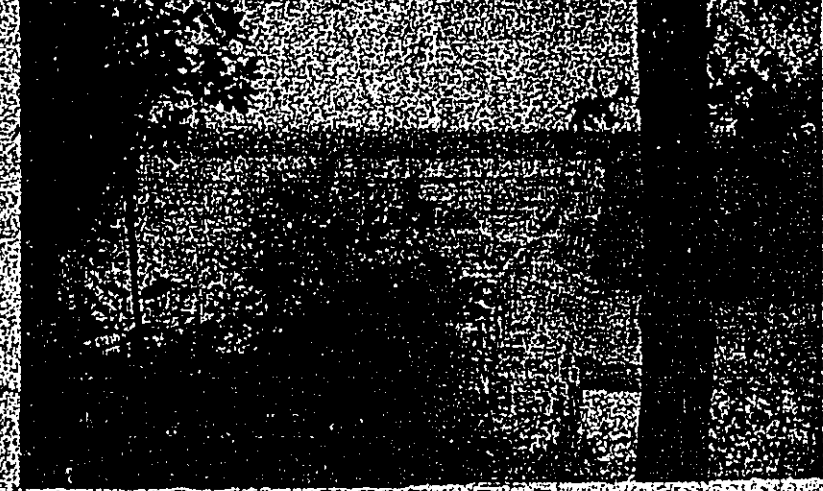


Hydropower Eyed For Dam B

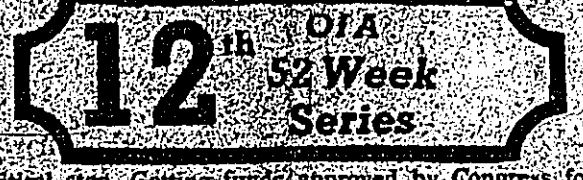

Lake Rockland Achieves 'Active' Project Status

The Chief of Engineers Office, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in Washington D.C. has approved the change of Lake Rockland from a "deferred" to an "active" project of the Ft. Worth District.

This action awakens the economically-feasible project from a deep sleep of over 35 years. Bob Billingsley, spokesman for the Southwestern Division of the Corps of Engineers in a call to "The Booster" Monday said, "Rockland is now an active Corps project, but the next step is



the critical step. Getting funds approved by Congress for the Ft. Worth District to re-evaluate the authorized project is the critical next move." Billingsley emphasized, stating further, that changes were slim for the 1984 budget requests. "There are projects from five other Districts which they will be competing with. Once we see how they stack up at the Division level, the office of Chief of Engineers must request Rockland's funding to the Secretary of the Army for Civil Works. Mr. William R. Gianelli, Billingsley said, "The Secretary of the Army acts as a spokesman for the administration" and will see how it fits into their priorities. From there it will go to the Office

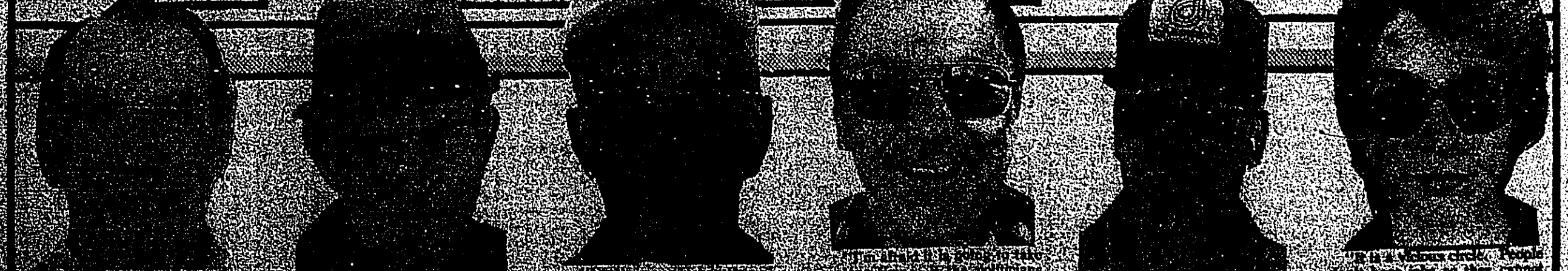
Club Completes Survey

Love, Marriage, Divorce & Will

Sermon By Rev. Joe Sheldon

The subject matter today is love, marriage, divorce, and will. I am sure some of you are saying, "I understand the connection between love, marriage, and divorce, but where does he get this 'will'?" Maybe that is why so many people think of the marriage service as a social affair. They really don't understand that the reason that we as Christians gather on such an occasion is to hear the man and woman express their will to love and care and strengthen and understand and endure to the ends of their lives. Let me say this again. Christians gather to hear a man and woman express their will to love for the rest of their lives. Today we are caught up in the movie brand of romantic love. That brand of love that lays emphasis on the butterflies, warm moonlight and pink cloud seven. This is the reason that we can hear love's favorites and "love going out of their marriages". They are talking about the warm feelings and pink clouds of love. Of course they go out of the marriage-at least they are not the preoccupying events of a few months. I shall never forget the young man on our staff that just got married. In less than a month, he was desisted at work, that is, not in front of his new bride. I asked what was the matter. He said, "I just found out that I am married and can't divorce." He had a batch of bills had just to work at loving no matter how you feel. "You see, I was usually fortunate. As a bachelor, I took my meals at a girls boarding house. I was one who had seen with his own eyes the drastic change that must occur between the time the girls would sneak down in their house coats to get that first cup of coffee while they still had their hair up in rollers and face cream still observable, and the time you would see them half an hour later. There is an anti-pink cloud drug, built into the ordinary life of two very different people together. These are called the before coffee grows; the month and bill trauma; the discovery that your partner is a slob or that he/she is a fussy old maid; the joint discovery that he no longer opens when the door for her and that she no longer always looks his favorites; and the celebration are their children. A strong love empowered by God's grace. We are talking about the miracle of strong love and full living. Divorces happen. And when they happen it is a failure of love-love strong enough to live without fizzle. This is why our Bishop is very interested in what party learned about and from the failure of wedding. If they are still full of resentment and accusations, they certainly aren't ready for another marriage. In our Gospel today, Jesus was asked about divorce. That was a stinker of a problem even then. Since he knew that they already know the important will to love. If they haven't learned to quote the law. The law of Moses had allowed a man to divorce if he gave a certificate of divorce. Of course, the woman did not have the same privilege. Then Jesus upset his hearers by quoting the Bible against this part of the Bible. You know what happens when you do something like this in East Texas. Your Bible quoting friends cease to be friendly. The scribes and the Pharisees weren't too friendly either. What Jesus said is simply that "Sure Moses allows this, but this is not what God intends." 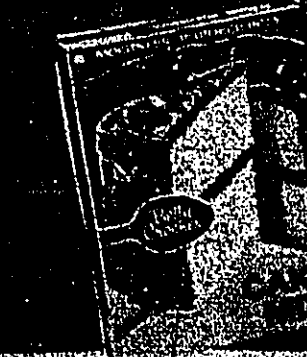

Purchase Holiday Toys With Care

Safety measures should be considered before buying toys for children this holiday season. Linking your child's age with the right toy is the first step in preventing injuries which befall thousands of children each year in the United States.

An estimated 130,000 children under the age of 15 were treated in hospital emergency rooms for accidents resulting from toys in 1981, according to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission.

"A child's development has much to do with choosing the right toy," said Dan Sowards, Chief of the Hazardous Products Program for the Texas Department of Health. "A year or two, or even a few months in a child's development can make quite a difference in his or her ability to cope with toys."

For this reason, manufacturers are required by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission to place age recommendations and precautionary labeling on toys. Testing is done for three different age levels: 18 months but not more than 3 years, and three years and not more than eight years of age.

Because looking for age recommendations, the consumer should look for precautionary labeling such as "nontoxic" on painted toys, "flame-retardant flame resistant" on fabric products, and "washable by hand" on stuffed toys and dolls.

Toys that can easily be broken are dangerous because of sharp cutting edges. Small toys, especially those with removable parts, can sometimes be swallowed by younger children, or become lodged in the nose, or windpipe.

Remote control airplanes, guided missiles, and similar flying toys can be harmful if the child using them is careless or not properly supervised. AUSTIN — Texas is proud of its modern system of highways, but our pride is literally beginning to have some potholes in it.

Financing the state's highways is sure to be a key issue before the 68th Session of the Texas Legislature convening in January 1983.

The highway crisis, which is national in scope, has been developing over the last ten years due to a number of factors including reduced government spending and increases in tax revenue earmarked for highway programs.

Proposed programs of New Federalism will place an even greater burden on Texas and other states by returning to the states the responsibility for funding and managing certain types of roads currently on the federal system.

You're probably familiar with recent stories in the press about a group of former employees of the Central Intelligence Agency who provided material and expertise to the Libyan regime of Colonel Khadaffy—knowing it was to be used for terrorist activities.

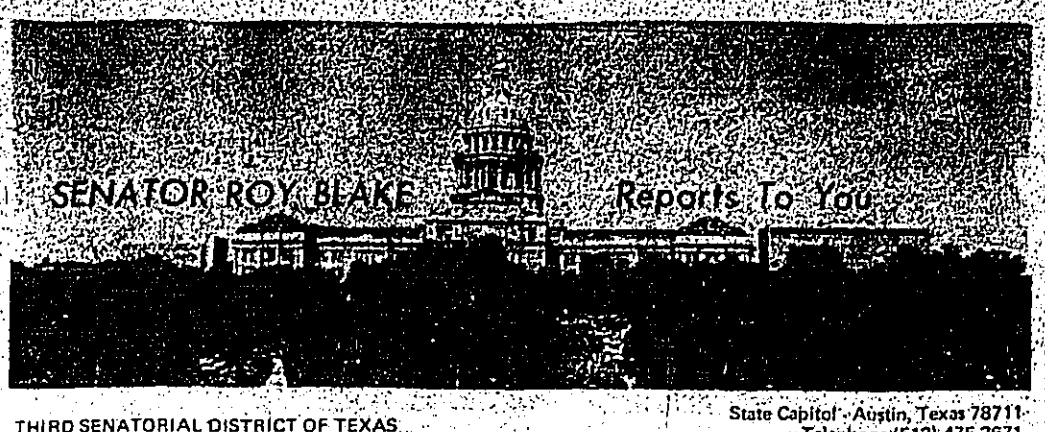
Government investigators and prosecutors were stymied for some time in the case because some of the activities of the group are legal under current U.S. laws.

My bill prohibits the sale of weaponry, explosive devices, munitions, plans and like items to a foreign state, or to an agent of a foreign state, for the purpose of aiding and abetting international terrorism.

Anyone convicted of violating the law would face a prison term of up to 10 years, a fine of up to \$25,000, or both.

AUSTIN — Through a fluoridation project funded by the Federal government and administered by the Texas Department of Health, financial and technical assistance is now available to communities wishing to fluoridate their water.

The project, which is operated under a grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, provides funding to reimburse communities for the cost of equipment, installation, engineering fees and two years worth of chemicals. The project also provides funds for existing fluoridation systems to get new equipment if needed in order to keep the optimum fluoride level.

The cost of fluoridation is only 20% of the total cost of other methods of prevention, yet is twice as effective. Decades of field and laboratory research, some in geographic areas where the natural fluoride content in the water was as much as 14 times the amount used in water fluoridation, has established beyond a reasonable doubt that fluoridated water is safe for the entire population and helps to make teeth decay resistant.

People who drink appropriately fluoridated water from birth can expect 65% fewer cavities and more attractive and durable teeth. Fluoridation does not eliminate or even diminish the need for regular dental checkups. When you consider the fact that the majority of our population never sees the inside of a dentist's office unless suffering from acute, advanced tooth decay, fluoridation becomes even more obvious. The entire population would derive great benefit, but children born to low income and poverty level parents would be the real winners. The cost of the free dental treatment received by many of these children would also be reduced.

Currently, the State Fluoridation Project has helped 86 cities to begin fluoridation and has assisted 14 other communities which were already fluoridating their water to upgrade their equipment or purchase new testing equipment for fluoride analysis.

In looking at a list of systems that have been assisted by the Texas Fluoridation Project, I noticed that Rusk and Center were helped in instituting fluoridation treatment in 1980. Conroe was assisted in upgrading its fluoridation treatment in 1980; and Nacogdoches is working on instituting fluoridation treatment.

The fluoridation of water supplies is endorsed by the Texas Dental Association and the Texas Medical Association. Members of the medical profession consider fluoridation to be an effective preventive measure which reduces the hazards of tooth decay and tooth loss, and also provides benefits to the individual, the family and the entire community.

If the Fluoridation Project continues at its present level of activity, the estimated completion date for fluoridating all public water systems in Texas would be in 1999.



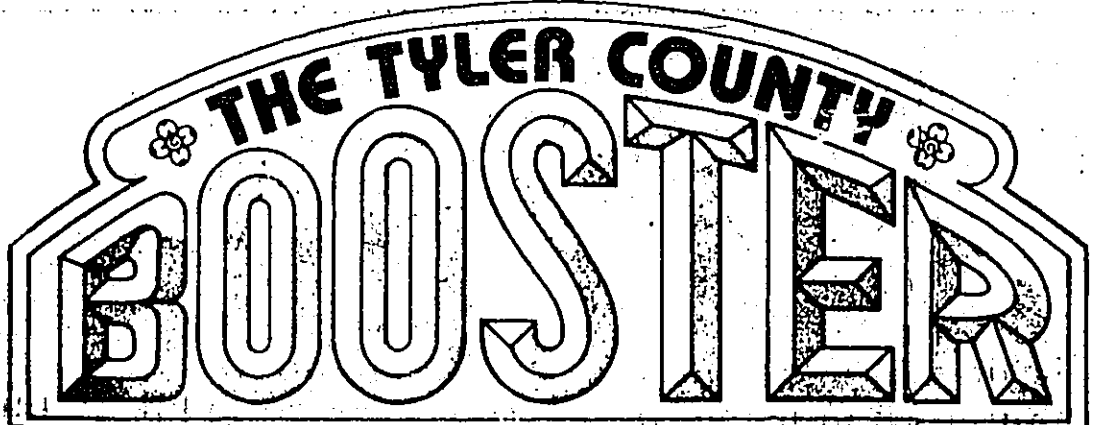


